- Violence against women hurts everyone and has long-term effects on families and our communities
- For too long, community organizations helping women affected by violence have not had the resources and support they need, with gaps in service and growing waitlists for counselling and crisis programs. People in crisis should not have to wait for help. Our government is enhancing supports for women and children affected by violence
- In December 2017, the province announced immediate one-time funding of \$5 million to help reduce waitlists and better meet demand for counselling, outreach and crisis support. This funding included:
 - \$4 million in one-time grants for victim service and violence against women programs to better address high demand for programs that help women and children affected by domestic abuse and sexualized violence;
 - \$800,000 to support inter-agency case assessment teams of police officers, victim service workers, transition house service providers and others who provide victim safety in high-risk domestic violence cases; and
 - \$200,000 to enhance education and prevention programs.

Pill press/ opioid crisis:

- Given that BC is the province most affected by the opioid crisis, provincial legislation aimed at making a more robust scheme for controlling access to pill presses is proposed for spring 2018.
- This legislation in part fulfils expectations set out in the Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General's mandate letter. Specifically, "Provide more support to police efforts to disrupt the supply chain and advocate for increased penalties for drug dealers who knowingly distribute death-dealing drugs."
- The overarching goal of the legislation is to support police efforts to disrupt the supply chain of drug traffickers, by prohibiting anyone, other than those who legitimately need to use a pill press in the course of their practice, or a business authorized to manufacture pills in BC or Canada, from owning, using or possessing one.

Discussions with Alberta have focused on restoring capacity on existing transmission infrastructure, which runs through the Crowsnest Pass, and potentially adding new transmission infrastructure. There is a second much smaller interconnection between Fort Nelson and Alberta. Fort Nelson is not connected to the main BC Hydro grid.

Other than Powerex's participation in the Alberta energy market, there have been no commercial discussions relating to the sale of a large block of power from B.C. to Alberta from Site C or otherwise.

The "up to \$500 million" value that Premier Notley stated Thursday is an upper bound on what might be possible if the intertie were restored to 900MW or 1,000MW.

- BC is taking a run at the authority of federal government
- They are making investors across the world question Canada
- I spoke with the PM today. I told him we need the full weight of the federal government behind the laws of the land
- As a first step, I am sending a letter to PJH indicating we are cutting off talks on existing interties between AB and BC that would enhance ability for BC to sell electricity.
- Would have contributed up to \$500 million to BC. [note these figures are not in line with information from BC Hydro's energy marketing arm, PowerEx]
- This does not include discussions on Site C power. I will have more to say on that going forward.
- Federal government can intervene. We are asking them to assure us that it will be built.

Additional comments of note from the Q and A:

- I think they know they don't have the ability to regulate what's in the pipeline
- I told the PM this is not an Alberta-BC issue. It's a Canada-BC issue.
- We wouldn't put a tariff on oil and gas products flowing to AB because that would have a significant negative impact on AB companies. Our focus is on looking at things that don't have negative impacts on Albertans.

We knew there was trouble at ICBC before the last election, but the previous government hid the problem from the public. Now we are faced with a big challenge: to fix the problems at ICBC and keep costs down for you and your family.

For years ICBC has provided low-cost insurance for B.C. drivers. It is a public institution envied across Canada for competitive rates that have helped make life more affordable for people in B.C. We're fixing problems left behind by years of neglect and bad choices. Our government will keep working hard to make your life more affordable, improve the services people count on and create good jobs for people around B.C.

Premier, ministers wrap up successful relationship-building mission to Asia

VANCOUVER – Premier John Horgan and ministers concluded a successful mission to China, South Korea and Japan to develop relationships and pave the way for job creation throughout B.C.

"We worked hard to showcase to three of our largest trading partners what B.C. has to offer in a number of key economic sectors," said Horgan. "The connections we made on this trip will grow markets, attract investment, benefit B.C. businesses and ultimately create good jobs for people in B.C. That's why we went and I'm proud of what we were able to accomplish." [NOT APPROVED]

The 10-day trip included business roundtables, numerous networking events and face-to-face meetings with government officials and business leaders with operations in B.C. or those considering expanding to British Columbia. The Premier was joined by Minister of Jobs, Trade and Technology, Bruce Ralston and Minister of State for Trade, George Chow, who participated in targeted meetings with potential business partners in all three countries. Minister of Tourism, Arts and Culture Lisa Beare, took part in tourism-related events in China.

The goal of the visit was to strengthen relationships with top government and business leaders in all three countries and to lay the foundation for future partnerships in technology and innovation, tourism, forestry, energy, manufacturing and agriculture, and to secure continued economic growth.

"This trip was a great opportunity to make a strong case for why businesses in China, South Korea and Japan should invest in B.C.", said Ralston. "The meetings I participated in provided me with an opportunity to highlight B.C.'s strengths in key sectors, and I expect these positive exchanges will go far in strengthening government and business ties between our countries." [NOT APPROVED]

"China is one of the fastest-growing inbound tourism markets in the world and presents tremendous opportunities for British Columbia's tourism sector," said Minister Beare. "The year 2018 is the China-Canada year of tourism and with this focus in mind, my visit to China was an important step towards enhancing tourism business prospects between China and B.C. New relationships resulting from this trip to Asia will help B.C.'s tour operators succeed in a globally competitive travel market." [NOT APPROVED]

"To travel and meet in person with key business and government representatives has been invaluable," said Minister of State Chow. "We could see first-hand that our message was being received and now, by keeping in touch and by working together, we can enhance and expand business with the three countries we visited." [NOT APPROVED]

The tour began in China on January 20, continued in Korea on January 25, and finished in Japan on January 30, 2018.

Quick Facts:

- B.C. goods exports to China totalled \$5.9 billion in 2016, making China B.C.'s second-largest export market.
- China was also Canada's second-largest export destination with 4.3% of Canadian goods shipped there.
- The 2018 Canada-China Year of Tourism is an initiative launched by the governments of Canada and China to celebrate and promote tourism opportunities.
- China is a burgeoning market for tourism, with a 22% increase in overnight visits to B.C. in 2016 over 2015.
- Inbound tourism to British Columbia from residents of China, South Korea and Japan in 2016 were:
 - Mainland China: 312,668 overnight customs entries. This has more than tripled since 2009 and is now B.C.'s second-largest market after the U.S.
 - o Japan: 151,535 overnight customs entries. This is B.C.'s third-largest Asia-Pacific market after China and Australia.
 - o South Korea: 108,903 overnight customs entries. This is B.C.'s fourth-largest Asia-Pacific market.
- Canada and South Korea share a thriving, two-way trade relationship totalling billions every year –
 particularly in the natural resource sector, agrifoods and seafood, international education, technology
 and tourism.
- B.C. exports to South Korea were \$2.2 billion in good exports in 2016, accounting for 51% of total Canadian exports to Korea.
- Japan is B.C.'s third-largest trading partner at \$3.7 billion in good exports in 2016. B.C. total exports to Japan, which are primarily commodities, are nearly double that of the next leading Canadian province.

Premier Horgan has returned from a 10-day trip to China, South Korea and Japan aimed at expanding economic ties with three of B.C.'s largest trading partners and creating a broader awareness of B.C.'s strengths in energy, natural resources, agrifoods, low carbon development, technology and innovation.

Highlights of the mission include:

China:

- Events were held in Guangzhou and Beijing to promote B.C. as a prime tourism destination, in support of
 the 2018 year of China-Canada tourism. With 50 weekly flights from China to Vancouver International
 Airport and more than 300,000 tourists from China already arriving this year, B.C. is poised to increase the
 number of tourists visiting B.C. from China.
- The Premier and Minister of Jobs, Trade and Technology Bruce Ralston, participated in the International Policy Forum on Wood Construction and Green Building with China's Ministry of Housing and Urban Rural Development and Forestry Innovation Investment. This event served to promote the use of B.C. wood in low and high-rise housing and commercial buildings and focus on green building design and the benefits of using wood in construction.
- Ralston and Minister of State for Trade George Chow, attended a conference for the promotion of international trade, organized by the Guangdong Business Council to discuss expanding trade ties between B.C. and China.
- Premier Horgan and Ralston took part in the B.C.-Guangdong Low-Carbon Roundtable, which followed up on the B.C.-Guangdong Climate Action Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to advance mutual climate action cooperation.
- The B.C. government delegation met with Chinese government officials and business representatives to reinforce the value of the B.C.-Guangdong sister-province relationship.
- The Premier attended bilateral meetings with China's National Energy Administration and with PetroChina, a major shareholder in the LNG Canada Project.
- Minister of Tourism Lisa Beare, attended a number of meetings to promote B.C.'s dynamic, year-round tourism destinations, to showcase B.C.'s agrifood products, seafood, craft beer and wine, and to mark the "2018 Canada-China Year of Tourism".
- During the visit, Beare also witnessed the International Business Group of Tencent, a leading provider of
 internet services in China and owner of social media giant WeChat (Weixin in China), sign a tourism
 promotion agreement with Destination BC. The agreement is the first of its kind in Canada and gives B.C. a
 preferred marketing platform on the messaging social media app, which attracts over 900 million daily
 active users, making it one of the largest in the world.

South Korea:

• In South Korea, Premier Horgan and Ralston met with Netmarble, Korea's largest social gaming company, to discuss investment opportunities in B.C. and how the province can help them find the talent they need

- to expand. Netmarble owns Vancouver-based game studio Kabam, which employs about 200 people and has plans to hire a significant number of new people this year.
- Ralston and Chow visited the Canada Village in South Korea where B.C. wood is being used to build a
 subdivision full of energy efficient single family homes. While there, Minister Ralston and Minister Chow
 commemorated the completion of homes built to the Super-E and Net-Zero energy efficiency standard,
 demonstrating how wood-frame, low carbon construction, and sustainable forest products from Canada
 and B.C. can help Korea provide energy efficient and environmentally friendly homes.
- The Premier and ministers took part in the signing of a renewed 3-year Economic Action Plan in recognition of the 10th Anniversary of the B.C.-Gyeonggi Sister-Province Relationship. This plan will enhancing cooperation in the areas of digital media, information and communications technology (ICT)/wireless technology, agrifoods, wood products and low carbon construction and tourism.
- Following the signing of the 3-year Action plan, a collaboration agreement was signed between DigiBC and the head of the Gyeonggi Content Agency to support growth of the digital media sector in B.C. and Gyeonggi.
- Premier Horgan met with business leaders at Korea Gas Corporation (KOGAS) and members of the LNG Canada Consortium.
- Premier Horgan met with multinational steel-making company POSCO in Korea, one of the largest importers of B.C. metallurgical coal. The Premier also met with POSCO's subsidiary, POSCO Daewoo. While there, POSCO Daewoo reaffirmed its continued early stage investment in the Kwanika mining project with Serengeti Resources.
- Premier Horgan and Ralston visited the Pangyo Techno Valley in Gyeonggi Province, South Korea's leading technology province that shares many mutual bilateral objectives with B.C., to learn more about the Korean tech sector and explore ways that B.C. and Korean tech companies can work together.
- During a BC Partnerships luncheon, Premier Horgan helped launch the Coupang e-commerce marketing promotion, which includes 23 B.C. agrifoods companies that will list more than 100 products on the Coupang site, Korea's version of Amazon. In 2015, the e-commerce market in South Korea was worth \$41 Billion, representing nearly 11% of total retail market share.

Japan:

- Premier Horgan met with Japan's Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) to advance bilateral cooperation across all economic sectors.
- The Premier attended a bilateral meeting with Mitsubishi Corporation, Japan's largest trading company, to discuss its long-term resource-based investments in B.C.
- The Premier also met with Japan Petroleum Exploration Company (JAPEX) and Japan Oil, Gas and Metals National Corporation (JOGMEC) to discuss past and continuing resource-based investments in B.C.
- The Premier and ministers hosted a natural resources roundtable to discuss B.C. products and services, which was attended by Japanese investors in mining and energy.
- The Premier and ministers took part in a BC Partnerships luncheon where they met with community, business and government guests to promote and strengthen BC-Japan business and cultural relations.
- The Premier met with senior executives of Astomos Energy Corporation and visited Astomos' propane facility. In 2017, Astomos entered into a propane purchase agreement with AltaGas, to be delivered through the Ridley Island Propane Export Terminal currently under construction near Prince Rupert. The facility is expected to provide 40-50 permanent jobs once operational. The Premier and Ralston visited Fujitsu, one of the world's largest Information and Communications Technology (ICT) companies.
- The Premier and Ralston met with Fujitsu and reaffirmed support for Fujitsu and its technology collaborations with B.C. companies, such as 1QBit (makers of quantum computing software).

 Ralston and Chow visited Japanese multinational video game company, SEGA. SEGA confirmed that its Vancouver subsidiary, Relic Entertainment will move to a larger studio in 2019 and create new jobs in the growing BC tech sector.

Here are the early highlights from today's release of the Labour Force Survey for January 2018.

B.C.

- In January, employment decreased by 5,100 in British Columbia to 2.487 million.
- There was a gain of 4,100 in full-time employment and a decline of 9,200 in part-time employment.
- Year-over-year to January 2018, employment increased by 59,500 (2.5%). This is the second fastest year-over-year growth rate among all provinces. Prince Edward Island is second with 2.7% year-over-year employment growth.
- The unemployment rate increased slightly to 4.8% from 4.6%. This is the fifth month in a row in which the unemployment rate is below 5% in British Columbia.
- In January, British Columbia had the lowest unemployment rate among the provinces at 4.8%. Saskatchewan and Quebec were second lowest at 5.4%.
- Youth (age 15-24) was unchanged in January. The youth unemployment rate remained at 7.0%. B.C. has the lowest youth unemployment rate in Canada. Quebec has the second lowest rate at 9.2%.

Canada:

- Employment decreased in January by 88,000. All provinces saw declines except Saskatchewan (+1,100), Newfoundland & Labrador (+200) and Prince Edward Island (+100). Ontario posted the largest decline (-50,900).
- This is the first monthly decline in employment in Canada since November 2016.
- The unemployment rate increased to 5.9% in January from 5.8% in December and remains under 6% for third month in a row.

Throne Speech outlines a clear path to make life more affordable for people

VICTORIA – Historic investments in housing and childcare are at the heart of the speech from the throne, which focused on making life more affordable, creating more opportunity for people and a brighter future for B.C.

"Making life more affordable for people is at the heart of this throne speech, and will be front and centre in next week's budget," said Premier John Horgan. "British Columbians have made their priorities clear. People are frustrated after years of rising living costs, dwindling services, and neglect by the previous government. Our government will take concrete action to give people relief from excessive fees and rising costs to help make life better and make sure people have the opportunities they need to succeed."

The throne speech announced the largest investment in affordable housing in this province's history, including investments in social housing, student housing, seniors housing, affordable rentals and Indigenous housing. Government will also introduce significant new measures to address the effect of foreign investment on real estate prices and to crack down on tax fraud and money laundering in B.C.'s real estate market.

"Access to affordable, safe and secure housing is the number one concern for people in B.C., to tackle the housing crisis head-on, government will make the single largest investment in housing in B.C. history and take swift and broad-ranging actions to reign in skyrocketing house prices," said Horgan.

Government will also make the most substantial investment childcare in B.C.'s history and take the first steps to implement a comprehensive child care program to reduce costs for families and meet the needs of every family in the province.

"We know when we invest in child care everyone benefits, government has also announced today that we will make significant investments to make sure families have access to safe, quality and affordable childcare," said Horgan.

LANGFORD - The Province is partnering with the City of Langford and the District of Sooke to build 115 new affordable rental homes to help address the housing needs of families and seniors in Greater Victoria's Western Communities.

Definitions

1 In this Act:

"approval authority" means

- (a) the government,
- (b) a public body, including a person or other entity, empowered by an enactment or otherwise to perform a function or duty of government,

- (c) a local government,
- (d) a public body, including a person or other entity, empowered by an enactment or otherwise to perform a function or duty of local government,
- (e) an agent of the government, of a local government or of a public body referred to in paragraph (b) or (d), and
- (f) any other prescribed entity;
- "constraint" means, in relation to a project, a measure that, unless replaced under section 4 or 5, may impede or otherwise interfere with the completion or operations of the project;
- "designated project" means a project that is designated as a provincially significant project by order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council under section 3;
- "government body" has the same meaning as in the *Financial Administration Act*;
- "government corporation" has the same meaning as in the *Financial Administration Act*;
- "local government" has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act*, and includes the City of Vancouver;
- "measure" means an enactment, directive, requirement, guideline, plan, program, policy, practice or procedure;
- "person" has the same meaning as in the *Interpretation Act* and, without limiting this, includes the government, a government body and a government corporation and any partnership in which any one or more of them may be involved;
- "project" includes the planning, development, construction, operation, modification or dismantling of a work, thing or activity;
- "**proponent**" means, in relation to a project recommended to the Lieutenant Governor in Council under section 2, the person identified as the proponent by the minister in that recommendation;
- "responsible minister" means, in relation to a designated project,
 - (a) the minister, or

(b) if another minister has been designated as the responsible minister for that designated project by the Lieutenant Governor in Council in the designation order made in respect of that project under section 3, that designated minister.

Recommendation for designation

- **2** (1) The minister may recommend to the Lieutenant Governor in Council that a project be designated as a provincially significant project.
- (2) Before the minister recommends a project under subsection (1), the minister must
 - (a) determine the identity of the proponent of the project, and
 - (b) obtain from the proponent a description of the project that
 - (i) in form and content is satisfactory to the minister, and
 - (ii) sets out the scope, intended operations, anticipated constraints and other details of the project.

Designation

- 3 (1) If the Lieutenant Governor in Council considers that a project in relation to which the Lieutenant Governor in Council receives a recommendation under section 2 is in the public interest and is or may be subject to a constraint, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may, by order, designate that project as a provincially significant project.
- (2) If and for so long as a project is designated as a provincially significant project,
 - (a) the responsible minister and every approval authority having jurisdiction in respect of any resource or other thing or matter that is or may be affected by the designated project, or in respect of which any of the lands or water on, in, under or over which the designated project is or may be constructed, must take all reasonable actions to
 - (i) ensure that decisions they are required to make in relation to the designated project are made expeditiously, and

- (ii) if and to the extent that it is decided that the designated project is to proceed, facilitate the expeditious completion and intended operations of the designated project, and
- (b) the Lieutenant Governor in Council may, in the designation order or in any subsequent order, authorize the responsible minister, subject to section 4, to approve the replacement of, and to create measures to replace, any or all of
 - (i) specified constraints,
 - (ii) constraints of a specified class, and
 - (iii) any constraints affecting the designated project.
- (3) The proponent of a designated project must provide to the responsible minister, when and as required by that minister, any information relating to the designated project that the responsible minister may request.

Consultations for removal of constraints

- **4** (1) If the proponent of a designated project considers that the designated project is being or may be impeded by a constraint, the proponent must consult with the approval authority having responsibility for that constraint in order to arrive at a means by which the completion and operations of the designated project can be facilitated in a manner that is consistent with the reasonable requirements of the approval authority.
- (2) The responsible minister may appoint a facilitator under section 8 to facilitate the consultations referred to in subsection (1) of this section.
- (3) Once a facilitator becomes involved under subsection (2), the proponent and the affected approval authority must provide information as requested by the facilitator and must otherwise cooperate with the facilitator in fulfilling his or her responsibilities.
- (4) If a proponent and an approval authority are able through the consultation process contemplated by this section to reach agreement on how a measure that is perceived by the proponent to be a constraint on the designated project can be overcome in a manner that is consistent with the reasonable requirements of the approval authority, the parties must

- (a) enter into an implementation agreement in which
 - (i) the measure that is perceived to be a constraint is identified.
 - (ii) the measures that the parties have agreed are to replace the constraint are specified,
 - (iii) the approval authority agrees to waive performance of the constraint identified in subparagraph (i) if the proponent performs the replacement measures specified under subparagraph (ii), and
 - (iv) the proponent agrees to perform the replacement measures specified under subparagraph (ii), and
- (b) submit the implementation agreement to the responsible minister for approval.
- (5) If an implementation agreement is submitted to the responsible minister under subsection (4) (b), the responsible minister may approve the agreement if the responsible minister has been authorized, under section 3 (2) (b), to approve the replacement of the constraint identified in that agreement.
- (6) If, after an implementation agreement is entered into under this section in relation to a designated project, the implementation agreement is approved by the responsible minister under subsection
 (5) and if the replacement measures specified under subsection (4)
 (a) (ii) are complied with, the following apply to the project whether or not the project loses its designation as a provincially significant project after the implementation agreement is made:
 - (a) compliance with the replacement measures is deemed to be full compliance with the constraints they replace;
 - (b) the approval authority must treat the project as having fully complied with the replaced constraints and, without limitation, must
 - (i) issue or provide, or facilitate the issue or provision of, the permits, approvals and consents that would normally be issued or provided had the replaced constraints actually been complied with, and

- (ii) take, or cause to be taken, any actions that would normally be taken had the replaced constraints actually been complied with.
- (7) For the purposes of subsection (6) (b), an approval authority referred to in that subsection must issue or provide, or facilitate the issue or provision of, the permits, approvals and consents referred to in subsection (6) (b) (i), and must take, or cause to be taken, the actions referred to in subsection (6) (b) (ii), in the manner, within the time and on the terms and conditions that
 - (a) are specified in the implementation agreement, or
 - (b) if not specified in the implementation agreement, would normally apply had the replaced constraints actually been complied with.

Responsible minister may make order respecting constraints

- 5 (1) If, at any time, the responsible minister considers that the proponent and an approval authority are not able, or will not be able, to reach an agreement contemplated under section 4 (4) in relation to a constraint, and the constraint is one that the responsible minister has been authorized under section 3 (2) (b) to replace, the responsible minister may
 - (a) develop detailed measures to replace the measure that is perceived to be a constraint, and
 - (b) set out those replacement measures in an order.
- (2) In developing the replacement measures referred to in subsection (1), the responsible minister must consult with the proponent, the affected approval authority and any facilitator appointed in respect of the designated project under section 8.
- (3) A responsible minister who makes an order under subsection (2) may at any time propose an amendment to the order, and, in developing the amendment, the responsible minister must consult with the proponent, the affected approval authority and any facilitator appointed in respect of the designated project under section 8.
- (4) If an order is made under this section in relation to a designated project and if the replacement measures set out in that order as they apply to the designated project are complied with, the following

apply to the project whether or not the project loses its designation as a provincially significant project after the order is made:

- (a) compliance with the replacement measures is deemed to be full compliance with the constraints they replace;
- (b) all affected approval authorities must treat the project as having fully complied with the replaced constraints and, without limitation, must
 - (i) issue or provide, or facilitate the issue or provision of, the permits, approvals and consents that would normally be issued or provided had the replaced constraints actually been complied with, and
 - (ii) take or cause to be taken, any actions that would normally be taken had the replaced constraints actually been complied with.
- (5) For the purposes of subsection (4) (b), an approval authority referred to in that subsection must issue or provide, or facilitate the issue or provision of, the permits, approvals and consents referred to in subsection (4) (b) (i), and must take, or cause to be taken, the actions referred to in subsection (4) (b) (ii), in the manner, within the time and on the terms and conditions that
 - (a) are specified in the order, or
 - (b) if not specified in the order, would normally apply had the replaced constraints actually been complied with.

Designated project performance

- **6** (1) The proponent must ensure that the designated project is undertaken, performed and completed
 - (a) in accordance with the project description provided by the proponent under section 2 (2) (b), and
 - (b) in a manner that will allow the designated project to be used only for
 - (i) the operations identified in that project description, and
 - (ii) other operations reasonably related to those identified operations.

- (2) After replacement measures for a designated project have been set out in an implementation agreement under section 4 (4) or in an order of the responsible minister under section 5 (1) or (3), the proponent must ensure that the designated project is undertaken and performed in accordance with the replacement measures and,
 - (a) if the designated project is undertaken and performed in accordance with the replacement measures,
 - (i) the constraint replaced by those replacement measures does not apply to the designated project during the period for which it has been replaced,
 - (ii) no person is liable to any fine, penalty or offence for failing, during that period, to comply with the replaced constraint in anything done or omitted to be done in relation to the designated project, and
 - (iii) any rights or powers of any person that apply to or in respect of the replaced constraint, and any provisions of any enactment that apply to that constraint, including, without limitation, any offence, penalty, liability or similar provisions that apply in the event of a failure to comply with the replaced constraint, apply to the replacement measure, except to the extent that their application is limited by the implementation agreement or order, or
 - (b) if the designated project is not undertaken and performed in accordance with the replacement measures,
 - (i) the constraint the replacement measures were intended to replace applies to the designated project,
 - (ii) any rights or powers of any person that apply to or in respect of the replaced constraint, and any provisions of any enactment that apply to that constraint, including, without limitation, any offence, penalty, liability or similar provisions that apply in the event of a failure to comply with the replaced constraint, continue to apply to the designated project as if no implementation agreement or order had been made, and
 - (iii) the proponent must ensure that the designated project is undertaken and performed in accordance with that constraint.

Monitoring performance

- 7 (1) The responsible minister may, to ensure that the designated project is being undertaken and performed in accordance with section 6 (1) and (2) (a), monitor the designated project or cause the designated project to be monitored.
- (2) For the purposes of subsection (1) of this section, the responsible minister may appoint a monitor under section 8.
- (3) A monitor referred to in subsection (2) of this section may inspect the designated project to ensure that it is being undertaken and performed in accordance with section 6 (1) and (2) (a) and must
 - (a) carry identification in the prescribed form,
 - (b) present the identification to the owner or occupant of any premises being inspected under this section, and
 - (c) on the conclusion of the investigation, prepare a report on the results of that inspection and provide a copy of that report to the responsible minister and the proponent.
- (4) A proponent must, on the request of a monitor referred to in subsection (2), give to the monitor every assistance in connection with the inspection that the proponent is reasonably able to give.
- (5) An oral or written statement or report made by a monitor or any other person in an investigation under this section has qualified privilege.

Responsible minister may appoint consultants and experts

8 Without limiting any other provision of this Act, the responsible minister may at any time appoint facilitators, monitors, consultants and experts and set their remuneration and the terms of their appointments.

Costs may be recovered

9 The responsible minister may order the proponent of a designated project to pay prescribed fees or prescribed charges for all or part of the costs that are incurred, for or in relation to any matter under this Act, by or on behalf of the government or a person appointed under section 8.

Non-compliance

- **10** (1) If the responsible minister considers that a proponent is contravening a provision of this Act or the regulations, the responsible minister, in accordance with the regulations, may do one or more of the following:
 - (a) order the proponent to comply with the provision, or comply to the extent specified by the order;
 - (b) order the proponent to cease all work on the designated project, or cease work on the designated project to the extent specified by the order;
 - (c) recommend to the Lieutenant Governor in Council that the designation for the designated project be revoked.
- (2) The responsible minister may rescind an order under this section if the responsible minister determines that there were insufficient grounds for making the order.
- (3) If the responsible minister considers that a proponent is not complying or has not complied with an order under subsection (1) (a) or (b), the responsible minister may apply to the Supreme Court for either or both of the following:
 - (a) an order directing the proponent to comply with the order under subsection (1) (a) or (b) or restraining the proponent from violating that order;
 - (b) an order directing the directors and officers of the proponent to cause the proponent to comply with or to cease violating the order under subsection (1) (a) or (b).
- (4) On application by the responsible minister under this section, the Supreme Court may make an order it considers appropriate.
- (5) An order or action of the responsible minister under this section is in addition to any offence, penalty or other liability that, in accordance with section 6 (2) (a) (iii) or (b) (ii), applies to the designated project.
- (6) Section 5 of the *Offence Act* does not apply to this Act or the regulations.

This Act prevails

11 (1) If there is a conflict between this Act and any other enactment, this Act prevails.

- (2) Subsection (1) does not apply in the event of a conflict between this Act and
 - (a) the *Agricultural Land Commission Act* and the regulations made under that Act, or
 - (b) the *Environmental Assessment Act* and the regulations made under that Act.

Power to make regulations

- **12** (1) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations referred to in section 41 of the *Interpretation Act*.
- (2) Without limiting subsection (1), the Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations as follows:
 - (a) prescribing an entity as an approval authority;
 - (b) prescribing the form of identification that must be carried by a monitor appointed under section 8;
 - (c) prescribing fees and charges for the purposes of section 9.

VICTORIA – Saying it's time to build a safe, reliable crossing for thousands of daily commuters, Premier John Horgan today announced the B.C. government is moving forward with the construction of a \$1.377 billion bridge to replace the aging Pattullo Bridge.

"This is an essential transportation link that British Columbians rely on, and it's our job to make sure it's safe and gets people moving better," said Horgan. "Replacing the Pattullo Bridge will help people get home to their families quickly and safely while creating good jobs for local workers."

The Pattullo Bridge Replacement Project, funded and delivered solely by the Province, includes a new Pattullo Bridge upstream of the existing one, network connections in Surrey and New Westminster, and removal of the existing bridge. The new Pattullo Bridge will be owned, operated and maintained by the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure.

"By stepping up to own and deliver a new Pattullo Bridge, our government is making sure all people who use the bridge can benefit from a safer crossing and smoother connections into New Westminster and Surrey, whether by walking, driving or cycling," said Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure Claire Trevena. "We heard the concerns of people who use this bridge regularly, and we listened."

"We're working in partnership with Metro Vancouver mayors to deliver on the things that matter to people," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "By taking ownership and leadership over the Pattullo Bridge, we're solving one of the region's biggest transportation problems."

The new bridge will be four-lanes built to modern safety standards, featuring a centre safety median barrier and wider lanes to accommodate both passenger and commercial vehicles. The bridge will also have walking and cycling lanes, separated from traffic, on both sides of the bridge.

There will also be smoother connections on and off the new Pattullo Bridge with new direct road connections between the bridge and East Columbia Street in New Westminster, and a new direct off-ramp from the bridge to westbound Highway 17 in Surrey.

The project budget is \$1.377 billion. The Province will proceed with the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) phase of a competitive procurement process later this spring, with start of construction in summer 2019. The bridge will be open to traffic in 2023.

Opening in 1937, the Pattullo Bridge is one of the oldest bridges in Metro Vancouver. The Bridge was designed for a 50-year life, which has now been exceeded by 30 years.

The Premier and the Government of BC appreciates the passion and care Mr. Leblanc and his colleagues have put into Woodwyn Farms and the Creating Homefulness Society.

The Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Judy Darcy, and staff from the Ministries of Housing and Agriculture met with the Creating Homefulness Society in January.

Decisions by the Agricultural Land Commission and the District of Saanich are made independently, and we are unable to interfere with that process.

In November 2017, the ALC Executive Committee did not approve an application from the Creating Homefulness Society (Woodwyn Farms) on land in the ALR.

The government will be working with BC Housing and Island Health to ensure that Woodwynn residents impacted by any changes are connected to appropriate housing and supports.

Land use decisions within the ALR are up to the Agricultural Land Commission.

The ALC is an administrative tribunal – arm's length from government – and government does not interfere in that independent decision-making process.

The ALC looks at many factors when carrying out its mandate and each application has its own distinct set of circumstances and is considered on its own merits.
