Notes:

- Includes only cases in pay and on BCEA (Temporary Assistance or Disability Assistance). For other cases there is no benefit paid (e.g. Medical Services Only) so EI is not deducted, or the data is not reliable (e.g. cases not in pay).
- EI data for people not in pay is not always updated and therefore not reliable. This means there might be a few situations where a person's EI made them ineligible for TA/DA and thus will not be included in the above table. This most often occurs when a person not on TA/DA applies for TA/DA while their EI benefits are pending and then leaves assistance when they start. Because EI benefits are much lower than employable earnings, there should not be very many situations where an existing TA/DA client starts receiving EI that makes them ineligible. Because of the

existence of other deductions, and because clients may leave assistance for reasons that are not relayed to SDSI, determining EI deductions from clients not in pay would require manual reviews of each case.

- Employment Insurance data is not identified by type.
- Employment Insurance is fully deducted from Temporary and Disability Assistance.
