#### RE: Eagle Mountain - Woodfibre Gas Pipeline Project (the "Project")

We understand that the Environmental Assessment Office will soon be referring to you its recommendation on whether the Project should be issued an Environmental Assessment Certificate.

In making your decision you will need to consider whether the Province's duty to consult and accommodate the Squamish Nation has been discharged. The Squamish Nation has not concluded any discussions with the Province regarding its aboriginal rights and title related to this Project. We also note that the Squamish Nation and the Province have not come to agreement on the conditions the Province is responsible for under the Squamish Process or for any accommodation of the Squamish Nation's rights and title. Therefore, we find that any decision on the Province's obligations to consult and accommodate the Squamish Nation on the Project premature.
