The Commonwealth Games Federation, which decides who wins the 2022 Games, is visiting us on August 8^{th} and 9^{th} . We don't have our Village and venue plans fleshed out just yet and we must convince them that we will be able to get everything in place and on time. One of the key issues is BC support.

The perfect thing to do would be to have them meet you or the Deputy Premier. We have the business plan almost done and you will love it. Is there any chance we could discuss it with you prior to the 8th and then organise a quick get together for you to meet the CGF reps and tell them you are in favour of hosting the Games here? A general statement on your part at this time would be sufficient because they will understand your government hasn't had a chance to review everything properly.

I hear that you and the Prime Minister are going to Williams Lake, \$.22 It would be great if you could discuss this Games opportunity for a minute and mutually agree to back it. I haven't heard back yet from the federal Sport Minister Carla Qualtrough but I know they are in support generally.

Andrew Weaver and Adam Olsen have agreed to meet the CGF reps and tell them we have their support. The advantages for Victoria are immense, as listed below.
