Meeting Summary

Welcome, Introductions and Action Item Log – DM Collins

DM Collins welcomed new members, confirmed minutes, and highlighted in weekly Information Note some increase in structures along Hastings but overall is still low. Also noted site preparation was underway for modulars and the need now to be clear on the tenanting process and flow.

Presentation: Meghan Will a/ADM (HOUS)

Meghan Will provided a presentation on the final version of the Provincial Response Plan: Supporting the Downtown Eastside. The plan has a broader scope and purpose beyond Hastings Encampment response: Bringing partners together in immediate actions and long-term planning to restore community health, wellness and safety in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside

The PESC has provided oversight to the plan in a collaborative structure that includes Premier's Roundtables, and Multilateral Government Working Group and Ministry, BC Housing, City of Vancouver and Community Partners – and ensures ongoing engagement.

C O N F I D E N T I A L

The final version of the plan incorporates partner feedback, including:

- Focus on distinct needs populations and community-based work, like the Red Woman Rising Report, SRO Strategy
- More inclusion of health, substance use and mental health supports; intervention/de-escalation
- Focus on poverty reduction, income and skills supports
- Family reunification and youth supports

Additional areas of feedback to address through implementation include:

- Data-sharing and coordination; change management
- Funding for community partners
- Washrooms, inhalation sites, day spaces

An overview of the plan goals and actions was provided. Next Steps for the Plan include a public communications approach and timing, as well as governance and revised scope of the PESC through implementation.

3. Discussion

Members discussed *How could PESC be leveraged to support the implementation of the Provincial Plan?* Members shared general support for PESC moving forward, members not wanting to continue were requested to email Teri or Meghan.

4. Partner Roundtable:

BC Housing

Heidi Hartman shared a recent fire affected 26 units at St Helen's site and 6 people were displaced. Regarding housing placements, 22 allocations in progress and 8 referrals. BCH trying to coordinate with non-profits and residents for interviews. BCH is working on occupancy plan for new units coming online with non-profit partners.

Allison Dunnet shared BCH is holding pattern waiting for DTES Plan to come through to potentially repurpose People Supports Group.

City of Vancouver

Paul Mochrie echoed dramatic deterioration of unsafe situation on Hastings and pressure to address, noting the situation is not tenable to continue into spring. Clear direction provided to CoV to act; serious problem and unsafe for everyone.

Sandra Singh shared day to day sanitation, engineering working at priority sites continues. Outreach are trying to offer shelter and supports, increasingly connecting with people who do not want to talk to the team or are becoming hostile. Very difficult to work. Fire Services are continuing to respond on daily basis as fire risk remains.

East Hastings Encampment Response

ISSUE SUMMARY:

- City of Vancouver (CoV) staff continue to work to clear tents, structures, and debris along and around Hastings – where people are either already connected to indoor spaces (as well as storage and supports) or using the space for other purposes such as informal or illegal markets.
- According to the CoV, as of March 7; 74 structures remained along Hastings St. This is an increase of 10 from the previous week and 6 from the week prior.
- CoV staff and Vancouver Police have noted increasing safety concerns and criminal activity in the encampment area, including weapons and violence against women. CoV has identified 'no go' sites where engineering/bylaw staff will no longer attend due to aggressive behavior and/or safety concerns for staff. CoV is mapping these sites so provincial partners are aware of their location to inform front line teams.
- CoV outreach reports fluctuations in the number of people sheltering along Hastings; counting 117 at the end of February – the majority of which are engaged with outreach and want housing 22 are not engaged.
- On the weekend of March 11/12, Vancouver Fire Rescue Services responded to numerous fire calls in the area. Two tent fires occurred, and a woman was found dead in a tent (likely deceased prior to the fire). Propane tanks and hoarding noted as increasing fire risk.
- Work continues on the two temporary modular housing sites at 1525 Western Street (formerly 1500 Main Street) and 2132 Ash Street:
 - 1525 Western Street (formerly 1500 Main Street) – Development permit issued, pending building permit. RFP by invitation to Indigenous providers closed March 13. Review and selection is underway by BCH procurement.
 - 2132 Ash Street – Pending development permit. PHS selected as operator.
- BCH is finalizing the purchase of Chalmers Lodge (1450 W 12th) which will provide up to 115 self-contained units; some renovations are required. This building will be used for seniors and vulnerable individuals.
- BC Housing continues to renovate SRO units to provide more housing options for individuals sheltering in the encampments.

BC Housing Update: People and Spaces

Number of new or newly renovated permanent indoor supportive housing spaces that have opened since August 2022:

- 129+ renovated spaces in various SROs from existing housing stock (permanent supportive housing)
- 10 rooms at Jubilee Rooms, 22 Main Street. Permanent housing.

In addition, there are more than 1,500 shelter spaces available in the City of Vancouver, a mix of temporary shelter spaces, permanent shelter spaces, and Extreme Weather Response spaces that have opened. While these are not being opened specifically for East Hastings, they augment the number of shelter options available across the City.

Outreach also offers shelter beds daily. From August 17- Mar. 7., 567 individuals were offered shelter spaces. 129 people have accepted offers of shelter.

However, this will change over time as new units are brought online and partners learn more about the specific needs of residents on East Hastings.</p>
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ISSUES/UPDATES:

Strategic Response Planning:

- Encampment response and operations continue to be guided by the CoV/BC Housing and partner-informed operational approach identified in the Encampment Response Plan – with updates provided at supporting working groups and from operational teams as work has progressed.
- The Provincial Response Plan - Supporting the DTES includes immediate encampment and longer-term actions and has incorporated feedback from ministry, federal, CoV, Indigenous government, Indigenous and community partners. The Plan is being finalized and prepared for public release, likely in mid-April.

Spaces:

- As shelter spaces become available, they are offered to people sheltering outdoors on East Hastings, in CRAB Park and elsewhere. Once people are in the shelter system, it enables staff to get to know guests' individual needs, build trust, and then support them to transition into homes as they become available, matched with appropriate support services based on needs. A shelter 'hold' system has been in place since January allowing people to retain their shelter bed if they wish.
- BC Housing and Carnegie meet regularly throughout the week as needed and, the Community Access and Assessment (CAA) Table meets weekly to review priority Hastings referrals. At this time, priority for housing allocations (typically renovated SRO units) is based around vulnerability and distinct needs such as Indigenous status, gender, age and those who have expressed a desire to move indoors. Note: There is no CAA process to guide allocation of shelter spaces.

- Construction is underway on temporary supportive (workforce modular) housing which will provide approximately 92 units: **1525 Western Street (formerly 1500 Main Street) and 2132 Ash Street.**
 - These are temporary buildings intended as a transitional step, while other permanent housing projects are in development.
 - These temporary buildings will provide residents with access to their own private rooms, showers, and meals, and offers 24/7 staffing, security and on-site health services. 20% of the units will have enhanced health supports for which BCH will be working with VCH to tenant. This will be supportive housing under BCH's model, including payment of rent.
 - Ministry of Housing, BC Housing, CoV and VCH are determining how these 90 units will be allocated. At this time, the criteria being considered is based around: level of vulnerability, demographics representative of community, appropriateness for health supports offered, and individuals who have extended shelter stay history. Criteria will be finalized once the operator for the Main Street site is selected.

City of Vancouver update:

- As of March 7, there were 74 remaining structures along E Hastings Street. At the end of February (Feb 22), there were 64 structures.
- CoV's Homelessness Services Outreach staff update:
 - At end of Feb, 117 people were sleeping overnight in the Hastings Area
 - 95 of the 117 people are engaged with Outreach (81%)
 - 70 of the 95 were there in October or prior and are open to shelter/housing options
 - 25 of the 95 are people engaged with city outreach since October and were open to shelter/housing options
 - 22 people (in tents), of the 117, do not want to engage (19%)
- Of note:
 - While the February numbers are similar to October they do not represent all the same people, as people move into housing/shelter, leave, return and come to shelter in this area. Movement is consistent.
- **Recent Community Impacts/Housing Loss (as of December 2022)**
 - March 11/12: Two tent fires, one person found deceased in a tent (likely prior to fire), numerous fire calls and propane/hoarding issues noted.
 - 91 elevator-related relocations in last six months (Portland Hotel, PCA, Sorellas, Hazelwood, Patricia).
 - Feb 22: Fire at the St. Helen's SRO at 1161 Granville St, no injuries reported. Displacement of some residents due to water damage.
 - Jan 17: Fire at Orwell Hotel, 456 E. Hastings Street. 13 individuals needed to be relocated.
 - Dec 16: Three fires at downtown SROs. Damage confined to units of origin.
 - Dec. 13: Fire at 1115 Nelson. One tenant was displaced and in hospital. More than 100 SDPR clients reside at the building.

- **Human-Centered, Intersectional and Trauma-Informed Response:**

- Partners meet to include a trauma and culturally informed response, rooted in feedback from people with lived and living experience of homelessness.
- Women and non-binary people:
 - Women's only drop-in storage is being provided by Atira (currently full).
 - Carnegie/Orange Hall is taking the lead on housing options and will need consideration for gender response. Women and Gender Diverse drop-in space implementation delayed with Vet's Manor discussions. 320 Alexander currently being used as Downtown Eastside Women's Centre emergency use (due to fire damage at shelter)

- **Indigenous Peoples:**

- Currently Aboriginal Front Door Society, via support from CoV and BCH, is supporting community outreach, storage, food provision, cultural supports and partnership development with other agencies
- All Nations outreach is working with SDPR Community Integration Services in Crab Park

- **Intersectional Community Outreach – Including Racialized and Immigrant communities:**

- Watari Counselling and Support Services is providing Indigenous Circles at the Astoria, and they continue to provide Youth Outreach services in the community.

- **People Who Use Drugs**

- CoV and partners continue to support OPS, VANDU and other community-based organizations to support harm reduction response in the area.

Issues Scan for Ministry of Housing

Week of March 13 – for Hastings St. Encampment

Issue: Body found in burned DTES tent at Hastings and Main

Media reported on Monday that the body of a woman was found by Vancouver firefighters who responded to a tent fire around 5:30 p.m. on Sunday night March 12.

Key Points

- **Vancouver Fire Rescue Services said evidence suggests the woman had died prior to the fire starting.**
- **As of March 13, Vancouver Police are working with the BC Coroners Service to identify the woman.**

Issue: Residents of Vancouver SRO demand compensation for time spent without elevator service

CTV reported on a rally by a group of Portland Hotel and member of the Vancouver Tenants Union group asking for PHS Community Services, which manages the Portland Hotel SRO, to compensate the tenants for the five months they lived without an elevator. The elevator was back online as of Feb. 7.

Key Points

- **During the time that the elevator was out of service all tenants were offered alternative housing and most accepted it. Some elected to stay.**

Issue: City of Vancouver to support CRAB Park washroom

Media shared that City of Vancouver would put \$700k or \$750k of its \$2,500,000 grant awarded by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and UBCM [Strengthening Communities Services Program](#) towards CRAB Park. The Strengthening Communities Services Program grants are for temporary supports. It is up to the City of Vancouver on how it is used. It was reported by media that the \$700k will go towards park washroom and staff services for those facilities, specifically to support folks who are sheltering outside and CRAB Park.

Key Points

- **More than \$700,000 has been earmarked by the provincial government to recover the cost to the city of servicing the camp. Included in that are four full-time park rangers who are assigned exclusively to the park.**
- **Media asked if BCH is currently aware that people sheltering at CRAB Park are being directed to a certain area at the park.**
- **Vancouver councillor Peter Meiszner of the ABC party says the city is working to shut the camps eventually, as his slate promised. "I understand people's frustration but unfortunately this isn't something that can happen overnight. But we are working hard on it and we are seeing the encampments on both Hastings Street and CRAB Park reducing in size."**

Issue: Narrative for DTES violence continues, man stabbed on March 8

Adult male stabbed at Hastings and Carrall streets on Wednesday evening. He was taken to hospital and expected to survive. Narrative of DTES violence. Woman shot with beanbag and arrested for stabbing with a needle on Feb. 25.

Week of Feb 23 – for Hastings St. Encampment

Issue: Advocates claim housing options are inadequate during Hastings decampment

Advocates and those sheltering in Hastings hold streetside press conference in response to City of latest effort from Vancouver bylaw and crew (with VPD in attendance) to remove structures along Hastings and decamp individuals. Media coverage of advocates sharing concerns that there is a lack of quality housing shelter options for those displaced.

Key Points

- **Advocates claiming that despite COV informing and offering shelter or SRO space options to those who had their structures removed that they are not adequate.**
- **Advocate group Stop the Sweeps says: “The housing is being refused because it's just not suitable or safe.... The standoff yesterday was as city staff again moved in to try to remove some makeshift shelters and belongings built up along Hastings near Columbia.”**
- **DTES advocate Kaylanne Lorraine: “We know these displacements, these so-called street sweeps are violent. They lead to people dying, they lead to people losing everything they have.”**
- **Pivot Legal’s Anna Cooper disputes that COV is helping and alleges they have an abusive and undignified approach to homelessness in the DTES, particularly against people along the Hastings Street encampment... She also accuses governments of misleading the public about the quality of available social housing units.**

BACKGROUND:

The East Hastings Street Encampment ("the encampment") in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside (DTES) was formed in the early summer of 2022. Though some individuals have historically sheltered outdoors in this area, a rapid and coordinated increase in tents and structures occurred during this time. In July 2022, the Vancouver Fire Rescue Service issued an order to remove the tents and structures. Since then, the city and province have been working with a variety of partners including all levels of government, service providers and community organizations to develop and implement a DTES Provincial Response Plan ("the Plan") - Appendix A.

The ministry has a strong presence in the DTES, which includes a dedicated outreach team in addition to 3 frontline ministry offices. Two dedicated Community Integration Specialists provide outreach supports to people along the encampment in partnership with DTES organizations, with an additional five who can be reassigned as needed. The dedicated Community Integration Services Branch (CISB) staff have provided outreach supports to individuals at the encampment area since mid-August 2022. Supports range from completing intake applications and administering crisis supplements, to system navigation and ongoing case management.

DISCUSSION:

The City of Vancouver ("the City") has responsibility for decampment efforts in the DTES, which are ongoing. Unlike previous park encampments, the encampment has no firm geographic boundaries. As a result, City staff are unable to fence and restrict access, which consistently allows new flow into the encampment. The ministry is represented on a cross-government working group focused on this encampment, however, to date the City has only shared limited details regarding their decampment plans. Staff from the City's Engineering Department will be leading the structure removal, with the support of the Vancouver Police to maintain the peace.

It is understood that decampment efforts are expected on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday of this week in 'low priority' areas. The city has also identified 'no go' zones for

decampment activities due to current safety concerns. Individuals are to be provided with a handout of where not to shelter following the decampment process. Carnegie Outreach and BC Housing - Orange Hall - have worked through each area of the encampment and offered an indoor option to everyone verified as needing housing. There are currently approximately 117 people sheltering outside at the encampment, 70 of whom have expressed a desire for housing. Offers of indoor spaces have been made to a majority of people sheltering outside. The number of structures along East Hastings Street has been reduced from 180 to 74 since July 2022. With the announcement of 330 housing units being made available to encampment residents, it is anticipated that the population will grow.

The BC Housing led Community Access and Assessment (CAA) Table meets weekly to review priority referrals affiliated with the encampment, and plans are in place to have regular ministry representation. Priority for housing allocations is based on vulnerability and informed by meeting the needs of priority populations Indigenous, women, and seniors. To support increased collaboration, BC Housing is creating a hub in their Orange Hall location to bring community partners together, including SDPR.

The role of the Community Integration Specialist to support the Plan is to:

- provide expedited intakes and connections to income supports and shelter funds;
- provide navigation supports for government services, including identification and referral to housing and health supports, regardless of income or disability client status;
- support with family and community reunification when requested through transportation and travel assistance;
- referrals to low-barrier employment opportunities such as like the Lookout Society LEEP project, and the EMBERS Eastside Works centre at 57 East Hastings;
- coordinate supports in partnership with BC Housing, the city, community partners, health authorities and other ministries;
- assist individuals obtain identification;
- fire safety education and supplies when available (e.g. extinguishers, fire blankets, fire retardant tarps);
- offer crisis supplements for food and clothing to help individuals with unexpected needs; and
- support recipients of the Supported Rent Supplement Program (SRSP) with coordinated case management and system navigation.

The ministry will not play a role in the final “enforcement phase” of the decampment. Community Integration Specialists will however be a resource a few blocks away, as long as it is safe to do so.

SDPR will partner with local community organizations to facilitate access to pre-employment and employment services, as well as access to work experience and peer

CONCLUSION:

ISSUE: East Hastings Street Decampment Update

BACKGROUND:

The East Hastings Street Encampment ("the encampment") in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside (DTES) was formed in the early summer of 2022. Though some individuals have historically sheltered outdoors in this area, a rapid and coordinated increase in tents and structures occurred during this time. In July 2022, the Vancouver Fire Rescue Service issued an order to remove the tents and structures. Since then, the city and province have been working with a variety of partners including all levels of government, service providers and community organizations to develop and implement a DTES Provincial Response Plan ("the Plan") - Appendix A.

The ministry has a strong presence in the DTES, which includes a dedicated outreach team in addition to 3 frontline ministry offices. Two dedicated Community Integration Specialists provide outreach supports to people along the encampment in partnership with DTES organizations, with an additional five who can be reassigned as needed. The dedicated Community Integration Services Branch (CISB) staff have provided outreach supports to individuals at the encampment area since mid-August 2022. Supports range from completing intake applications and administering crisis supplements, to system navigation and ongoing case management.

DISCUSSION:

The City of Vancouver ("the City") has responsibility for decampment efforts in the DTES, which are ongoing. Unlike previous park encampments, the encampment has no firm geographic boundaries. As a result, City staff are unable to fence and restrict access, which consistently allows new flow into the encampment. The ministry is represented on a cross-government working group focused on this encampment, however, to date the City has only shared limited details regarding their decampment plans. Staff from the City's Engineering Department will be leading the structure removal, with the support of the Vancouver Police to maintain the peace.

It is understood that decampment efforts are expected on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday of this week in 'low priority' areas. The city has also identified 'no go' zones for

decampment activities due to current safety concerns. Individuals are to be provided with a handout of where not to shelter following the decampment process. Carnegie Outreach and BC Housing - Orange Hall - have worked through each area of the encampment and offered an indoor option to everyone verified as needing housing. There are currently approximately 117 people sheltering outside at the encampment, 70 of whom have expressed a desire for housing. Offers of indoor spaces have been made to a majority of people sheltering outside. The number of structures along East Hastings Street has been reduced from 180 to 74 since July 2022. With the announcement of 330 housing units being made available to encampment residents, it is anticipated that the population will grow.

The BC Housing led Community Access and Assessment (CAA) Table meets weekly to review priority referrals affiliated with the encampment, and plans are in place to have regular ministry representation. Priority for housing allocations is based on vulnerability and informed by meeting the needs of priority populations Indigenous, women, and seniors. To support increased collaboration, BC Housing is creating a hub in their Orange Hall location to bring community partners together, including SDPR.

The role of the Community Integration Specialist to support the Plan is to:

- provide expedited intakes and connections to income supports and shelter funds;
- provide navigation supports for government services, including identification and referral to housing and health supports, regardless of income or disability client status;
- support with family and community reunification when requested through transportation and travel assistance;
- referrals to low-barrier employment opportunities such as like the Lookout Society LEEP project, and the EMBERS Eastside Works centre at 57 East Hastings;
- coordinate supports in partnership with BC Housing, the city, community partners, health authorities and other ministries;
- assist individuals obtain identification;
- fire safety education and supplies when available (e.g. extinguishers, fire blankets, fire retardant tarps);
- offer crisis supplements for food and clothing to help individuals with unexpected needs; and
- support recipients of the Supported Rent Supplement Program (SRSP) with coordinated case management and system navigation.

The ministry will not play an active role in the final “enforcement phase” of the decampment. Community Integration Specialists will however be a resource a few blocks away, as long as it is safe to do so.

SDPR will partner with local community organizations to facilitate access to pre-employment and employment services, as well as access to work experience and peer

employment grants for DTES residents who are ready for supported low-barrier employment opportunities with local employers.

CONCLUSION:

The decampment efforts, including the enforcement phase, are led by the City. The ministry will not play an active role in the enforcement phase of the decampment, however, Community Integration Specialists will be a resource a few blocks away, as long as it is safe to do.

Microsoft Teams meeting

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1. Nanaimo:

- There was a shooting near a Nanaimo encampment recently.
- The incident has led to an increased focus on the homelessness situation in Nanaimo.
- The encampment where the shooting happened is a small area, down a sheer embankment – a tarp is up to hide it from view but CI Specialists estimate there are not more than 4-5 tents along the river.
- CI has risk assessments and safety protocols in place and they continue to follow them.

2. Abbotsford

- **Lonzo:**
- Currently estimated to be 26 people at the encampment, up three from the last update.
- 17 at the Lonzo site and 25 vehicles, 9 people at the Riverside portion.
- There were two fires, one at each site this week, however there were no injuries.
- One car left Lonzo this week, but 3 other vehicles recently come onto the site, making it a net increase of 2 vehicles.

3. Richmond: Vulcan Rd. encampment

- There are approximately 14 people currently residing on Vulcan Way.
- Conditions have improved somewhat as residents have started to clean up around their areas.
- Eight people have recently relocated.

4. Victoria

- Uptick in numbers downtown as people move outdoors - doorways are particularly busy.
- There continue to be several high-volume tenting areas across the CRD, including:
 - Pandora: Numbers have increased from 6-7 tents daily to approx. 24 tents daily, as well as many people sleeping without tents.
 - Topaz: 8 tents and people, concerns it will become busier as the weather warms up.
 - Stadacona Park: The city is reporting April 23 as a potential date to start work on a new playground; communication will happen with the campers on or before then. There will be enough room for all current campers to stay at the park, but they will have to change location. HART team continues to connect with people, and some will be put forward for upcoming vacancies.
 - Western Communities: Continued hot spot behind Fairway in Langford with up to 6 structures. The Salvation Army is supporting people at the site.
 - Ellice Street: HART attended recently and reported up to 18 unhoused individuals and a lot of tension between people.

5. Vancouver – Hastings and CRAB Park

- **Hastings:** CoV report the numbers of structures continues to increase. Totes continue to be offered to assist people in packing up.
- Propane tanks and materials continue to be removed. There have been impoundments and there is clear communication on the process for people to collect their belongings from impoundments.

- Carnegie outreach is continuing to offer shelter beds and locate people who have active housing allocations.
- **SDPR Community Integration Specialist Hastings update:**
- As of March 31, CI specialists approached 202 people, spoke with 162 (40 declined), completed 59 new income assistance intakes and provided 195 crisis grants.
- **CRAB Park:**
- There are 41 tents, and 15-20 people in the park, 18 of which are receiving peer support from Lu'ma.
- Vancouver Coastal Health outreach visits twice a week as well.
- Outreach is seeing more people coming into the park but not necessarily sleeping overnight.

6. Prince George – Homelessness Update

- **Moccasin Flats and Millennial Park:**
- Moccasin Flats continues to see about 7 people and 6 structures.
- Fire occurred at Moccasin Flats on March 21 and destroyed a structure. No occupants were on site at the time and no injuries were reported. Fire Department attended.
- Millennial Park is seeing 6 people and 8 structures.
- Outreach has distributed 290 cold-weather kits to people in the community since Dec. 1.
- **Bylaw Proposal:**
- A cross-ministry team (HOUS/HLTH/BCH/SDPR) met regarding the situation in Prince George.
- The City of Prince George is proceeding with a bylaw to designate Moccasin Flats as a centralized encampment site and under the new policy, anyone setting up shelters around the community will be directed to move to the site at Lower Patricia Boulevard.
- The City had attempted to clear the encampment in 2022 through a court order but was denied. It has been an entrenched encampment since, with significant health and safety concerns and minimal supports – what is provided is largely through community and ministry partners.
- Ministry staff are concerned about the City's decision to divert vulnerable people to a singular encampment site – namely as health and sanitation services are not in place, numerous structures and refuse present fire risk and several cohorts of people experiencing homelessness may have safety and conflict issues in close proximity.

7. Fire Safety Updates

- The remainder of the fire safety supplies have been distributed to SDPR offices.
- Outreach staff are out in all the 23 communities handing out the supplies, which are being well received.

Our folks have confirmed that VPD and city staff are present on Hastings and have begun setting up a perimeter.

Our operational plan is as follows:

- A coordination centre has been established on the third floor of our DTES office at Main and Powell for the team's supervisor and manager.
- We are waiting to see where the edge of the perimeter is and then CIS will be setting up two tents at that are staffed with a team of seven CISp.
 - VCH has shared their response plan for CISp to be able to connect individuals with health supports if needed.
 - We will be updating a list of community partners and their availability as this information is known.
 - If the situation necessitates supports through our leg and regs, we will be supporting this. We will also have a supply of our backpack items (e.g. soft-chew granola bars, individual first aid kit etc...) to address needs in the moment.
 - An open invitation to VCH and BC Housing has been made to join the CISp.
- We have ADM approval for overtime for tomorrow to maintain resources, as Earned Days Off that were scheduled for Friday will have been moved up due to the Easter long weekend.

Next update will be 1pm, unless there is something of note.

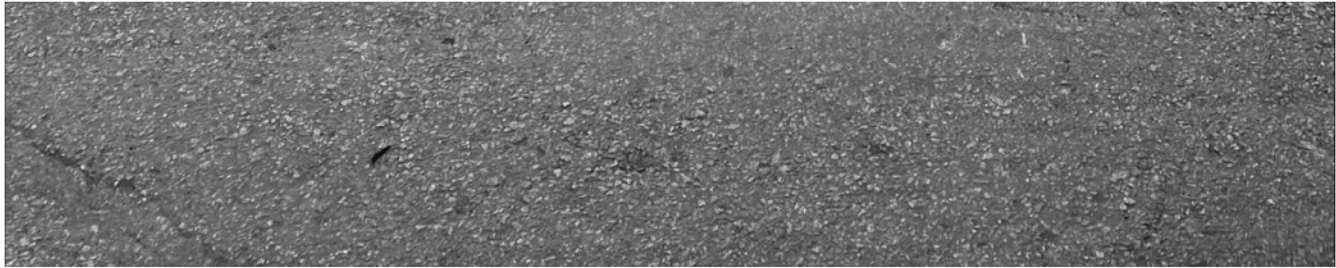

Here is an update from the team.

- Focus for CoV has been on individuals willing to voluntarily packing up. We have informally heard that the Emergency Response Unit of VPD will be ready for 1pm deployment if necessary.
- A "Service Hub" will be established at the corner of Gore and Hastings, which will include CISp and other NGO folks.
- Teams of 4 CISp (one has an MSD) have been connecting with those leaving voluntarily to let them know where they can get support. We have also been joined by All Nations Outreach Staff and connected earlier in the day with Carnegie Staff.
- Colleagues in the Community Services have advised there is nothing more to report related to the decampment from an office operations perspective.
- The team is reporting a growing presence of onlookers at Carrol and Hastings.

FYI – Encampment question [today in QP](#) from MLA Olsen. Community Integration Specialists were not specifically mentioned.

A. Olsen: In the same week that the Premier stood in front of a million dollar townhome and declared his housing affordability plan, he's scattering the homeless population in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside. Just hours ago, people's belongings were thrown in garbage trucks, street cameras were rendered inoperable, barricades were put up to keep the public away. It's a complete erosion of public trust. The Premier promised to resolve this decades-old crisis in the Downtown Eastside. In November, he promised 90 temporary shelter units for the neighbourhood. The deadline's passed, and those units are nowhere to be seen.

Today what we see is not leadership. It's policing poverty. The sweeps have never worked. Year after year, month after month, people displaced without a plan and look where it's gotten us — to today.

To the Premier, where does he suggest the most vulnerable people in our society go?

Hon. R. Kahlon: Thank you to the member for the question. This is certainly a challenging issue. The city of Vancouver notified me this morning that they were going to move in and move on the encampment. We have been working closely with the city of Vancouver on housing, on related issues, on supporting people with mental health.

I agree with the mayor that it's not safe right now. The encampment on Hastings, in particular, is not safe. The fire risks are great. Many of the housing units that we have on Hastings have been at risk, with some of the fires that have happened. We know that there was a recent report from a not-for-profit that interviewed 50 women, and all 50 of had been reported to be sexually assaulted.

So we have been working with local government, in particular, but we've been working with not-for-profit partners to work with the individuals that are in the encampment. We have been able to house 90 of them, which was, I think, a positive thing. We estimated there were around 70 people that said that they would be interested in housing. We have shelter spaces open. I've been getting reports that people have been leaving the encampment and going to shelters spaces, which is positive.

We're going to continue to work with the city to expand the opportunities. We have 330 additional units that are coming on by the end of June, 100 every month — 100 this month, 100 next month, 100 the next month. We have additional units coming this fall.

The city has been moving on some of the projects that we've already approved and saying: "You know what? We can actually add more density to those units, because we know the need is great."

So all that work is happening, but it is a challenging situation.

Mr. Speaker: Member, supplemental.

A. Olsen: No doubt it's a challenging situation. It's been a challenging situation for more than a decade.

It's kind of shocking to hear that the mayor just called the Minister of Housing today. The rumors have been floating around social media for the last couple of days that this action was going to be taken.

The Premier has said that he's worried about fires and the assaults that the Minister of Housing has pointed out. I agree, and I think we agree, that there are safety issues and concerns at the encampment, but the Premier also hasn't mentioned the fires, the assaults and the disgusting conditions at the SROs in the province, which is part of the solution that this province has, apparently.

A man living on the sidewalk in Downtown Eastside said that he feels that he's safer on the street. He said they face overdoses, violent deaths, assaults and filthy conditions in those dilapidated buildings.

The Premier says that this is a safety issue, but let's be clear: rounding up people and moving them inside without fixing the deplorable situations in the SROs is not ensuring safety. Scattering people across the communities of the

Lower Mainland isn't making those most vulnerable people in our society more safe. The Premier wants dignified housing for people, but it appears that he actually wants them off the street more.

To the Premier. Can he confirm that there is dignified housing, like he promised, available today — not the end of June, today — for every person that is being displaced by this action in downtown Vancouver today?

Hon. R. Kahlon: Again, thanks to the member for the question.

He is, he is correct. The challenges that are faced by many, especially around the Downtown Eastside, are decades in the making. It is a complex situation.

We are working with our partners, all partners, to find paths to get people into safe and adequate housing, so I'll make a couple of comments. One, some SROs are not in great shape. We have SROs that are very old. The buildings are in tough shape, and we're working with our partners to renovate, to make them safer. All that work is happening.

We know, over the long term, that we need to move away from the SRO model. That work has also begun. City of Vancouver, CMHC and B.C. Housing have been working together on what does that plan look like.

We also know, and the member will know also — activists will tell you — that for now, a lot of those SRO spaces are adequate housing for people. We, in fact, have activists come to us often to say: "An SRO building is going on sale. The province should buy it." Because people understand, for the time being, it's adequate housing.

Shelter spaces are available. We're moving people into shelter spaces. I will say to the member.... I would say that right now the shelter spaces are safer than the encampment for people. Given the fires, given the increased crime, the shelters are a safer place for people.

Then, when they get into shelters, we assess their needs. From there, we move them into different housing units. We have housing units coming on in the short term, by June — 330.

We actually have hundreds more coming in the fall. We're building the capacity as fast as we can to get people housed.

Good afternoon,

Here is this afternoon's update:

- VPD and other CoV staff are back on Hastings today to clear the tents that popped up overnight. Hastings is currently closed from Main to Carroll. (see imbedded photo).
- This morning staff have spoken with 90 individuals.
 - They have processed >25 crisis requests, mainly for food and clothing – all the individuals cite their belongings ending up in garbage trucks.
 - 3 intakes have also been completed.
 - In addition to the IA/DA supports, the team has been making referrals to various community partners, as well distributing backpack items (rain ponchos being one of the more requested items).
- Unrelated to Hastings, there have been multiple evictions from SROs. CISp are speaking with building managers to better understand the cause.
- In discussions with the CoV outreach coordinator, they are also seeing more folks increased vulnerability regarding their mental health.

The team has also clarified that the number of individuals they connected with yesterday was more in like 260, citing that they often spoke to folks in groups of 3 or 4. They offer apologies for the confusion.

Next updated is planned for end of day.

- Staff connected with ~115 individuals today. The morning was dedicated to connecting with folks and identifying needs, where the afternoon was focused on completing/processing the Service Requests and Intakes and delivering cheques before the weekend. In total the team processed:
 - 38 crisis requests , for food and clothing.
 - 3 intakes (including 2 individuals in Crab Park).
- In addition to the IA/DA supports, the team has been making referrals to various community partners, as well distributing backpack items (rain ponchos being one of the more requested items).
- 2 individuals were connected with, and received, shelter placements; however, there was 1 additional individual who was offered a room at Chelsea Hotel and declined citing safety concerns related to one of the tenants that resides there.

Good afternoon,

Here is this afternoon's update:

- VPD and other CoV staff are back on Hastings today to clear the tents that popped up overnight. Hastings is currently closed from Main to Carroll. (see imbedded photo).
- This morning staff have spoken with 90 individuals.
 - They have processed >25 crisis requests, mainly for food and clothing – all the individuals cite their belongings ending up in garbage trucks.
 - 3 intakes have also been completed.
 - In addition to the IA/DA supports, the team has been making referrals to various community partners, as well distributing backpack items (rain ponchos being one of the more requested items).
- Unrelated to Hastings, there have been multiple evictions from SROs. CISp are speaking with building managers to better understand the cause.
- In discussions with the CoV outreach coordinator, they are also seeing more folks increased vulnerability regarding their mental health.

The team has also clarified that the number of individuals they connected with yesterday was more in like 260, citing that they often spoke to folks in groups of 3 or 4. They offer apologies for the confusion.

Next updated is planned for end of day.

Good morning

I checked in with the team this morning and they are reporting the following:

~20 tents on Hastings this morning, mainly between Columbia and Carroll; staff also report seeing tents being set up in the alleys connected to Hastings. Crab Park appeared to have more individuals; however nothing was observed in Oppenheimer or on the side streets in Gastown.

Yesterday the team estimates connecting with ~120 individuals, all of them noted being on IA or DA. No new intakes were completed, or crisis grants requested.

It was mentioned during the planning leading up to yesterday that CoV would provide the residents with an information sheet on where not to shelter, CISp advise that did not see such a document being distributed, We heard that the drinks, snacks, and rain ponchos that the CISp handed out we greatly appreciated. Folks also stated that knowing that the CISp's were there to connect with and that we will be there for "aftercare" eased their anxiety.

Drug toxicity was concern, more so than normal. Two CISp did identify one individual who had OD'd, administered three rounds of Naloxone prior to paramedics arriving and the prognosis was not looking good.

Today the plan is:

6 CISp to be out in community doing street outreach. At the moment we will not be setting up the tent as folks are distributed throughout the DTES.

Our supply of "backpack items" is still good and we will be handing more out today.

Situation updates are planned for 1pm and 4pm today.

We are working with Telus Health (formally Life Works) to provide staff with Critical Incident Response counselling, likely next week.

Steven asked to put this scenario from yesterday in the report. Sukhi I will send a draft of the details and however you want to present it.

Yesterday after 430pm

- VPD and COV engineering team (tent removal team) arrives at my clients' tent shortly after 430pm.
s.22
- CI removes themselves as soon as protesters, activist and VPD and COV arrives by the tent but stays in close vicinity as CI is one of the only person client trusts and able to have conversations without getting triggered.
- As COV starts to take client's belonging down, client doesn't move from the tent s.22
- COV communicates with CI how to approach the conversation as client not listening or responding to COV or VPD. Client wasn't responding to Elder and other indigenous cultural worker either.
- CI advised COV to remove men presenting people/police/city staff around her tent, or authority as police with uniform is triggering for the client. CI also advocates for client's dignity as an indigenous woman and advised COV for only female worker touching client's tents and belonging.
- VANDU legal coordinator Molly, DTES Women's center executive Alice Kendall discusses with this CI for additional support re the conversation with the client. CI advises the community leaders the same as above.
- After long conversations, COV and VPD decides to leave client stay in her tent for the night.
- Around 645pm, VPD and COV leaves the tent area. Elder and cultural support worker conducts smudging.
- After everybody leaves, CI connects with the client. Provided meal tickets and bag of clothing from donations.

Today April 06

- CI speak to the client this morning. COV is in ongoing communication with CI re the client. (CI has been coordinating with COV tent removal team to provide trauma informed and culturally appropriate service while active decampment in progress).
- Client decides to leave her tent and take a shelter bed at the first united.
- Today around 330pm client goes to First United Church to do an intake for their shelter bed.
- CI also provided crisis supplements to the client as all their belongings are now removed.

I just wanted to mention the coordination between COV, VPD, VANDU, DTES Women's Centre and myself to support an s.22

CI advocated for humility, dignity and culturally appropriate actions. The outcome: Today client left her tent, checked into her shelter, and the removal was peaceful and without any violent incident.

- Staff connected with ~115 individuals today. The morning was dedicated to connecting with folks and identifying needs, where the afternoon was focused on completing/processing the Service Requests and Intakes and delivering cheques before the weekend. In total the team processed:
 - 38 crisis requests , for food and clothing.
 - 3 intakes (including 2 individuals in Crab Park).
- In addition to the IA/DA supports, the team has been making referrals to various community partners, as well distributing backpack items (rain ponchos being one of the more requested items).
- 2 individuals were connected with, and received, shelter placements; however, there was 1 additional individual who was offered a room at Chelsea Hotel and declined citing safety concerns related to one of the tenants that resides there.

Good morning

I checked in with the team this morning and they are reporting the following:

~20 tents on Hastings this morning, mainly between Columbia and Carroll; staff also report seeing tents being set up in the alleys connected to Hastings. Crab Park appeared to have more individuals; however nothing was observed in Oppenheimer or on the side streets in Gastown.

Yesterday the team estimates connecting with ~120 individuals, all of them noted being on IA or DA. No new intakes were completed, or crisis grants requested.

It was mentioned during the planning leading up to yesterday that CoV would provide the residents with an information sheet on where not to shelter, CISp advise that did not see such a document being distributed, We heard that the drinks, snacks, and rain ponchos that the CISp handed out we greatly appreciated. Folks also stated that knowing that the CISp's were there to connect with and that we will be there for "aftercare" eased their anxiety.

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Our supply of "backpack items" is still good and we will be handing more out today.

Situation updates are planned for 1pm and 4pm today.

We are working with Telus Health (formally Life Works) to provide staff with Critical Incident Response counselling, likely next week.

- City crews and VPD actively removing tents and structures on Hastings St as of 10:00AM
- < 10 tents/structures on Hastings (between Columbia and Carrall)
- 4 large structures are on wheels and appear to be moving from location to location (pic attached)
- Tents/sheltering in the alleyway 1 block west of the Main & Powell offices (pic attached)
- No tents observed in DTES parks (Thornton, Oppenheimer, Wendy Pool, behind Tinseltown)
- Visited Vanier Park, 2 tents reported in the media are not visible – likely located deeper in the forested area
- 2 CIS attended Hastings and handed out snacks, ponchos, hand/foot warmers
- Connected with 10 individuals – no specific requests made
- 2 CIS attended Crab Park and connected with Jason (self identified spokesperson/leader) who disclosed a handful of new tents since decampment
- CIS handed out backpack items and connected with 15 individuals
- 2 individuals expressed the need for fuel (to keep warm at night) – no action taken
- Connected with a new individual at Crab Park who is not attached to SDPR – intake scheduled for today
- Crab Park folks were private, stayed in their tents and did not wish to engage with CIS (common for this park)
- 2 crisis supplements for food issued
- No activity or concerns reported from the DTES offices (random requests for food crisis coming in and assessed by local office)
- Vandalism to Kiwassa office likely due to displaced Hastings folks who were camping on the disability ramp over the long weekend. Clients with mobility needs are being diverted to Strathcona office (pic attached)
- No activity or concerns reported from community partners
- Staff will be on standby for as needed decampment supports but will return to partnerships for CI work
- Critical incident debriefing scheduled for Thursday, April 13

Good afternoon,

Below are the updates provided by the team:

- Teams of CISp were both on Hastings and in Crab Park today, as well as out in other areas. In total the teams connected with another 25 individuals by 230. Our total connection tally since the decampment is 401.
- Individuals are still setting tents up on Hastings (<10 between Columbia and Carrall). We are also seeing an increase of folks setting their tents up in alleys – see photo.
- The team also visited Vanier Park, as the media has been focusing on the “encampment” there, however we could not locate and assume they are deeper in the forest.
- Jason, the self-identified spokesperson/leader for crab disclosed that they have seen ~5 new tents. The residents not wanting to engage with the CISp and stayed in their tents, common for this encampment.
 - While in Crab we identified another individual not connected to IA and are connecting this afternoon to complete it. Our total intake tally is at 4.
- Another 2 crisis requests were processed for food. Our tally since the decampment in the field is 40, however it is difficult to say this is all of the need related to the decampment as folks would have accessed the office and possibly the phones and MySelfServe.
- We handed out backpack items (snacks, rain ponchos, hand and foot warmers) again, pretty indiscriminately - no tracking of how much of what and to whom. This as been very well received by folks and is making a huge difference in our ability to build relationships.
- We are seeing/hearing increased anger from the displaced individuals; however, this has not been directed towards the staff.
- The staff are doing well emotionally. However, we suspect that this is/will affect them in a variety of ways and have scheduled a Critical Incident Debrief as a group for Thursday; we have also been confirming daily that they leave with the 24 hr phone number to the Employee and Family Assistance Program.

No further updates are planned for today. Our next update will be in the morning tomorrow.

Health Services Impact Post Decampment Operations – VCH Brief Summary

- Overall, we did not see a significant disruption to health care services offered through the 11 store front programs or to home based services. The two exceptions were to outreach supports to people living in the encampment on Hastings and overdose prevention programs on the first day of the police operation.
- Due to the nature of the Decampment operation, VCH was not able to track clients who were displaced.
 - VCH Car87 and the Intensive Housing Outreach Team (IHOT) were on standby near to decampment operation to provide urgent health supports as referred by VPD/CoV during their operation.
 - Standby Health services were available during formal operations and subsequently throughout the long weekend. Overall there were two calls for urgent services between April 5th and April 10th inclusive.
- ‘Storefront’ overdose prevention services (OPS) saw reduced traffic on Wed April 5th, and closer to normal levels Thurs April 6th.
- Outreach teams providing **essential** services during formal decampment operations included Car87, IHOT, Regional Overdose Outreach Team (OOT), Priority Populations Outreach Team, STOP HIV/AIDS Outreach, and Primary Care outreach services.
- Car87 continued to offer regular outreach service to the DTES together with standby health services as needed during the long weekend. As noted, only 2 calls for service came from the impacted blocks, and 7 calls overall from the DTES to Car87 over the long weekend.
- Approximately 40 people that were being regularly outreached on Hastings, could not be located on April 6th. Teams will be back out to look for these clients on the week of April 11th.
- Essential Home Health/Home Support appointments for people living in buildings on impacted blocks of Hastings were briefly delayed during 1st day of decampment but otherwise occurred without issue through the weekend.
- The Molson OPS Clinic space at Main and Hastings, which provides episodic primary care at a clinic on Hastings twice a week, continued with their regular clinic on April 6th. Volumes were similar to previous weeks.
- Bookings to bed based detox services doubled on April 5th and returned to near normal levels Thurs April 6th.
- Validated overdose data is not yet available for the period of April 5th to 10th, 2023 but can be provided as soon as available.
- OPS site leads deployed street and alley patrols over the long weekend to enhance overdose prevention services.

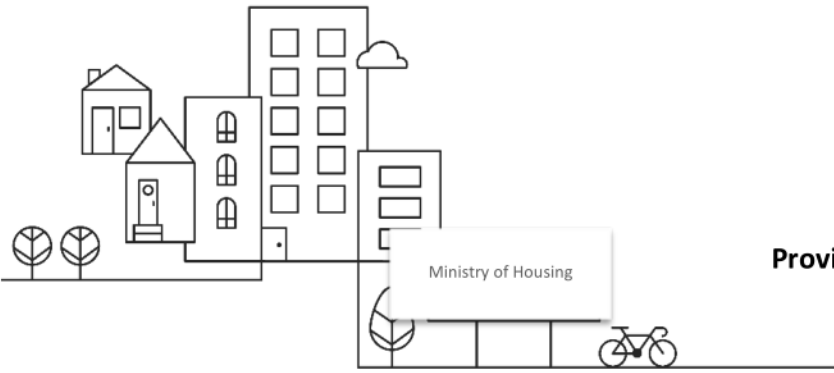

ISSUE: Tents and Propane in Downtown Eastside

BACKGROUND:

The Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction (SDPR) provides clients with monthly Support and Shelter allowance payments. Monthly checks were issued on March 22, 2023. Single income assistance (IA) and persons with a disability (PWD) clients receive Support allowances of \$560.00 and \$983.50 respectively. IA and PWD clients monthly shelter allowance is based on their actual shelter costs for a place of residence, up to the maximum shelter allowance for the family unit size (e.g. \$375 for a single). Place of residence refers to the place where the family unit currently lives and includes, but is not limited to, living in a house, apartment, tent, vehicle, recreational vehicle, or boat.

When calculating the actual shelter costs of an eligible family unit, the regulation provides authority for the following costs:

- rent;
- mortgage payments, house insurance premiums, property taxes, and with the minister's prior approval, the actual cost of maintenance and repairs when a family unit owns their place of residence; and
- any of the following utility costs:
 - fuel for cooking or heating;
 - water;
 - hydro;
 - garbage disposal provided by a company on a regular weekly or bi-weekly basis; and
 - rental of one basic residential single-line telephone.

When a client is homeless, their place of residence is anywhere they are residing at that time (e.g., tent) and they are eligible for the higher of:

- the minimum shelter allowance (\$75 for a single person); or
- their actual shelter costs (e.g., fuel for cooking and heating), which is often used for the cost of propane to fuel stoves or heaters.

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Updated:

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MINISTRY OF SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT AND POVERTY REDUCTION INFORMATION NOTE

The shelter allowance does not allow for purchase of tents, but since tents are owned by the client, the ministry can provide for the costs of maintenance and repairs.

Crisis supplements are available to clients:

- who have no other resources available to pay for an unexpected expense or item of need, and
- if the expense or item is necessary to address an imminent danger to the physical health of a person in the family unit, or to prevent the risk of removal of a child.

Crisis supplements are provided for any expense or item, other than healthcare goods or services, including food, shelter, utilities, clothing, furniture, home repairs, household items, and transportation.

Crisis supplements for shelter or utility costs are assessed based on the same definition of shelter costs used when determining the shelter allowance.

DISCUSSION:

While the ministry does not generally fund tents as they are not an allowable shelter cost, crisis supplement regulation does not restrict funds for a tent if a client has no other resources and the tent is necessary to avoid an imminent danger to a client's physical health. Alternatively, clients may request a crisis supplement for food or utilities if their unexpected item of need was a new tent.

The following table shows the number of crisis supplements by type in the Downtown Eastside (DTES) in the past eight weeks, provided by all sources (i.e. offices, contact centres, etc.):

This data shows that crisis supplement requests follow a consistent pattern. Specifically, the number of requests decrease the week of and the week after cheque issue, and the number of requests increase the week or two prior to cheque issue.

Between April 5-7, the three physical DTES offices (Kiwassa, Dockside, and Strathcona) received a total of 65 crisis supplement requests, of which the vast majority were for food

or clothing. This is relatively comparable to what the ministry would expect to receive for this point in the month.

- Kiwassa: 13 requests (1 for shelter; the majority for food)
- Dockside: 13 requests (20% clothing, the majority for food)
- Strathcona: 39 requests (20% clothing, the majority for food)

Overall, the ministry has not seen any significant changes in crisis requests since the DTES de-encampment activities were initiated by City of Vancouver on April 5, 2023.

CONCLUSION:

The ministry provides shelter allowance and crisis supplements based on regulatory criteria, which allows for the provision of funding for fuel for cooking and heating, such as propane. Tents are not generally an allowable item, but crisis supplements can be issued to any client who requires an unexpected item to avoid an imminent threat to their physical health.

Overall, the ministry has not seen an increase in requests by clients related to tents and propane in the DTES since de-encampment activities began.

- 7 tents between Main & Columbia, 4 tents between Columbia and Carrall, handful of rolling structures with city provided storage bins on the side streets
- City crews and VPD actively removing tents and structures on Hastings St
- 2 CIS attended Hastings and connected with 10 new individuals
- 6 crisis supplements for food/clothing issued
- 1 new intake identified and completed
- Snacks, juice boxes and supplies handed out

Crab Park

- 2 CIS attended Crab Park and connected with 9 individuals
- 2 new tents in Crab Park since yesterday
- 3/10 folks are housed (1 in New West and 2 at Hazelwood Hotel); stated they feel safer outside
- 1 crisis food supplement issued
- Many folks did not come out of their tents this morning
- Cheque delivered to client who was identified as a new intake yesterday; he asked CIS to visit him throughout the week to check on him

DTES Offices

- 4 requests for tents due to the decampment received at the Main & Powell offices – will be assessed by CIS
- The disability ramp at the Kiwassa office sustained additional damage today by a client who was removing bricks and smashing them on the ground
- The ramp remains closed to the public however clients continue to use it as an area of refuge overnight

A short story from one of the connections made by Lyndsay and Sultan today:

We met a man just outside of Crab Park this AM (says his name is Joe Inch) and he is currently housed at the Hazelwood Hotel. He is in his 50's. He said that he gave his room to a girl because she was more in need. He states that he would rather live outside because of the conditions and the multiple drug dealers living in the hotel and he finds it hard to stay sober or feel safe. He states that everything there has weapons. He doesn't seem too interested in detox/ treatment at this time. He spoke about getting out of DTES and getting his job back at Seaspan. He didn't get into details around why he ended up in the DTES but he did say that since he's been down there a lot has changed. He says its more dangerous than ever and even he doesn't feel safe. When we connected with him he was actively using and apologized profusely but we told him that we hold no judgement and just wanted to help support him. When we left he yelled down the street "anytime you see me say hi, remember my name is Joe Inch"

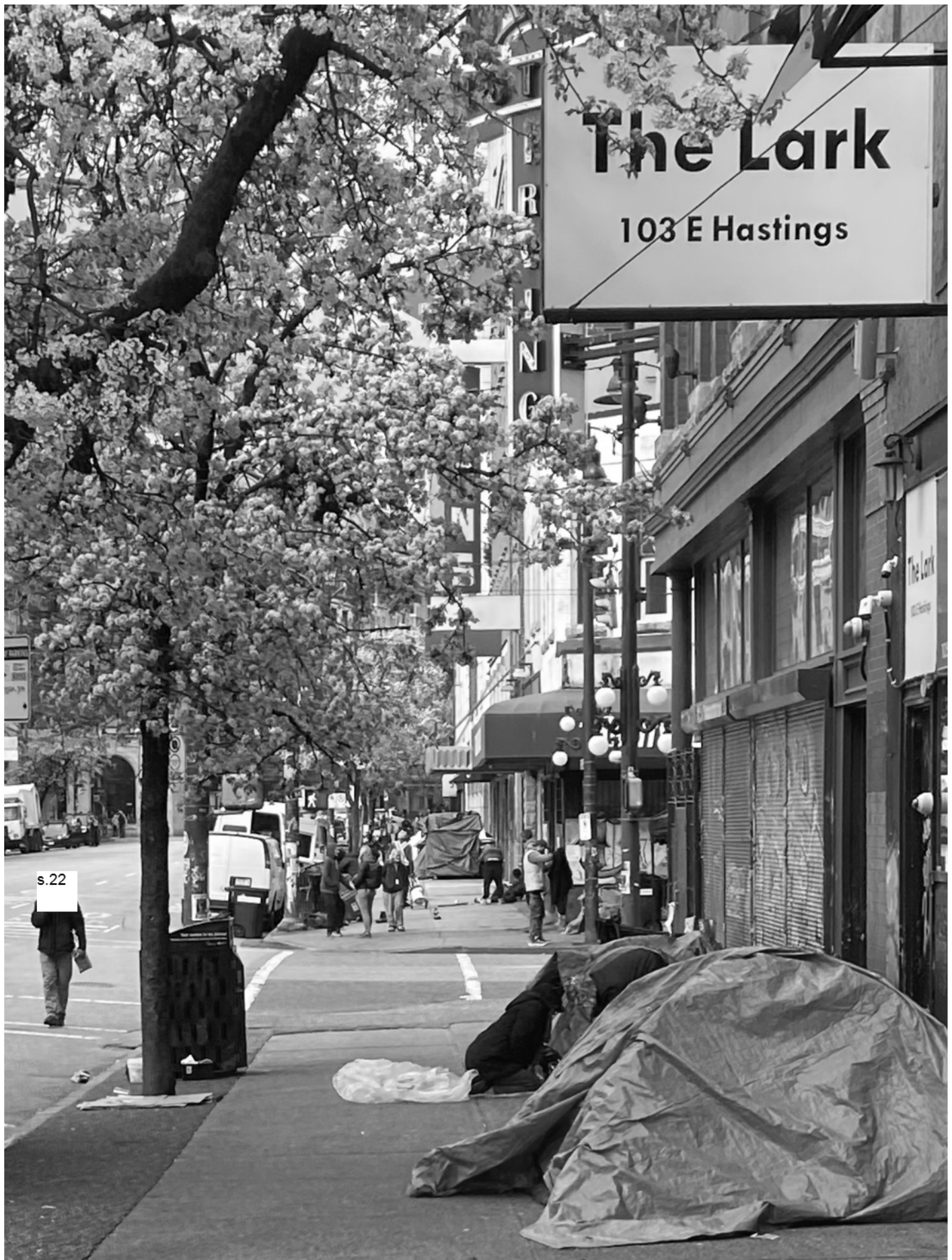

Crisis supplement

59 (1) The minister may provide a crisis supplement to or for a family unit that is eligible for income assistance or hardship assistance if*

(a) the family unit or a person in the family unit requires the supplement to meet an unexpected expense or obtain an item unexpectedly needed and is unable to meet the expense or obtain the item because there are no resources available to the family unit, and

(b) the minister considers that failure to meet the expense or obtain the item will result in

(i) imminent danger to the physical health of any person in the family unit, or

(ii) removal of a child under the Child, Family and Community Service Act.

"If" sets up a condition that in the event that the criteria coming after are met, then the minister's obligation is to provide the crisis supplement. In other words, the minister would not have the discretion to deny the crisis supplement.

Evidently word is out that SDPR is issuing replacement tent. CIS attending Hastings and Crab Park have been approached by clients asking for tents. The 3 DTES offices also have an influx of clients coming in and requesting replacement tents. We have also received requests at community partner offices (Carnegie and DCC).

The majority of the requests are coming in at the local offices and then deferred to the CIS team to action.

Since the decampment, we have issued 32 replacement tents. Some of these have been under furniture (code 78) as that is how the DTES historically processed these requests. The remainder of the requests have been issued under crisis shelter.

We ran our latest data and we are not seeing anything out of the ordinary, but as many of you have said it may be too early for the address information to be updated in MIS. This means we will have to wait until next month's cheque run to get more current data (we'll look in ICM to see if there is something more current we can use – if so we can pull it but that will take us a while). Anyway, as of last Friday here is the data on cases that were in the DTES and are now (May 2023 cheque) appearing elsewhere. As is usual most cases in the DTES that move do so to other parts of Vancouver. These are the top 20 – there are about 45 more records but are mainly 1s and 2s.

Housing – High level

- Everyone in the Downtown Eastside deserves a safe, stable and supportive place to call home.
- We're working as quickly as possible with all of our partners to bring people living outside in the Downtown Eastside inside, but these are challenges that have grown over many years, due to colonization and systemic oppression. The key to our approach is bringing together everyone involved – all levels of government, Indigenous and community partners, health, social and housing supports.
- By working together, we are better able to coordinate services and improve access to housing and supports.
- Since 2018, the Province, through BC Housing, has opened more than 1,400 new supportive homes in Vancouver for people experiencing homelessness, with nearly 900 more underway. The Province has also opened more than 800 affordable rental homes in Vancouver since 2018, with more than 3,100 more underway.
- Over the past several months, the Province, through BC Housing, has worked with community and government partners to develop and implement a new coordinated response plan to support people experiencing homelessness in the Downtown Eastside.
- The plan focuses on helping people get off the streets and into homes to resolve encampments, and on strengthening health, social and cultural supports to make the Downtown Eastside a healthier, safer place for everyone. More information about the DTES response plan is available here:

- Through this plan, we've already helped 97 people from the 100 Block of East Hastings move into indoor spaces since last summer. We are also in the process of allocating renovated SRO units as they become available, including the 95 newly renovated SRO spaces at The Gastown, and have hundreds of more units with support services that will be available before the end of June. - Outreach workers are actively connecting with people sheltering outdoors on the Downtown Eastside to ensure they're aware of shelters, drop-in services, the Supportive Housing Registry and how to apply. Many people in shelters and staying on East Hastings already have active Supportive Housing Registry applications and will be offered units as they become available.
- The Downtown Eastside is ground zero for the housing crisis. It's a very challenging situation for people right now.
- There are shelter spaces available, and I'm grateful to outreach workers working to help connect people to shelter.
 - People who want a shelter bed can call or text 2-1-1 to find available beds.
- We're working closely with all partners, including the City – who is responsible for on the ground operational decisions - as we work to deliver housing for people.
 - We have roughly 100 units of housing opening each month for the next three months.
 - We are in the process of re-opening the Gastown - 95 units of freshly renovated SRO units, which will free up additional capacity in shelters.
 - We just purchased Chalmers to provide 100 more supportive homes this year, especially to seniors currently living in the Downtown Eastside.

Item of Discussion

This week has been particularly heavy for Lyndsay and Ocean. They both expressed concerns around burn out/vicarious trauma that is starting to be activating (witnessed 3 ODs). I've italicized Ocean's update above that speaks to their experience on Hastings. Cheque issue magnifies this as so many people on the streets were bordering on non-responsiveness due to the drugs. We heard from other outreach teams that majority of the dope in the DTES has high levels of tranquilizers, benzos and Fentanyl.

Ocean has proposed a bi-weekly trauma informed debrief session for the Vancouver team. They are interested in leading this to hold space for their colleagues, share their experiences and best practices in terms of managing stress.

Also, onboarding our 3 internal hires (EAWs) to the DTES team ASAP will help to alleviate the workload pressure as it will build capacity for street outreach team.

ISSUE: Overview of the Downtown Eastside Provincial Partnership Plan

BACKGROUND:

The Downtown Eastside (DTES) Provincial Partnership Plan is led by the Ministry of Housing. It's vision is for a "healthier, hopeful, and safer DTES – where people of all walks of life can access housing and the wraparound supports they need to establish a positive community and thrive together". It supports the 2022 provincial mandate to the Minister of Housing, with support from the Ministers of Mental Health and Addictions, Social Development and Poverty Reduction and Public Safety and Solicitor General, to better coordinate services to deliver improved outcomes for people living in Vancouver's DTES.

The plan follows a 'housing first' approach by ensuring housing is accompanied by integrated supports that meet the person's needs and aims to address the immediate health and safety issues of DTES and encampments. It lays the groundwork to support the prevention of future encampments and improve the community for all residents and visitors. The plan includes support for people sheltering along Hastings St, in Crab Park and in other areas to stay safe, healthy, and connected to indoor spaces and housing. Supports and services will be modeled on the Integrated Supports Framework.

GOALS:

The Province commits to working in partnership with BC Housing, City of Vancouver, Vancouver Board of Parks and Recreation, Federal government, Musqueam, Squamish Tsleil-Waututh (MST) governments, Indigenous and community partners to achieve the goals laid out in the plan. The goals of the plan are:

1. **Engaged Community:** clear, coordinated and regular communication with people sheltering outdoors in DTES, MST communities, Indigenous partners, advocates and community members to reduce fears, encourage engagement and bring together the community in support of the most vulnerable.
2. **Safe Communities:** transition the DTES back to a safe and manageable area where all community members can thrive.
3. **Integrated Health and Social Services:** help people sheltering outdoors, and in shelters, with coordinated transition to indoor spaces and housing and provide

access to integrated health, social and community services, pre-employment and employment services, across Metro Vancouver communities.

4. **Accessible Shelter & Housing Options:** Coordinated access to a range of interim and permanent housing options to meet people's needs. This includes:

Integrating Health and Social Services will involve implementing a multidisciplinary team dedicated to serving individuals in the DTES. Community Integration Specialists will make up part of this team, along with representation from the City of Vancouver, BC Housing, Vancouver Coastal Health, Indigenous governments and organizations, peers and community service providers. This team will coordinate outreach and assessments so that individuals in need can connect with a single contact and won't be required to share traumatizing stories repeatedly – every door will be the right door. The expansion of Community Integration Specialist services will further assist in this goal by supporting individuals with intake assessments, housing and health referrals, low-barrier employment opportunities, family reunification benefits, assistance with obtaining identification and fire safety education. Additionally, SDPR will be able to provide enhanced crisis supplements for food and clothing.

SDPR's role in regard to Accessible Shelter & Housing Options will involve family reunification. Requests for family and community reunification may be supported through transportation and travel assistance supplements.

What's Next

The Ministry of Housing is developing a Provincial Encampment Framework with partners to respond to and address unsafe encampments with a Housing First and person-centered approach to achieve the following:

- Housing loss prevention, and a shelter diversion plan where indoor options are pathways to permanent housing
- Increased funding and support for Indigenous and community-led programs and housing

ISSUE: Overview of the Downtown Eastside Provincial Partnership Plan

BACKGROUND:

The Province has been working with a variety of partners – including all orders of government, service providers and Indigenous and community organizations – to develop and implement a comprehensive Downtown Eastside (DTES) response plan. Lead by the Ministry of Housing, the Plan works to support better coordinate services from the ministries of Housing, Health, Mental Health and Addictions, Public Safety and Solicitor General, and Social Development and Poverty Reduction to deliver improved outcomes for people living in the DTES.

The Plan recognizes that people are better able to access supports when they have safe, stable shelter and their basic needs are met. The Plan respects people's human rights and agency, while protecting their health and safety and minimizing disruption. It also takes an anti-racist, trauma-informed and culturally safe approach, including recognizing the unique history and culture of the DTES.

DISCUSSION:

The plan follows a 'housing first' approach by ensuring housing is accompanied by integrated supports that meet the person's needs and aims to address the immediate health and safety issues of DTES and encampments. It lays the groundwork to support the prevention of future encampments and improve the community for all residents and visitors. The plan includes support for people sheltering along Hastings St, in Crab Park and in other areas to stay safe, healthy, and connected to indoor spaces and housing. Supports and services will be modeled on the Integrated Supports Framework (ISF).

The Plan outlines five goals:

1. *Engaged Community*: clear, coordinated, and regular communication with people sheltering outdoors in DTES to reduce fears, encourage engagement and bring together the community in support of the most vulnerable.
2. *Safe Communities*: transition the DTES back to a safe and manageable area where all community members can thrive.
3. *Integrated Health and Social Services*: help people sheltering outdoors, and in shelters, with coordinated transition to indoor spaces and housing and provide

access to integrated health, social and community services, pre-employment, and employment services, across Metro Vancouver communities.

4. *Accessible Shelter & Housing Options*: Coordinated access to a range of interim and permanent housing options to meet people's needs.

SDPR Involvement

Community Integration Specialists will be part of the Integrated Health and Social Services teams dedicated to the DTES. The team will coordinate outreach and assessments so that individuals in need can connect with a single contact and won't be required to share traumatizing stories repeatedly.

Community Integration Specialists will also support individuals with intake assessments, housing and health referrals, low-barrier employment opportunities, family reunification benefits, assistance with obtaining identification and fire safety education.

Community Integration Specialists will provide enhanced crisis supplements for food and clothing, as well as assist in family and community reunification through transportation and travel assistance supplements.

Community Integration Services staff have developed the Backpack Program to help meet an individual's basic needs during interactions. Community Integration Specialists observed that when individuals are provided with items such as soft food, meal replacement drinks, juice, socks, gloves, hand warmers, rain ponchos, hygiene kits, and mini first aid kits, they were able to build positive relationships and deliver much needed services that had previously been refused. The annual budget for the Backpack Program is estimated at approximately \$60K.

The Office of the Fire Commissioner, the ministries of Housing, SDPR, and Health, and BC Housing recommended creating and distributing Fire Suppression Kits (Kits) to vulnerable populations and to encampments. The Kits include fire safety supplies and education materials to individuals sheltering outdoors, including: The Kits include fire extinguishers and fire-resistant tarps, carbon monoxide monitors, hand and foot warmers, as well as LED lanterns to reduce use of lighters, candles and fires. The Kits are being distributed in priority areas by the Community Integration Specialists and have been well received by individuals to date. The budget for the Kits is \$100k.

April 2023 Decampment

In April 2023, the City of Vancouver began removing an encampment along Hastings Street. The decampment took place before BC Housing 330 new housing units could be brought online.

CONCLUSION:

SDPR plays a critical supporting role in the implementation of the Plan. A new Community Connections Hub at Orange Hall (341 Gore Ave.) will be established so people have a centralized place to access referrals and information about housing and services.

SDPR will be establishing a Memorandum of Understanding with BC Housing on what role the Community Integration Specialists will play at Orange Hall in Summer 2023.
