Subject: For your consideration an alternate approach to the Greyhound conundrum

I see MCT has commented today on her meeting with fellow transport Ministers on Thursday and on the prospect that other operators may take over "some routes" in BC.

I want to suggest another approach, which could better meet the needs of communities and not burden government with what seems to be inevitable and difficult demands for subsidies to deliver infrequent service to some locations.

I think one of the reasons Greyhound sank is that many people are already using online ridesharing message boards and services, both for traditional ridesharing (I'm driving to Calgary, want to share the cost of gas?) and more moneyfocused services. A quick look at Craigslist demonstrates: https://victoria.craigslist.ca/search/rid

I think it would be a great idea to really think through whether this is an opportunity to move to a "rural ridesharing" model.

A ridesharing service that supported long trips, had the driver-checks and customer rating features of ride sharing apps, and the flexibility of getting a ride when you need to be in the regional centre at 10:00 am for a doctor's appointment, not catching the bus 14 hours before time. This is a growing field in the states as this slideshow talks about: https://www.slideshare.net/rpoamerica/liberty-mobility-now

Manitoba has GoManitoba, which seems to focus on more traditional ridesharing/commuting, but the platform has an option for single trip rides and if you want to commute the 200km from Brandon to Winnipeg five days a week, three people are online looking for passengers. https://www.gomanitoba.ca/Public/Home.aspx

There is an opportunity to engage with communities around the province, and see if there are partnership opportunities that the province can make real, instead of solutions that people demand the province provide.
