ISSUE: Amazon's HQ2 project and the City of Langford's proposal

BACKGROUND:

- Amazon's request for proposals toward a second headquarters (HQ) somewhere in North America was released September 7 with proposals due October 19.
- Named "HQ2", this second HQ anticipates hiring up to 50,000 high-paying jobs and USD\$5 billion in investment over the next fifteen years
- Amazon received 238 proposals from cities and regions across North America vying to host the company's HQ2
- Securing this investment in British Columbia would greatly benefit our communities, the BC tech sector, and British Columbians who work in related industries and surrounding regions
- Both Metro Vancouver and the City of Langford prepared and submitted proposals
- The City of Langford submitted their proposal successfully by the October 19 deadline and Amazon has confirmed receipt

CONCLUSION:

- BC government contributed \$15,000 to help the City of Langford prepare its bid.
- Out of respect for the RFP process, the City of Langford does not have immediate plans to release their full submission until a decision has been made by Amazon.
- Amazon intends to announce its final site selection and successful candidate sometime in 2018

BC Government believes that BC has a real chance of being the successful candidate to host HQ2.

- BC has a diverse and burgeoning technology sector that continues to see unprecedented growth and has an exceptional amount of competitive advantages that sets us apart from other North American jurisdictions.
- Tech companies such as Amazon can benefit from our government's prioritization of the tech sector.
- In addition, our province also offers:

Appendix 1

Background on Amazon in BC:

- Founded in 1994, Amazon.com, Inc. (Amazon) is a Seattle based e-commerce and cloud computing company that is the largest internet-based retailer in the world by total sales and market capitalization. Amazon has over 341,400 employees and had 2016 gross revenue of \$US136 billion with a net income of \$US4.2 billion.
- Amazon has a sizable presence in British Columbia.
- In 2014, Amazon Web Services (AWS) established a technology development and cloud computing facility in Vancouver to support AWS. 1,000 workers currently work at this facility located across several floors at the Telus Garden building in downtown Vancouver. The facility has 350 job postings at the moment. More space is planned elsewhere in the downtown core.
- In 2012, Amazon Canada Fulfillment Services (ACFS) opened a retail fulfillment centre in Delta, BC. This was the company's first fulfillment centre east of Ontario. Since then, ACFS have opened an additional centre in New Westminister. Both facilities have a combined 300-600 seasonal and full time staff.
- BC government and BC's US Trade and Investment Representative Office assisted Amazon in their decision to open the fulfillment centres and during the site selection process and planning for staff.
- BC government has also assisted with labor and immigration challenges as AWS Vancouver strived to attract and retain senior talent from international markets.
