100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Armenia's First Republic Celebration Tuesday May 15 12:00-1:00 pm Hall of Honour

Background: Following the Armenian Genocide of 1915 in Ottoman Turkey, the surviving refugees found themselves making a last stand for survival along with Armenians on the Russian side of the border in the Russian Empire. Armenia declared itself an independent republic in 1918 and it became the first free Armenian state in over 500 years.

Independence lasted for only two years, but members of the Armenian community are celebrating its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary as they credit it as a key reason why there is a place on the map today called Armenia.

The Canadian House of Commons formally recognized the Armenian genocide in the form of a motion in 2004. Adrian moved a motion in 2006 in remembrance of the genocide and it was passed (for your nerdy interest, I include the Hansard links below below). Similar commemorative events have been hosted in the legislature in the years since.

Subject: First interprovincial meeting for a Seamless Canada - Réunion interprovinciale inaugurale pour un Canada sans faille

Fellow colleagues and JTF Commanders,

As you know, the first chapter of Canada's defense policy focuses on our people. The results of multiple surveys conducted over the years by the CAF indicate that the transient nature of our profession can cause significant stress to members and their families. In particular, interprovincial moves can cause hardship for our members and their families, particularly in the areas of education, health care, transportation, and spousal employment. It is to soften this reality that the CDS and CMP are proposing a "Seamless Canada" concept for CAF members and their families. The success of this concept requires provincial and territorial leaders to engage in a collective dialogue with senior CAF officials to discuss possible solutions to help mitigate interprovincial barriers faced by CAF members and their families. The purpose of this email is to ask you to assist me in determining and confirming who in the provincial government in your respective AOR is the best person to attend the inaugural Interprovincial Meeting for a Seamless Canada.

As a JTF commander, you benefit from a privileged platform being in a position where you may know who is the best government representative to be invited to a meeting of this nature. Some provinces, such as New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Alberta have already designated politicians as "liaison officers" for military-provincial affairs which might be an appropriate level of government official to attend this meeting. I have attached a list of known contacts for your validation. In addition, I would ask you to recommend a provincial representative for the provinces and territories

where we are missing such a representative. Please note that the person chosen should be of an appropriate level that allows them to represent the intentions of their government and to report to their respective Premiers.

The inaugural Interprovincial Meeting for a Seamless Canada will be held June 27, 2018 at the Canadian Forces College in Toronto. The purpose will be to present to the provincial/territorial representatives the reality experienced by military families during transfers between provinces and territories. We already know that some provinces will take the opportunity to recommend some common initiatives.

In short, I ask you to send me the list of people to invite by May 4th. If you prefer to provide this return via your staff, please direct them to Maj Cybele Wilson: cybele.wilson@forces.gc.ca<mailto:cybele.wilson@forces.gc.ca>. Finally, I would ask you to let these representatives know about this meeting and give them appropriate notice so that they may add it to their schedule.

I am available at your convenience to discuss with you any questions or comments that you may have. As you can imagine, this initiative has great potential and could perhaps help put an end to some of the bureaucratic logistical obstacles for interprovincial transfers of our members and their families. Thank you for supporting the CAF efforts to improve the quality of life for our members and their families.

Dear Colleagues,

We are writing to update you on the Province's support for the Cascadia Innovation Corridor (CIC), a cross border initiative aimed at bringing the Vancouver and Seattle regions closer together to increase economic growth and innovation, especially in the technology sector. The CIC has played a role in some important initiatives to date — including advocacy and direct support for float-plane service between Seattle and Vancouver, a joint BC/WA study on high speed rail, and adding capacity to BC's trade and investment office in Seattle. The CIC steering group, co-led by the Business Council of BC and Challenge Seattle, is currently engaged in developing a vision document to be discussed at the Cascadia Conference 3.0 to be held in Vancouver in October 2018.

To date, the Province has been represented on the CIC by the Intergovernmental Relations Secretariat. This will continue, but the Ministry of Jobs, Trade and Technology is now taking an active lead. Jamie Hammond, ADM of the International Strategy and Competitiveness Division, is responsible and he has established a Secretariat to support the Province's involvement in the CIC. The Secretariat will represent the Province on CIC working groups and help determine which strategies or activities could best be leveraged with the Province's support. It is also of note that the newly-appointed Innovation Commissioner, Dr. Alan Winter, is already acting as a respected ambassador who will help raise the profile of provincial support for the CIC.

In the near future Jamie will be reaching out to ADM colleagues to raise awareness about the CIC. ADMs will be asked to identify their leads for various initiatives that have Cascadia corridor implications. The Executive Director heading the Secretariat, Jane Burnes, will then facilitate cross-government coordination for CIC initiatives and compile an inventory of Cascadia-related activities already underway with a view to identifying opportunities for collaboration. Please note that we don't see the secretariat taking charge of Ministry-led initiatives, rather they would simply take on the coordination role as described above.

Minister attends WESTAC to promote, advance B.C.'s trade corridor

VICTORIA - Claire Trevena, Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure, will meet with western counterparts today at a summit in Winnipeg to discuss innovative ways to improve B.C.'s transportation network and the movement of goods across the West.

Trevena will meet with cabinet ministers from Manitoba, Saskatchewan and the Yukon, as well as industry representatives and leaders, at the Western Transportation Advisory Council (WESTAC) conference. The

conference is a public and private forum that brings together industry stakeholders to look at the evolution in transportation, as well as technological advancements in the industry that improve supply chain and network efficiency.



Subject: Draft Principles that Guide the Province of British Columbia's Relationship with Indigenous Peoples

#### Colleagues,

As you are aware Cabinet has approved B.C.'s draft *Principles that Guide the Province of British Columbia's Relationship with Indigenous Peoples* (the Principles). In advance of our DMC discussion tomorrow, I am providing you with the roll out plan, as well as information related to their release, including actions that will be necessary in your ministries. At this point in time, we are targeting the week of May 21 to release the Principles to the BC Public Service.

#### The Principles

The Principles are a tool to guide us in meeting our respective mandate letter requirements to "fully adopt and implement" the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UN Declaration), and to move forward on the Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada (TRC). The Principles, which parallel action taken by the federal government last summer, are being adopted as draft and as a starting point for necessary conversations with Indigenous peoples on their content. They highlight that "how" we collaborate with Indigenous peoples is as important as "what" we do, setting us on a unique path of collaboration with Indigenous communities.

#### Next Steps

A roll-out plan related to the Principles is attached. It outlines proposed cross-ministry bodies to guide the implementation of the Principles. This includes a Principles ADM Committee, chaired by MIRR Assistant Deputy Minister Jessica Wood and comprised of ADMs in key ministries (composition to be determined). This ADMs Committee will work closely with a Statutory Decision Makers Working Group on the practical application of the Principles, as well as the BC Public Service Agency on complementary efforts such as the Diversity and Inclusion Action Plan.

At this time, I ask that you develop a plan for communicating the principles in your organization, in anticipation of their release. Key messages are attached, and we are available to assist you with additional messaging, if you require it, to introduce the Principles to your staff.

I also ask that you review the key ministry actions in the roll-out plan attached. Please identify a champion from your ministry who will hold responsibility for the development of plans to operationalize the Principles in your organization. Those contacts should be identified by <a href="mailto-lessica Wood">email to Jessica Wood</a> by May 31.

#### **Additional Resources**

Key messages document is also attached to assist you. More resources will be made available to all staff on @Work when the Principles are released, including FAQs and links to the UN Declaration and Calls to Action. Jessica Wood and I are also available to speak to your leadership teams about the Principles over the coming weeks.

Thank you for your assistance in building awareness and support for the Principles within your ministries. As we all work to implement government's reconciliation mandate, my ministry will continue to engage across government in building related tools and resources.



To become more influential on the national stage, Canada's Council of the Federation must develop a more focused internal agenda, says a new publication by the Institute for Research on Public Policy.

In Coordinating Federalism: Intergovernmental Agenda Setting in Canada and the United States, author Jared Wesley finds that diverse interests have divided Canada's premiers, particularly in areas such as resource development and climate change. Even when premiers agree on a particular priority, arriving at a common position or set of key messages has often been challenging.

According to Wesley, American governors have proven more effective at influencing the national agenda than Canadian premiers. Far fewer topics are up for discussion at the National Governors Association table, and governors consequently have greater opportunity to develop short-term strategies.

Wesley concludes with a discussion of potential changes that could assist the Council of the Federation in raising its national profile.



- With flooding on the rise over the past couple of years, it's important for homeowners to talk to their insurance provider and not assume their home insurance includes flood protection.
- We've just announced that Disaster Financial Assistance funding is available to those affected in the Thompson-Nicola Regional District including Cache Creek – as well as many areas in the Cariboo – and more announcements will be made as the season progresses.
- We've also been shipping flood mitigation equipment and millions of sandbags to the interior.
- The Province has announced several major flood prevention and emergency preparedness projects this year, including funding for the National Disaster Mitigation Program, the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund, and several other structural and non-structural flood mitigation projects throughout B.C.
- We're working with local governments to help protect communities and are monitoring the increased risk closely.

### **Provincial Flood Support and Investments**

- Emergency Management BC is assisting local governments in flood response. As of end of day May 12, the province has:
  - Activated the Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) to support the Central (CTL), Southeast (SEA) and Northeast (NEA) Provincial Regional Operation Centres (PREOCS).
  - Activated PREOCS in Kamloops, Prince George, Surrey and Nelson to provide assistance to local governments.
  - Deployed around 2 million sandbags to local governments to protect homes and public infrastructure.
  - Provided 12 sandbag machines to Cache Creek, Oliver, Vernon (2), Willowbrook, Kelowna (2) and Prince George staging area (3).
  - Six sandbag machines are on loan from Saskatchewan.
  - Currently deployed 251 BC Wildfire Service fire fighters to Kelowna, Oliver, Lower Nicola Indian Ban, and Stump Lake to assist with sandbagging. Previously, fighters were also deployed to Penticton and the Nooaitch Indian Band near Merritt.
  - Shipped 3.116 km of Gabions and 10.3 km of tiger dams to the interior.
  - FLNRORD's River Forecast Centre and Water Stewardship Branches are providing water flow expertise, as well as geotechnical specialists and engineers.
- EMBC has additional flood response resources ready to deploy:
  - Prince George:
    - 264,000 sandbags
    - 1,500 metres of Gabions
    - 2,000 metres of tiger dams
    - 3 sandbagging machines
  - Kelowna:

- 168,000 sandbags
- 1,553 metres of Gabions
- Chilliwack:
  - 807,000 sandbags (with weekly deliveries to ensure constant supply)
  - 16,525 metres of tiger dam
  - 5,700 metres of Gabions
  - 2 sandbag machines
- Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA) is also available for eligible British Columbians who may have been impacted by overland flooding or landslides from heavy rains.
  - Applications for the DFA event in the Thompson-Nicola Regional District (including municipalities, unincorporated areas and First Nations) must be submitted to Emergency Management BC (EMBC) by Aug. 2, 2018
  - Applications for the DFA event in the Northeast must be submitted to Emergency Management BC (EMBC) by Aug. 1, 2018.
    - Eligible regions include:
      - Cariboo Regional District
      - City of Quesnel
      - Regional District of Fraser Fort George
      - Kluskus First Nation
      - Xatsull First Nation
      - Williams Lake Indian Band
      - Tlètinqox Government
      - Ulkatcho First Nation
      - Nazko First Nation
      - ?Esdilagh
  - Applications for the DFA event in the Central Interior must be submitted to Emergency Management BC (EMBC) by July 16, 2018.
    - Eligible regions include:
      - the North Okanagan Regional District
      - the Columbia Shuswap Regional District
      - the Okanagan-Similkameen Regional District
      - the Central Okanagan Regional District
  - DFA is available to home owners, residential tenants, small business owners, farmers, charitable organizations and local government bodies who were unable to obtain insurance to cover these disaster-related losses.
  - British Columbians can access the DFA application at: http://www.gov.bc.ca/disasterfinancialassistance
- While we're prepared to respond to flooding to protect public safety, anything we can do to understand and prepare for flood risk is a step in the right direction.
- That is why the Province funds programs such as National Disaster Mitigation Program and the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund for local governments.
- The National Disaster Mitigation Program and Community Emergency Preparedness Fund enable communities to develop flood risk assessments, maps and mitigation plans in addition to constructing flood protection infrastructure. A full list of potential funding programs can be found at Emergency Management British Columbia's Disaster Mitigation Branch webpage.
- We are committed to working collaboratively to improve public safety and disaster preparedness for all British Columbians.

### If asked about recent investments in mitigation:

 EMBC is committed to improving the public safety of all British Columbians; that is why we are investing heavily in flood prevention and protection.

In April, 2018, the Province announced \$6.5 million in disaster-mitigation projects throughout the province. Funding highlights include:

- \$2.6 million to plan and undertake structural and non-structural flood-mitigation projects in various locations throughout B.C.;
- \$1.75 million to further assess earthquake-related hazards in the Metro Vancouver area;
- \$1.5 million to the Union of British Columbia Municipalities (UBCM) for the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund;
- \$450,000 to the Fire Chiefs Association of British Columbia to support road rescue, fire safety and prevention: and
- \$130,000 to Avalanche Canada and the District of Stewart to support avalanche reporting and mapping.

#### National Disaster Mitigation Program:

- On Feb. 2, 2018, the Governments of Canada and B.C. announced funding for 30 projects, valued at approximately \$12.1M (including investments from local governments and NGOs) through the National Disaster Mitigation Program.
  - B.C. government contribution: approximately \$5M

#### April 2018 Mitigation Funding:

- \$2.5 million to plan and undertake structural and non-structural flood-mitigation projects in various locations throughout B.C., including:
  - \$1.5 million to support local government flood-mitigation projects through the UBCM Community Emergency Preparedness Fund.
  - \$1.45 million for the Okanagan Water Basin Board to obtain aerial photos and surface topography for the entire Okanagan watershed during the current spring freshet.
  - \$500,000 for the Central Coast Reginal District to develop a flood risk assessment and to model several flood scenarios in the Bella Coola Valley.
- Previous investments:
  - In March 2017, EMBC announced the investment of \$60M for flood mitigation projects in B.C. communities.
  - This followed the announcement in 2016 of \$50M of funding earmarked for 15 community hazard mitigation projects including upgrades to dikes.

#### If asked about Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA):

- Disaster Financial Assistance is a provincial program to help individuals and local governments recover from uninsurable disasters. The program is administered by Emergency Management BC.
- The purpose of DFA is to provide a helping hand to get people and local governments back on their feet after an uninsurable disaster.
- The eligibility criteria for DFA, which has been consistently and fairly applied since 1995, is defined according to the Emergency Program Act and Disaster Financial Assistance Regulation.
- DFA is available in the event of a disaster in respect of which the minister, or designate, has determined that disaster financial assistance may be provided.
- When this determination is made, Emergency Management BC defines the eligible dates and geographic locations, notifies affected local governments, posts this information on its website, publishes information in local papers, and attends community meetings if requested.
- For flooding disasters, DFA is available to qualifying home owners, residential tenants, small business owners, farm owners, and charitable organizations. Applicants should be aware of the following:

- Financial assistance is provided for each accepted claim at 80% of the amount of total eligible damage that exceeds \$1,000, to a maximum claim of \$300,000.
- Claims may be made in more than one category (e.g., home owner and farm owner).
- A home owner or residential tenant must show that the home is the applicant's principal residence.
- Seasonal or recreational properties, hot tubs, patios, pools, garden tools, landscaping, luxury items (like jewelry, fur coats and collectibles), and recreational items (like bicycles) are not eligible for assistance.
- Small business owners and farm owners must demonstrate the business or farm is the applicant's primary source of income.
- Charitable organizations must provide a benefit of service to the community at large.
- Assistance is also available to local governments for essential materials and to rebuild or replace
  essential public infrastructures to the condition it was in before the disaster. Assistance is provided
  for each accepted recovery claim at 80% of the amount of total eligible damage that exceeds
  \$1,000. There is no maximum claim.

### If asked about the impact of overland flood insurance on DFA assessments:

- Until recently, overland flood insurance was only available for commercial buildings. The BC Government
  expects that within two years DFA will be available to family residences throughout B.C. Overland flood
  insurance is now available in certain municipalities throughout B.C.
- Disaster Financial Assistance is not applicable where flood insurance is readily and reasonably available.
   In communities where flood insurance has not yet been introduced, DFA is applied according to the eligibility criteria established since 1995.
- All residents or tenants who make a DFA application will be treated on a case-by-case basis and, as is normal practice, will be given a form to fill out and then present to their insurance agent or broker to determine whether the resident was offered the flood insurance option.

### If asked about support provided for the 2017 freshet:

- EMBC supported evacuees through Emergency Social Services.
- During the 2017 freshet, EMBC coordinated the deployment of hundreds of personnel to assist communities—including technical experts from several fields and ministries. For example:
- EMBC deployed flood mitigation resources to support local authorities, including:
  - Approximately 4.4 million sandbags
  - 7.5 km of gabions (wall-like structures filled with sand)
  - 6.7 km of Tiger Dams (stackable orange tubes filled with water)
  - 9 sandbag filling machines, used in communities throughout the flood season

### **Community Emergency Preparedness Fund**

The Community Emergency Preparedness Fund (CEPF) is a suite of programs designed to enhance the resiliency of local governments and their residents. The Province provides the funding, which is administered by UBCM. In March 2017, the Ministry of Transportation & Infrastructure launched CEPF as part of an \$80 million announcement for emergency preparedness.

# Daily Update Report (new information in red):

The PECC will remain activated today at level 2 in support of the CTL, SEA, NEA/NWE, and SWE PREOC's.

#### PROVINCIAL WEATHER

- A strong ridge of high-pressure building over southern BC will give sunny warm conditions for the next few days
  with temperatures over central and southern BC rising a degree or two each day through Tuesday. The exception
  is in the northwest corner of the Province where high cloud associated with a low in the Gulf of Alaska is
  streaming over top of the upper ridge. High temperatures will range from the upper twenties to near thirty over the
  southern interior to the mid-twenties over the central interior and the upper teens to low twenties over the far
  north.
- With the warmer temperatures, freezing levels will also rise into the 3500 to 4000 m range over the southern half
  of the province. The warm temperatures and rising freezing levels will lead to continued rapid snowmelt in the
  mountains, which will exacerbate flooding concerns across the province.

### RIVER FORECAST CENTRE No Change

- **Flood Warning** Boundary, including the Kettle River, West Kettle River, Granby River and surrounding tributaries. Salmon River near Falkland/Salmon Arm. Bulkley River including tributaries around Houston, Smithers and adjacent areas.
- Flood Watch Nautley River, Nechako River, Dean River, Okanagan including Mission Creek and tributaries in the Vernon, Kelowna, Penticton, Oliver and surrounding areas. Similkameen River and tributaries including the Tulameen River. Central Interior including the Nicola River, Coldwater River, Bonaparte River, Guichon Creek and tributaries in the Merritt, Kamloops, Cache Creek and surrounding areas.
- High Streamflow Advisory Fraser River, West Kootenay, East Kootenay, Nazko and West Road River,
   Prince George area including the Chilako River, Salmon River and surrounding tributaries
- A state of local emergency has been declared in 30 communities (1 in Southwest region, 23 in central region, 1 in Northeast region, 5 in Southeast region).
- There are 32 evacuation orders in effect across the province (1 in Southwest region, 24 in central region, 2 in Northeast region, 5 in Southeast region).
- There are 40 evacuation alerts (32 in Central region, 2 in Southeast region and 4 in Northeast region, 1 Southwest, 1 in Northwest).

#### CENTRAL REGION (CTL)

- The Central PREOC remains activated to level 2 in support of regional EOC's response to flood and debris flow incidents.
- Regional District North Okanagan (RDCO): The EOC Level 1 activated due to flooding on Coldstream Creek flooding and potential affecting 2-16 homes.
- Thompson Nicola Regional District (TNRD):
- **Electoral Area M:** A SOLE (expires May 16<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect for Beautiful Nicola Valley North. An evacuation alert remains in place for the Lower Nicola Valley mobile home park and three properties on Marshall Road. An Evacuation Order is in place for 19 homes in Stumbles Creek, Beaton Road and Guichon.
- **Electoral Area J:** A SOLE (expires May 16<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect for Copper Desert Country. Two Evacuation Orders are in place for 2 properties near Cherry Creek.
- City Of Kelowna: A SOLE (Expires May 21<sup>st</sup>) remains in place due to flooding along Mill Creek.
- **District of Peachland:** A SOLE (Expires May 13<sup>th</sup>) was declared due to a landslide at Princeton Ave and water flowing across Hwy 97.

- City Of West Kelowna: A SOLE (Expires May 18<sup>th</sup>) remains in place. An Evacuation Orders remains in effect for one property on Capri Road and an Evacuation Alert for 7 properties near McDougall Creek due to high stream flow.
- Regional District of Central Okanagan (RDCO): A SOLE (expires May 17<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect for Central
  Okanagan West area. Near Ewing's Landing 2 properties remain on an Evacuation Order due to a landslide and
  one property on Evacuation Alert due to slope instability risk. An Evacuation Alert remains in effect for three
  homes on Hodges Road due to flooding potential.
- Westbank First Nation: An Evacuation Alert remains in effect for eight homes on Old Boucherie Road due to the risk of flooding.
- **City of Merritt:** A SOLE (expires May 12<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect due to threat of flooding on the Nicola River. An Evacuation Order was issued for the Nicola Meadows Retirement Living Complex.
- **Upper Nicola Indian Band:** BCR in place. An Evacuation Order remains in place for 1 home near Hamilton Creek. An Evacuation Alert remains in effect for 31 homes and 4 businesses (RV parks) in IR#1 Nicola Lake North and South Flat and IR#2 Hamilton Creek.
- Lower Nicola Indian Band: Two BCR's remains in effect due to rising waters and potential flooding issues. An
  Evacuation Alert is in place for 16 properties near Godey Creek. An Evacuation Order is in place for 5 properties.
  Some of these properties are a part of the Guichon Creek Mobile Home Park (in TNRD Electoral Area M). An
  Evacuation order was issued for IR 1: 6 homes on Fyall Road, and 1 home on Highway 8 Nicola Mameet IR1, on
  May 11.
- Village of Cache Creek: A SOLE (expires May 17<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect due to the threat of flooding. Disaster
  Psychosocial team members continue to assist local ESS resources with support to community members. An
  evacuation order remains in place for one home.
- **District of Summerland:** A SOLE (expires May 17<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect due to the threat of flooding on Eneas Creek. An evacuation alert for 2 properties on Garnet Avenue was issued on May 10.
- Regional District Okanagan-Similkameen (RDOS):
- Electoral Area A: An evacuation order was issued for 16 units (Willow Beach). Increased flows are breaching, protection measures in place.
- **Electoral Area B:** A SOLE (expires May 15<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect due to flooding risk in Cawston. An Evacuation Order for Chopaka Road is in effect.
- Electoral Area C: A SOLE (expires May 14<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect. 18 properties remain under an Evacuation Order in the Sportsmen's Bowl Road area and 149 properties are under Evacuation Alert. An Evacuation Alert is in place for one property on Gold Tau Road.
- Electoral Area D: A SOLE (expires May 15<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect due to the threat of flooding and debris flow around the area of Green Lake (south of Okanagan Falls), Green Mountain Road and Farleigh Lake. An Evacuation Alert remains in effect for 17 properties. An Evacuation Alert for 64 properties around Twin Lakes near Kaleden due to rising lake levels and the imminent risk of flooding. Okanagan Falls has an Evacuation Order issued for 54 properties.
- Electoral Area E: A SOLE (expires May 17<sup>th</sup>) was declared.
- **Electoral Area F:** A SOLE (Expires May 18<sup>th</sup>) and an Evacuation Alert remain in effect for 60 properties near Faulder and Meadow Valley. An Evacuation Order was issued May 11 affecting one property at Kettle Place.
- Electoral Area G: A SOLE (expires May 15<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect due to flooding risk and three Evacuation Alerts are in place for 237 properties.
- **Electoral Area H:** A SOLE (expires May 15<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect for flooding risk near Tulameen. There are 15 properties under Evacuation Order and approximately 133 properties under an Evacuation Alert.
- Nooaitch Indian Band: A BCR and Evacuation Alert remain in effect for 6 homes along Highway 8, west of Merritt, due to flooding risk. A BCR remains in effect to support an Evacuation Order for homes rendered uninhabitable during spring 2017 freshet flooding.
- Okanagan Indian Band: A BCR remains in place due to flooding risk covering reserves 1, 3, 6, & 7. An Evacuation Alerts remains in effect for 4 properties on Bonneau Road due to potential flooding on Equesis Creek.

An Evacuation Order (issued May 9) was rescinded for one property of IR#1. An Evacuation Order was issues for one property on Madeline Lake Road due to imminent inundation by flood water compromising the residence.

- Columbia Shuswap Regional District (CSRD) Sunnybrae: A SOLE (expires May 18<sup>th</sup>) and an Evacuation Order remains in place to prohibit entry to homes destroyed in 2017 landslide.
- CSRD: An Evacuation Alert remains in effect for 4 addresses in the Vicker's Trail and Robinson Creek areas due
  to spring 2017 flooding concerns.
- CSRD Area D: A SOLE declared for Electoral Area D due to imminent or occurring flooding.
- Town of Osoyoos: A SOLE (expires May 15<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect due to flooding of Osoyoos Lake. Two
  Evacuation Orders were issued on May 11, 2018 for 30 properties.
- **Lower Similkameen Indian Band**: A Band Council Resolution remains in place and an Evacuation Order was issued for Chopaka Road IR 7 and 8 due to high water levels and impassible road conditions on Chopaka Road.
- **City of Armstrong**: An Evacuation Alert remains in effect for properties along Meighan Creek in the Willowdale Road, Patterson Avenue and lower Becker Street areas (55 homes)
- Upper Similkameen Indian Band: A Band Council Resolution remains in effect for Chuchuwayha IR 2 due to flooding risk.
- Village of Lumby: An Evacuation Alert remains in place for 170 properties.
- Town of Princeton: A SOLE (expires May 16<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect due to the threat of flooding.
- District of Coldstream: An evacuation alert remains in effect for 8 properties bordering Coldstream Creek.
- Village of Keremeos: declared a SOLE (expires May 17) due to the threat of flooding and or landslides in the village.
- NORTHEAST REGION (NEA)
- The Northwest and Northeast regions opened a joint PREOC on May 11<sup>th</sup> to manage the 7 EOC's opened across the two regions.
- Fort Nelson: A SOLE and Evacuation Order remain in effect due to an interface wildfire that threatened 10 properties. The fire was eventually brought under control and the Evacuation Order was rescinded. If the SOLE is no longer required today it will also be rescinded.
- Regional District Fraser Fort George (RDFFG): A SOLE remains in place (expires May 17<sup>th</sup>). An Evacuation
  Order for one property and an Evacuation Alert has been issued for 39 properties along the Upper Mud River
  Road due to flooding.
- Xat'sull (Soda Creek Indian Band): A BCR and an Evacuation Alert remain in place for 6 properties.
- Nazko First Nation: A BCR is in place. There is currently 1 Alert for Nazko First Nation IR20 & Besikoh IR27) 1
  Order for Bunchek IR17.
- Cariboo Regional District (CRD): A SOLE was rescinded May 11, 2018. Two previous Evacuation Alerts have been lifted. Monitoring and planning for Quesnel River. Cottonwood River and Horsefly River.
- Tl'etinqox (Anaham) Government: A BCR is in place. One alert was issued for 5 homes at Anaham Meadows IR#1. Foundation of the Jim Meadow dam has cracked; overflow of water has washed out the dam walls which need repair. Water pressure is high which is now leading the flooding of Anaham Fields below the reserve.
- Northern Rockies Regional Municipality: Declared a SOLE and issued Evacuation Order for 107 homes due
  to a wildfire and subsequently rescinded both in the same day.
- NORTH WEST REGION (NWE)
- Regional District of Bulkley Nechako: There is one Evacuation Alert in place for Ebenezer Flats area.
- SOUTHEAST REGION (SEA)
- The Southeast PREOC is expected to activate today in support of Local Authority's and First Nation EOC's response to flooding.
- Regional District of Kootenay Boundary (RDKB):

- RDKB Area C: 688 properties are under order in Christina Lake, 4 are under order on Manly Meadows Road, 66 are under order in the Village of Midway, 380 are under order in the City of Grand Forks. Three Evacuation Orders have been partially rescinded for 13 properties in the City of Grand Forks.
- RDKB Area D: A SOLE (Expires May 15<sup>th</sup>) has been issued for Area D.
- RDKB Area E: 642 properties are under order in Area E/ West Boundary. Reception Centres and Group Lodging facilities have been stood up in both Grand Forks and the Village of Midway.
- **City of Grand Forks** A SOLE (Expires May 16<sup>th</sup>) remains in effect and 380 properties are under Evacuation Order. The City of Grand Forks remains heavily impacted by flooding.
- Regional District Central Kootenay (RDCK): An Evacuation Alert remains in effect for one property due to the mudslide that occurred April 18th on Highway 3A east of Castlegar.
- City of Castlegar: An Evacuation Alert remains in place for eight homes in Castlegar due to a landslide that occurred in Bloomer Creek in May 2017.
- SOUTHWEST REGION (SWE)
- The Southwest PREOC is expected to activate today.
- District of Kent: A SOLE (expires May 17<sup>th</sup>) and an Evacuation Order remains in place for six properties due to a rockslide which occurred on November 5, 2017. Three couples (6 people) are receiving ESS. The SOLE and ESS will continue until further assessment is complete.
- **Chilliwack:** An alert for 6 homes was issued due to risk of flooding. There is no risk to critical infrastructure at present.

#### Message:

- We must all work together to prepare for and respond to flooding and other disasters.
- During this trying time, we want British Columbians to know we will be here to help.
- Our government will assist them in any way we can.
- We're hoping for the best, but preparing for the worst. This includes shipping flood mitigation
  equipment and millions of sandbags to the interior to hopefully prevent the kind of flooding that we
  witnessed last year.
- The Province has also announced several major flood prevention and emergency preparedness
  projects this year, including funding for the National Disaster Flood Mitigation Program, the Community
  Emergency Preparedness Fund, and several other structural and non-structural flood mitigation
  projects throughout B.C.
- We're working with local governments to protect communities and are monitoring the increased risk closely.

### 2018 Freshet Background:

- A higher than normal snowpack combined with hot temperatures has led to on-going rises in river levels and flooding incidents in a number of communities across the province.
- Temperatures are expected to increase again this week contributing to more snowmelt runoff, before beginning to cool again with more precipitation expected.
- River Forecast Centre:
  - A Flood Warning is maintained for the Nazko River and West Road River
    - A Flood Warning means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
  - Flood Watch is maintained for Central Interior including the Bonaparte River, and tributary rivers around Cache Creek, Merritt, Williams Lake, Quesnel and surrounding areas
    - A Flood Watch means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.
  - High streamflow advisory is maintained for central Interior including the Bonaparte River, and tributary rivers around Cache Creek, Merritt, Williams Lake, Quesnel and surrounding areas

Hi All,

As you know, Interior of the province has been experiencing significant flood conditions and recent projections from the River Forecast Centre indicate a heightened potential risk of extreme flooding in the Lower Fraser River. These conditions are due to the high snowpack, water-resistant soils, very high temperatures, and significant rainfall events. I know that several ministries have been working tirelessly over the past few weeks on mitigation and response and I would like to take this opportunity to thank emergency response personnel supplied by your ministries for their efforts.

The situation is expected to deteriorate over the next two weeks. If the situation worsens, as we expect, increased staff support from your ministries will be required for sustained response and recovery efforts.

All ministries are asked to give high priority to requests for assistance from the Province in response to emergency events. Such requests include ensuring that your senior managers support the activation of staff participating in the Emergency Management BC (EMBC) and BC Wildfire Temporary Emergency Assignment Management System (TEAMS) programs. The TEAMS programs provide much-needed staffing to support the Province's emergency operations centres and on the ground efforts. Due to the limited number of TEAMS members, and because flooding could reach catastrophic levels in some areas, we may ask you to send staff without TEAMS training to relieve personnel in those emergency operations centres. Those staff will receive on the ground training.

Although I hope otherwise, flood response and recovery will likely last for several weeks and workload management and employee wellness will be of primary concern. I ask that your senior managers consider planning for the potential activation of some of their staff in anticipation of a request for assistance. Please treat resource requests for flooding support with the utmost urgency. This is not asked lightly, and such a request reflects the gravity of the situation.

FYI, I will be sending out an email to all staff later today which will be asking for willing participation if requested.

Once again, I would like to thank you for the assistance that EMBC has received from you and your staff. Your support of the response and recovery efforts continues to be essential as the flood situation develops.

Premier Horgan was asked one question about WPC at his education announcement in Langford:

Reporter: Premier, you're going to be in Yellowknife next week for [inaudible]. Can you say what you [inaudible] to have go on there. And also, if I can ask a side question, how do you feel about how you're going to get along with [inaudible]?

Horgan: Certainly the Western Premiers Conference is being held next week in Yellowknife. I've never been to Yellowknife. I'm looking forward to going and seeing the north for the first time, the true north for the first time. We're going to be making proposals around a national PharmaCare program. We believe that the provinces have always led the way when it comes to PharmaCare. BC, particularly, with our Fair PharmaCare, our reference-based pricing programs, has led the way for other provinces. The federal government now wants to talk about a national program. We're excited about that, but we don't want to be pushed to the side after all the work that we've done here in BC and at the provincial level, to have the federal government come in and tell us how and where and what we should be doing. So I think that's going to be the focus. Those are the initiatives that I'm bringing forward.

With respect to Premier Notley, we have a disagreement on one issue. Our values are lockstep. We have been friends for 20 years. We disagree on the Kinder Morgan pipeline. I believe largely the issue is around transporting diluted bitumen, whether by rail or whether by pipeline. And I believe that the risk of a diluted bitumen spill to our economy, to our environment is too great, and I've made that abundantly clear. I don't think there will be any surprises next week.

- B.C. will continue to work closely with the Government of Canada to best protect B.C.'s interests in this dispute, and in the context of our international trade obligations.

 The wine industry is an important contributor to B.C.'s economy, creating jobs and other economic benefits for British Columbians.

# If asked about B.C.-only wine and imported wine sales:

- Trade agreements such as NAFTA and CETA allow some private wine outlets to sell only B.C. wine.
- In B.C., the number of liquor stores selling imported liquor has increased significantly since 1987, from 344 to approximately 1,116 today (1,105 stores selling imported beer, wine and spirits and 11 stores selling only imported wine).
- U.S. wines have by far the largest share of the imported wine market in B.C.
- Over the past four fiscal years, wholesale sales of U.S. wine have increased almost 32% from 2012/13 to 2016/17.




