Thank you for pulling these resources together. I think it would be helpful to include some culturally relevant resources as well, as EFAS as not yet been able to provide culturally relevant counselling to indigenous youth interns, colleagues, s.22

As well, there are some teachings from elders to go spend time in nature, a place that resonates with you. Whether it be in the forest, by the ocean. An elder shared a teaching to throw four rocks into the water, one at a time, with each rock acknowledging and letting go of heavy feelings or thoughts you may be carrying. Another teaching is to sit outside, and be open to any teachings that nature may have to offer you.

The First Nation Health Authority also provide counselling to First Nations from BC, and they have a [page on traditional healing](#).

As well for survivors of residential schools, I know we have a few working in government at least, there is a [federal page](#) for 24 hour crisis line. They also have a [great page/brochure](#) on coming with emotional responses and some self-care strategies.

Hi Jeff,

I'm glad we're able to connect. I manage the Employee & Family Assistance Services (EFAS) contract provided by Morneau Shepell, and our team (the Workplace Health and Safety branch of the PSA) is also responsible for a number of other health and wellness initiatives. My initial idea was to add several slides directing people to appropriate resources for additional support as may be required. The services that I thought might be the most relevant, although I'm definitely flexible on what we highlight, would be:

- Discussing how to access EFAS/eligibility (many people don't realize that ALL employees are eligible to access these services, as are any family members who normally reside with them)
- Service focus would be on short term counselling as I'm guessing that would be the most appropriate given the topic?
- Secondary focus could be on the People Leader Advice Line as a resource for managers/supervisors

Please let me know when you might be available to discuss this further.
