Centerra Gold Provides Operations Update

TORONTO, Dec. 27, 2017 (GLOBE NEWSWIRE) -- Centerra Gold Inc. (TSX:CG) today reported that, due to a lack of sufficient water resources, mill processing operations at the Mount Milligan mine in British Columbia, Canada have been temporarily suspended. Mill processing operations are expected to recommence at partial capacity by the end of January 2018 and at full capacity after the spring melt.

As disclosed in the Company's news release of October 31, 2017, Mount Milligan experienced a drier than normal spring and summer during 2017 with a limited amount of spring snow melt. This resulted in lower than expected reclaim water volumes in the tailings storage Facility (TSF) at Mount Milligan which is used for mill processing operations. The water shortage has been exacerbated by unanticipated extremely cold temperatures at Mount Milligan, which has

resulted in a greater than expected loss of water volumes in the TSF due to ice formation. In the fourth quarter of 2017, the Company sought to mitigate the water shortfall by drilling additional water wells to draw water from nearby aquifers located on the property. While such wells were partially successful, the additional water obtained was not sufficient to offset the loss of water volumes noted above. In addition, as a further, longer-term mitigation measure, the Company is pursuing an amendment to Mount Milligan's Environmental Assessment (EA) to allow pumping of water from a nearby lake (Phillips Lake) and is applying for the additional related permits. It is expected that by the end of January 2018 there will be adequate fresh water available to restart mill processing operations utilizing just one of the ball mills (38,000 tpd to minimize water requirements). The Company expects that additional fresh water will become available after the spring melt, typically in April, at which time it expects to re-start the second ball mill returning mill processing operations to full capacity. However, as noted, above, the availability of water is subject to, among other things, natural forces that can be unpredictable.

During this downtime, mill maintenance crews will continue to carry out outstanding preventative maintenance activities and will look to bring forward other maintenance work that had been planned for later in the year. The Mount Milligan mine continues to operate according to its mine plan and will continue to expose, mine and stockpile additional ores for future processing. Year-to-date the Mount Milligan mine has produced approximately 225,000 ounces of payable gold and approximately 54 million pounds of payable copper. 2017 gold production at the Kumtor mine, located in the Kyrgyz Republic, has continued to be strong and the mine is expected to finish the year with production of approximately 560,000 ounces of gold.

Additionally, the Kumtor mine has received its maximum allowable emissions permit ("MAE") and its maximum allowable discharge permit ("MAD") from the Kyrgyz Republic State Agency for Environmental Protection and Forestry ("SAEPF") for the full calendar year of 2018. With the MAE

and MAD permits in place, Kumtor now has all the necessary permits and approvals to operate throughout 2018.

The Company expects to issue its 2018 full year production guidance in mid-January 2018 and will be providing additional information regarding Mount Milligan as it becomes available, including updates on and additional steps to mitigate Mount Milligan's water shortfall.



British Columbia is blessed with exceptional natural resources. Even more exceptional are the local workers and local businesses who unlock the economic potential of those resources, and turn them into jobs and prosperity for our province.

Resource industries are the bedrock of the economy in many B.C. communities. Forestry alone supports more than 60,000 workers and their families.

That's why I've been fighting so hard to protect B.C.'s interests in the softwood lumber dispute, and redoubling our efforts to expand international trade in B.C. products.

In my first week as Premier, I went to Ottawa and Washington D.C. to deliver a message both to the Prime Minister, and to U.S. Trade Representatives. I made it crystal clear that our province was interested in a fair, long-term deal to avoid time and money wasted in duties and litigation. However, we cannot control the outcome of softwood lumber negotiations, so we're moving quickly to build other markets. That's why our minister of forests led the single biggest forests trade mission to Asia in B.C. history. Minister Doug Donaldson was joined by over 30 senior executives from B.C. forest companies and associations as they met with the Chinese government and business leaders in Shanghai, Nanjing and Tokyo.

We recognize that B.C.'s trade and investment relationships in Asia are vital to our economic prosperity. We have a long-standing link with Asia, and we are taking every opportunity to deepen cultural, family and business connections to strengthen our trade relationships, not just for forestry but for all B.C. industries.

We're not picking winners and losers in our approach to resource development – because B.C. is strongest when we focus on building strong, sustainable economy with a diversity of industries. Our mining sector has a production value of \$6.3 billion and provides jobs for 30,000 British Columbians, supporting families in communities across the province. And that direct investment supports over 1100 B.C. businesses that provide services and supplies to mining operators. Our natural gas industry is also a significant employer and contributor to B.C.'s prosperity. Our province currently produces a quarter of Canada's natural gas – putting a further 13,000 people to work, and delivering \$840 million a year in revenue that supports the services people rely on.

Each of these industries is equally important to our government, because they are important to families and communities that rely on them. Sustainable resource development is one of the foundations of a strong, sustainable economy that benefits everyone. We will be working to strengthen them, while also respecting Indigenous rights and title and protecting our air, land, and water.

We are telling the world that B.C. is a great place to invest, because it is. We have abundant resources, skilled workers, and industry partners that deliver prosperity while protecting the environment. Together, we can chart a path to prosperity, and build up families and communities.

Subject: Site C impact on rates

Dear Premier Horgan and Cabinet Members,

I understand that rate impacts continue to be a big issue. I asked Robert McCullough to summarize the rate impact issue and his response to me is in the letter attached.

Mr. McCullough concludes:

The bottom line is that regardless of BC Hydro's claims, the current estimate based on BCUC findings is that cancelling Site C will save rate payers a minimum of \$266 million per year or \$123 per household in 2024.

There is nothing in the law or regulatory practice requiring that BC rate payers be penalized for a termination of a project that is:

- twice the cost of the wind backed by Mica Dam alternative,
- headed for further cost overruns that could take the total project cost to \$12-\$15 billion,
- poorly managed,
- environmentally costly, and
- one which has adverse impacts on the ability of First Nations to exercise their treaty rights.

It is important to recognize that part of the money spent so far was used for building infrastructure and developing resources in the Peace valley region that have a value and will be utilized.

And, this is without entering into a long term sales agreement of BC power under the Columbia River Treaty entitlement - an agreement which would generate billions of dollars to offset Site C cancellation costs and fund other BC government infrastructure projects.

To continue with Site C is fraught with problems. In 2017, there is no need to destroy our river valley's for power, and the BCUC Final Report has clearly shown we are not "past the point of no return." I hope this helps towards your decision to terminate Site C which will allow us to take part in the exciting advances happening around the world.



Thank you for dropping by the library on Tuesday. I am following up on your request for information on organized crime in BC.

PostMedia reporter Sam Cooper has been covering the story on money laundering in BC Casinos. His articles How B.C. casinos are used to launder millions in drug cash (published in September) and Gang Police and Transaction Assessment Team Now Operating in BC Casinos (published today, Dec 14) provide a good overview of how organized crime groups in the Lower Mainland use gamblers recruited from China to launder the proceeds of crime. You can read more of his stories at this link. It might be more detail than you need, but the attached PDFs provide an overview of the topic of money laundering from a Canadian context. The pages are from the book "Proceeds of Crime and Money Laundering" by Peter German, who was recently appointed to review BC's anti-money-laundering policies.

The Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General publishes <u>annual statistics on crime trends</u> in British Columbia. The latest report, covering years 2007 to 2016, can be found <u>at this link</u>—money laundering is included in the category of "Other Offences".

The following titles explore other aspects of organized crime:

The construction of the gang in British Columbia: mafioso, gangster, or thug?: an examination of the uniqueness (thesis, 2015)

This thesis explores the structure, demographics, and history of gangs in British Columbia (BC), Canada, through a social constructionist lens. The purpose of the research is for the reader to consider the current state of gangs in BC as inherently different from other places in the world, to assist in understanding why there may be misconceptions, and to promote the research and implement of more appropriate context-specific interventions.

Gangland: The Rise of the Mexican Drug Cartels from El Paso to Vancouver (book, 2011)

Offering a firsthand look from members of law enforcement, politicians, journalists, and people involved in the drug trade in Mexico and Canada, Gangland sheds a harsh light on the multibillion dollar industry that is the drug trade, the territorial wars, and the on-the-street reality for the United States, with the importation of narco-terrorists.

To Hell and Back: A Former Hells Angel's Story of Recovery and Redemption (book, 2017)

A gripping portrait of a notorious Vancouver gangster and Hells Angels elite who descended into a life of homelessness and addiction, ultimately redeeming himself through award-winning youth advocacy.

Nasty, Brutish, and Short: The lives of gang members in Canada (book, 2012)

Dr. Mark Totten has spent fifteen years learning all about these gangs and the young men and women who belong to them. He has interviewed over 500 gang members across the country, traced their lives from infancy to adulthood, and explored the roots of their involvement in crime and their reliance on violence.

The Notorious Bacon Brothers: Inside Gang Warfare on Vancouver Streets (book, 2013)

Infamous and seemingly untouchable, the Bacon Brothers publicly lived the successful gangster lifestyle to a tee, with flashy cars, jewelry and a serious reputation for violence. What was unusual was their comfortable, middle-class upbringing and stable family life—rather than being left with no option but crime, they seemed to have made a conscious decision to step outside the law. Unfortunately for them, nothing in the criminal underworld is permanent, and shifting alliances, rivalries and police work eventually caught up with each of them. In The Notorious Bacon Brothers, bestselling author Jerry Langton tells the story of the new drug trade in BC, of betrayals and retributions, of public shootouts and assassinations, and of innocent bystanders caught in the middle.

GREEN PARTY NOT THROWING IN THE TOWEL ON STOPPING SITE-C YET

The BC Green Party is not throwing in the towel yet on stopping the Site-C dam despite the decision this week by the NDP government to finish the project.

Party leader Andrew Weaver says his caucus will take the message of stopping Site-C directly to the Premier.

"We haven't given up yet our caucus is meeting with the Premier, Carole James, and George Heyman this afternoon. We are very concerned about the decision. We want to articulate again why the rationale simply does not hold water and why we are going to continue to do everything we can to get them to see the lost opportunity."

The meeting may be tense as Weaver says he is no mood to hear the government's excuses on building Site-C and may leave the talking to MLAs Sonia Furstenau and Adam Olsen.

"We want to hear directly from Carole James who will be there and George Heyman. I suspect I won't say very much here because I am frankly not in the mood to be engaging in a rationale discussion to be conned why this decision is going forward. I suspect my colleagues have a lot of questions they want answered and that is hopefully what will happen."

This week the provincial government announced it will finish building the now \$10 billion Site-C dam.

Hello,

For the Fernie MAH and TRAN OICs that went to and were approved at the Nov 22 Cabinet.

Amends the Letters Patent of the City of Fernie (City) and the Regional District of East Kootenay (RDEK) to transfer six leased Crown properties, 104 residential properties, and four farms to the City. Includes a provision for a gradual transition from rural tax rates to full municipal rates over five years for the residential and farm properties.

The RDEK and the City have worked since 2010 to upgrade the water, sewer, and storm sewer infrastructure in West Fernie (WF). In 2014, WF residents voted 56% in favour of joining the City which has been undertaken in two phases. Infrastructure upgrades under the first phase were completed and the City's boundary was extended to bring in 129 properties in December 2016. This order addresses the balance of properties for phase two.

Also, designates a section of Highway 3 that will be within City boundaries as an arterial highway so that it will remain under provincial jurisdiction.

The Fernie infrastructure upgrade and restructure project was a multi-part proposal (Phase 1 in 2014 and Phase 2 in 2017 which was transparent throughout the process) that was approved by the property owners using the petition method. In 2014, 56% of property owners in West Fernie signed petitions

- \cdot endorsing establishment of a service to upgrade the water and sewer infrastructure in the area,
- · consenting to borrowing the local portion of the cost, and
- \cdot acknowledging that if the upgrades proceeded, the properties would join the City of Fernie, which would operate the water and sewer systems.

These results have been relied upon by the RDEK for the service establishment and borrowing (including approval of the Inspector of Municipalities) and the first phase of the boundary extension. The petition approach requires 50%+1 of the total property owners to respond in the affirmative, and that those property owners represent at least 50% of the taxable assessment in the affected area. This is a higher test of responsiveness than an assent vote, where only 50%+1 of those who show up to vote are required to carry the day, and there is no minimum voter turnout threshold.

Phase I was completed last year including those boundary extensions and this is now phase II of which the sewer works are now completed. This is why we have the timing of the vote 2014 – completion of infrastructure 2017 – boundary extension and dissolution 2017.

Geoff,

Thank you for meeting with me today. I thought that you might find a follow-up summary useful:

Please know that logging contractors are a very passionate group. Having the Premier at the Convention is very symbolic for them as it serves to demonstrate and strengthen the (new) government's relationship with the timber harvesting community. Over 90% of all timber harvesting in the province is done by contractors. The Convention typically generates a lot of media coverage.

Contractor Sustainability Review

This is the top issue for logging contractors across the province. Acknowledging it, and how significant it is, would be of keen interest to the audience.

Skilled labour shortage

Government already has done plenty of studies on the Labour Market front to identify that we have a looming problem. Unfortunately, the problem is here now and bound only to become more acute, especially if Alberta picks ups on the oil & gas front. Many contractors are opting to downsize or shut down as they can't afford to invest in skill development of their workers. A tax credit similar perhaps to the apprentice training tax credit might be an efficient and productive way to address this problem. We need a way to transfer all that on-the-job know how from our most experienced workers to the next generation. Perhaps government might be interested in undertaking a review or a study to determine if the idea of a tax credit has merits?

HEMS - Helicopter Emergency Medical Services

This is an issue bigger than just forestry. From my perspective, a forest worker in a remote location should have the same chance of surviving a work place injury as that of a worker in the lower mainland. Both contribute to the success of the province. The HEMS issue applies to all remote industries and communities including First Nations. Perhaps a process to review specific needs and solutions might be the next step as follow up to the BC Forest Safety Council's

Ombudsman report? I think that there is a UBCM recommendation on this topic that government is reviewing currently.

In his Convention speech, the Premier could note his experience with TLA Directors as he actually sat with the TLA Board last year when John was the Opposition Leader. If the Premier was able to meet with Jacqui Beban (the TLA President) and the TLA Executive for a short meeting in January (or December) ahead of the Convention, they could also explain these issues in greater detail directly to the Premier.

A government that puts people first

I believe that government should work for people. This simple value eluded the government that came before us, and people paid the price.

The list of challenges our government inherited is long: an unrestrained housing crisis, eroded services, unacceptably high poverty levels, stagnant wages, a financially strapped ICBC, cost overruns and mismanagement at Site C, inaction on climate change, an overdose emergency, and s.13 to name a few.

In the face of those challenges, we've made some tough choices. Site C is the most recent and difficult example, but it's not the only the one. From getting the budget right, to tackling the financial crisis the BC Liberals left at ICBC, to crafting a comprehensive housing plan, we have tough work ahead of us. But we are determined to get it done so government works better for more people.

My priority will always be to make life more affordable, improve the services people count on, and create good-paying, sustainable jobs in every corner of the province.

Making the best decision on Site C for people, and for the future of B.C.

As Premier, my priority is to deliver on our commitments we made to British Columbians: to make life more affordable, fix the services people count on, create jobs, protect the environment, and make reconciliation with Indigenous peoples a reality.

For many years, we have been critical of the B.C. Liberal government's decision to build Site C. We questioned their motivations, their business case and their budget. Worse, raided Hydro's accounts to balance their budgets, while making people pay more. Hydro rates are up 24 per cent in four years, 70 per cent since 2001.

For these reasons and more, we sent the Site C project to an independent review by the BC Utilities Commission. The BCUC review validated many of our concerns, and left us with two clear options: Complete Site C at a cost of \$10.7 billion.Or cancel Site C and absorb \$4 billion in construction and remediation costs.

Our government listened, deliberated, and debated. But at the end of the day there was only one decision our government could make.

Site C is not the project our government favoured, and it is not the project we would have started, but we must complete it.

I know this decision will be a profound disappointment to some. However,

cancelling Site C would mean asking British Columbians to take on \$4 billion in debt with nothing to show for it in returns. 13 the province could not pay that bill without hydro rates increasing or making cuts to services people count on.

We will not ask the people of B.C. to take on this debt, and we will not put at risk our ability to deliver the housing, child care, schools, hospitals and other infrastructure people desperately need.

We have not made this decision lightly. I sat across the kitchen table from families, whose farms and homes overlook the Peace River. I met with Treaty 8 First Nations. I met with workers, whose livelihoods depend on Site C. The decision affects all of these people, and will have profound and lasting impacts for everyone in this province.

To those who demanded that we cancel Site C: I respect the strength of your convictions, and your concern for our future. We share your determination to protect B.C.'s farmland, to move B.C. to a clean, renewable energy future and to move forward with reconciliation with Indigenous peoples.

We can't change the past; we can only make the best decision for B.C.'s future.

The old government committed billions to Site C without appropriate planning and oversight. Our job now is to do everything possible to turn Site C into a positive contributor to our energy future. We are launching a new project oversight team to ensure the revised Site C budget remains on target.

We will use community benefit agreements to make sure Site C creates training opportunities for British Columbians, and sub-contracting opportunities for local business.

We will enhance food security with new funding to boost the productivity of our agricultural lands, and we will introduce new measures to support reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, including re-opening BC Hydro's standing offer program to trigger new partnerships with First Nations for renewable energy. We know this decision is not what some First Nations wanted. Your voices were heard and you perspectives were an important part of the deliberations on a very challenging decision. Your voices will be heard as we move forward.

We're putting an end to the years of energy policy that put politics ahead of people – where government forced BC Hydro into costly contracts, hiking rates for homeowners and renters, and delivering dividends to government it simply couldn't afford.

As we move forward, we will define an energy strategy that protects our environment, delivers on our climate responsibilities, powers future generations, and creates jobs and opportunities for all British Columbians and helps the province exceed its climate goals.

Mismanagement by the old government left B.C. in a terrible situation, but we cannot punish British Columbians for those mistakes.

Our decision on Site C was incredibly difficult, but we made the best choice we could for the future and for the people of B.C.

You can count on us to keep working hard to deliver on our commitments and make life better for people.

VICTORIA, B.C. - Today Andrew Weaver responded to the NDP government's decision to proceed with the construction of Site C.

"Our caucus is extremely disheartened by this decision. It is fiscally reckless to continue with Site C and my colleagues and I did everything we could to make this clear to the government.

"This government promised to be better than the B.C. Liberals. On this issue, the NDP government's approach has turned out to be no different whatsoever.

"Since the beginning I have been concerned this would end up being a political decision. Today's announcement reflects a sad reality for B.C., and British Columbians deserve better. They deserve a vision grounded in bold ideas that will enable our province to be a leader in the 21st century economy, not more empty campaign promises and political calculation.

"The government's argument that cancelling Site C is too risky due to debt is incredibly cynical. This is a question of priorities. They had no problem adding billions onto the public debt to cancel the tolls on the Port Mann and Golden Ears bridges, transferring those costs to people outside of the Lower Mainland to pick up votes in a couple of swing ridings.

"Today, Site C is no longer simply a B.C. Liberal boundoggle - it has now become the B.C. NDP's project. They are accountable to British Columbians for the impact this project will have on our future.

"We have seen what is happening to ratepayers in Newfoundland because of Muskrat Falls, a similar project, where rates are set to almost double. I am deeply concerned that similar impacts are now in store for B.C. ratepayers.

Congratulations on your appointment as Chief of Staff to the Premier. You bring a wealth of experience, notably in municipal government which will be invaluable to the Premier and his Cabinet as they move their agenda forward.

The Canadian Council for Public-Private Partnerships (CCPPP) is a national not-for-profit, non-partisan, member-based organization with broad representation from across the public and private sectors. Its mission is to promote smart, innovative and modern approaches to infrastructure development and public service delivery through public-private partnerships with all levels of government.

I will be traveling to Victoria with members of my Board of Directors on October 2nd and the morning of the 3rd and we are hoping to meet with you to give an overview of our organization, an update on the public-private partnership sector, and to discuss how the Council can be helpful as the government pursues its ambitious infrastructure plan.

As you may be aware, British Columbia was the first provincial jurisdiction to undertake public-private partnerships. The province also developed a P3 best practices guide for municipalities in 1997. It is particularly noteworthy that BC is today recognized worldwide as a best-in-class infrastructure market and a number of Canadian and international P3 companies have headquarters or regional offices based in the province.

It is my hope that we can build a strong relationship with the new government to build on this BC and Canadian success story. I look forward to hearing back.

I spoke with the Japanese Consul General earlier this afternoon. I would be happy to debrief. Please see below and attached. For ease of reference please see the Parliamentary Secretary's statement as reported in the Blues:

"On December 13, people across the world will pay tribute to the lives of more than 200,000 Chinese victims in the city of Nanjing. In late 1937, during the second Sino-Japanese war, hundreds of thousands of people, including both soldiers and civilians, were killed. The horrific events are known as the Nanjing Massacre, and many reports documented 20,000 to 80,000 women were sexually assaulted.

As Canadians, we are well informed by many historic and current events happening around the world where women and children are often the first casualties of war and armed conflicts.

Here is a story of a survivor. "My name is Chen Jiashou. When the armies invaded Nanjing in 1937, I was only 19 years old. I was taken by some nearby soldiers and brought to a pond adjacent to Shanghai Road. Soldiers hustled several lines of about 200 Chinese troops toward the edge of the pond. I was terribly frightened. Thus, the instant the soldiers opened fire on us all, I immediately fell towards the ground, faking my death. Struck by flying bullets, my Chinese comrades all piled on top of my body. Right up until it got dark and the soldiers had all left, I lay underneath the dead bodies, not daring to move. I waited 'till dark when the soldiers left. It was thus how I became a fortunate survivor of the Nanjing Massacre."

Canadian-Japanese writer, Joy Kogawa, wrote in the Toronto Star that "large scale acts of violence in history need to be widely know and studied so they are not repeated. Whereas the Holocaust in Europe is taught and remembered, the same cannot be said for wide-scale atrocities in Asia's history."

This December 13 will be the 80th anniversary of the horrific events. Commemorative events will be held across the country and the world, and I urge members of this House to attend events in their communities. "


