Very hard if not impossible to get the true ownership of quota. We are on the case now but will take many hours of investigation. We have a data request for this in to DFO (but they'll say they can't give it to us), and two PhD students on the case of researching shareholders through legal records, but it is not easy. License owners are listed but not quota, and even the licence owners are often shell companies. I know who bought those 50 mill and 10 mill of licences only because s.22

they give me info. Others know too as the info gets around pretty quick. But most folks will not be quoted for fear of being blacklisted which is a very real issue for those in the industry.

Re ocean ranching, definitely opposition to privatization but that is from folks who would support it generally of not privatized. The larger lobby against is those who believe it will mess with biodiversity and the prestine-ness of the wild system. Purists, single E engo's, and then there are the sports fishing enviros who fear if you build up stocks and create economic opportunity or incentives, you will ultimately be doomed to compromise the wild stocks - for them rebuilding commercial salmon fleets is bad generally, especially by way of them having more opportunity to fish, cause then they'll have more opportunity to intercept weak stocks or stocks prized by other interest groups. This group won this fight over the past many years with dfo and basically shut down the hatchery system. Japan, Russia, USA, everywhere else enhances stocks and beef it greatly from it, but BC is a playground for many deep pockets as it has the most, and most diverse, wild stocks and some believe enhancement, and/or commercial fishing period, will destroy this.

This is all in overly simple terms of course, and there are good arguments against these, but it is not all thumbs up. I think, and always have, that it would be worthwhile to do some investigating and feasibility assessments. There are

many ways and locations to do this, we do still do it in some places e.g. heiltsuk, and it can be fairly low risk under many circumstances. I think the tide is turning in favour of this one even in dfo.

There was lots of discussion at or gathering on PICCFCAF from east coast presenters and attendees on how they won the battle and got PIIFCAF (they used to be under corporate control as well). Our policy framework is essentially the opposite of this. By way of example, we have lost over 60 million of BC fishing licenses and quota to Chinese investors in the last year alone. And that is made up of just two sales we know about.

> One quick note on salmon specifically, salmon s you know matter immensely to just about everyone and give rise to great emotions -- First Nations, fishermen, engo's sport fishermen/lodges, seafood processors, retailers mongers, restaurateurs, the general BC citizen who sees it as an icon etc etc. The problem is that all of these groups have different relationship to salmon and very different ideas on how they should be used, who should benefit, and how best to manage them (mostly impacted by their answer to the former). An example of this is ocean ranching. Many people wanted me to add that to the agenda at the gathering. I could not as this gathering was expressly for addressing the urgent and immediate need to take advantage of LeBlanc's work and get us on the road to licensing change here in BC. Without this, fisheries will be a sad case in BC no matter what happens to salmon or any other species, and coastal communities and fishermen will be the losers.

> I will have meetings and put time on ocean ranching as I think it is important, a serious option to explore that could have dramatic benefits, and good timing with the rise of reconciliation and Nations strong intentions to do it. Dear Mr. Meggs:

I am writing today to share with you that Catalyst Paper will be temporarily curtailing our P11 paper machine at Powell River for approximately three weeks due to insufficient fibre availability.

As you may be aware, we've been struggling for some time to source fibre for Powell River and our other BC mills. In general, there is a shortage of available fibre in the Catalyst wood basket. This has

forced us to go farther and purchase more expensive wood to keep our operations running. Unfortunately, we have no choice but to reduce production until the affordable supply streams catch up.

The mill's P11 paper machine will be temporarily curtailed from approximately April 16 to May 7, 2018. This curtailment should enable us to increase our affordable fibre supply for the mill.

Although insufficient fiber for our operations was the driver for the temporary curtailment, the recently announced 22.16% anti-dumping duty was a key factor in our decision to temporarily curtail the P11 machine. The majority of the machine's grade mix attracts the full 28.25% in duties on the uncoated groundwood printing papers we export to the US. Our P10 paper machine has a different grade mix from the P11 machine and will continue to operate.

This curtailment will not lead to any job losses, although some employees may be reassigned during the curtailment period. The company will meet with the Unions over the next few days to discuss potential impacts to staffing.

Niki, Paula and Karen – attached are the CCFRI stats from end of day Friday and see summary below. The big difference from previous stats is that you will see opt-in rates and approvals by facility instead of by contractor/contract. One contractor can have a number of facilities covered by their CCOF contract, not all of which are eligible for CCFRI because they may not offer infant/toddler or 3-Kingergarten care. Fees can vary by facility so we may issue approval for one facility while we may need more information for another. For the next stats update, we'll include the opt-in rate by organization so we can compare to previous stats and

Base CCOF

 To date, 3,461 organizations have been sent contracts which includes 3,444 contracts sent March 18 for renewal and 17 new contracts. Of the 3,461 contracts,1,951 (56%) have been returned and are now in base funding.

Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative

- Of the renewed 3,444 contracts, 3,300 facilities were eligible to opt-in (i.e.: they offer one of the eligible care types).
- Of the 3,300 eligible facilities, 1,689 (51%) facilities have opted in. Of these, 755 (45%) have been approved.
- Of the 1,689 facilities that have opted in:
 - 1,332 applied by March 27. Of these, 569 (43%) have been approved, 6 (0.05%) are ineligible and 757 (57%) require further review (most likely because of a fee increase or incomplete information.)
 - 357 applied after March 27. Of these, 186 (52%) have been approved, and 171 (48%) require further review.

 Staff are working throughout the weekend on the applications requiring further review. Approvals are being issued to those providers that fall within a regional median of fees. Those providers above the regional median are being called to request further information to complete the review process.

Premier appoints Rental Housing Task Force to improve tenancy laws

VICTORIA – Premier John Horgan has appointed a Rental Housing Task Force headed up by MLA Spencer Chandra Herbert to advise government on how to improve security and fairness for renters and landlords throughout the province.

"Our laws haven't kept up with the changing housing market and that has left both renters and landlords vulnerable," said Premier Horgan. "This task force will connect with British Columbians, review laws in other jurisdictions and deliver the first full review of our residential tenancy laws in 16 years." DRAFT

"We have made many significant improvements to our tenancy laws in the last eight months but we still have more to do," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "This task force will give British Columbians in every region of the province an opportunity to offer their ideas on how our laws can be updated to protect renters and give landlords the confidence to put more homes on the market."

The Rental Housing Task Force will work throughout the summer to better understand what further changes may be needed to modernize B.C.'s tenancy laws, including:

- Consulting the public, landlords, tenants and stakeholders on their views and experiences with our current tenancy laws and processes within the rental industry;
- Identifying options to improve security and fairness for both renters and landlords while addressing the challenges of affordability;
- A review of the existing laws and how they apply to different housing models; and
- A review of innovative approaches in other jurisdictions.

MLA Chandra Herbert will work alongside MLAs Adam Olsen and Ronna-Rae Leonard who will make up the remaining two positions on the three-member task force.

The task force will report findings and make recommendations to Premier Horgan and Minister Robinson in fall 2018.

Thanks for taking time today to meet. Further to our discussion, I have enclosed the proposal that back-stops last week's generous financial contribution from the Government of BC. Let me know if you have any questions.

The other (inter-related) items we touched on included:

- 1. Announcement we discussed a few possible scenarios and you will connect us with Vanessa from your office in order to scope out what that could look like. In addition, I will share with you some language that we can begin to use now in our promotional activities that properly acknowledges the ongoing support and leadership of the Government of BC
- 2. Premier's Challenge we discussed the idea of the Premier promoting the adoption of the Accessibility Certification program to his fellow Premiers as a way to highlight BC's leadership. One possible platform for this could be for Premier Horgan to sponsor the Accessibility Certification program as a "featured initiative" at this year's Council of the Federation meeting in July. We will do more research on how that could work and share that with you shortly.
- 3. Procurement Policy Support we discussed the different possible ways the Government of BC could accelerate the adoption of the Accessibility Certification program by introducing accessibility language and certification requirements into procurement processes. Some of the different ways this could happen are included in Appendix B in the attached proposal. This could also be part of an announcement as well as challenge to other jurisdictions. We agreed that perhaps a follow-up meeting with Don Wright could be organized to determine how this could be worked into the overall "machinery of government".

Again, thank you for your leadership and support in getting everything over the finish line last week. The Foundation is incredibly grateful for this funding and excited to translate the province's belief in us into meaningful and lasting change for British Columbians and all Canadians.

You can't put a price on who you are

As I travel to Ottawa this weekend to meet with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and Alberta Premier Rachel Notley, I'll be thinking of the Heiltsuk First Nation.

I visited their territory after the grounding of the Nathan E Stewart tugboat, which spilled more than 100,000 litres of diesel fuel into coastal waters near Bella Bella. It was an experience I'll never forget.

The diesel slick was everywhere you looked, and the smell from the fumes was overwhelming. From our small boat, we watched the waves push diesel over clam beds that had been harvested by the Heiltsuk for centuries.

The community had been working for days alongside emergency responders to try and contain the spill and protect the clam beds. People were exhausted, and beside themselves with grief.

The devastation I saw that day is considered by some to be a small spill. s.13

And the Heiltsuk will live with the consequences for many years to come.

I'm travelling to Ottawa this weekend to stand up for British Columbia.

I'll be fighting for our coast, the tens of thousands of BC jobs that depend on oil-free coastal and inland waters, and the millions in economic activity generated by industries like tourism, film and fisheries.

I'll be representing people who are worried about a seven-fold increase in tanker traffic and the impact a heavy oil spill would have on our economy and environment.

Anyone who has walked Long Beach in Tofino, gone berry picking in Haida Gwaii, or fished for salmon in the Skeena and Fraser rivers understands what we could lose.

Anyone who lives near the proposed pipeline in Burnaby, spends summer days in English Bay, or takes a ferry through the Salish Sea understands what we could lose.

Whether a community was built on forestry or mining, agriculture or small business, an oil spill will hurt all British Columbians, cost us tens of thousands of good-paying jobs, and make it harder for people to get ahead.

The national interest is not being served if we force the risk of catastrophe on unwilling communities. Nor does it advance true and meaningful reconciliation with Indigenous peoples.

Defending our coast means defending our people, communities, and our way of life.

BC is squarely within its rights to do so.

We won't just sit back and watch things happen, giving way to interests that are not our own.

We're taking responsibility and fighting for BC's interests.

That's what our government was elected to do. That's what we've been doing. And we're going to keep doing it, as best we can, for all of BC.

We believe that people should have a say in the things that happen here. That's why we want to consult British Columbians about the transport of diluted bitumen over our rivers and streams by rail car, tanker or pipeline.

Some people take issue with BC acting in its own jurisdiction. The best way to resolve those concerns is not to bully, threaten, or pit the people of one province against another.

The way to resolve is through the courts -- clearly, fairly and decisively.

No matter how much is at stake in this dispute, you can't put a price on who you are.

The interests of British Columbians -- and all Canadians -- should come before those in Texas boardrooms.

VICTORIA – The B.C. government is building 14,000 new rental homes across the province to help make housing more affordable for seniors, families, and low and middle income seniors, Premier John Horgan announced today.

"We're building British Columbia by investing in homes for people who live and work in our communities," said Premier Horgan. "Fixing the housing crisis is not just about ownership – it's about making sure that British Columbians who rent rather than own can find homes they can afford and have a future in."

Through the new Building BC Community Housing Fund, government will invest close to \$1.9 billion over ten years to deliver safe, secure and affordable housing for B.C. renters – this housing will be built through partnerships with municipalities, non-profits and coops.

"People are struggling in the midst of this housing crisis – we need to do everything we can to make housing more affordable," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "Through the Community Housing Fund, people who have been squeezed out of the tight rental market will be able to find a place to call their own so they can stay in their community." DRAFT

BC Housing is issuing Requests for Proposals to identify prospective partners, including non-profit societies, housing cooperatives and municipalities, who want to develop and operate mixed-income rental housing projects.

"Providing new affordable rentals for low-to moderate-income families and individuals keeps them living and working in our city," said Mayor Helps, City of Victoria. "We look forward to working with the Province on developing new affordable housing for the city."

Projects will be prioritized based on a number of criteria, including targeted clients and the impact the project would have in reducing the community's affordable rental housing need.

"Non-profit housing providers have been anxiously awaiting this day – the launch of a historic investment in affordable housing," said Dean Fortin, executive director, Pacifica Housing. "We all know the fundamental importance of decent housing to enable the building of strong and resilient families and children and how important quality housing is to individuals in determining a quality of life every citizen deserves."

Quick Facts:

- Each project built under the Building BC: Community Housing Fund will reflect the following mix of incomes:
 - o 30% of the units will be for households with moderate incomes.
 - These are defined as household incomes up to \$71,200 for homes with less than two bedrooms or up to \$104,000 for homes with two or more bedrooms.
 - o 50% of the units will be for households with low to moderate incomes.
 - These are defined as household incomes below the Housing Income Limits (which range from \$21,000 to \$95,000 depending on the community and the unit size). Housing Income Limits represent the income needed to pay the average market rent. Average rents are derived from Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation's annual Rental Market Survey.
 - Rents for these units will be targeted at the CMHC definition of affordability, at or below 30% of the household income.
 - o 20% of the units will be for households with low incomes.
 - Households requiring a deeper level of subsidy, such as those receiving Income Assistance(incomes below \$15,000 to \$30,000 depending on unit size).
- Budget 2018 launched the biggest investment in housing affordability in B.C. history more than \$7 billion over 10 years.
- The Province has set a target of creating 114,000 new homes, including affordable market rental, non-profit, co-op, supported social housing and owner-purchase housing through partnerships.

Premier of British Columbia on Apology by the City of Vancouver to Chinese-Canadians April 22, 2018

Today's apology to Chinese Canadians from the City of Vancouver is necessary and important. We must recognize, remember and the condemn the historic discrimination which so many members of the Chinese community endured.

Members of the Chinese community were denied basic human rights, including the right to own property and live in a neighbourhood of their choosing. Families were broken apart by the head tax. They were denied the right to vote, and to hold public office. They were restricted to working in dangerous and undesirable jobs, and they couldn't freely pursue an education.

In 2014, the province apologized for 160 wrong and discriminatory policies and laws that targeted the Chinese community. As part of that apology we committed to stopping racism and intolerance in our communities today.

That means recognizing the role members of the Chinese community played in the history of our province, and it means celebrating their achievements both past and present.

As part of that work we created plaques and monuments at historically significant locations around the province to commemorate the contributions Chinese Canadians have made to B.C.'s history, culture and prosperity.

In March of this year, our government also published a special book which honours the achievements of over 90 British Columbians of Chinese descent. We look forward to that book being in public schools and cultural centres throughout the province this fall.

Together with the City of Vancouver we recognize the historic wrongs suffered by the Chinese community and commit to working every day to stop racism and discrimination so we can make sure these wrongs are never repeated.

Province submits court reference to protect B.C.'s coast

VICTORIA – The government of British Columbia submitted a reference question to the B.C. Court of Appeal to affirm its right to protect B.C. from the threat of a diluted bitumen spill.

The reference question concerns provincial autonomy, particularly the rights of British Columbia to regulate the environmental and economic impacts of heavy oils like diluted bitumen transported through the province. It was filed today in the Court of Appeal and can be read here [link to reference question].

"We have asked the courts to confirm B.C.'s powers within our jurisdiction to defend B.C.'s interests so that there is clarity for today and for the generations to come," said Premier John Horgan. "Our government will continue to stand up for the right to protect B.C.'s environment, economy, and coast."

On March 12, 2018, the government announced it had retained expert legal counsel to prepare and present a reference case related to B.C.'s right to protect the province's land, coast and waters.

For its reference, the B.C. government is asking the court to review proposed amendments to the Environmental Management Act that would give the Province authority to regulate impacts of heavy oils like diluted bitumen whose release into the environment would endanger human health, the environment, and communities.

"We have been clear from the outset that the appropriate way to resolve disagreements over jurisdiction is through the courts, not through threats or unlawful measures to target citizens of another province," said Attorney General David Eby. "This reference question seeks to confirm the scope and extent of provincial powers to regulate environmental and economic risks related to heavy oils like diluted bitumen."

The province has been engaged with Indigenous groups, industry, environmental organizations and local governments to improve spill response in British Columbia.

"Our government is working to protect our economy, environment and communities by making sure we have effective spills prevention, response and recovery in place," said Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy George Heyman. "A single spill of diluted bitumen would put at risk tens of thousands of jobs across B.C. We have a responsibility to ensure that every measure to reduce risks is in place, and that those responsible for spills are held accountable for fixing any environmental damage they cause."

In January 2018, B.C. proposed a second phase of regulations to improve preparedness, response and recovery from potential spills. The regulations would apply to pipelines that transported any quantity of liquid petroleum products, as well as rail or truck operation transporting more than 10,000 litres of liquid petroleum products. The proposed regulations would ensure geographically appropriate response plans, improve response times, ensure compensation for loss of public use of land and maximize the application of regulations to marine transport.

This work builds on the first phase of new spill regulations, approved in October 2017 under the Environmental Management Act, which established a standard of preparedness, response and recovery necessary to protect B.C.'s environment.

Quick Facts

- A legal reference is an advisory opinion on a point of law. The B.C. Court of Appeal is the highest court to which the Province can send a reference question.
- British Columbia's reference seeks to clarify provincial jurisdiction with regard to regulating the potential impacts of heavy oils like bitumen that would endanger human health, the environment, and communities.
- B. C. has had two recent references one regarding the constitutionality of polygamy and one related to third-party advertising in elections.

New classrooms are on the way for Surrey students says Premier Horgan

SURREY – A brand new elementary school, two additions to existing schools and the land needed to build another school will help ease overcrowding and improve classroom conditions for students in Surrey, Premier John Horgan announced today.

"Surrey students and their families have been waiting too long for new classrooms for their growing school district. The wait is over. We're getting it done," said Premier Horgan. "We are delivering the safe and comfortable schools kids in Surrey deserve." NOT APPROVED

The Ministry of Education is investing almost \$64 million to build a new elementary school in the Douglas area of South Surrey, expand Frost Road Elementary and Coyote Creek Elementary schools in Fleetwood, and buy land for a future elementary school in Grandview Heights.

"We have been working hard to accelerate the approval of capital and seismic projects throughout B.C.," said Minister of Education Rob Fleming. "These three projects and the land purchase will relieve pressure on the surrounding schools in Surrey, reduce the number of students learning in portables, and make life better for students, educators and parents."

The new \$24.3-million, two-storey elementary school will be built beside Dufferin Park and will accommodate 605 students. It will have a Neighbourhood Learning Centre (NLC) with two childcare rooms, as well as project, media and technology spaces and outdoor washrooms. This school will help relieve enrolment pressure at nearby Hall's Prairie Elementary, Pacific Heights Elementary and South Meridian Elementary. Construction is expected to start in March 2019 and complete December 2020.

"Our board has been pushing hard and working closely with Minister Fleming to obtain funding for new school spaces for our students, so it is wonderful to see the government making these investments," says Surrey Board of Education chairwoman Laurie Larsen. "I know our trustees join our students, staff and parents through-out the Surrey School District in welcoming the announcement and we all look forward to the next one."

The \$5.6-million addition at Frost Road Elementary School will create six classrooms with space for 150 more students. Four portables currently at the school will be removed at the end of construction.

Coyote Creek Elementary School's \$4.9-million expansion will add four classrooms, creating 100 new spaces for students. Two portables will be removed once the project is complete. Construction at both Coyote Creek and Frost Road is expected to begin in April 2019 with completion in June 2020.

These three projects combined add up to 855 new K-7 spaces in Surrey.

The Province is also investing \$28.9 million to purchase land for a future elementary school, at the southeast corner of 20th Avenue and 165th Street. The school will be needed to accommodate the growing number of students in the South West Grandview Heights area, and will relieve pressure at the existing Sunnyside Elementary. The Surrey School District is contributing \$1.4 million toward the site purchase.

Including today's announcement, Government has invested \$107 million dollars for two new elementary schools, three additions, two seismic upgrades and a site acquisition since September 2017. These include a new \$24-million, 655-seat elementary school in Grandview Heights and a \$9-million 300-seat expansion at Pacific Heights Elementary school.

I hope your well!

You may recall that we saw each other ^{s.22} where I also met the Premier for the first time. We spoke about the 20th anniversary of the **Coast Mental Health** *Courage to Come back Awards* on **May 10th** which I have been chairing for the past 13 years. He stated his commitment to mental health and an interest in attending. As well, Kevin Falcon mentioned that he touched base with you, so, I'm following up.

Geoff, the "Courage" awards in the largest charity event in the city and I do recall inviting you in the past. This year we will have close to 1800 guests and the who's who in the community. It is an extraordinary testimony to the human spirit and would be a wonderful opportunity for the Premier to introduce himself to a large key component of the community he may have not met. As well, the lieutenant governor will be there in one of her first appearances, s.22 in her official capacity. There will also be 10 politicians who have confirmed from the liberal side but none, so far, from the NDP or greens. We do announce our honoured guests from Government and it would be very special to have both sides represented.

We have a spot at the top of the program for Premier Horgan to speak and I'm hoping that he or another representative would like to take advantage of the opportunity to speak about this Governments commitment to mental health initiatives. You may be aware of my family's leadership role in mental health and lead gift to the new eponymous mental health building at VGH. Coast Mental Health represents the missing piece of the puzzle (housing, employment, support) which primary care does not address.

I have been holding a seat for the Premier at my father, Joe's, table s.22 and a spot for yourself at my table. It would be an honour to have you both attend, along with others from your team such as David Eby, Carole James and Adrian Dix. I know that one of "Courage's" ambassadors and a judge this year, Jessica Taylor, has spoken glowingly to both David and the Premier about the event so it should not be a surprise.

Hi Geoff

Political staff like other public servants are eligible to run in civic elections. Our terms and conditions provide for this. During the election campaign they must take a leave of absence. They are not allowed to use government resources (computers, office supplies) to support campaign efforts and they must ensure that they are not in a conflict in interest. Depending on their current position, eg senior MA in Minister of Education's office running for school board would be a conflict. Each request for leave if someone is considering running needs to be assessed on an individual basis.

Civic elections don't result typically in full time jobs so if they were successful and needed to attend a council meeting for instance, we would grant them leave to do so.

I can have staff work with Maura to pull together a communique that can be shared with staff that can include FAQs.

In meantime, please see specific policy below for both political and civil service staff:

60. Leave to Run for and Hold Political Office

60.1 OIC Categories A and B

An appointee must obtain written approval from their minister before seeking nomination to a municipal or school board office to ensure there is no conflict of interest between the appointee's duties as a public servant and the office to which they seek nomination. An appointee elected to a municipal or school board office must ensure that the duties of that office, other than the regular council or board meetings or meetings of committees of the council or board, do not impinge on the appointee's normal working hours and that there is no conflict of interest between the duties of that office and the duties of the public service position. Where municipal council or school board meetings or meetings of committees of the council or board are held during the appointee's normal working hours, the employer will grant leave without pay to attend such meetings.

60.2 Regular Employees

An employee must obtain written approval from their deputy minister before seeking nomination to a public office to ensure there is no conflict of interest between the employee's duties as a public servant and the office to which they seek nomination. The deputy minister may, on their own initiative or upon the employee's request, grant leave of absence without pay for up to 90 days immediately preceding the date of election for an

employee to seek nomination or election to office. An employee elected to a municipal or school board office must ensure that the duties of that office, other than the regular council or board meetings or meetings of committees of the council or board, do not impinge on the employee's normal working hours. Where municipal council or school board meetings or meetings of committees of the council or board are held during the employee's normal working hours, the employer will grant leave without pay to attend such meetings. An employee who becomes a Member of the Legislative Assembly or a Member of the House of Commons shall, upon written request to the Head of the Public Service Agency, be granted a leave of absence without pay for up to a maximum of five years. Employment shall be deemed to be terminated when an employee becomes either a provincial or federal minister of the Crown.
