Very good day to you Minister Darcy,

I'll start with a brief introduction, my name is Darcy Long. I am a Peer Support Worker and one half of the Community Transition Team (CTT) based in Kamloops. Throughout British Columbia there has been 4 Community Transition Teams created by Provincial Health Services Authority. These teams are in response to the extreme risk that exists to opiate addicted peoples leaving correctional institutions. It was determined that there existed a sizeable gap in services for vulnerable people leaving custody, whether they had been incarcerated for 30 days or two-years less a day. Although there has been many progressions over the last decade in programming offered to inmates, until last December, the

moment those inmates became community members again they had little or no support established. Recognizing the value of contrast and collaboration, PHSA crafted the teams to consist of a MSW and a Peer Support Worker. In the case of the Kamloops area, Heather Cooke is the MSW that makes up the other half of the team. Heather has a wealth of experience and has worked in many different positions and areas including the East Coast of Canada and the United Kingdom. Between the two of us, we have been able to navigate for our clients the complex needs and obstacles which an addicted person leaving corrections may face. That was, until recently.

When appointed to the Minister of Mental Health and Addiction Services, our Premier mandated you to "Work in partnership to develop an immediate response to the opioid crisis that includes crucial investments and improvements to mental-health and addictions services." There is no question after working with the population we both serve that there has been an incredibly tragic shift in recent years in the risk of being an opiate addicted person. I doubt that given your position you would view the opioid epidemic as anything less than a "life and death situation", which is what the MSDPR requires the situation to be before they'll designate funding towards it. The threat is real and cannot \$.22

What we are hoping is that you will assist us in advocating for a change in legislation. A change that would recognize opiate treatment as a matter of life and death in the eyes of our Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction, so that those people who live in rural areas, who have exhausted other options, would be able to receive funding for transportation twice a month to access their medication and fulfill their obligations to the program that may just save their life.

I am saddened by how Victoria is now becoming.

While I am sure the board has had many meetings with Island Health and VPD to come up with solutions it appears to the community none are working.

I read that housing is one issue and this I can agree with. I wonder if we have thought about creating a three tier approach for support. I believe this was successful in Alberta.

1. Remove all illicit drug use from Our Place. None of these clients will ever come on their own to try and get off drugs without

full supportive programs. They are not capable in deciding on how to start or willing as they are too engrained in their disease. The current drugs are too strong and powerful to come off of. All these clients should be sectioned and removed from the streets to a complete dry out program. Physician, Nurse, Social worker and psychiatry run. Clients stay for up to a year until in full recovery.

- 2. Mental Health stream. All clients who are schizophrenic wondering the streets sectioned until we manage their medication then put into supportive housing.
- 3. Mental health with challenges to ADL in supportive housing with daily medication dispensing occurring. Some with shared accommodation as they have strong relationships with no housing for couples.
- 4. Poverty and homeless, creative subsidized housing.
- s.22 this is starting to look like hasting street. I am not ignorant to the medical cut backs as at one time EMI housed over 500 beds, Riverview, for phrenic psych closed down, and now Island Health has 86 beds to work from and multiple sites within the community as supportive. But obviously not enough. We need to wrap care around each person to support them. But we need to start with the drug addicted first and get back^{s.22} Our Place, as it is now known to the community as a piace to do drugs, sell drugs without any consequences and those who use it for its reasons are scared for their future. We cannot keep excepting this as a safe place and enable the community to believe it. I want change as much as everyone does. We need to take back the community of Victoria. Just my thoughts and would be happy to sit on a working group.

Hi Shelley,

Do you have s.22 DOB? I'm wondering if she's over 65 and if she is, she likely won't be a client of our ministry. People transition from provincial income support (Persons with Disabilities or PWD) to federal OAS/GIS benefits when they turn 65. There are cases sometimes where a person can receive a "top-up" from us if their federal CPP isn't as much as when they were on PWD. Would you know if that's the case with s.22 If she is receiving a top-up from us then she may be eligible for what we call Medical Services Only (MSO). If she is over 65 and on CPP alone (not receiving a provincial top-up), then she wouldn't be eligible for MSO.

Also, you may find more information at the link below as seniors fall under the scope of the BC Ministry of Health. There may be something there specific to them and not our ministry, something I'm not aware of. https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/family-social-supports/seniors.

I can also connect you with my counter-part at the Ministry of Health too, if you'd like to follow up there.
