As I've mentioned to you both and to the Premier, business confidence and capital placement are eroding here as operational/regulatory complexity and cost grow dramatically in BC and across Canada. As you know this is something that has been happening over the last five plus years but has accelerated with the US tax and regulatory changes, NAFTA and buy America provisions and threats. I thought this article captures a robust conversation we had at our Board yesterday. It is not just energy sector sentiment, but the sentiment I am hearing form every quarter of BC and Canadian business leadership from tech to natural resources. The concern aside from capital formation (BC capital investment is now below depreciation levels) will lead to a drain of top level talent (less activity and opportunity in the absence of firms investing and higher personal taxes), less R and D spending (better return and scale in the US) resulting in slower economic growth, followed by potential for head office relocations to the US from Canada (as asset classes and protectionism shift to the south). This isn't just a BC issue as I've said to you both, this is a Canadian issue. The new EA process announced federally yesterday exacerbates time, complexity and cost. We are happy to help but thought you should know this is gathering steam in conversations and actions ...
