Government events and activities are below.

Premier Horgan will participate in the Canadian Cancer Society Daffodil Month ceremony.

Minister Eby introduces amendments to the International Commercial Arbitration Act. The amendments aim to position Vancouver as a more desirable location to host international commercial arbitration proceedings.

Minister Bains introduces amendments to the Employment Standards Act to extend BC's parental leave, permit earlier pregnancy leaves, extend unpaid compassionate care leave, establish unpaid leave for parents of missing children resulting from a crime, and establish unpaid leave for parents of a deceased child due to any reason.
