The Hon. Dominic LeBlanc Dear Minister,

I am writing with respect to your department's recent decisions regarding Northern and Southern Resident Killer Whales in British Columbia and related Chinook salmon fisheries management. While I fully support federal efforts to recover these two iconic BC populations, your department's approach has been taking a toll on BC residents and coastal communities.

The process through which Pacific Region staff engaged with stakeholders over the recently enacted closure Southern Resident Killer Whale-related closure in the Strait of Juan de Fuca left many stakeholders questioning the value of

engaging in such a process. The final closure will have a significant impact on tourism opportunities in the community of Sooke.

Following on the heels of this closure, Pacific Region initiated an external review of critical habitat for both Northern and Southern Resident Killer Whales. Many of our Indigenous, recreational and commercial stakeholders are currently engaged in peak-season operations of their fisheries-related businesses and traditional harvests. I'm sure you can appreciate that many of those stakeholders have little time to devote to a process that could impact them profoundly. Moreover, it appears that many of these stakeholders are one of the primary sources of reliable information about whale foraging and Chinook salmon abundance for the staff at Pacific Region.

British Columbians are deeply concerned about the state of our Southern Resident Killer Whales and are prepared to make sacrifices to protect this iconic population. Similarly, British Columbians are determined to conserve our wild salmon stocks and want to ensure they are available to Southern Resident Killer Whales, First Nations, recreational and commercial fishers for generations to come. Unfortunately, it appears that Pacific Region is more focused on short-term fixes rather than on presenting a cohesive plan that will accomplish these goals over the long term. Indeed, the scientists Pacific Region assembled for the November 2017 workshop at the University of British Columbia uniformly agreed that in the absence of a cohesive plan to bolster Chinook stocks, addressing the foraging challenges facing Southern Resident Killer Whales would be incredibly difficult.

I strongly encourage your department to reconsider the timelines of its in-season consultation plan to provide stakeholders with the necessary opportunity to provide meaningful input and so your department can conduct the necessary scientific work to determine the full extent of Southern and Northern Resident Killer Whale critical habitat.

I believe that if we work collaboratively, we can develop a strategy that will produce more fish for Southern Resident Killer Whales and stakeholders alike.





Q: who would be involved in the agreements with fish farm operators, band councils, hereditary chiefs, members?

A:

There is no single universal answer as to whom is the "proper rights holder" in a First Nation.

The rights holding entity in a community varies; and the Province relies heavily on the self-determination of the First Nation themselves in terms of whom needs to be engaged.

The agreements that fish farm companies conclude should be done with the relevant indigenous rights holders from that community.

Companies can find out the proper entity for engagement for each First Nation through the publicly accessible consultation areas database, in combination with consultation and clarification from permitting agencies (in this case FLNR who is the provincial permitting agency for the fish farm infrastructure).

As a lifelong New Democrat who has worked for decades to make life better for working people, I was surprised to see your publication's claims regarding the focus of our government's efforts. I was surprised because one of the first things our government did after taking office was to reverse the last government's tax cut for the top 2% of income earners in our province. We are reinvesting those dollars into supporting public education and other programs so important for the middle class.

The last government chose to raise revenue by doubling regressive MSP premiums. These fees fall disproportionately on working and middle class British Columbians to the benefit of the wealthiest in our province. The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIPPA) contains both mandatory and discretionary exceptions to disclosure. Sections 13 to 20 are the discretionary exceptions. Where Information Access Operations (IAO) has advised the head that a discretionary exception may apply, it is important that the head consider the possibility of releasing the information despite the fact that an exception may apply.

Factors relevant to the exercise of discretion include:

- the general purposes of the legislation: public bodies should make information available to the public; individuals should have access to personal information about themselves;
- the wording of the discretionary exception and the interests which the section attempts to balance;
- whether the individual's request could be satisfied by severing the record and by providing the applicant
- with as much information as is reasonably practicable;
- the historical practice of the public body with respect to the release of similar types of documents;

I didn't agree with what they came up with... I have always preferred It's been NDP policy to support mixed member proportionality as the preferred proportional representation system"

"Our plan would be, after the election – should we be successful with the first past the post system, would be to strike a committee, and go about hearing from citizens, formulating a question at the conclusion of that putting that question to a referendum"... A. Wilkinson: Last Thursday we had quite a show put on by the Attorney General as he demonstrated that he was unwilling or unable to answer the most basic questions about the proportional representation referendum that is apparently happening someday this fall.

The supposedly neutral arbiter of the process has demonstrated in the past, through his statements and behaviour, that he is in fact deeply biased in favour of a positive outcome for that vote.

He has completely failed to avoid the perception of bias. In any judicial system, he'd be voluntarily recusing himself from the role. However, the Attorney General carries on and maintains the facade that he can be neutral.

Will the Premier keep his promise made during the election that he will establish a truly independent and non-partisan oversight process for the referendum?

Hon. J. Horgan: I thank the Leader of the Opposition for the question, but I have to say I reject the premise. I have full confidence in the Attorney General to discharge his responsibilities to this place and to the people of British Columbia.

We will be having a referenda in the fall to address the question of electoral change. That's something that we campaigned on. That's something the people on the other side of the House put into a throne speech that didn't make it past first-day debate. But nonetheless, they seemed enthusiastic about it then. I don't know why they're not now.

Mr. Speaker: The Leader of the Official Opposition on a supplemental.

A. Wilkinson: This is diagnostic of the problem. The Premier takes an arrogant, dismissive approach to this issue, which is going to be fundamental to how this institution is governed and how our province is governed.

Interjections.

A. Wilkinson: The members opposite mock the need for an objective process. Listen to them sneering at the prospect of an open process.

What we have is a record. In 2005 and in 2009, British Columbians were asked questions that were formulated by an independent body that took more than a year to develop those questions, in cooperation with the academic community, with Elections B.C. The entire process was clear and transparent.

Instead, today we have a referendum with no date. We have a question apparently to be decided by cabinet. We don't know if there will be one or more questions. There's no prospect of a debate in this House on what the questions might be. There's no set date for the referendum. There's no clarity whatsoever about any funding for organizations, both acting in favour and opposed to the referendum.

We are told nothing. The people of British Columbia are kept in the dark, and this is supposedly five months away. And we have arrogant and dismissive answers from the Premier.

To the Premier, how can he justify this charade in comparison to the 2005 and 2009 open, transparent and public engagement processes?

Hon. J. Horgan: We have had a record response to this question in terms of feedback from the public to the government and to this Legislature about where the people of British Columbia want us to go with respect to this question.

Electoral reform was a key pillar in our election campaign, as well as for the Third Party. Again, as I say, it was embraced most recently by those on the other side of the House last June.

I would say to the Leader of the Opposition that we're doing our level best to ensure that we have everything in order in a timely matter so that the public will have an opportunity to have their say on whether they want to keep the first-past-the-post system or they want to have a different approach in British Columbia.

We're committed to that, and I would hope that the members on the other side would join us in that regard.

Mr. Speaker: The Leader of the Official Opposition on a second supplemental.

A. Wilkinson: The Premier has broken his promise of a simple yes-or-no question. No debate about that. The Premier has broken his promise for regional thresholds. No debate about that. The Premier has broken his promise to set up an all-party committee on proportional representation. No debate about that. A series of broken promises.

Now the Premier falls back on an on-line contact process, for which they refuse to disclose the actual material that came in and where it came from. Was this done by bots from Zimbabwe? We don't know because they won't tell us.

This process is entirely secretive, is entirely hidden, and the Premier smirks with glee as he says: "I'm getting away with it." This is an insult to the people of British Columbia.

Will this Premier finally acknowledge that this cynical exercise is nothing more than an effort to mollify the Greens to keep his fragile coalition together?

Hon. J. Horgan: Cynical exercises are being practised by those on the other side of the House who forget their record of 16 years of indifference to public participation, their indifference to engaging with the public to get a true understanding of where the people of British Columbia want to go. We're engaging in that process now.

To suggest that I've broken a promise on a question that we don't yet know is a little bit of a reach by the Leader of the Official Opposition.

I understand that asking questions from that side of the House is new to those members, and they're going to get better at it over time. But I think they should have some patience, allow us to fulfil the commitments we made to the people of B.C. It will be known in the fullness of time. I have full confidence in the Attorney General to do that in an impartial and just way.

Materials, including the draft report, are being finalized in advance of a briefing for MGH tomorrow (I'll attend that briefing). I'll get a hold of all final docs and send them along when ready. In the meantime the ADM has sent me the conclusions and recommendations from the draft report.

Conclusion and Recommendations:

Based on the results of the audit following inspections of the 30 fish processing facilities and a review of effluent discharge quality samples, permit requirements, a jurisdictional scan and best achievable technology (BAT), it can be concluded that:

- 1. Eighteen of the 30 fish processing facilities are currently operating or plan to be operating in 2018, and are or will be discharging effluent to the environment.
- 2. Eight of these eighteen facilities operate year round and the remaining 10 operate seasonally, generally between June and September.
- 3. The tonnage of farmed salmon processed represents 67 percent of all fish processed at these 18 facilities operating in BC. All of the farmed salmon is being processed by five fish processing facilities.
- 4. Two of these facilities processing farmed salmon, process greater than 60 percent of all fish. One other facility, processing exclusively wild finfish, processes nearly 20 percent of all fish. The tonnage of fish processed by the remaining 15 facilities represents less than 20 percent of the total fish processed and less than 10 percent of the total farmed salmon processed.
- 5. The effluent discharges are also regulated by with Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) and Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) under the *Fisheries Act*, which prohibits causing serious harm to fish and the deposit of deleterious substances into waters frequented by fish. The effluent discharges are also regulated by the DFO and Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) co-led National Aquatic Animal Health Program, which prevents the transfer of pathogens and the DFO administered the *Species at Risk Act*. This *Act* currently lists in BC, chinook, coho and sockeye salmon as endangered, threatened or of special concern.

- 6. A jurisdictional scan of seafood processing waste discharge legislation, standards and guidelines identified almost no requirements or environmental standards of effluent discharges.
- 7. A consultant's review of the existing data and knowledge of piscine orthoreovirus (PRV) in BC determined that, researchers have been unable to demonstrate a causative relationship between PRV and Heart, Skeletal and Muscle Inflammation (HSMI) disease, testing for PRV does not indicate whether the virus is viable and without the ability to test for the live virus, it is unknown what the efficacy of wastewater disinfection is for PRV.
- 8. The fish processing facilities were In Compliance with 44 percent of their permit requirements and Out of Compliance with 22 percent of their permit requirements. Compliance was Not Determined for 10 percent of all requirements and Not Applicable for 24 percent of all requirements. The instances of non-compliance were due to:
 - a. Exceeding discharge rate;
 - b. Exceeding discharge quality;
 - c. Modifying authorized treatment works without approvals;
 - d. Failure to post outfall signage;
 - e. Failure to conduct outfall inspections;
 - f. Failure to conduct monitoring or sufficient monitoring of the discharge rate, discharge quality or receiving environment quality; and
 - g. Failure to submit required data or reports.
- 9. Effluent discharge samples were collected at eight fish processing facilities that were currently operating and discharging to the environment at the time of the inspectiosn. These included facilities that process farmed salmon, wild salmon and wild finfish and seafood as well as facilities that have treatment works that ranged from only fine screening to fine screening in combination with primary treatment and disinfection.
- 10. The effluent discharge quality and toxicity results indicate that typical undiluted fish processing facility effluent having passed through current treatment works is frequently acutely lethal to fish due to high levels of BOD, COD and TSS. Once released into the receiving environment effluent mixing and dilution occurs potentially reducing harmful concentrations of contaminants.
- 11. The requirements of the 30 EMA permits, which were assessed in this audit do not contain consistent wording or requirements. All permits contain a maximum discharge rate; however, only some permits set effluent discharge quality limits, have maintenance of works, bypass and process modification requirements, outfall posting and outfall inspection requirements, discharge rate, discharge quality and receiving environment quality monitoring and reporting requirements.
- 12. Most of the current permits do not contain foundational environmental protection provisions. Some inconsistencies are expected due to the site-specific nature of permitting; however, the permits frequently do not contain effluent discharge quality limits and monitoring and reporting requirements for discharge rate, discharge quality and receiving environment quality.
- 13. Most of the current permits authorize treatment works that utilize treatment guidelines developed in 1975 and are generally limited to fine screening.
- 14. Best achievable technology (BAT) for the sector includes: preliminary treatment (solids removal), primary treatment (suspended solids removal), and disinfection where required to control the spread of fish pathogens. The authorized treatment works of 24 of the 30 fish processing facilities is limited to preliminary treatment using fine screening. Two of the 30 permits require fine screening and also primary treatment and disinfection. These two facilities, process nearly 40 percent of all farmed salmon and 40 percent of all fish.
- 15. BAT for facilities operating continuously for more than six months of the year also includes secondary treatment (soluble BOD reduction). None of the 30 permits currently require secondary treatment.

16. Many of the permittees indicated that the costs associated with additional treatment would be too much of a burden on their current budgets and would likely mean that in the event that they are required to add additional treatment, they would have to discontinue the operation of their facilities.

It is recommended that:

- 1. The existing permits be amended to include foundational environmental protection provisions such as:
 - a. Numerical values for effluent discharge quality, in particular BOD, COD, TSS and nutrients. ENV should engage with DFO and ECCC to ensure that these values consider existing legislation such as the *Fisheries Act*, to ensure that the effluent discharge quality limits do not cause serious harm to fish and the effluent would not be considered a deleterious substance;
 - b. Monitoring for effluent discharge quality and toxicity;
 - c. A well-designed receiving environment monitoring program; and
 - d. An interpretation of the receiving environment data and an assessment of the impact of the discharge on the environment.
- 2. The existing permits be amended to include consistent and verifiable requirements for all permits to the extent possible without limiting the site-specific nature of permitting. Wherever there is a limit or rate, there must be requirements to monitor and report. Wherever there is an authorized works, there must be requirements to maintain the works and to not bypass the works or modify the works without notifying ENV.
- 3. The amending of the existing permits should prioritize facilities based on relative environmental risk, the existing treatment technologies, the tonnage of fish processed and the volume of effluent being discharged.
- 4. The fish processing facilities develop and review their Standard Operational Procedures to reduce the volume and improve the quality of the effluent discharged to the environment.
- 5. The treatment capabilities of best achievable technology (BAT) should be considered in determination of effluent discharge limits.
- 6. In the event that BAT is not possible to achieve effluent discharge quality limits, that the fish processing facilities consider alternatives for effluent disposal including connection to a municipal sewerage system, if possible.

- Monitoring of "politically exposed persons" is not a specific requirement for the casino sector in Canada. However, BCLC takes a proactive approach to conduct due diligence in this area, including with background checks and source of funds interviews. If BCLC identifies a patron as a "politically exposed person," the patron will be flagged and placed into the appropriate risk category based on the outcome of BCLC's screening process. The player's activities will be monitored as per legislative requirements.
- The Proceeds of Crime (Money Laundering) and Terrorist Financing Act & Regulations place no requirements on the reporting entity to immediately terminate a business relationship based solely on the fact the patron is a confirmed "politically exposed person." The prescribed measures are risk based. Note that "politically exposed persons" include classes of individuals, such as every deputy minister and court of appeal justices, under the legislation.
- As part of BCLC's AML Program, BCLC may place certain conditions or requirements on patrons. When BCLC
 receives credible information regarding a patron or a particular source of funds deemed to be of high risk, BCLC
 will immediately act on that information, which can include placing the patron on various conditions or barring
 the patron from all gambling facilities in B.C.
- BCLC reports all suspicious financial transactions to FINTRAC and local law enforcement agencies for further investigation. BCLC also reports all conduct, activity or incident that involves the potential commission of an offence under the Criminal Code or Gaming Control Act to the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch.
- BCLC does not allow third-party buy-in transactions at B.C. gambling and entertainment facilities. We cannot comment on activities at offsite locations.

Request

I am freelancing a feature article for a Canada-US magazine, based in Seattle, about salmon-fish farms. I have two sets of questions related to "Salmon Treaty" talks, and BC's review of fish processing plants.

"Salmon Treaty"

On March 16th, at a joint-newser seated beside B.C. Premier Horgan in Vancouver, Washington Gov. Inslee described negotiations for a "Salmon Treaty" with Canadian jurisdictions. Gov. Inslee said he was hopeful the "treaty" talks would conclude in the "weeks ahead" to protect salmon along our shared coast. That timeline would put us to about now.

- 1. What is the status and purpose of these "Salmon Treaty" negotiations with BC, described by Gov. Inslee?
- 2. Technically, is this a Canada-US "treaty", or some kind of other agreement between Washington state and B.C. (and possibly other jurisdictions)?
- 3. Do those negotiations for a treaty/agreement touch upon salmon aquaculture farms (a.k.a. fish farms)?
- 4. Does the "Salmon Treaty" described by Gov. Inslee have anything to do with negotiations for an updated "Columbia River Treaty"?

BC review of fish processing plants

In December, Minister Heyman announced a review of fish processing plants, in the wake of a "blood water" video that went public.

- 1. What has this B.C. review found so far?
- 2. A Dec. 20 CBC report said in December that the province conducted its own tests of the blood water, but "the results [were] not back yet." Are those provincial test results back in now -- and if so, what have tests shown?
- 3. What efforts, if any, is the BC government exploring to move BC's salmon fish farms inland? Deadline: end of week (May 4) if possible.

Background

Recommendation

Provide the following bullets on background:

Attributable on background to Ministry of Agriculture

- The treaty Gov. Inslee was referring to is the Canada-US Pacific Salmon Treaty (PST)
- The Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) is the Canadian lead on the PST negotiations.
- Detailed comments about negotiations and the current process need to be sent to DFO, as the lead agency.
- The PST represents a bilateral Pacific salmon agreement that addresses conservation and harvest sharing on a coast-wide basis. It provides a forum for the countries to meet and develop coordinated fisheries management plans to achieve the objectives of Treaty conservation and sharing.
- The Province has participated in the Pacific Salmon Commission (PSC) process since the Treaty was signed in 1985.
- The Province has had a Commissioner representing its interests at the table since 2001.
- The BC Commissioner is appointed by the federal Minister of Fisheries and Oceans. Paul Sprout is the current appointee.
- No, the PST does not have a connection to the Columbia River Treaty.

Attributable on background to Ministry of Environment

- Following an announced review of fish processing plants on December 20, the provincial government initiated inspections of the 30 fish processing plants with provincial permits. The inspections will review whether:
 - o Effluent discharge is potentially causing harmful pollution
 - o Current authorizations contain strong environmental protection provisions.
 - o Current authorization holders in the fish processing sector are in compliance with their permit.
 - o Best achievable technology (BAT) is being used in the treatment of effluent from fish processing plants.
 - * Audit is on track to be complete by May 31, 2018.
- * Once inspections and data collection is complete, Ministry staff will be reviewing permits and/or regulations to require that best available technology is used in the treatment of effluent from fish processing plants to protect wild salmon stocks.
