We hope this letter finds you well! It is with great pleasure that we share with you Free The Children's annual report for 2012, enclosed. As we near the end of the school year we look back on some incredible moments; moments that would not have been possible without your support and belief in the work that we do. We are excited to be able to share just some of the impacts and milestones that have been reached over the past year.

The world is changing every day. As an organization, we are continually evolving, adapting and growing. In 2012, we saw our first-ever U.S. We Day, our return to the CBS program 60 Minutes, and some incredible examples of what can be accomplished in 365 days of action.

As an organization committed to long-term sustainability, water was our Adopt a Village pillar of focus in 2012. Last year the global water crisis alone affected 780 million people around the world. We know that without access to clean water projects, girls must typically walk far distances to collect water for their families, missing school in the process. We launched an initiative to bring clean water and sanitation projects to 100,000 people in communities around the world, most importantly, so girls would be free of this tedious chore and able to bring clean water home from the community well after their days in school.

This initiative motivated and touched people across North America. Spencer West, a double amputee, lent his support by climbing Mt. Kilimanjaro in June to bring awareness to the struggle that communities face to attain clean water. His climb was incredibly successful and gained worldwide media attention for this important issue.

Moreover, young people in North America lent their voice as thousands of them collected pennies to support clean water projects. Through the We Create Change campaign it became clear that no matter how small the actions, they can add up to have a significant impact. It exemplified to youth that anyone can make a difference.

This volume of response also further showed just how dynamic the power of "we" can be. Together with the incredible partners and individuals that have taken part along the way, we have been able to implement sustainable solutions that have brought clean water access to families around the world; solutions that will improve community resources for generations and help empower children both at home and abroad along the way.

This report offers a snapshot of 2012 for Free The Children—the story of millions of youth and adults who are committed to living "we" year-round. It is an ongoing story, an ongoing movement for change, and we are, as always, so grateful to have you with us on this journey.




Upcoming Spring Campaigns




Revelstoke Secondary School
