- BC has supported the s.16 proposal for the reclassification of LNG plants as manufacturing and processing facilities in the 2015 federal budget. This reclassification would address the asset depreciation period for corporate income tax purposes and make Canadian LNG facilities more competitive by reducing corporate tax payable during the early years of a facility's operation.
