They must be convinced of this. And one more step forward, they must go into a public private partnership with the government. Assume that we target a hundred wealthy immigrants. The government creates new housing and convinces the new immigrants to buy into this new housing. of course there are options that the government must present in terms of locations and type of new housing. we must leave existing housing for those who are already here. And the government must also create affordable housing for them to. If there are thousand families who fall under a certain revenue criteria the government could present various options of types and locations and then sell it to a group of families.
- we must make it easier for professionals to enter the job market; instead of having people work at menial jobs, we must give them incentives such as a loan to get their qualifications up to par with Canadian standards. they would sign an agreement such that after their qualifications are upgraded the would pay off their loans. They move on to citizenship status after their loans are paid; and they are only only allowed to leave the country after some years working in Canada. ie make the process secure such that people leave right after they have their Canadian qualifications

3. As I have written before, the provincial and federal government must encourage the Indigenous Organizations to build Community Centers in one major city in each province. The Indigenous Organization should close all schools above elementary. Those students must move to the city and live at the Community Center. They would attend middle and high schools in the city which are better equipped in all aspects; sport, education, laboratories, science, technology, arts. The Community Centers would be run by Professional Indigenous Staff well capable in disseminating and preserving culture. During vacation time, the students would visit their parents to continue their cultural traditions.

The Indigenous Organizations must run their land, resources and communities as a business in all aspects. This will enable them to survive for years to come. They must be in a position to work with the governments and private businesses and form partnerships. They could charge rent, share the profits, sign clauses for capacity building and training all the while ensuring that there are clauses protecting their land from pollution. they could be part of the board of directors. And by involving themselves in the running of business, they will realize their future needs with reference to human resources. they will know what professions are required, will be required within their communities and coach,mentor the students accordingly.

4. Now let us address the issues of education. I am of the firm belief that the provincial and federal government stop supporting private religious schools, colleges and universities. Religious education is the responsibility of each Faith Community within their homes and houses of worship. The social sciences offered from K-University must include the mention of all Faiths and Ideologies.
