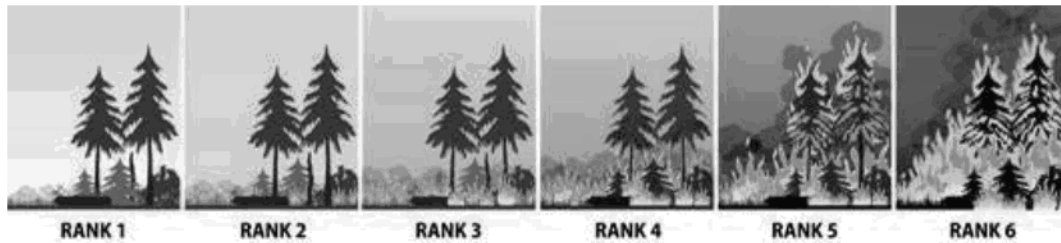

Importance: High

Update 2

The wildfire is now estimated at 380ha's in size and fire suppression crews, including airtankers, continue to make progress in containing the fire. The fire is exuding Rank 2-3 fire behaviour primarily in grass land and some timber.

The City of Kamloops has indicated a half dozen homes on Shuswap Road east of the Sage Meadows Trailer Park have been tactically evacuated as a precaution. A reception centre has been established for evacuees at the Sk'elep School of Excellence on the reserve.

Further updates are expected.

Update 1:

The wildfire is now estimated at **150ha's in size** and burning in a westerly direction. Tk'emlups First Nation has opened their EOC and are working in Unified Command with City of Kamloops and BCWS to address response activities. BCWS is reporting that houses are 2-4 km away and not imminently threatened at this time but **tactical evacuations are underway as a precaution**. Airtankers continue to lay retardant on the base and flanks of the fire. The EMBC Regional Duty Manager is engaged and working to address any community support requests.

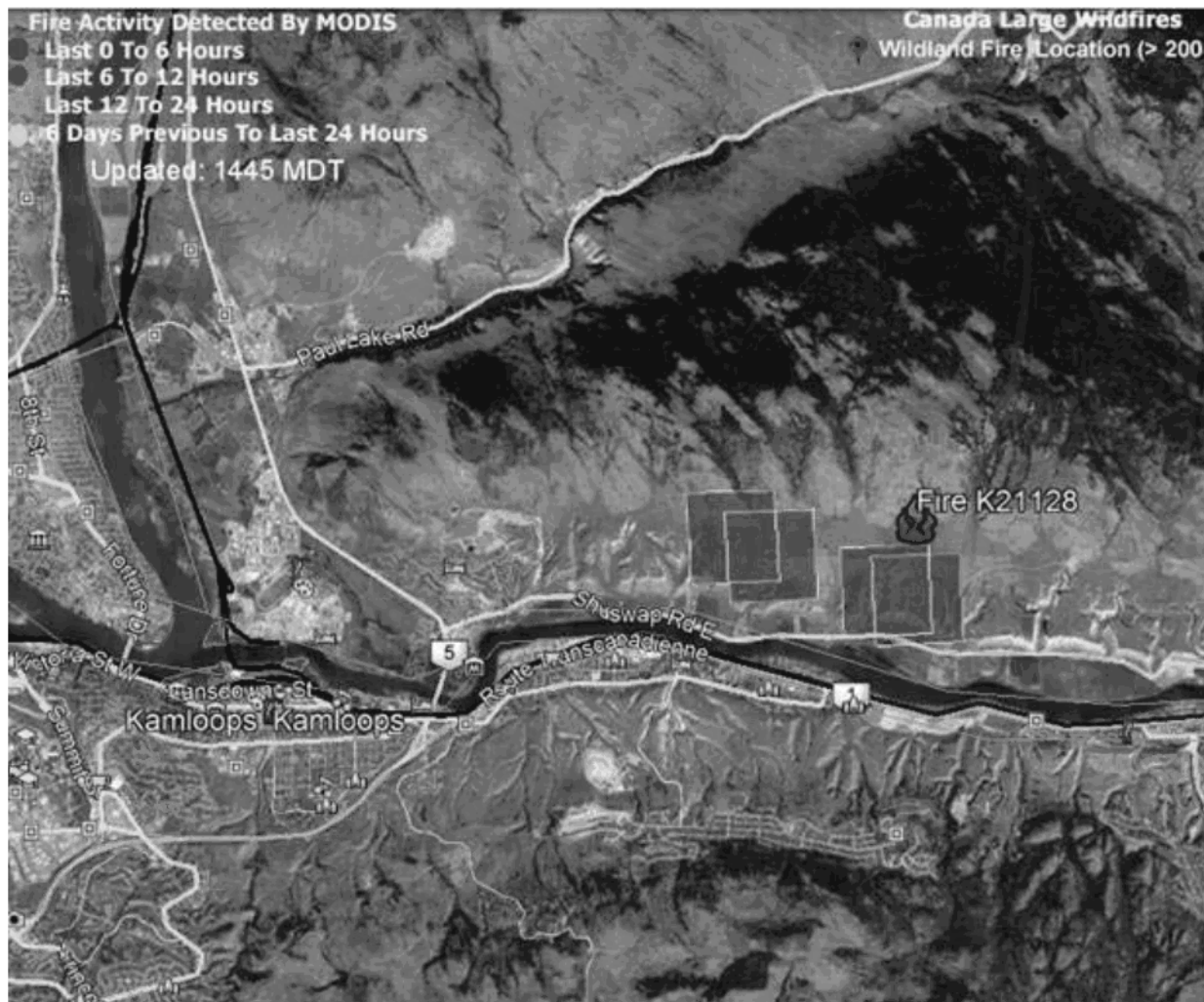

Initial Report @13:58hrs

Good afternoon. The latest information suggest the wildfire size is now approximately 20 ha's. Fire is burning in open grassland and fir/pine trees. There are values at risk in the area, but are not considered threatened at this time. There are no evacuation orders or alerts in place at this time. Airtankers are working on site in conjunction with ground fire crew support. The RDM is aware and monitoring for community support requirements.

The PDM is monitoring the situation and will provide further information if the situation deteriorates.

B.C. seniors deserve a safe, affordable place to live and services they can rely on

Every senior in British Columbia deserves the peace of mind that comes with having safe and affordable housing – yet too many can't find the secure, accessible, affordable homes they need.

Our government is working with community partners to increase the supply of housing and make sure more seniors have good homes they can afford.

In Nanaimo this week, I was proud to announce over 150 new affordable rental homes that will give seniors relief from rising housing costs. It's part of our plan to make life better for seniors and deliver affordable housing and the services they need in their communities, so they can stay close to friends and family.

Budget 2018 launched the largest investment in housing affordability in B.C. history – more than \$7 billion over 10 years to create 114,000 homes for people. Seniors on fixed incomes will benefit from investments in affordable housing across the board. As part of this plan, our government will directly fund 37,000 new affordable rental units, leverage partnerships to build even more affordable homes, boost rental assistance for seniors and working families, build over 2,500 supportive housing units for people struggling with homelessness, retrofit and upgrade existing affordable housing, and more.

This includes \$58 million over three years to expand eligibility and increase the average benefits of the Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters (SAFER) program, which provides rent supplements in the private market to low-income seniors. As a result of these changes, over 17,000 existing low-income seniors will see their SAFER benefits increase, and 700 new senior households will become eligible. The average payment for SAFER recipients will go up by approximately \$930 a year, beginning Sept. 1, 2018.

We're also working to deliver better, faster, fair access to health care for everyone in B.C., including seniors who have increasing health care needs as they age. Seniors deserve respect and quality care. That's why we're working to expand the scope of services seniors need to live in dignity – at home, in their communities, and in long-term care homes.

To get patients better and faster access to surgeries, we've launched a new hip and knee replacement program to increase the number of surgeries performed, reduce wait times, and improve continuity of care for patients. Our government has also launched a new primary care strategy with a focus on team-based care to put patients back at the centre of health-care delivery.

To make sure people can afford the prescription medicines they need – regardless of income – we have eliminated PharmaCare deductibles for people with incomes below \$30,000 and reduced deductibles for people with incomes below \$45,000. We cut MSP premiums by 50% as of January 2018, and will eliminate them completely by 2020, saving families up to \$1,800 per year and individuals \$900 per year. We also froze and rolled-back ferry fares and brought back the 100% seniors' weekday passenger fare discount.

This is only the beginning. More support for seniors is coming in the weeks and months ahead. We're going to keep working hard to making life better for everyone in B.C. s.13
