VANCOUVER – The B.C. government is launching a new, four-part surgical strategy aimed at reducing wait times for the health care British Columbians need. One of the first components of the strategy will see five hip and knee replacement programs implemented across the province, Premier John Horgan announced today.

"For far too long, far too many British Columbians were left on waitlists instead of getting fast access to the surgery they needed to enjoy full, active, lives," said Premier John Horgan. "We're getting people back on their feet faster by dramatically increasing access to hip and knee surgeries."

These programs will address the long waits faced by people. In 2016-17, 30% of people waiting for hip surgery and 38% of people waiting for knee surgery waited more than 26 weeks.

"We are embedding the innovations of the former Richmond hip and knee reconstruction project into our program because it is a public health-care system solution that is proven to work for patients", said Health Minister Adrian Dix. "Our strategy will not only mean people spend less time waiting for hip and knee replacements but that we keep up to demand for all surgeries by investing in more surgeries and implementing operating room efficiencies."

The strategy is supported with ongoing targeted funding of \$75 million starting in 2018-19 and increasing of \$100 million in 2019-20.

The hip and knee replacement programs are designed to support increased surgical volumes, reduce wait times, and improve continuity of care for patients by coordinating all the services a patient requires to prepare for, undergo, and recover from surgery. They build on the Richmond project by adding new components like dedicated operating room time, pre and post surgical support, centralized intake, standardized assessment, first available surgeon, and ongoing evaluation.

"We are thrilled to be part of this important work and announce the new hip and knee replacement centre at Vancouver General Hospital," said Dr. Bassam Masri, Vancouver Coastal Health's surgeon-inchief for Vancouver Acute and the head of the Orthopedics department. "Streamlining the intake and assessment process for hip and knee replacement surgery reduces wait times for patients, providing them with comprehensive, wrap-around care before and after surgery so they can get back to living their lives in the best way possible. With people spending less time in hospital, we are able to perform more surgeries."

In 2016-17 approximately 14,390 hip and knee surgeries were performed and by 2018-19 more than 19,250 will be done annually. The additional surgeries will mean a 34% increase in hip and knee surgeries. This will significantly reduce the number of patients waiting.

West Vancouver resident Christopher Hebb had both of his hips replaced at Vancouver General Hospital. "My recovery from the surgery was rapid and let me continue to travel for work and remain active. I hike two to three times a week with my wife and, last year, I took on the Grouse Grind for the first time since my surgeries. I plan to do it again this summer," said Hebb.

In total under the surgical strategy, 9,400 more surgeries – 4,000 additional hip and knee, 900 dental and 4,500 other surgeries – will be done across the province by the end of March 2019 compared to the previous year.

The surgical strategy has four areas of focus:

 Providing more surgeries in areas with long wait times, starting with hip and knee surgeries and incrementally tackling other surgeries with long waits;

- Investing to keep up with growing demand for all other surgeries;
- Making surgical programs and operating rooms more efficient across the province through better planning and scheduling and, establishing centralized booking and a single point of contact for patients; and,
- Making sure the right number of health professionals are in place to deliver the services needed to meet demand both now and into the future, including surgeons, anesthetists, nursing and rehabilitation health professionals.

Two backgrounders follow.

## **BACKGROUNDER**

#### **Surgical Strategy**

Increasing access to surgeries is being achieved through a four-part strategy aimed at performing additional surgeries, focusing on high priority backlogs, creating operating room efficiencies and system improvements throughout the province.

#### 1. Addressing backlogs and long waits to catch up to demand:

- Surgeries with the longest wait times and waitlists will be targeted one at a time, starting with hip and knee replacements as well as a focus on expanding access to dental surgery.
- Once caught up with hip and knee replacements and dental surgeries, the next set of priority surgeries will be determined.
- To support this, B.C. is establishing new hip and knee replacement programs, the first five opening this year, one in each health authority and adding dedicated operating room time for dental surgeries.

#### 2. Perform additional surgeries to keep up to demand:

 4,500 additional scheduled surgeries will also be performed to make sure that for all other surgeries, both scheduled and unscheduled, there is no deterioration in volumes or wait times.

## 3. Make system improvements to create more surgical access across the province:

- · Optimize the use of provincial operating room capacity.
- Create capacity for additional surgeries by making surgical services run more efficiently

   ensuring that the first case of the day starts on time, reducing the time to get the
   room ready for the next patient, minimizing early finishes and reducing seasonal
   slowdowns of surgical services.
- Expand work underway at eleven sites to implement health authority scheduling of surgeries with patients prioritized based on need, providing patients with a single point of contact, offering first available surgeon and active surgical wait list, management and improved scheduling at a further eighteen high volume surgical sites.

#### 4. Support for existing and new staff:

- Success of the surgical strategy is in part dependent on having the necessary health human resources available to provide services, by way of interdisciplinary team-based care.
- The ministry has conducted a provincial health human resource review and identified several professions needed to support the government's surgical strategy, including: anesthesia, specialty nursing, physiotherapy, occupational therapy and perfusion.
- Provide regular and ongoing education, training, and recruitment and retention
  activities to ensure the province has the necessary health human resources in place to
  achieve the announced surgical targets.
- Ongoing reporting and evaluation to meet targets.

#### Statement from the Premier on the Prime Minister's exoneration of Tsilhqot'in Nation war chiefs

VICTORIA – Premier John Horgan has issued the following statement in support of the Prime Minister's exoneration of six Tsilhqot'in Nation war chiefs:

"We welcome statements from Prime Minister Justin Trudeau exonerating six Tsilhqot'in war chiefs and apologizing for their wrongful hanging in 1864 and 1865. British Columbia also apologized and exonerated them in 2014.

"Five chiefs were imprisoned, tried and executed in October 1864 after accepting an invitation to discuss peace terms to end the Chilcotin War. A sixth chief was hanged the following year. The dishonourable treatment of Tsilhqot'in leaders more than 150 years ago by the Colony of British Columbia continues to be a source of suffering for the Tsilhqot'in people.

"Genuine reconciliation with Indigenous peoples includes acknowledging and owning past injustices, and speaking truth to our shared and troubled history. We're hopeful the acknowledgement from both the federal and provincial governments that these leaders had committed no crime or wrongdoing, and were honourably defending their lands and their peoples, will help continue the process of healing within Tsilhqot'in Nation.

"British Columbia shares Canada's commitment to transforming the Indigenous-Crown relationship. Today is another positive step in building trust as we work towards a brighter and more just future with Indigenous peoples."

VICTORIA – Premier John Horgan has issued the following statement in support of the Prime Minister's exoneration of six Tsilhqot'in Nation war chiefs:

"We welcome statements from Prime Minister Justin Trudeau exonerating six Tsilhqot'in war chiefs and apologizing for their wrongful hanging in 1864 and 1865. British Columbia also apologized and exonerated them in 2014.

"Five chiefs were imprisoned, tried and executed in October 1864 after accepting an invitation to discuss peace terms to end the Chilcotin War. A sixth chief was hanged the following year. The dishonourable treatment of Tsilhqot'in leaders more than 150 years ago by the Colony of British Columbia continues to be a source of suffering for the Tsilhqot'in people.

"Genuine reconciliation with Indigenous peoples includes acknowledging and owning past injustices, and speaking truth to our shared and troubled history. We're hopeful the acknowledgement from both the federal and provincial governments that these leaders had committed no crime or wrongdoing, and were honourably defending their lands and their peoples, will help continue the process of healing within Tsilhqot'in Nation.

"British Columbia shares Canada's commitment to transforming the Indigenous-Crown relationship. Today is another positive step in building trust as we work towards a brighter and more just future with Indigenous peoples."



- The Northwest BC Resource Benefits Alliance (RBA) is a group of local governments committed to achieving fair revenue sharing for the region through negotiations with the provincial government
- The RBA consists of 21 local governments across the Northwest from Masset to Vanderhoof and was formed in 2014 by the Regional District of Kitimat-Stikine, the City of Terrace, the Districts of Kitimat, Stewart and New Hazelton, the Village of Hazelton, and all RDKS Electoral Area Directors, the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako and the North Coast Regional District, as well as all of their member municipalities and Electoral Areas.
- RBA believes a regional approach is needed because development is incredibly industrially diverse, projects can affect several communities at once but don't fiscally benefit any and the whole region deserves a share of the wealth generated in the region.

- RBA was seeking to start negotiations in Sept 2017 and met with Premier Horgan on Sept 29, 2017.
- The RBA website notes over \$13B has been spent on capital projects within the region noting the provincial government has earned at least \$500 million in incremental revenue associated with these projects;
- Projects identified on the site included Banks Island North Wind Energy Project, Kitimat LNG Terminal, Pacific Trails Pipeline, Blackwater Gold, Kitimat Clean Oil Refinery and Pipeline and Kerr, Sulphurets Mitchell and Iron Cap.



## Statement from the Premier on the Prime Minister's exoneration of Tsilhqot'in Nation war chiefs

VICTORIA – Premier John Horgan has issued the following statement in support of the Prime Minister's exoneration of six Tsilhqot'in Nation war Chiefs:

"We welcome statements from Prime Minister Justin Trudeau exonerating six Tsilhqot'in war Chiefs and recognizing their wrongful hanging in 1864 and 1865. British Columbia also recognized the Chiefs as warriors and exonerated them in 2014 with full support from the Legislature.

"Five chiefs were imprisoned, tried and executed in October 1864 after accepting an invitation to discuss peace terms to end the Chilcotin War. A sixth chief was hanged the following year. The dishonourable treatment of Tsilhqot'in leaders more than 150 years ago by the Colony of British Columbia continues to be a source of suffering for the Tsilhqot'in people.

"Genuine reconciliation with Indigenous peoples includes acknowledging and owning past injustices, and speaking truth to our shared and troubled history. We're hopeful the acknowledgement from both the federal and provincial governments that these leaders had committed no crime or wrongdoing, and were honourably defending their lands and their peoples, will help continue the process of healing within the Tsilhqot'in Nation and across British Columbia and Canada."

"British Columbia shares Canada's commitment to transforming the Indigenous-Crown relationship. Today is another positive step in building trust as we work towards a brighter and more just future with Indigenous peoples."

Scrum notes not verbatim

Thank you for attending, you obviously attended the press conference with the Premier announced his framework for attracting LNG to bc.

We support the govt in CASA which is predicated on reducing ghg. The government talked about dropping the pst on electricity, this is a rate payer subsidy.

Neither of us are willing to support legislation based on these changes. Secondly if you plan on adding 8 mega tones of ghg and meet our targets. That means all other aspects of our economy must decrease ghg by half.

What we are saying is that our support for this government is developing a climate plan to meet our targets. We are trying to jive with adding 8 megatonnes with our ghg targets.

Q - Will you withdraw support of this govt.

A - our confidence is based on meeting ghg targets. Frankly I don't know how we are going to get a 40 percent reduction.

Q - So would you call an election?

A - we agreed to work with the bendp based on casa, and in that are firm 2030 and 2050 ghg

targets. There are many things we are exciting about in this agreement with the government, like the tech supercluster.

- Q Would you agree voting against the NDP on this bill, it won't make a difference. Will you make a confidence vote?
- A We have no problem supporting the repeal of this legislation. We would not support any legislation allowing for a pst exemption on electricity. The government will have to show us a climate plan.
- Q Are there ways to show that you don't have confidence in this government.
- A Our goal is to get the government to comply with the statues of CASA.
- Q So are there conditions you would remove your confidence vote?
- A We can remove confidence at any time, but we are not issuing a threat.
- Q If the government doesn't make changes, how would you topple the government?
- A We want to be clear, our confidence in this government is firmly embedded in CASA.
- Q Why would LNG Canada care if 3/87 members of the legislature don't support their investment?
- A We have outlined in our letter that we want to see a climate plan. We have been crystal clear that we need action on climate. If we wanted to focus our economy on LNG we would have had it by now. The problem is it is race to the bottom economics and missing other opportunities.
- Q But what about missing out on 40bn of investment?
- A Let's break down that number Les. Most of that would be pre-construction in Asia. The number is more like 7bn. Currently we are not making much money on LNG. We have often lost money or not made much. The government is trying to race to the bottom and desperately trying to get a project. There are so many exemptions: steel, carbon tax etc. The feeling I get is analogous to Justin Trudeau trying to land a Pipeline because Harper couldn't. This is similar, Horgan wants to build a pipeline because Clark couldn't.
- Q What is the point of CASA considering you are issuing a veiled threat to the government.
- A I have said this about six times, our support is predicated on CASA which is based on a climate plan. This should come in the fall.
- Q What if you don't get it in the fall.
- A that is very hypothetical. Our role is provide certainty.
- Q Isn't the job to provide certainly to the government?

You aren't listening Rob. LNG Canada has to know that our confidence is predicated on CASA which is based on a climate plan and pricing future emissions?

Q - Are you signalling to LNG Canada that this is an unstable situation?

A - We need to reconcile how we add 8 megatonnes and more cars with a reduction in ghg. We need to see evidence. If the government believes they have some magic, they must show us the magic.

Q - Are you trying to scare LNG Canada away?

A - We cannot move forward without seeing a climate plan. We cannot continue this intergenerational sellout. With the steel tariffs and most of the infrastructure being built in Asia we won't see much economic benefit. The government must show us a plan.

The NDP government must explain what's going on. Site C was predicated on providing cheap electricity to the LNG and here we see the government selling 4 cents per kwh electricity to LNG Canada.

The CASA says we would but Site C to the BCUC. The NDP campaigned on a climate plan, so now they must show us. Ironically the BCNDP rallied against LNG when in opposition and now they support it.

Q - Are you just waiting back for an election under a PR system?

A - No. For us, politics is about principle. We will not switch just because of the PR referendum. We will continue to work hard on PR and continue working within the CASA framework to develop a climate plan.

This energy advantage, combined with shorter shipping routes to Asia, means British Columbia can displace the use of higher carbon intensive fossil fuels in emerging economies, and do so with a smaller carbon footprint than other global suppliers of LNG. This comes at a time when the International Energy Agency projects that global demand for LNG will increase by 45% through 2040.

"Today's announcement also underscores the importance of regulatory

certainty and clarity, market access and fiscal incentives when competing to attract investment to British Columbia, regardless of the industry," said D'Avignon. "These factors play into the decision-making processes of not only LNG companies, but for businesses and investors of all sizes, both local and international. Regulatory complexities, uncertain timelines and new taxes and fees are placing increasing pressure on industry in B.C. and Canada. Policy makers need to take a holistic look at the cumulative impact of these developments on the overall investment climate and the long-term prosperity of the province."

British Columbia and Canada have an opportunity to create a realistic low-carbon energy and climate strategy which takes into account global realities, supports economic reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples, and leverages innovative policies and local assets in natural resources, energy and technology. We can use these exports to invest in innovations that would reduce local emissions in our built environment and transportation sectors. Limiting access to global markets for Canadian products puts at risk a national climate strategy and our country's overall economic health. The Trans Mountain Pipeline Expansion Project will also enable such access, as well as expand resource sector investment for the benefit of Canadians.

The Business Council looks forward to the anticipated final investment decision from LNG Canada and the potential, significant, economic opportunity this project and sector represents for the B.C. economy and the people of our province.

# B.C. Green Caucus releases letter to LNG Canada clarifying position on government's LNG approach

VICTORIA, B.C. – The B.C. Green Caucus released a letter sent to LNG Canada clarifying the Caucus' position on the government's proposed LNG regulations. The letter, sent on Monday March 19, came after the Caucus was was made aware of the the details of the government's proposed LNG regime. The letter is intended to give industry maximum clarity, as the minority government requires the B.C. Green Caucus' votes for general stability and to pass legislation.

"There are significant opportunities to grow B.C.'s economy while meeting our climate targets," said Andrew Weaver, leader of the B.C. Green Party. "For instance, the supercluster funding announced last month is expected to generate 50,000 jobs and \$15 billion in economic activity in B.C. in the next 10 years. Future development must fit within our climate targets, and the numbers on LNG simply don't add up."

The B.C. Green Caucus does not support extending the proposed measures to support existing Emissions Intensive Trade Exposed (EITE) industries as currently conceived to prospective LNG companies - a policy that would in effect freeze the carbon tax at \$30/tonne for certain facilities. CASA commits government to extend the carbon tax to fugitive emissions, and the

Caucus expects that this will include the natural gas industry. Further, the Caucus is concerned that increasing B.C.'s emissions through LNG developments will place an undue burden on existing industries and the public to reduce their emissions beyond what is already required.

"Not only is a plan to meet our climate commitments a core component of our Confidence and Supply Agreement (CASA) which forms the stability of this government, it is essential for ensuring we do not betray our duty to future generations." Weaver continued. "When it became clear that the government intended to propose measures that are incompatible with B.C.'s ability to meet our climate targets, we felt it was our responsibility to communicate to LNG Canada that if these measures were to go ahead unamended, we would no longer have confidence in government.

"To be clear - our Caucus is fully committed to working in partnership with the B.C. NDP government to enact a plan to meet our climate targets and in attracting the investments we need to build a 21st century economy. We will continue to hold this government to account on all its promises, including our responsibility to the next generation and our international commitments to act on climate change."

New framework for natural gas development puts focus on economic and climate targets

VICTORIA - As part of a new approach to natural gas development, the British Columbia government is overhauling the policy framework for future projects, while ensuring those projects adhere to B.C.'s climate targets, Premier John Horgan announced today.

"Our new approach welcomes investment that puts our province's people and future first, and rejects the old ways of resource development at any cost," Premier Horgan said. "Our obligation is to the people who call British Columbia home, and our job is to get the best deal for them and the generations that follow."

Under the new approach, all projects should:

- \* Guarantee a fair return for B.C.'s natural resources.
- \* Guarantee jobs and training opportunities for British Columbians.
- \* Respect and make partners of First Nations.
- \* Protect B.C.'s air, land and water, including living up to the province's climate commitments.

These four conditions form the basis for government's discussions with LNG Canada, which is moving toward a final investment decision on a project that, if approved, would be the largest private-sector investment in B.C. history. This project would see the construction of a natural gas pipeline from northeast B.C. to Kitimat, where a new terminal will process and ship LNG to Asian markets. It is expected to create up to 10,000 construction and up to 950 full time jobs in northern B.C.

"No premier or government can dismiss this kind of critical economic opportunity for the people of British Columbia," Premier Horgan said. "But neither will we turn our back on our commitment to climate targets, or our path to reconciliation with Indigenous peoples."

At the centre of the discussions with LNG Canada is a revised fiscal framework that is designed to put natural gas development on a level playing field with other industrial sectors, accessing the same fiscal policies and working within the same overall B.C. framework to achieve greenhouse gas (GHG) reductions.

The new framework, to which LNG Canada will be subject, provides:

- \* Relief from provincial sales tax (PST), in line with the policy for manufacturing sectors, subject to repayment in the form of an equivalent operational payment.
- \* New GHG emission standards under the Clean Growth Incentive Program, announced in Budget 2018.
- \* General industrial electricity rates consistent with other industrial users in B.C.
- \* Elimination of the LNG income tax that had required LNG-specific tax rates.

"The LNG Canada proposal has the potential to earn tens of billions of dollars and create thousands of jobs for British Columbians over the life of the project," Premier Horgan said. "It's a private-sector investment that could benefit our province for decades to come, but not at any price - we need to make sure the values British Columbians believe in come first."

The Premier said his government will also expect the LNG Canada project to fit within the goals of the Province's climate-change plan and, specifically, its legislated GHG reduction targets.

"We committed, during the election campaign, to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions by 40% below 2007 levels by 2030, and by 80% by 2050. That remains our goal," Premier Horgan said.

"We cannot achieve the necessary reductions in greenhouse gas emissions and do our part in protecting the global environment without a significant shift to a low carbon economy. The work for all of us - in government, business, labour and beyond - is only just beginning. And all resource development proposals must be considered within the context of our global commitment to protecting our air, land and water."

With B.C.'s new fiscal framework provided to LNG Canada this week, it is anticipated the company will make a final investment decision sometime before the end of this year.

BACKGROUNDER 1
Climate action in British Columbia

On April 1, 2018, the carbon tax will increase by \$5 a tonne annually, until 2022.

Increasing the carbon tax meets the requirements set out by the federal government's pan-Canadian climate framework. Rebates will go to a majority of British Columbians.

However, increasing the carbon tax alone will not enable B.C. to meet its long-term greenhouse gas-reduction goals of 40% below 2007 levels by 2030, and 80% by 2050. Significant new climate-action initiatives will be required in order for B.C. to meet these 2050 legislated targets, while encouraging strong economic growth. To ensure an interim target, new legislated targets for 2030 will be introduced later this year. Specific targets for each of the industrial, transportation and building sectors will also be established.

Meeting climate targets will not be easy and will require a concerted effort across all sectors to make the transition to a low-carbon economy. The addition of emissions from LNG will increase this challenge but government is committed to taking the steps necessary to achieve B.C.'s climate goals.

#### Specific Measures:

- \* A portion of the carbon tax revenue, paid by large industry, will fund a rebate program to incent the use of the greenest technology available in the industrial sector, including the natural gas sector, to reduce emissions and encourage jobs and economic growth. Some of the revenue will also go into a technology fund, to help spur new, clean technologies in all sectors, to make sure they fit within B.C.'s climate plan.
- \* The Climate Solutions Clean Growth Advisory Council (CSCG), established in October 2017, is supporting government's goal of reducing carbon pollution, preparing for the impacts of climate change and growing a sustainable economy. The CSCG is comprised of community leaders from across British Columbia, including representatives from First Nations, local government, industry, environmental organizations, academia and labour.
- \* The CSCG is providing advice on actions and policies to achieve significant greenhouse gas reductions, while taking advantage of opportunities for sustainable economic development and job creation.
- \* Immediate priorities for the CSCG include achieving emissions reductions in the transportation sector, developing pathways to clean economic growth, as well as policies to support the competitiveness of B.C.'s emissions-intensive and trade-exposed industries.
- \* Government is working to develop a framework for fugitive emissions that match the federal government's target of a 45% reduction by 2025.
- \* Government is examining every opportunity to reduce emissions from slash burning by providing alternative economic usage for slash where available.
- \* Government has initiated a scientific review of hydraulic fracturing aimed at ensuring that industry in B.C. operates according to the highest-possible standards.

#### **BACKGROUNDER 2**

British Columbia establishes new framework for natural gas development

Natural gas has a key role to play to provide clean, reliable, affordable and less-carbon-intensive options to global energy markets.

British Columbia has a vast supply of low carbon-intensive natural gas resources in places like the Montney Basin, and has been developing them to support economic growth and job creation at home for decades. B.C. natural gas is an important transition fuel that can help B.C. move to a lower-carbon economy.

While B.C. has been exporting natural gas to U.S. markets for decades, it has an opportunity to export the same fuel to other jurisdictions. To that end, government will introduce a fiscal framework that will provide fair returns to both British Columbians and investors, as well as a climate strategy that will allow B.C. to meet its legislated climate targets.

To ensure British Columbia does it better than anybody else in the world, the provincial government has four key conditions to ensure British Columbians benefit from any proposed LNG development. They are:

- \* Guarantee a fair return for B.C.'s natural resources.
- \* Guarantee jobs and training opportunities for British Columbians.
- \* Respect and make partners of First Nations.
- \* Protect B.C.'s air, land and water, including living up to the province's climate commitments.

#### **Emerging LNG Proposals**

Despite the cancellation of Pacific Northwest LNG, Aurora and Woodside project proposals, several other LNG proponents have expressed renewed interest in developing projects in BC.

#### LNG Canada

LNG Canada's proposed Kitimat project, should it proceed, represents a very significant economic opportunity for British Columbia - a project that involves one of the largest private sector developments in B.C. history.

Shell and its joint-venture partners have worked constructively to satisfy the provincial government's conditions for LNG, and British Columbia expects LNG Canada will continue to do so moving forward.

LNG Canada is also working to achieve global leadership in low-emissions technology and operations.

#### Kitimat LNG

Chevron and its partners have expressed continued interest in developing its project in northern B.C. and is focusing on the use of new low-emissions liquefaction technology.

These come as the Province is completing a climate-action strategy in place that meets the Province's greenhouse gas-reduction targets - to reduce B.C.'s greenhouse gas emissions by 40% below 2007 levels by 2030, and by 80% by 2050.

#### **New Framework**

The B.C. government has developed a new framework aimed at ensuring British Columbians receive a good return for their natural gas resource and proponents receive a reasonable return on investment.

As part of this work, British Columbia and LNG Canada jointly conducted a financial analysis of the LNG Canada project. This analysis corroborated evidence and information from internationally recognized LNG analysts that B.C. has a competitiveness issue and formed the basis of a mutual understanding upon which the Province is prepared to commit measures that will increase the competiveness of British Columbia's LNG industry.

These measures provide a framework for other industries in British Columbia in similar circumstances - they are not exclusive to the LNG industry or LNG Canada.

As it pertains to LNG Canada, the measures detailed below will only be implemented if the proponents are able to conclusively decide on or before Nov. 30, 2018, to proceed with the construction of the LNG facility and associated investments. These measures below would apply to the entire LNG sector.

#### 1. New Operating Performance Payments

Under current legislation, proponents constructing significant manufacturing facilities would receive a PST exemption on input costs, whereas those proposing to construct LNG facilities would not.

Under the new framework, The B.C. government will exempt LNG Canada from the provincial sales tax (PST), on the construction of their initial proposed facility. This will be conditional on LNG Canada entering into a separate agreement with the province whereby LNG Canada will pay annual operating performance payments over 20 years, a total amount equivalent to what LNG Canada would have otherwise paid in PST during the initial facility construction period.

This framework will be available to all proponents constructing significant manufacturing facilities in the province. Clean Growth Incentive Program

2. The provincial government recognizes that energy-intensive trade-exposed industries, including the natural gas sector, face unfair competition when competing globally with jurisdictions that do not impose carbon taxes. Proponents who make a final investment decision to proceed will be subject to the new Clean Growth Incentive Program, announced by the provincial government in Budget 2018. A benchmark for world-leading clean LNG production will be established as part of this program, replacing existing requirements under the current Greenhouse Gas Industrial Reporting and Control Act.

#### 3. Industrial Electricity Rates

Proponents who make a positive final investment decision will receive the general industrial electricity rate charged by BC Hydro. This is the same rate paid by other industrial users in British Columbia.

#### 4. Removal of LNG Income Tax

The existing LNG income tax is not the most efficient and effective tool for generating returns to British Columbia. It is cumbersome to administer and has led to uncertainties. Government intends to introduce legislation to repeal this tax and instead government will utilize a number other tax and royalty measures under its new fiscal framework, to ensure that British Columbia gets a fair return for its natural gas resource.

## New Approach to LNG

As part of establishing a new fiscal framework, the provincial government will take steps to improve the transparency and consistency with which it assesses industrial development opportunities. To that end, government intends to introduce legislation to repeal the Project Development Agreement Act, passed by the previous government, to tie the hands of future governments with respect to the rules governing LNG projects. These measures effectively indemnified proponents against changes. Government will also review and potentially cancel or repeal other LNG measures established by the previous government.

#### A budget that works for people, and an economy that works for you.

By John Horgan, Premier of British Columbia

We live in a wealthy province, but for too long our economy has only been working for the few at the top while most people struggle to afford housing and childcare, or find the opportunities they need to succeed. It's time to build a strong, sustainable economy that works for people. That was a core focus of our recent budget, and it's a core focus of this government.

Budget 2018 included historic investments in child care, and big steps to make housing in B.C. affordable for the people who liveand work here. It also included investments to generate good jobs in every corner of the province.

Our government has a broad, balanced view of the economy, and we're developing a long-term economic plan that that puts people first. Instead of looking to one sector to create jobs, we're working to strengthen traditional industries like forestry, energy and mining, while supporting small business, tourism, agriculture, manufacturing, innovation, tech and the digital economy.

We're reaching out to our neighbours to the South, and to economic partners across the pacific to expand markets and attract investment to B.C. Last week, I met with Washington State Governor Jay Inslee, and we committed to work together to deepen transportation and economic links between B.C. and Washington State. I also announced that B.C. will contribute \$300,000 to a feasibility study on a potential high-speed corridor to link Vancouver, Seattle and Oregon. That's just one of the ways we're taking action to boost opportunities and create good jobs for people on both sides of the border.

The B.C. tech sector now has more than 10-thousand companies employing over 106-thousand people. The average wages for technology jobs are around 85% higher than B.C.'s average wage. Those are good jobs we want in B.C., and that's why we're doing everything we can to and encourage the growth of B.C. tech and the digital economy.

That includes providing incentives for venture capital, investment in B.C. start-ups, not just in Vancouver and Victoria, but around the province. We're also investing in tech education and talent development in B.C. schools and adding 2,900 tech-related spaces throughout B.C. post-secondary institutions to build up the next generation of tech workers.

We're supporting small business, starting with lowering the small business tax rate from 2.5 per cent to 2 per cent and increasing grants to support B.C.'s vibrant communities and creative economy.

#### **Key Messages**

For nearly 20 years, former residents of Woodlands have fought for compassion, closure and some level of justice.

Today, the B.C. government is finally doing the right thing by extending compensation to individuals previously denied redress for the abuse they suffered at this provincial institution

When the ombudsperson released a report in 2002 determining there was systemic abuse at the institution – physical, psychological and sexual – the Province at the time would not accept the findings, which forced former residents – who include some of the most marginalized individuals in the province - to seek redress through a class action law suit.

The government of the time then tried to limit the class, through the BC Court of Appeals which restricted those who could seek compensation to those who were at Woodlands after August 1, 1974.

People who resided at Woodlands prior to 1974 will receive \$10,000 in an ex gratia payment. In addition, people who resided in Woodlands after 1974 will receive up to a maximum of \$10,000. The later payment will take into account settlement awards previously provided through the Woodlands Class Action Settlement.

Members of the new government have long advocated that the Province treat the Woodlands survivors - who have persisted against prejudice and mistreatment for decades - with dignity, fairness, and respect. In my meetings with survivors, I expressed to them my commitment to provide an avenue of redress long denied to them. Today, I hope that they feel a sense of vindication and closure.

#### **Q1.** What is being announced today?

That the Province, after nearly two decades, is doing the right thing by extending compensation to individuals

- previously denied redress for the abuse they suffered at this provincial institution
- People who resided in Woodlands prior to 1974 will receive \$10,000 in ex gratia payment.
- People who resided in Woodlands after 1974 will receive up to a maximum of \$10,000. The payment will take into account settlement awards previously provided through the Woodlands Class Action Settlement.
  - For example, a person who received \$3,000 through the Woodlands Class Action Settlement may receive up to an additional \$7,000.
- In addition, people who resided in Woodlands after 1974 and whose claims were rejected through the Woodlands' claims process will receive compensation.

#### **Q2.** Who is eligible to receive a payment?

- Former residents of Woodlands who resided in the facility prior to Aug. 1, 1974 and were excluded from the Woodlands Class Action.
- Former residents of Woodlands who resided in the facility after the enactment of the *Crown Proceeding Act* on Aug. 1, 1974 whose compensation was less than \$10,000 per person.
- In addition, the person must be living.
   Payments will not be made to a deceased's estate.

## **Q3.** How much money will be distributed in total?

 Approximately \$9.92 - \$15.8 million for payments in total to people who resided in Woodlands both prior to 1974 and post-1974, depending on how many people will receive payment, and how much they will receive.

## **Q4.** How many people are expected to receive a payment?

- It's estimated there could be up to 835
  people who resided in Woodlands prior to
  1974 who could receive an ex gratia
  payment, though the final number is still
  being determined.
- Approximately 796 people who lived in Woodlands after 1974 could receive total compensation up to a maximum of \$10,000.

# **Q5.** What is the timeline - when will they receive payment by?

- A process will be developed over the coming months to confirm address and contact information of the former Woodlands residents.
- It is expected that monies will be paid out by March 31, 2019.

## **Q6.** How can people apply for compensation?

- A process will be developed over the coming months to confirm address and contact information of the former Woodlands residents.
- **Q7.** What do people do if they cannot afford legal representation?
  - Its highly unlikely they would not need legal representation but they, or their legal guardian, will likely need to complete and sign a claim form.

# **Q8.** How will people receiving compensation be contacted?

- This will depend on the process that is set up. The government is looking at different options to facilitate this and will have more to say in the coming months.
- **Q9.** Why are you doing this now hasn't this case already been settled though

## the Woodlands Class Action Settlement?

- The Woodlands Class Action Settlement did not include people who resided in Woodlands prior to 1974. In addition, most of the people who received payment from the Woodlands Class Action Settlement received awards in the lowest tiered range of \$1,500-\$5,000.
- Our government made a promise that if
  we were elected to government, we
  would lift the Aug. 1, 1974 cut-off date
  that excluded hundreds of Woodlands'
  survivors from being able to apply for
  compensation. In addition, we are topping
  up the payments that people who resided
  in Woodlands after 1974 received to
  ensure their payments are fair and
  respectful.

# Q10. How much did people receive through the Woodlands Class Action Settlement?

- The Woodlands Class Action Settlement
  was started for all previous residents of
  Woodlands; however, on April 30, 2009
  the British Columbia Court of Appeal
  upheld the Province's application to
  exclude people who resided in Woodlands
  before Aug. 1, 1974.
- On July 7, 2010 the British Columbia
   Supreme Court approved a proposed settlement for people who lived at Woodlands after Aug. 1, 1974. The majority of awards made as part of the Class Action Settlement were in the lowest tiered award range from \$1,500-\$5,000.
- The original lump sum demand was \$20 million. The total amount of damages paid out was \$4,516,346.

# Q11. Why were residents prior to Aug. 1, 1974 precluded from the original settlement?

- Until Aug. 1, 1974 it was not possible for people in British Columbia to sue the B.C. government except in very limited circumstances. On Aug. 1, 1974, British Columbia passed a statute allowing it to be sued for wrongs it had committed.
- In the Woodlands Class Action, the government argued that because the statute did not exist until Aug. 1, 1974, it could not be sued for anything it did wrong before this date and the existence of the Crown Proceeding Act.
- Both the British Columbia Supreme Court and the British Columbia Court of Appeal ruled in the government's favour, holding that there is no cause of action against the government until the enactment of the Crown Proceeding Act.
- As a result of the British Columbia Court of Appeal's ruling, residents who resided in Woodlands before August 1, 1974 were ineligible to receive compensation through the class action.

#### Q12. What was Woodlands?

- Woodlands institution opened in New Westminster on May 17, 1878 as the Provincial Asylum for the Insane, later renamed the Provincial Hospital for the Insane. In 1950 it was renamed Woodlands School and in 1974 the name was changed again - to Woodlands.
- Woodlands was an institution that provided care primarily to the developmentally disabled and some individuals with both developmental disabilities and mental illness.
- Woodlands was operated by the Ministry of Health until June 27, 1974 on a medical

- model. After that time, Woodlands was managed and operated by the Ministry of Human Resources.
- Shortly before the Ministry of Human Resources assumed responsibility for Woodlands, the type of care provided in that institution was shifting from the medical model to the social model which recognized that residents were not ill; rather they needed additional supports.
- During the decade beginning in 1986, residents were deinstitutionalized, with the majority finding community placements.

## **Q13.** How many people lived in Woodlands?

 The population of children and adults at Woodlands ranged over the life of the institution from as many as 1,200 children and adults to a few hundred during the final phases of closure.

## **Q14.** How were people placed in Woodlands?

- Children were placed in Woodlands by the Superintendent of Child Welfare when taken into care as wards of the Province, or through the provisions of the Mental Health Act when Woodlands was operated by the Ministry of Health. After Woodlands transitioned to operation by the Ministry of Human Resources, all admissions became voluntary as Woodlands was no longer deemed to be a mental health facility and therefore the Mental Health Act had no application.
- Adults were admitted through the provisions of the Mental Health Act when Woodlands was operated by the Ministry of Health. After Woodlands transitioned to operation by the Ministry of Human Resources, all admissions became

- voluntary as Woodlands was no longer deemed to be a mental health facility and therefore the *Mental Health Act* had no application.
- Starting in 1980, Woodlands only admitted children and adults with developmental disabilities or mental illness whose needs could not be met in the community. In May 1982, Woodlands' admission policy was changed to only allow admissions for children and adults with severely profound developmental disabilities and mental illness.

#### **Q15.** What was the Need to Know report?

- In spring of 2000, the B.C. government retained Dulcie McCallum, the thenprovincial ombudsperson, to look into allegations of abuse at the residential facility. Her report, The Need to Know, was released to the public in 2002.
- McCallum found that there had been widespread sexual, physical and psychological abuse of Woodlands residents, and that it was systemic in nature in part due to a code of silence among staff.
- Among the recommendations McCallum made in her report was for government to establish a reparation process for former Woodland residents outside of civil and criminal proceedings.
- After The Need to Know report was released, the Public Guardian and Trustee (PGT) commenced an investigation on Woodlands which began in 2002, and was released in August of 2004, entitled The Woodlands Project. The PGT report, which reviewed approximately 100,000 pages of residents' files, supported the findings of the ombudsperson report.

- Q16. What was the then-government's response to The Need to Know and The Woodlands Project?
  - At the time of these reports, the thenprovincial government took the position of disputing the findings of systemic abuse and ignoring the recommendation made by the former Ombudsperson for a reparation process that would avoid litigation.

#### **Q17.** What is an *ex gratia* payment?

- An ex gratia payment is a sum of money paid when there is no legal obligation or liability to pay it.
- **Q18.** Won't this open the door to from other groups for similar *ex gratia* payments?
  - While this is a possibility, we are committed to giving the people who lived in Woodlands the respect and compassion they deserve.

- In 2016, B.C. wine exports increased 4% over the previous year to \$9.7 million shipped to 17 international markets.
- Ice wine exports were \$1.8 million of the total.
- The top markets for B.C. wine were China (54%), Taiwan (23%) and the United States (11%).

#### Woodlands' survivors finally to receive redress from provincial government

NEW WESTMINSTER – Former residents of Woodlands who attended the school before Aug. 1, 1974 will finally receive compensation for systemic abuse suffered at the provincial institution, announced Premier John Horgan.

"For nearly 20 years, former residents of Woodlands have fought for compassion, closure and some level of justice. Today, the B.C. government is finally doing the right thing by extending compensation to individuals previously denied redress for the abuse they suffered at this provincial institution," said Horgan.

People who resided at Woodlands prior to 1974 will receive \$10,000 in an ex gratia payment. In addition, people who resided in Woodlands after 1974 will receive up to a maximum of \$10,000. The payment will take into account settlement awards previously provided through the Woodlands Class Action Settlement.

"This is a historic occasion that closes this dark chapter in BC history," said Bill McArthur, Woodlands survivor. "Today acknowledges and vindicates Woodlands survivors, who I hope can live the rest of their lives with a sense of self respect and dignity."

"I want to recognize the Woodlands survivors, many who I met on this issue more than a decade ago," said

Health Minister Adrian Dix. "They have persisted against prejudice and mistreatment from the Province for decades, even after the school shut its doors and a settlement agreement was reached with some former residents. Today's announcement brings some small measure of justice for them, and I am very proud of the Premier and many advocates for making it happen."

Woodlands opened in New Westminster on May 17, 1878 as the Provincial Asylum for the Insane and was later re-named the Provincial Hospital for the Insane. In 1950 it became Woodlands School and in 1974 the name was changed again - to Woodlands. Woodlands provided care for children and adults with developmental disabilities and some individuals with both developmental disabilities and mental illness. In 2002, the then provincial ombudsperson Dulcie McCallum determined that there had been widespread sexual, physical and psychological abuse of Woodlands' residents. However, the provincial government at the time did not accept the findings of the ombudsperson's report.

In August 2002, a class action was commenced by former Woodlands residents. After it was certified, the Province sought and won a ruling at the BC Court of Appeal to exclude former students who lived in Woodlands prior to Aug. 1, 1974. This decision was applied to the settlement agreement eventually reached in 2009 and approved in 2010 establishing a compensation claims process.

"Today is a bittersweet day. Bitter, because it has taken too many years of pushing for justice for the survivors of the Woodlands institution, and sweet because finally after so long BC's new provincial government has done the right thing and recognized the systemic abuse experienced by all former Woodlands residents," said Jane Dyson, executive director, Disability Alliance BC. "Disability Alliance BC sincerely thanks Premier Horgan, his government, and Minister Dix for showing the leadership and compassion Woodlands survivors have waited so long to see."

"When I started working on this in 2006 with the now-Minister Adrian Dix, it consumed me," said David Klein, of Klein Lawyers, responsible for launching the class-action lawsuit. "I was instantly drawn in by the tremendous injustice the victims faced, and I knew I had to help guide the survivors. When I didn't have support or funds to pursue their justice, my family stepped in and we worked long nights shoulder-to-shoulder to make compensation happen. When I received the great honour of carrying the Olympic torch for the 2010 Olympics, the survivors ran with me, in my heart. This is a momentous day for Woodlands survivors and all of us."

A process will be developed over the coming months to confirm address and contact information of the former Woodlands residents. It is expected that monies will be paid out by March 31, 2019.

The payments are being made on an ex-gratia basis without admission of liability on the part of the Province.

Thousands more MRI exams to benefit British Columbians

SURREY - To give people faster access to the diagnoses and care they need, Adrian Dix, Minister of Health, has announced that 37,000 more magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) exams will be done throughout the province by the end of March 2019, compared to the previous year.

Under the B.C. Surgical and Diagnostic Strategy, 225,000 MRI exams will be completed in 2018-19, up from 188,000 in 2017-18. To meet these ambitious targets, \$11 million is being made available in the public health-care system to add resources and capacity.

"This is a bold step to dramatically increase the number of MRI exams being done in B.C., and this coming year alone, the increase will be close to 20%," said Dix. "We are delivering on our promise to restore services and find capacity in our public health-care system so that British Columbians don't have to wait months and months for prescribed exams. We know that by rebuilding and expanding capacity in the public system, we will improve access to care and patient outcomes."

Overall wait times for scheduled MRI exams in British Columbia are long, with 50% of patients waiting more than 41 days, and 10% of patients waiting more than 199 days. At the end of 2016-17, B.C.'s per capita rate for MRI exams was 37 per 1,000 population, far below the national average of 55.5.

"Wait times are simply too long in B.C., in part due to volumes that are 35% to 40% less than other provinces," said Dix. "Increasing MRI exams by 37,000 exams in B.C. this year, with further increases planned for 2019-20, will reduce the uncertainty and pain caused by long waits. Our plan is to maximize resources and employ best practices in the public system to reduce wait times and improve care."

Reaching MRI targets will be achieved by:

- \* operating existing machines longer to accommodate additional exams;
- \* establishing centralized intake at a regional level that will reduce duplicate referrals and appointments, and prevent wasted operating time, while also offering patients the earliest appointment available in a region, as appropriate;
- \* installing already-planned MRI machines; and
- \* adding additional capacity to the public system.

In addition to increasing capacity, the Ministry of Health is working with health authorities to find ways to make sure referrals for MRI are the most appropriate diagnostic choice, and that the quality of exams are consistently high to ensure patient safety, and reduce the need to repeat the exams and take up more valuable time.

MRI is one of the tools used to diagnose a number of medical conditions, including abnormalities of the brain, as well as tumours, cysts and soft-tissue injuries in other parts of the body. An early diagnosis can lead to early treatment, which can positively affect people's quality of life and return them to being contributing members of their communities and the economy.

In addition to adding MRI capacity, on March 21, 2018, Premier John Horgan announced the Province's surgical strategy to complete approximately 9,400 more surgeries within the public health-care system by the end of March 2019.

The strategy will improve timely access to surgery through a more-efficient surgical system, and help the province catch up and keep up with demand, starting with hip and knee replacement surgery and dental surgery. It will also improve patients' experiences by focusing on improving surgical pathways, co-ordination of care and information provided to patients.
