

Some policy excerpts / references:

#### 17.20.1 On-site store endorsement

A manufacturer licence holder or applicant may apply for one on-site store area which authorizes the sale of liquor to the public from a store located on the manufacturing site or by internet sales. The store is the area where the licensee may sell their own products that are manufactured under the manufacturing licence and registered with LDB. Stores can sell by the bottle only.

A single licensee may hold multiple manufacturing licences on the same site (e.g. a winery and distillery). Where there are multiple manufacturing licences on the same site and each licence is owned by the exact same legal entity, a separate on-site store is permitted for each manufacturing licence, or a single store may be shared with no requirement to erect walls for physical separation of the different products. If there is another business on the site, the on-site store must have full height walls for separation, with no door allowing patron access between the store and the other business. Where there are different licensees located on the same site (e.g. different units of a warehouse) separation requirements of full height walls and separate entrance/exits apply.

### 17.20.2 Products that may be sold in the on-site store

Sale of liquor products in an on-site store is limited to liquor products that are manufactured under the licence, and registered with LDB to the manufacturing licence at that site. Licensees who hold multiple licences on the same site (winery and distillery) can sell the manufactured products of those manufacturers in one on site store. If there is a separate store for each licence on the same site, each store is limited to the sale of product manufactured under that licence.

Non liquor products may also be sold provided they are directly related to the liquor products being sold.

#### For example:

- items specifically identified with storing or serving liquor, such as bottle openers and drinking glasses;
- Figure 1 printed materials such as books and pamphlets concerning liquor in general or specific liquor products that are sold in your store;
- items that identify liquor products for sale in your store, such as umbrellas, T-shirts and aprons; and,
- be packaged snacks and liquor-related soft drinks and juices, such as cocktail mixers.

The sale of B.C. lottery products is permitted in manufacturers' on-site retail stores under the following conditions:

- o the licensee has been granted a lottery sales licence by the B.C. Lottery Corporation; and
- o the licensee sells only lottery products licensed by the B.C. Lottery Corporation.

Tobacco products and confectionary items may not be sold.

#### 17.17.1 Sampling at the manufacturing facility

Manufacturers may have one or more sampling rooms (or areas) at the manufacturing site. The sampling room(s) must be in an indoor area of the licensed manufacturing facility, and may be located within an endorsement area such as an on-site store or lounge. Sampling areas must be indicated on the floor plan and are approved at the time of licensing. To change or add a sampling area(s), a structural change application is required.

The amount that may be sold varies depending on the type of product being manufactured. If the licensee has multiple manufacturer licences at the site, the Branch may permit sampling rooms to overlap, allowing for the sampling of the product of all licences on the site.

Wineries: In a sampling room (or area), a winery may provide unlimited free samples of their products. If a winery charges for samples of their liquor products they may provide no more than 150 ml of liquor per patron, per day.

# 17.16 Minors in manufacturer premises

Minors are generally permitted at a manufacturing site. Minors are permitted in sampling rooms, lounge and special event areas, and on-site stores when accompanied by a parent or guardian. Minors are permitted in picnic and tour areas unless otherwise restricted by the general manager.

Minors may not be employed to manufacture liquor or to serve liquor in any licensed area of the manufacturing site such as an on-site store, sampling room, or endorsement areas.

# 17.14 Hours of Operation

For the purposes of the manufacture of liquor, there are no restrictions on the hours of operation. Hours of operation for an on-site store are between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m., or as otherwise indicated on the face of the licence.



Thank you for your recent submission of a structural change application, floor plan and additional email information that you and your lawyer, Andrea Hagen, have provided regarding the proposed changes to the existing licensed manufacturing facility.

Further to our email exchange and application information, you have confirmed the following:

- There are two buildings on site, of which one building (the smaller one) will be the
  manufacturing facility and the larger building will house the on site store/retail/tasting area
- The main floor plan of the larger building will include a tasting bar, product and display table
  and POS area (on site store endorsement area). I note that there are outdoor patio areas
  which will, at this time, be unlicensed. I also note that you have a picnic endorsement
  application in progress and the on site store application which will require a licensing fee at
  the time of inspection.
- The Foundation Plan of the Manufacturing facility shows 2000 litre barrels X 3, pumps, work bench area, as well as an outdoor crush area.
- The manufacturing facility is secured by double lock
- The museum display denoted on the store plan is just a type of shelving for product display and you have confirmed that there will not be a museum-type exhibit in the facility

I am satisfied that the proposed layout complies with statutory and Liquor Control and Licensing Branch policy provisions with respect to a winery manufacturing facility. All existing terms and conditions on the face of your winery licence will remain in effect.

#### Floor Plans

I have enclosed one copy of the manufacturing facility including the on site store endorsement area which has been stamped and authorized as "approved in principle". If this is not an accurate assessment of the plan or the plans change during the construction stage, please advise the branch at your earliest convenience.

This approval in principle allows you to proceed with the renovations as applied for, however, it does not imply final approval.

Your liquor inspector will:

- Confirm that the floor plans (manufacturing facility and retail store area) match the actual construction and floor plans, and
- Take photos of the changes
- Please ensure this letter <u>and</u> the attached approved floor plan is available for review at time of inspection
- Rob, you or one of the other shareholders within Terrabella Wineries Ltd. must be in attendance for the final inspection
- An additional fee of \$200.00 will be charged to reschedule a final inspection if you are not ready when the Liquor Inspector attends the establishment.
- This plan approval in principle expires on August 11, 2015
  - o If you are unable to complete the renovations and arrange for a final inspection prior to the expiry date, you MUST submit a written request to the Branch 30 days prior to expiry of AIP. The request should be accompanied by evidence demonstrating that the delay is beyond the control of the applicant. Where another authority is responsible for the delay, a letter from that authority outlining current status and schedule for completion should accompany the request for extension. Failure to request an extension will result in the applications being considered abandoned and subsequently terminated on the expiry date noted.

Upon confirmation from Liquor Inspector Hufsmith that the physical layout of the new retail store area/tasting areas and manufacturing areas are as depicted on the attached approved floor plan, you will receive a final approval letter and official validated floor plans.

Please allow 5 business days from the time the final inspection is successfully concluded so that staff may complete the licensing application process.

This letter is to acknowledge receipt of the required documents in support of your application for a winery licence and on-site retail store endorsement to be located at the above-noted address.

I have had the opportunity to review your application and supporting material for criteria including business intent, eligibility and applicant suitability, as well as preliminary review of your manufacturing site and building floor plans.

Based on my review, your application is deemed complete as of today and Approval in Principle (AIP) for the winery manufacturing facility is granted and the floor plan has been signed and dated as such. This AIP allows you to proceed with construction/renovations of the manufacturing facility; this AIP does not allow you to begin manufacturing winery products.

Under the Regulation of the *Liquor Control and Licensing (LCL) Act*, a winery must meet minimum production and facility requirements. These include:

- Produce a minimum of 4500 litres of wine per year on site (on the manufacturing site with equipment that is also on site).
- Have fermentation tanks, filtering equipment and secure storage area(s) onsite.

# Liquor Distribution Branch Manufacturer's Agreement

Before the Branch will issue the manufacturing licence, the applicant is required to enter into a Manufacturer's Agreement with the Liquor Distribution Branch (LDB), which provides the authority for the applicant to make sales in the province and ensures the applicant understands the appropriate policies, procedures and reporting requirements associated with these sales.

The Branch has provided LDB with a copy of your Manufacturers application, site plan, and business proposal documents. The LDB will be in contact with you to arrange for your signing of the LDB Manufacturer's Agreement. #### Floor Plans

I have enclosed one copy of the Approved in Principle floor plan which includes the manufacturing facility and storage area outlined in red and the on-site store endorsement outlined in blue.

You may construct or renovate the manufacturing building in accordance with the approved plan. If this is not an accurate assessment of the plan or the plan has changed significantly during construction, please contact the writer as new plans may be required to be submitted.

It is noted that you intend to use existing buildings at the proposed winery site for the manufacturing facility and onsite store and the construction of the new facility is anticipated next year. If you decide to proceed and construct the new facility and onsite store in the future, you would be required to file a Structural Change Application and receive approvals prior to any changes occurring.

It is the licensees responsibility to ensure adequate security for all areas of the manufacturing facility and all product storage.

Note that this approval is subject to, but not limited to, all local fire and building, zoning, jurisdictional bylaws, ALR restrictions, and health authority approvals as required in your area.

# Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR)

- You will also need to ensure that you have signed copies of your agreement with LDB available prior to contacting the Inspector for a final inspection.
- A shareholder within Terrabella Cellars Inc. must be in attendance for the educational session and the establishment inspection of the manufacturing facility.
- An additional fee will be charged to reschedule a final inspection of the facility if you are not ready when the Inspector attends your establishment.

- advise the applicant that a copy of the federal excise licence letter, issued under federal jurisdiction (CRA) should be faxed to the Branch upon issuance (after LCLB has issued the manufacturing licence);
- discuss LCLB Winery regulatory reporting requirements (4500 litre minimum production on-site per year) and requirements for renewal of the licence; and
- Inspector will verify by email to LDB at <u>Yolanda.Lam@bcldb.com</u>, confirmation of 15.0 acres of grapes.

The first year pro-rated licensing fee for the winery licence will be required prior to final approval. If you wish to arrange for payment of the licensing fee prior to the final inspection, please contact the Branch at 1-866-209-2111.

This AIP will expire November 5, 2014. An extension to this approval will only be considered where a written request is received by the Branch at least 30 days prior to the expiry of the AIP. Failure to request an extension will result in the application being considered abandoned and therefore, terminated on the expiry date noted above. No further notice will be provided.

# Regulation 17 - record keeping and reporting requirements:

17 (1) For the purposes of administering and enforcing the Act and this regulation, a person who holds a winery licence must, in a manner acceptable to the general manager, maintain the following documents and records:

- (a) source documents including, without limiting this, business structure documents, invoices, receipts and bank statements;
- (b) records including, without limiting this, the general financial ledger, general production and inventory ledger and winemaker's journal.
- (2) In addition to the requirements under section 34, a person who holds a winery licence must make available for inspection, at the request of the general manager or his or her designate, records of the following information as applicable:
  - (a) records of tonnage of grapes or fruit harvested;
  - (b) purchase records for grapes or fruit purchased indicating the type, source and tonnage of the grapes or fruit;
  - (c) purchase records for juice or concentrate purchased indicating the type, source and volume of the juice or concentrate;
  - (d) purchase records for bulk and bottled wine purchased indicating the type, source and volume of the bulk and bottled wine;
  - (e) purchase records for additives to wine such as alcohol and sugar indicating the source and volume of the additives:
  - (f) production records for bulk and bottled wines;
  - (g) records of the movement and disposition of bulk and bottled wine that is transferred from one location to another for sale or export;
  - (h) records of the disposition of wine by spillage, sampling and tasting.
- (3) The information required by subsection (2) must be recorded on an ongoing basis.
