Statement from Premier John Horgan on Transgender Day of Remembrance

VICTORIA - Premier John Horgan has issued the following statement to mark the Transgender Day of Remembrance:

"Each year on November 20, we honour the memory of transgender people who have been killed in acts of transphobic violence.

"Transgender people are increasingly visible in our communities. They are our neighbours, our friends, our family. A growing number of transgender people are speaking out, running for elected office and fighting to be recognized without prejudice. Yet when doing so, many put their safety at risk. Transgender people going about their daily lives are often subject to hateful crimes.

"We denounce these violent acts, and we stand with transgender, gender-diverse and twospirited communities in support of their right to be who they are.

"I am proud that British Columbia prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender identity and gender expression. British Columbia gives transgender people explicit protections under the Province's Human Rights Code.

"A person's identity can never be erased. Today and always, we remember those we have lost. Together, we will build a more just and inclusive province."



New management plan to be developed for grizzly bears

VICTORIA - In response to an auditor general's report on the management of grizzly bear populations over the past two decades, the B.C. government will develop a provincial grizzly bear management plan with clear objectives, roles, responsibilities and accountabilities.

The government is accepting all 10 recommendations in the report, which identified historic gaps in the management of grizzly bears. The Province will work with First Nations, natural resource industries, stakeholders and the public in implementing the auditor general's recommendations.

In August 2017, government announced that it will end grizzly bear trophy hunting throughout the province and stop all hunting of grizzlies in the Great Bear Rainforest, at the end of November.

At the same time, government announced that it will begin consulting on a renewed wildlife management strategy for the province. The auditor general's report will help to shape and form that strategy to develop short- and long-term plans for wildlife resources and protect habitat for all wildlife.

"As a new government, we agree that more needs to be done for this iconic species and to improve wildlife management overall in British Columbia, but we know that grizzly bears remain in 90% of their historic range. We look forward to implementing the auditor general's recommendations."

George Heyman, Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy -

"We will build a robust plan to manage and protect this vital species by applying more conservation resources where they are needed - in the most effective manner. A strong, clear and proactive management plan will help to ensure that grizzly bear populations will thrive in this province. We also look forward to working with all interested British Columbians to develop long-overdue Species at Risk legislation for our province."

#### BACKGROUNDER

Response to auditor general's report on grizzly bear management

Recommendation 1: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations\* and the Ministry of Environment\* create and implement a grizzly bear management plan that includes:

- \* Clear indication of how the plan fits into the ministries' overall wildlife management planning (where is it in the priority);
- \* Clear goals and targets;
- \* Prioritized activities and timelines, including accountabilities for those activities; and
- \* Resources and expertise required to undertake the activities in the plan.

Response: The ministries will work together to complete a provincial grizzly bear management plan to guide the development of area-based management plans where they are needed.

The Province is also committed to a collaborative process with First Nations, stakeholders and the public to improving wildlife management and habitat conservation for all species.

Recommendation 2: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and the Ministry of Environment develop and implement an adequately resourced inventory and monitoring strategy for grizzly bears.

Response: The ministries will prepare a B.C. grizzly bear inventory and monitoring strategy. To

support the resourcing of identified priorities, government is exploring options for dedicated funding for wildlife and habitat conservation.

Recommendation 3: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations revise its policy and procedures to determine how uncertainty will be accounted for when determining grizzly bear-hunt allocations and to be transparent about the process.

Response: The Grizzly Bear Harvest Management Procedure will be modified to address uncertainty explicitly, and guidance for reporting uncertainties in population estimates will be developed. This will be done so it aligns with the Province's broader objective to improve wildlife management and habitat conservation in the province.

Effective Nov. 30, 2017, the grizzly bear hunt will end in the Great Bear Rainforest and a ban will be implemented on trophy hunting, while allowing food and First Nations hunting opportunities for grizzly bears in the remainder of the province.

Recommendation 4: The Ministry of Environment ensure the Conservation Officer Service has the appropriate resources and tools for preventing and responding to conflicts with grizzly bears.

Response: The Province is committed to greater investment in the Conservation Officer Service. The Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy will work closely with the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development to increase activities that aim to reduce human-bear conflicts and lethal methods of control.

Recommendation 5: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and the Ministry of Environment develop clear policies and procedures for bear viewing.

Response: In 2016, provincial government staff began meeting with the Commercial Bear Viewing Association of BC and other stakeholders to discuss concerns and opportunities with the bear-viewing industry. Government is committed to formalizing a collaborative process with First Nations, industry and stakeholders to develop clear policies and procedures for wildlife viewing in the interest of bear conservation and viability of bear-viewing businesses.

Recommendation 6: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and the Ministry of Environment identify those grizzly bear populations that are in need of recovery and outline what actions will be taken and when.

Response: Over a decade ago, the Province classified nine grizzly bear population units where populations were in decline or had the potential to become extirpated (locally extinct). Today, four population units (the Granby, South Selkirk, South Chilcotin and Squamish Lillooet) which have been the focus of research, monitoring and enhanced management have increasing grizzly bear numbers.

As part of the Provincial Grizzly Bear Management Plan, a formal process to prioritize specific populations for enhancement activities will be developed.

Recommendation 7: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and the Ministry of Environment evaluate and adjust as needed the tools used to mitigate industries' impacts on grizzly bear habitats.

Response: Government is committed to improving wildlife management and habitat conservation. The Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development is implementing new guidance to statutory decision makers and professionals to ensure enhanced consideration of wildlife values including grizzly bear.

As well, the Environmental Assessment Office (EAO) has monitoring requirements and conducts inspections on the conditions of certificates issued under the Environmental Assessment Act. The auditor general's recommendations will also be considered during revitalization of the environmental assessment process.

Recommendation 8: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and the Ministry of Environment evaluate and adjust as needed tools to conserve grizzly bear habitats.

Response: British Columbia has established management provisions for approximately 340,000 km2 (150,000 km2 of high quality) of grizzly bear habitat through establishment of designations under the Forest and Range Practices Act, Land Act, Parks Act and Great Bear Rainforest Land Use Order. The two ministries are currently evaluating these designations through the Forest and Range Evaluation Program and Cumulative Effects Framework assessments. The effectiveness review of these tools will continue and adjustments will be recommended as required.

Recommendation 9: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and the Ministry of Environment report out to the public and legislators on how well it is managing grizzly bear populations throughout British Columbia.

Response: Grizzly bears are already a key "Environmental Reporting B.C." value that the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy reports to the public about the status of grizzly bear populations in the province. The Province uses web-based tools, updated regularly, to report on key aspects of grizzly bear management. The Province will revise its provincial status assessment, web-based metrics and maps, and associated reporting pages as required, while reviewing the effectiveness of ongoing efforts in making the information available to the public and legislators.

Recommendation 10: Government review the legislation, policies and accountabilities for wildlife management and ensure that roles, responsibilities and accountabilities allow the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and the Ministry of Environment

to be fully effective in delivering grizzly bear management.

Response: Legislation, policy, and accountabilities for grizzly bear management span both ministries. The natural resource sector agencies have a governance structure and processes that foster collaboration and integration.

In addition, the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development and the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy will work together to review the roles, responsibilities and accountabilities for grizzly bear management and include them in the Provincial Grizzly Bear Management Plan. If changes are needed to ensure greater effectiveness in co-ordination, effectiveness and accountability they will be brought forward and considered.

Province to launch coastal ferry review in January

VICTORIA - In January 2018, the Province will begin a comprehensive review of the coastal ferry service in British Columbia to evaluate its performance in meeting the needs of ferry users and British Columbia's coastal communities.

This review will identify what improvements can be made to the existing model and the Coastal Ferry Services Contract to better serve the needs of ferry users and coastal communities.

Under the terms of reference, the review will:

- \* Examine whether the contracted ferry services are being provided for in a manner that supports the public interest.
- \* Consider what changes to the price cap and regulatory model would ensure the ferry system is working as efficiently and effectively as possible for all British Columbians, and, in particular, for the ferry users and communities who depend on this essential service.
- \* Identify opportunities and recommend actions to enhance ferry service delivery and/or reduce costs without impacting existing service.

The review will not consider bringing BC Ferries back into government. The review is expected to cost approximately \$250,000, inclusive of all fees for technical expertise, research and analysis under the terms of reference to support the review process.

The Province has appointed Blair Redlin, former deputy minister of transportation and former CEO of the BC Transportation Financing Authority, as a special adviser to oversee the review. Redlin will report to the

Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure, with a final report to be delivered to government by June 2018.

VICTORIA - Premier John Horgan and Minister of Labour Harry Bains have issued the following statement on the workplace fatalities in Fernie:

"Late yesterday afternoon, British Columbians were saddened to learn of three workplace fatalities in the community of Fernie. The circumstances surrounding the accident at the Fernie Memorial Arena are still under investigation and the community has declared a local state of emergency while HAZMAT teams address a suspected ammonia leak. WorkSafeBC, the BC Coroners Service and the Ministry of Environment are on scene.

"This is a tragic situation. Families and friends are grieving, and our hearts are with them. We send them our deepest condolences.

"We want to thank those who responded so quickly and valiantly, such as the Fernie Fire Department, Elk Valley RCMP and the BC Ambulance Service.

"Like every British Columbian, our thoughts are with the loved ones and the families of those involved and the entire close-knit community of Fernie.

"Neither workers nor their families should have to fear for their safety when they are on the job. Tragedies like this force us to underscore our commitment to ensure that B.C. families can rely on safe workplaces."

Statement from Premier John Horgan on Transgender Day of Remembrance

VICTORIA - Premier John Horgan has issued the following statement to mark the Transgender Day of Remembrance:

"Each year on November 20, we honour the memory of transgender people who have been killed in acts of transphobic violence.

"Transgender people are increasingly visible in our communities. They are our neighbours, our friends, our family. A growing number of transgender people are speaking out, running for elected office and fighting to be recognized without prejudice. Yet when doing so, many put their safety at risk. Transgender people going about their daily lives are often subject to hateful crimes.

"We denounce these violent acts, and we stand with transgender, gender-diverse and twospirited communities in support of their right to be who they are.

"I am proud that British Columbia prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender identity and gender expression. British Columbia gives transgender people explicit protections under the Province's Human Rights Code.

"A person's identity can never be erased. Today and always, we remember those we have lost. Together, we will build a more just and inclusive province."

## Did the B.C. Liberals gut B.C.'s climate action plan because of big money?

**VICTORIA -** New Freedom of Information documents reveal the Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers, whose members donated over \$3.6 million to the B.C. Liberals since 2011, received extensive secret backroom consultations on B.C.'s proposed Climate Action Plan.

"Was it \$3.6 million in donations to the B.C. Liberals that led to the backroom consultation and eventual gutting of the climate action plan?" asked Vancouver-West End MLA Spencer Chandra Herbert. "We may never get the truth from the B.C. Liberals on this, but this is precisely why our new government banned big money."

Back in 2015, the B.C. Liberal government commissioned a blue-ribbon panel of experts to make recommendations on a plan for climate action in British Columbia. The government then proceeded to ignore nearly every single one of the panel's 32 recommendations. Newly uncovered documents are suggesting a picture of how we got there.

A scan of donations dating back to 2011 shows producer and associate members of CAPP donated over \$3.6 million to the B.C. Liberals. This tally doesn't even include donations from subsidiaries or owners and CEO's.

The secret meetings, held in CAPP's Calgary boardrooms, occurred over a three-month period after the Climate Leadership Panel made its final recommendations in October and before the province's Climate Action Plan was announced in the spring.

"British Columbians deserve answers from the B.C. Liberals on the impact these

consultations had on the final policy, which almost entirely abandoned the panel's recommendations. With the way the B.C. Liberals did business, it's no surprise they are fighting our new government's proposal to bring in the strictest political finance laws in the country," said Chandra Herbert.

Ministries' management of grizzly bears did not meet expectations

VICTORIA - The Office of the Auditor General of British Columbia has released a new report, An Independent Audit of Grizzly Bear Management.

British Columbia is one of the last areas of North America where grizzly bears live in their natural habitat. The health of B.C.'s 15,000 grizzly bears is important because, as an umbrella species, they are an indicator of how well other species and ecosystems are doing.

"Grizzly bear populations in some areas of B.C. are increasing, but this is likely happening independently from an adequate management framework," said Auditor General Carol Bellringer.

The Ministry of Environment\* and the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations\* have long-standing public commitments for managing grizzly bears. Bellringer and her team found that the ministries have not fulfilled many of their commitments, including a grizzly bear management plan and the implementation of a recovery plan in the North Cascades. Also absent was an inventory and monitoring strategy of grizzly bears in B.C. and clear policies for bear viewing.

Bellringer's office did find that the greatest risk to grizzly bears is not the hunt. It is the degradation of grizzly bear habitat.

"The expansion of development in oil and gas, forestry and human settlement makes it more difficult for grizzly bears to mate, and results in food source loss, as well as more human-bear conflict," said Bellringer.

An increase in resource roads - 600,000 kilometres existing and more added every year - also leads to more human-bear conflict, and ultimately, grizzly bear deaths.

The Ministry of Environment and Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations have undertaken activities to reduce grizzly bear habitat degradation, but have not evaluated

whether their efforts are effective.

Bellringer has made 10 recommendations, including a recommendation for government to review legislation to clarify roles and responsibilities between the two ministries. This is because the ministries have overlapping responsibilities.

\* After the audit was complete, the Ministry of Environment became the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy and the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations became the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development.

# B.C. Liberal leadership hopeful Mike de Jong thinks people in B.C. won't remember his neglect on housing, education and child care

**VICTORIA** – B.C. Liberal leadership candidate Michael de Jong must think people in B.C. have forgotten 16 years of B.C. Liberal neglect on housing, childcare and education as he announces things he refused to deliver while he was the minister of finance.

Over the last week, de Jong said he would tackle child care and early education, address the cost of housing and look at foreign buyers of B.C. homes and the effect on the market.

"In 2014, when the New Democrats raised the alarm on the effect of foreign buyers on the
housing market, it was Mike de Jong himself who quickly responded, saying he wouldn't do
anything," said "Over the next two years - before they were forced to act - the
cost of an average home shot up \$600,000. People will remember that it was him and his government that refused to act, as homes were priced far beyond families' budgets."

#### \$200 thousand pre-election government grant to B.C. Liberal insiders raises serious questions

**VICTORIA -** While the B.C. Liberal government claimed before the election they had no money to help the province's most vulnerable people, they magically found \$200,000 to give to two B.C. Liberal insiders for an organization they registered only a few days earlier. New Democrat MLA for Delta North said the more he has looked into the grant, the more extraordinary it looks, and the more serious questions are raised.

"There are some very questionable things when it comes to this B.C. Liberal government grant to their friends," said Kahlon. "The grant came from a contingency fund just a month before the 2017 election to known B.C. Liberal insiders. They registered an organization on March 1, and by March 17, just 16 days later, they received a \$200,000 grant from the B.C. Liberal government.

"I've never heard of a case where an organization gets a massive government grant 16 days after existence."

Kahlon added, "I've also never heard of an instance where the B.C. Liberal government gave out a \$200,000 grant just before an election and didn't hold an event to draw attention to it. I haven't even been able to find a press release. That alone is extraordinary."

Radio stations in Metro Vancouver had documented ongoing rifts developing between B.C. Liberal insider Satnam Johal and the B.C. Liberal leadership as the election approached, primarily due to reports that Johal was kept out of the nomination process in at least one constituency. Johal and his close colleague Rajmohan Singh formed New Horizons Village Society on March 1, 2017. The Treasury Board approved a \$200,000 grant for them 16 days later, to be funded from contingencies.

"So far, I haven't been able to find much in the way of a business case or paper trail leading up to the

grant," said Kahlon. "I've seen a letter to Rich Coleman just before they formed the society, officially requesting the money. Mr. Coleman must have advanced the request at that point, despite the organization not even officially existing yet."

Kahlon noted that even today, the website for the organization only has a phone number on it and "Site and Development Coming Soon" placeholder text.

"It's like an empty shell of an organization. This grant doesn't pass the smell test, and I plan to look into it more," said Kahlon.

VICTORIA – An internal party document makes clear, that despite protestations to the contrary from Transportation Minister Claire Trevena, the BC NDP has long-planned to kill the Massey Tunnel.

"The minister has been trying to pretend the government is not leaving more than 80,000 commuters stranded in gridlock traffic twice a day," says Delta South MLA Ian Paton. "Now we have proof the NDP has been deliberately misleading British Columbians. The document is clear: 'We'll pay for this instead of replacing the Massey Tunnel – even if it is a safety risk.'

"It's so frustrating that the minister is doing a 'consultation dance' when they have no such intentions. Instead, she's throwing five years of work and any hope those commuters have of a quick trip into the garbage bin."

Earlier this month, Trevena announced plans to kill the Massey Bridge and admitted that would come at a cost of \$100 million. At the time, she suggested the government would consult on a future replacement.

"This document illustrates the NDP have no plans to fix the worst bottleneck in British Columbia," says Richmond-Queensborough MLA Jas

Johal. "These are people trying to get to work, kids to hockey practice and workers trying to move goods. And Claire Trevena has just told them – sorry, don't expect anything anytime soon."

The replacement bridge would save rush hour commuters up to 30 minutes, be seismically safe and move goods worth \$25 billion a year more efficiently.





# 16 days of activism against gender-based violence Nov. 25, 2017

#### **Background**

- Since 1991, thousands of organizations have recognized 16 days of activism against gender-based violence, and used these days to campaign for global change.
- The 16 days (Nov. 25 to Dec. 10) includes the following dates of note:
  - Nov 25: Intl. Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women
  - Dec 6: National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women
  - Dec 10: Human Rights Day
- The BC government has chosen the 16 days to launch its annual #SaySomething campaign, which encourages British Columbians to step up and speak out about sexual assault and intimate partner violence.

# **Key Messages -- General:**

- Women, transgender and non-binary people are speaking out about the profound impact that sexual assault, harassment and violence has had in their lives, and in the lives of loved ones.
- For every person who courageously steps forward, there are thousands more who suffer in silence.
- Domestic violence and sexual assault affects tens of thousands of women and children in B.C. each year.
- We must also remember those we have lost through violence, including hundreds of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls, who are disproportionately targeted.

- Our government will enhance supports for women and children escaping violence, and invest in education and prevention programs to stop genderbased violence.
- The fight to end gender-based violence cannot to fall survivors alone. Men must be allies and part of the solution.
- We want everyone in B.C. to feel safe and secure in their relationships, and in the place that they live --- to know they can speak out if something isn't right, and to know that support will be available, when and where they need it.
- Gender-based violence is the product of inequality. Our government is advancing gender equality by improving access to child care, reducing poverty, addressing housing affordability, and increasing the minimum wage. And for the first time in B.C. history we have a gender-equal Cabinet.

### **Key Messages -- 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence campaign:**

- The 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence campaign, aims to increase awareness about gender-based violence and encourage people to work together for change.
- The 16 days includes a number of important dates, including one we must never forget -- the National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women on December 6.
- Dec 6 marks the anniversary of the 1989 École Polytechnique massacre, where 14 students and staff were killed just because they were women.
- We want everyone in B.C. to feel safe and secure in their relationships and in the place that they live --- to know that they can speak out if something isn't right, and to know that support will be available, when and where they need it.
- We need to continue to work together to change the attitudes, behaviours and cultures that allow violence to happen.

- We are grateful to those who have the courage to speak out against violence every day, for the front line workers who support victims and help them heal, and for the work that community-based organizations do every day.
- Our government will enhance supports for women and children escaping violence, and invest in education and prevention programs to stop genderbased violence.

## **Key Messages -- #SaySomething:**

- We want British Columbians to speak up and say something to stop the violence. We're running the Say Something campaign to help prevent sexual assault, and to help victims.
- Say Something will reach out to young women, who are statistically at greater risk, and to adults under 30 in general, where we have the best chance to change the attitudes and behaviours behind sexual violence.
- Victims of sexual violence should know that help is available at any time through VictimLink BC – a free, multilingual crisis line. The number is: 1-800-563-0808.

#### **Key Messages -- Domestic Violence:**

- We know the devastating impact domestic violence, sexual assault and abuse has on women, children, families and communities.

Subject: Vaisakhi events in April 2018

#### Local Vaisakhi events in Surrey and Vancouver

The local MLA offices in Surrey and Vancouver will receive invitations from local community groups and organizations who are holding Vaisakhi events. The MLAs will arrange which ones to go to, depending on availability and time. There is not a lot of focus on these events as it is the main Surrey and Vancouver Vaisakhi Parades that are the major events at this time. These two events are always attended by the Premier and local MLAs and draw crowds of over 300,000 people and are extremely large and busy affairs. Not that the Opposition leader will also attend the event.

Typical rundown as follows for each event:

2018 - Vancouver Vaisakhi Parade April 14<sup>th</sup>

In 2018 the parade is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, April 14th, which is the first day of the Vaisakhi season this year.

The Surrey MLAs (Harry Bains office in particular) and Ravi Kahlon usually arrange the days program and the LO should coordinate with them.

The Vaisakhi parade takes place from 11 am to 4 pm, starting at the Ross Street Temple at 8000 Ross Street just off Marine Drive in South Vancouver.

The participating MLAs and the Premier usually meet at the White Spot restaurant on Marine Drive and walk to the Ross Street Temple to pay respects and meet with local temple dignitaries. They then walk down Main Street together along the Parade route

The Premier and MLAs do meet and greets with people and usually go on the stages of local radio stations (RED FM and KRPI etc.) and speak for a few minutes. They also speak at the stage for the Main Street Punjabi organizing committee before leaving the parade. Usually a local New Democrat MLA or MPs office will have a booth at both parades that the leader and the MLAs will stop in for a while.

Note crowds are huge and it gets very busy. In the past the walk with the leader and MLAs was very informal with no security. This may be changed now I imagine.

#### 2018 the Surrey Vaisakhi Parade

In 2018 the Surrey Vaisakhi Parade is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, April 21.

The participating MLAs and the leader usually meet at the Gurdwara Dashmesh Darbar Temple, at 12885 85th Avenue in Surrey.

Once again it is usually Harry Bains office that coordinates, but with so many Surrey MLAs and Ravi now it may be a joint effort. The procession heads south each year along 128th Street, west at the BC Hydro (Newton) Railway line, south down 124th Street, west back to 128th Street via 75th and 76th Avenues, and then back to the Temple.

The parade starts at about 9 AM with events finishing back at the Temple by around 4 pm.

The MLAs and the leader walk the length of the parade stopping to speak at stages for local radio stations and other (The Surrey MLA office and Ravi will be able to plan which stage they should speak at. (RED FM, KRPI, etc.) and at any prearranged stages for local organizations. A local New Democrat MLA office will have stall at the parade the Premier and MLAs will visit. Once again the parade route gets extremely busy and crowded.

#### Things to be aware of:

- The leader should wear a traditional South Asian outfit as in the past. This world well for photos and social media posting. Any color outfit works apart from yellowy-orange (Khalistan affiliated colors).
- Note, the Vaisakhi parades are very colorful, vibrant occasions and great opportunities for photographs and video of the leader and MLAs for social media use. A Videographer /photographer would be a good idea to tweet and post. Photos of the Premier and MLAs with seniors, families and kids are the most useful for our files.
