Thank you so much for your e-mail of January 10, 2018. Please note that my reply is being sent to each of the Ministers to whom you addressed your letter and copied, as well to my colleague Sheila Malcolmson, and Theo Boere at the Men's Centre here in Nanaimo. Firstly, by way of bonafides for you I want to ensure all who received a copy of this letter that I know you personally, that you have done excellent work \$.22 s.22

You make excellent points in your letter and I have written to the Solicitor General on this matter on the issue of funding for the Men's Centre in Nanaimo, and funding for services directed at assisting men in this Province previously. In the latest case out of Victoria, \$.22), once again we see a situation where there is no excuse for what happened but part of the explanation is clearly another situation involving people who are desperate, who perhaps had or felt they had no place to turn and or no sympathetic voice to hear them. I fully support what you are doing because I am satisfied after 38 years of practicing law, a substantial portion of which was Family Law, that nothing good comes from the denial of contact by what we used to call non-custodial parents, or rather now use the new language, parents who would be applying for contact but not guardianship of their children. We may not be able to prevent the horrific cases but we may save other children from the prospect of growing up without like those of the \$.22 contact with their other parent whom they instinctually wish to see and have contact with themselves, which has been almost my invariable experience even in the most difficult of cases. The service you are suggesting addresses that fundamental issue for those difficult situations involving one parent who has parent control and the other who is seeking contact.

On the larger issue, the funding for the Nanaimo Men's Centre, I encourage every Minister who receives this to consider the matter as I am sure the Solicitor General may wish to discuss it with all of Ministers receiving this because it touches on their respective Ministries both directly and indirectly and the responsibilities those Ministries have.

Non-residential parents, to use your language Carmen, whether they be men or women should have contact with their children as long as that contact is reasonable and healthy and if it requires supervision, so be it, but those parents whether they be men or women need places / centres that serve both genders and any others who find themselves in these situations.

Thank you for taking the time to write this and to trying to raise this issue and put it squarely before the Ministers involved.



s.22 does not believe that the current symbol of a person in a wheelchair is a suitable symbol for someone who does not use a wheelchair or other mobility device. s. feels that people who are able to walk short distances without assistance are not seen by the general public to be deserving of accommodation with things like designated parking spaces. s.22 would like to see a new symbol developed by your Ministry that such people could use to indicate that they do indeed need special accommodations.

Given that the wheelchair symbol is one that is used in multiple jurisdictions, my staff advised \$.22 to contact organizations such as Disability Alliance BC and the Canadian Council for People with Disabilities to talk to them about s. goal. As well, we agreed to bring this matter to your attention.


