I mentioned to you after our meeting last year that I'd keep you updated about BC's glaciers and how they are affected by recent climate change. I've attached an advanced copy of a paper that will be published next week (15 January, 2018). I wanted to give you a heads up about our work before we comment about it to the press next week.

We plan to continue our work with a new collaborative project with the Hakai Institute on ways to better monitor our seasonal snowpack, our glaciers and how wildfires may accelerate changes in our snow and ice.
