Dear Premier:

Re: **UBC Seismic Risk Assessment**

We understand that the Ministry of Advanced Education, Innovation & Technology plans to embark on a system-wide seismic assessment program starting in 2013/14 for at-risk BC post-secondary institutions. We are pleased that the Province is taking action on this critical issue for our students and campus communities.

UBC recently completed an initial seismic risk assessment of buildings on its Vancouver campus. This assessment, conducted by external structural engineering consultants (JM Engineering in partnership with Glotman Simpson), identified 25 buildings as Very High Risk and 12 buildings as High Risk, out of a total inventory of 400 buildings. Very High Risk and High Risk ratings indicate buildings that will experience full or partial collapse or partial localized collapse during a moderate seismic event or higher, with probable loss of life.

The estimated cost to structurally upgrade these buildings to enhance life safety is approximately \$137 million. The existing deferred maintenance backlog in the identified buildings is an additional \$270 million. UBC has developed an initial plan to address seismic deficiencies in the highest priority buildings using \$2.5 million in annual insurance premium savings achieved by transferring its insurance coverage from the Canadian Universities Reciprocal Insurance Exchange (CURIE) to the Province's University, College and Institute Protection Program (UCIPP).

The scope of this initial plan is unfortunately limited by the relatively small amount of capital available through insurance savings. We therefore wish to discuss with you, at the earliest possible date, the potential for a collaborative solution with the Province to address this critical issue. The jointly-funded UBC Renew program, which successfully upgraded 12 UBC academic buildings between 2004 and 2011, offers an excellent example of the type of strategy that could be employed moving forward to address both seismic risk and deferred maintenance deficiencies.

We recognize that this is a significant, system-wide issue with no easy funding fix and so will take time to fully address. However, as stewards of public assets used by thousands of British Columbians, UBC and the Province share a mutual obligation to develop a timely and effective solution for this critical seismic risk issue.


The day's agenda has been designed to provide an opportunity to examine our second generation research in more depth. A series of keynote addresses will explore three exciting new research streams:


