The worst case cost for an individual change their name and gender and replace their provincial ID (Birth Certificate, BCID or BCDL, Service Card)is: 581\$. Cost to government is \$301: (191 to vital statistics; 51-75 + 15-35 to ICBC).

This does not include a nominal fee payable to vital statistics to retrieve a person's original birth record. This is an option for people who have lost their original birth certificate. For British Columbian's born outside of BC, they pay the gender change fees to their home province (in order to get a correct birth certificate), but everything else on the list is still required.

For people born outside of Canada who cannot change their birth certificate, there is an additional oath people can swear (cost to notary \$100+) which entitles them to a BCID, BCDL, Service card without proving an amended birth certificate.

Thanks for running this by me. Feel free to share my remarks with Shannon or anyone else to whom it might be useful.

The option you propose will be contentious. There are two problems.

The first is that the X is a compromise between two deeply entrenched positions, and the second is that the X is voluntary, and applicants must pay to access it.

There is a division in our community. One side, organizing as the gender free ID coalition supports the mandatory removal of all ID markers from all ID. http://gender-freeidcoalition.ca/. They want assigned sex to still be recorded in the aggregate, but not to be noted on any government forms. This is the option Ontario has take for the Ontario Health Card. Notably they want this change for everyone, not just trans people who elect to have it. This group view the X option as dangerous, because it singles people out. It also fails to make systemic change because cisgender people continue as they are, and are not aware of how they participate in a binary gender system which is oppressive to many.

The other side of the community takes a more binary view of sex, and they feel they need to have a gender marker (particularly an F) on ID because they struggled very hard to be recognized as the gender they are, and for vulnerable trans women, it is sometimes required in order to prove they belong in womenonly facilities. This side supports an optional X, as long as it isn't mandated.

I'm sure you know all this.

The X initiative will be perceived as a trans inclusive move by the public, and by the growing number of folks who identify as non binary. The gender free ID coalition will be critical perhaps.

A slightly more politically courageous solution that would please everyone, would be a scheme in which people could choose an M, F, X U (unspecified) I (intersex) or be able to leave the field blank. This also solves the problem of parents who oppose having to gender their infants before those infants are old

enough to express a gender choice. This is particularly important for intersex people. I understand there is at least one active Human Rights complaint on behalf of a minor on this issue.

An amendment of the Vital Statistics Act to remove the mandatory inclusion of a sex marker on the one form register of birth and the birth certificate would be required, along with changes at health and ICBC for service cards and BCDL/BCService cards requirements, application forms, and fees.

Because the choice of an F would still exist, this option would not upset women who are very proud of their F, or people who need to show one for safety. Because a sex marker could be obscured it would please the coalition.

Icing on this cake would be a fees amnesty for trans people on gender markers and name changes, and the replacement cost of ID. This is is an expense faced disproportionately by the trans community. It can cost 500\$ between federal and provincial documents to change a person's name and gender marker to align with their gender identity.

I saw the Attorney General at a legal conference earlier this month and he asked me for a letter outlining which of those fees are provincial. I'm recovering from surgery and have not yet written that letter, but the applicable fees are:

The cost of a fee amnesty to government could be estimated by collecting from the number of people who apply to the Vital Statistics office in Kelowna for a gender change, adding 20% (for people who might apply if there was a non-binary option) and then adding the cost of a name change and replacement ID costs.

November 20th is Trans Day of Remembrance and it would be a more suitable day to announce than the 1st because we could say we've heard from the community that being misgendered it dangerous, and here is what we are doing to help.

As for the sex/gender problem, I have surveyed the law in British Columbia and there is little distinction between sex and gender in the legislation. Sex of course is a physical trait. All British Columbian's have ID that lists the sex they were assigned at birth, unless they are trans people who have requested (and can afford!) to change it, in which case it is a gender marker.

For cisgender people, their sex marker is also a gender marker. For trans people, calling it a sex marker is potentially hurtful because for us it is either an incorrectly assigned sex, or a gender marker.

I recommend government communications refer to this as a gender marker.

Here is the briefing for the Labour Force Survey results for October 2018.

B.C.

- In October, employment decreased by 1,100 in British Columbia to 2.515 million.
- There was an increase of 12,100 in part-time employment and a decrease of 13,300 in full-time employment.
- Year-over-year to October 2018, there are 48,400 (2.0%) more people employed in British Columbia.
 - o British Columbia has the third highest year-over-year rate at 2.0%.
 - Prince Edward Island has the highest year-over-year employment growth at 5.6%. Nova Scotia is second at 2.1%.
- In October, the unemployment rate decreased to 4.1% from 4.2% in September as fewer people looked for work. British Columbia has the lowest unemployment rate in Canada for the 14th month in a row.
 - Quebec was second at 5.3% in October and Manitoba was third at 5.8%.
- Youth (age 15-24) employment decreased by 5,800 in October. The youth unemployment rate decreased to 6.7% as fewer young people looked for work.
 - British Columbia has the lowest youth unemployment rate in Canada. Quebec has the second lowest rate at 9.1%.
- Average hourly wages are up \$0.07 from \$26.73 in September to \$26.80 in October, a slight increase of 0.3% from the previous month.
- Year over year wages are up \$0.58, an increase of 2.2%. This was the third highest year over year growth amongst the provinces, behind Ontario at 3.5% and Newfoundland at 3.4%.

Canada:

- Employment increased in October by 11,200.
- The biggest gains were in Quebec (9,100). Saskatchewan and Ontario each had a gain of 2,500.
- The unemployment rate decreased to 5.8% in October. The unemployment rate is 6% or lower for the twelfth month in a row.

Housing prices have spiraled and years of neglect have left the province in a crisis.



Evan - as requested info on PRES and messaging follows:

The PRES (Peace Region Electricity Supply Project) is a new proposed 230 kV double-circuit transmission line which would run approximately 57km from the new Shell Groundbirch Station located about 30 kms east of Chetwynd to the future Site C substation.

- It would add around 400 MW of capacity in the South Peace and improve service reliability for existing load served by the Dawson Creek/Chetwynd Area Transmission (DCAT) Project.
- Estimated cost to build the line is between \$204 million and \$360 million.
- Demand for electricity is growing in the South Peace Region, mainly due to unconventional gas production and companies wishing to use clean electricity from BC Hydro to power their facilities.

- To meet this need, more electricity needs to be supplied.
- BC Hydro recently completed Dawson Creek/Chetwynd Area (DCAT) transmission line as a first step.
- BC Hydro's proposed Peace Region Electricity Supply Project (PRES) is designed to bring additional clean, renewable electricity from its generating facilities to the south Montney area.
- The PRES project offers the opportunity to realize significant GHG reductions as producers choose to run their operations with electricity off the grid rather than selfgenerate using gas or diesel.
- Full electrification of expected new industrial loads in the Montney Basin – enabled by PRES and other transmission lines – could avoid up to 4 million tonnes of emissions per year.
- Consultations with First Nations and local governments on the PRES project have been ongoing since 2013, and will continue as the project is further developed.
- The Government of B.C. along with Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba are working with the federal government to evaluate electricity projects, including the PRES, for their ability to cost-effectively reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.

 Based on the outcome of these studies, the federal government, through the Green Infrastructure Fund, may share project costs to provide the necessary capital to develop the required infrastructure needed to reduce GHGs through upstream electrification in the northeast.

Evan – you requested I follow up on when the feds will be making a decision on funding BC Hydro's PRES project. You'll recall we were hoping for mid to late Oct. Now looks like the fed TB decision will be mid-Dec

Making sure B.C.'s forestry sector has a strong, sustainable, future

By Premier John Horgan

From day one, our government has been about people. We're working every day to make life better for people all over the province. That means investing in good-paying, sustainable jobs in every corner of B.C., including in B.C.'s iconic forest industry.

The forest sector is a cornerstone of economic activity in British Columbia, supporting families, communities, and jobs across our province. As a major manufacturing and export industry, there are forestry jobs all over B.C. In rural and remote communities, forestry employs more than 57,000 British Columbians and supports over 7,000 businesses. One-third of our exports are forest products, which means that forestry jobs also extend into urban B.C., in occupations such as transportation, warehousing, shipping, towing, customs, accounting, sales and marketing and others.

Given forestry's long history in B.C., it would be easy to view the industry as part of the 'old economy' – different and apart from our growing technology sector. Fact is, forestry is a significant customer for parts of B.C.'s technology industry, and technology is central to every part of modern forest management.

Today's foresters use satellite-enabled technologies to see through the forest canopy to direct harvest planning, monitor site conditions and respond more effectively to wildfires. Drones are used to cost-effectively scan large areas of forest. Technology makes harvesting operations safer, and allows remote-controlled machines to access slopes that would be too dangerous to harvest by hand. Modern lumber manufacturing is high-tech too, using scanners to optimize the use of each log and computer-linked machinery to guide each step of processing logs into lumber. New products like Cross Laminated Timber (CLT) create additional jobs and value from our lumber, and make it possible to build strong, safe skyscrapers from wood.

Wood products are used in tall applications and small ones, from the 17-storey Brock Commons student residence at UBC to the 2,000 new supportive modular homes that were built in 22 communities during 2018 to help address B.C.'s homelessness crisis. Wood building materials can also help British Columbians tackle climate change and spur a greater demand for top quality manufactured wood products as a clean, natural, healthy, renewable building material.

Government is working with First Nations, communities and the industry to develop a fair, lasting strategy to strengthen forestry all over B.C. I asked Forests Minister Doug Donaldson to lead the Coastal Forestry Revitalization Initiative, which will renew our forest policy framework, help to expand domestic manufacturing, encourage getting more value out of every log, provide new opportunities for First Nations and encourage innovation and a better business climate.

We're moving forward on our government's commitment to implement UNDRIP and to build a true partnership with First Nations based on rights, respect and reconciliation. In the forest sector, we're continuing to explore ways

Indigenous communities can benefit from forestry activities on their lands. The Province recently entered into a unique community forest agreement for the Qala:yit Community Forest – the first of its kind in B.C. The Pacheedaht First Nation, BC Timber Sales, Cowichan Lake Community Forest Co-operative, and Province are all working together to create good jobs and more opportunities for people in the Cowichan Lake communities. Partnerships like these will inspire new ventures and processes of working together, protect the environment, promote economic opportunity and growth, and manage land and resources.

Across B.C., 2018 was another devastating wildfire season, with over 1.3 million hectares of land impacted by wildfires. Hundreds of industry contractors assisted the BC Wildfire Service in fighting the fires and keeping communities safe. Thanks to everyone's dedication and hard work, not one life was lost. Acting on lessons learned during 2017 and 2018, as well as the recommendations from the report by George Abbott and Chief Maureen Chapman, the BC Wildfire Service is looking at changes to be better prepared for 2019 wildfires.

The TLA selected a theme of "Making it Work" for your January 2019 convention, representing so much that is going on across the forest sector as well as your organization's 75 years of representing logging contractors and other members. In that regard, I am pleased that Dan Miller has been able to help logging contractors and licensees reach agreement to work together on developing rate models and rate determination factors.

Looking forward, B.C.'s forest sector continues to explore innovative ways to make better use of our vast resources. Together with partners in all parts of the industry, our government is working to grow demand for our wood products, design services, and building technologies and to expand foreign markets for B.C. lumber. We're working hard to make sure B.C.'s forest industry has a strong, sustainable future – for everyone. I look forward to working with you to continue building a better British Columbia.

FYI and further to our discussion please note the attached. First is the current distribution list for the SA media monitor package (twice daily). Second is the current services profile. It is true that only the first hour of Thind is monitored and then summarized by our single S Asian Online Editor, Ajaib Sidhu. This is a resource issue – were we to do all three hours it would impact the ability to cover the other daily media. The other significant pressure that is faced is the request for transcripts (in English) – usually from staff who would like to follow exactly what their minister (for ex) said on air. This is possible for short excerpts but becomes very difficult to manage for complete programs. The rule of thumb is 1:4 i.e. a five minute segment would take twenty minutes to transcribe in English, and so forth.

I'll be looking at the package to see what we might do about form and content. Also note Scott's suggestions about additional media to be included.

At the briefing in October by senior deputy ministers on the LNG Canada deal, we were told Site C won't provide enough energy to meet the province's electrification needs, and that we are going to need a lot more renewable power. Can you provide me with the latest numbers of what the gap is? So in the year 2030, with the status quo plans, we will have XX amount of capacity and Xx amount of demand for electricity? What capacity does B.C. presently have for hydrogen fueling stations, and how many hydrogen-fueled cars are on the road in B.C. today?

I probably will have another question or two as I dig deeper into this topic, but hope you can get me started with this.

Suggested Responses:

GCPE to offer an interview and provide the following on background:

Q: What info can you send me on the cost of household heating – electricity versus natural gas – both for northern B.C. and for residents in the milder regions? Depending on the source, I've read that heat pumps *can* be comparable to natural gas for home heating under certain circumstances.

A: Energy bill savings for the average home switching to a heat pump would be in the range of 5-10%. Homes in the northern parts of the province use more energy on heating, but could see similar percentage savings provided they are using cold-climate heat pumps that work year round.

Commercial Renovation Program:

Program for commercial buildings, multi-unit residential buildings and nonprofit housing.

envelopes.

Up to \$20,000 for energy studies to identify cost-effective improvements.

4,900 new affordable rental homes on the way for B.C. families

By Premier John Horgan

Every person in this province deserves a secure place to call home. But years of inaction on the B.C. housing crisis has left people unable to find affordable housing, and even middle-income families struggling to get by. We're making different choices.

On Tuesday, our government made a historic announcement - 4,900 new affordable mixed-income rental homes will be built in 42 communities around the province. This new housing is the first to be delivered through the Building BC: Community Housing Fund, a \$1.9 billion investment over 10 years to deliver 14,000 affordable rental homes for seniors, families, and low-and-middle income earners in B.C.

From Surrey, to Kamloops to Vancouver and Vanderhoof, the 72 projects will include new, affordable homes for people across a range of income levels.

The non-profits and co-ops will be built over the next two to three years. The new homes are designed to address the need for affordable housing for middle, moderate, and low-income earners, in response to a housing crisis that has made housing unaffordable for even middle-class families. The units will also include heavily subsidized rentals for seniors and people with disabilities, and homes for low wage workers.

It's an important part of our work to take action on the housing crisis and give people a break from skyrocketing housing costs around B.C. It also means people in can stay in their communities, and be part of B.C.'s robust, sustainable economy.

Budget 2018 included the biggest investment in housing affordability in B.C.'s history – more than \$7 billion over 10 years. We are beginning to see the impacts of that funding on the ground as part of our 30 point, cross-government plan to tackle supply, curb demand and provide more security for renters.

Our Rapid Response to Homelessness program has already been put into action. By the end of 2019, we will have built more than 2000 modular homes with 24/7 support services in 22 communities. So far, 600 modular homes have been built in four B.C. communities, helping people get out of tent cities, off the street, and on the path to opportunity. We've also started 12 projects that will provide 280 safe new homes for women and children fleeing violence and abuse. And for the first time in Canadian history, a province has taken steps, together with Indigenous leaders, to directly address the housing needs of Indigenous communities on-reserve.

People need an opportunity to survive, thrive, and get ahead. That starts with knowing that you and your family have a place to come home to.

We're working collaboratively across the aisle and with local partners to deliver safe, secure, and affordable housing for British Columbians. It's good for people, it's good for communities and it's good for the economy. And it's only the beginning.

Making sure B.C.'s forestry sector has a strong, sustainable, future
By Premier John Horgan
By Fremier John Horgan
From day one, our government has been about people. We're working every day to make life better for people all over the province. That means investing in good-paying, sustainable jobs in every corner of B.C., including in B.C.'s iconic forest industry.
The forest sector is a cornerstone of economic activity in British Columbia, supporting families, communities, and jobs across our province. As a major manufacturing and export industry, there are forestry jobs all over B.C. In rural and remote communities, forestry employs more than 57,000 British Columbians and supports over 7,000 businesses. One-third of our exports are forest products, which means that forestry jobs also extend into urban B.C., in occupations such as transportation, warehousing, shipping, towing, customs, accounting, sales and marketing and others.

Given forestry's long history in B.C., it would be easy to view the industry as part of the 'old economy' – different and apart from our growing technology sector. Fact is, forestry is a significant customer for parts of B.C.'s technology industry, and technology is central to every part of modern forest management.

Today's foresters use satellite-enabled technologies to see through the forest canopy to direct harvest planning, monitor site conditions and respond more effectively to wildfires. Drones are used to cost-effectively scan large areas of forest. Technology makes harvesting operations safer, and allows remote-controlled machines to access slopes that would be too dangerous to harvest by hand. Modern lumber manufacturing is high-tech too, using scanners to optimize the use of each log and computer-linked machinery to guide each step of processing logs into lumber. New products like Cross Laminated Timber (CLT) create additional jobs and value from our lumber, and make it possible to build strong, safe skyscrapers from wood.

Wood products are used in tall applications and small ones, from the 17-storey Brock Commons student residence at UBC to the 2,000 new supportive modular homes that were built in 22 communities during 2018 to help address B.C.'s homelessness crisis. Wood building materials can also help British Columbians tackle climate change and spur a greater demand for top quality manufactured wood products as a clean, natural, healthy, renewable building material.

Government is working with First Nations, communities and the industry to develop a fair, lasting strategy to strengthen forestry all over B.C. I asked Forests Minister Doug Donaldson to lead the Coastal Forestry Revitalization Initiative, which will renew our forest policy framework, help to expand domestic manufacturing, encourage getting more value out of every log, provide new opportunities for First Nations and encourage innovation and a better business climate.

We're moving forward on our government's commitment to implement UNDRIP and to build a true partnership with First Nations based on rights, respect and reconciliation. In the forest sector, we're continuing to explore ways Indigenous communities can benefit from forestry activities on their lands. The Province recently entered into a unique community forest agreement for the Qala:yit Community Forest – the first of its kind in B.C. The Pacheedaht First Nation, BC Timber Sales, Cowichan Lake Community Forest Co-operative, and Province are all working together to create good jobs and more opportunities for people in the Cowichan Lake communities. Partnerships like these will inspire new ventures and processes of working together, protect the environment, promote economic opportunity and growth, and manage land and resources.

Across B.C., 2018 was another devastating wildfire season, with over 1.3 million hectares of land impacted by wildfires. Hundreds of industry contractors assisted the BC Wildfire Service in fighting the fires and keeping communities safe. Thanks to everyone's dedication and hard work, not one life was lost. Acting on lessons learned during 2017 and 2018, as well as the recommendations from the report by George Abbott and Chief Maureen Chapman, the BC Wildfire Service is looking at changes to be better prepared for 2019 wildfires.

The TLA selected a theme of "Making it Work" for your January 2019 convention, representing so much that is going on across the forest sector as well as your organization's 75 years of representing logging contractors and other members. In that regard, I am pleased that Dan Miller has been able to help logging contractors and licensees reach agreement to work together on developing rate models and rate determination factors.

Looking forward, B.C.'s forest sector continues to explore innovative ways to make better use of our vast resources. Together with partners in all parts of the industry, our government is working to grow demand for our wood products, design services, and building technologies and to expand foreign markets for B.C. lumber. We're working hard to make sure B.C.'s forest industry has a strong, sustainable future – for everyone. I look forward to working with you to continue building a better British Columbia.

- Centerm Expansion: improvements to meet anticipated container capacity demand including a new Centennial Road Overpass and an extension to Waterfront Road
- Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Expansion: proposed new three-berth container terminal at Roberts Bank in Delta to provide 2.4 million TEUs of container capacity
- Truck Staging: facilities outside of port terminal to allow drayage trucks to wait and avoid truck congestion on Deltaport Way and Hwy 17

Background:

- At their Nov 14th meeting the Mayor's Council voted to suspend the Surrey LRT project and request further information about the possibility of switching to SkyTrain for discussion at their December meeting.
- The resolutions approved were the following:
 - 1. Endorse TransLink's decision to suspend the Surrey-Newton-Guildford Project, stopping all expenditures of money and resources on the project, based on the request from the City of Surrey;
 - 2. Use the 10-Year Vision as the basis for South of Fraser rapid transit planning, recognizing the City of Surrey request to change the technology and timing of the Fraser Highway project from LRT to SkyTrain, and draw only on the available funding currently allocated for South of Fraser rapid transit in the Phase Two Plan, and the financial framework for the Phase Three Plan.
 - 3. Request the additional analysis and a work plan on "Option 2" in this report, for consideration at the December 13, 2018 meeting of the Mayors' Council.
- "Option 2" was a proposal to begin planning, design and procurement readiness works for SkyTrain on the Fraser Highway while concurrently refreshing other Surrey rapid transit.

Message:

- The bottom line is people in Surrey have been waiting too long for transit improvements.
- We made a significant investment to support the Mayors' 10-Year Vision for the region, which included funding for rapid transit in Surrey. We remain committed to this investment in Surrey.
- We respect the Mayors' Council's decision to look at updating the vision for rapid transit in Surrey and understand they've asked for more information from Translink.
- Once a decision about next steps for rapid transit in Surrey has been reached by the Mayors' Council, we would be happy to review a new business case.
- We will continue to work with the new Mayors' Council on our shared goal of keeping people moving quickly and affordably in a growing region.

New affordable homes and child care spaces on the way for people in Langford

LANGFORD, B.C. – Seniors and families in Langford will benefit from new affordable homes and child care spaces at Oak Park, which is undergoing a second phase of redevelopment with funding from the provincial government's Building BC: Community Housing Fund.

"The housing crisis has left too many people struggling to afford the basics in B.C. communities," said Premier Horgan. "These new homes at Oak Park, with new child care spaces on-site, are a model of the kind of project we are building throughout the province to address the housing crisis and make life better and more affordable for seniors and families." DRAFT

The phase two funding will add another 80 new affordable rental homes and 36 child care spaces. The Premier made the announcement at the grand opening celebration for phase one of the project, which added 73 new homes.

"Housing is the foundation of healthy families and strong communities, but too many people in B.C. are without access to the safe, secure and affordable housing everyone needs," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "By investing in projects such as Oak Park, we are helping families struggling today and making sure we have affordable homes for generations to come." DRAFT

The \$8 million funding for phase two is part of the Province's new Building BC: Community Housing Fund, a \$1.9 billion investment over 10 years to build more than 14,000 affordable rental homes for middle income households, seniors and people with low incomes. The first set of projects announced on November 13 include 4,902 homes in 42 communities across B.C. to be built over the next two to three years.

The child-care facility being built as part of the project, operated by the Atira Women's Resource Centre, is currently planned to provide full-time spaces for 12 infants and toddlers and 24 spaces for three- to five-year-olds.

APPROVED QUOTE: "This project is a great example of how partnerships can deliver innovative solutions to create new child care spaces across B.C.," said Katrina Chen, Minister of State for Child Care. "Incorporating affordable, quality child care into the Oak Park redevelopment project will help parents return to the workforce, and give their children the best start to their early years, and beyond."

The Oak Park redevelopment will be completed in partnership with Pacifica Housing and the City of Langford, and will provide 153 new affordable rental homes for low-to moderate-income individuals, families, seniors and people with disabilities.

Oak Park is one of Pacifica Housing's 26 subsidized housing properties in the Capital Regional District and Nanaimo Regional District.

Construction of the second phase is expected to start before the end of the year.

- Phase one of the redevelopment included replacing 13 townhouse-units with a four-storey 73-unit apartment complex.
- Phase two will include replacing the remaining 12 townhouses-units with 80 units of affordable rental housing and the child-care facility.
- Tenants from the first 13 units moved into neighbouring Pacifica-operated properties, and the tenants from the remaining 12 now live in the building built during phase one.
- The Province invested \$14.9 million in capital cost towards the Oak Park redevelopment:
 - Phase 1: \$6.9 million for through the Investment in Housing Innovation program
 - Phase 2: \$8 million through the Building BC: Community Housing Fund
- The City of Langford is contributing \$100,000 from its affordable housing fund, and municipal reductions in the amount of \$788,065.

Provincial government puts B.C. on path to 100% Zero-Emission Vehicle sales by 2040

VICTORIA – In a move aimed at removing a major source of air pollution and climate change, the provincial government has put B.C. on a path to require the sale of all new light-duty cars and trucks be Zero-Emission Vehicles (ZEVs) by the year 2040.

Premier John Horgan has announced his government, in partnership with the Green Party Caucus, will introduce legislation next spring to bring in phased-in targets for the sale of Zero-Emission Vehicles (ZEVs). This legislation will set targets of 10% ZEV sales by 2025, 30% by 2030, and 100% by 2040, and will include steps to make ZEVs more affordable.

"There's nothing more important than taking care of the place we call home," said Premier Horgan. "As a province, we need to work together to put B.C. on a path that powers our future with clean, renewable energy and reduces air pollution." NOT APPROVED

The premier also outlined a three-point plan to kick-start and fuel the rollout of the ZEV standard:

- 1. Ramping up B.C.'s charging capacity, including:
 - Expanding the size of the province's electric vehicle direct-current fast-charger (DCFC) network to 151 sites, with 71 already completed or underway and, leveraging federal and private sector dollars, another 80 in the works.
 - Updating the B.C. Building Code to expand access to at-home and workplace charging stations.
- 2. Increasing the provincial incentive program, administered by the New Car Dealers Association of BC, by \$20 million this year to encourage more British Columbians to buy clean energy cars now. This will bring the incentive program up to \$57 million in total.
- 3. Reviewing the incentive program with an eye to expanding it over time so buying a ZEV becomes a more affordable option for middle- and lower-income British Columbians.

"If we want British Columbians to be part of the solution for reducing air pollution, we need to make clean energy vehicles more affordable, available and convenient," said Horgan, who added that this initiative is the first major policy commitment of the government's upcoming strategy to meet B.C.'s legislated climate goals. NOT APPROVED

"Transforming the way we get around and moving away from reliance on fossil fuels is a significant part of a cleaner future," said Andrew Weaver, Leader of the Green Party Caucus. "Point-of-sale vehicle purchase incentives are considered the most critical measure to increase the demand for, and affordability of, zero-emission vehicles for

consumers so this funding makes it easier for people to choose a clean-energy vehicle as their next purchase." **NOT APPROVED**

B.C. already has one of the largest charging and fueling infrastructure networks – electric and hydrogen fuelling – in Canada and, with 12,000 clean energy vehicles registered, the highest adoption rates of electric vehicles in the country.

BACKGROUNDER

Program support for zero-emission vehicle use and infrastructure

British Columbia is a leader in zero-emission vehicles, with one of the largest charging-infrastructure networks in Canada (over 1,500 public charging stations), and the highest per capita adoption rate of electric vehicles in the country with about 12,000 CEVs registered in B.C.

The B.C. government has committed more than \$84 million to the Clean Energy Vehicle (CEV) Program since the September 2017 Budget Update -- encouraging British Columbians to choose clean, green vehicles that reduce their transportation greenhouse gas emissions. The program supports battery electric vehicles and plug-in hybrid electric vehicles, along with hydrogen fuel cell electric vehicles.

Government's target is that by 2025, 10 per cent of new light-duty passenger vehicle sales in B.C. will be clean "zero emission vehicles" (ZEVs), increasing to 30 per cent by 2030 and 100 per cent by 2040.

B.C.'s CEV Program invests in five main program areas:

B.C. government's current support for zero-emission vehicles has:

- More than doubled the size of B.C.'s electric vehicle direct-current fast-charger (DCFC) network to 71 from 30 sites with:
 - BC Hydro installations at 20 new sites, which leverage about \$1 million in federal funding and \$700,000 in provincial CEV Program funding.
 - 13 DCFC sites throughout the Kootenays with FortisBC operating five (with \$125,000 from the CEV Program) and BC Hydro operating eight.
 - Fast Charging stations at 8 highway rest areas throughout the province.
- Delivered \$2 million in provincial funding for the next deployment of 80 direct-current fast-chargers, leveraged with 2-to-1 federal-to-provincial dollars. Through an agreement with the federal government, the B.C. investment is included in the latest federal call for projects and will be included in future federal calls until the \$2 million is fully expended and the target of 80 additional DC fast chargers is achieved in B.C.
- Provided \$1 million from the provincial Innovative Clean Energy (ICE) Fund to help local government and private fleets adopt hydrogen fuel cell electric vehicles.
- Put in place the first six public retail hydrogen fueling stations in B.C., starting this year with two stations in the Lower Mainland and one in the Capital Regional District, and completion of all stations towards the end of 2020.

Premier John Horgan's statement on National Housing Day

VICTORIA – Premier John Horgan has issued the following statement to mark National Housing Day:

"Every person deserves a safe place to call home. But years of inaction on the B.C. housing crisis has left too many people in B.C. unable to find affordable housing. Our government is making different choices, and taking action to tackle supply, curb demand, and make housing more affordable and secure for people around the province.

"Our first budget as government included the largest investment in housing in B.C. history – with more than \$7 billion going to communities over 10 years. Our 30-point plan to take action on the housing crisis will give people a break from skyrocketing housing costs around B.C. It also means people can stay in their communities, and be part of B.C.'s robust, sustainable economy.

"Last week our government made a historic announcement – 4,900 new, affordable mixed-income rental homes will be built in 42 communities throughout the province. This new housing is the first to be delivered through the Building BC: Community Housing Fund, a \$1.9 billion investment over 10 years to deliver 14,000 affordable rental homes for seniors, families, and low- and middle-income earners in B.C.

"Our Rapid Response to Homelessness program has already been put into action. By the end of 2019, we will have built more than 2,000 modular homes with 24/7 support services in 22 communities. So far, 600 modular homes have been built in four B.C. communities, helping people get out of tent cities, and on the path to opportunity.

"We've started 12 projects that will provide 280 safe new homes for women and children fleeing violence and abuse. And for the first time in Canadian history, a province has taken steps, together with Indigenous leaders, to directly address the housing needs of Indigenous peoples, both on and off reserve.

"Our Housing Hub has already approved hundreds of affordable market rentals, which are being built in partnerships with the private sector, faith groups, non-profits, and communities. And as part of increasing affordable rental supply in the private market, we gave communities the power to zone for rental housing, giving them the opportunity to decrease speculative pressure on land, while opening the door to increased density.

"People need an opportunity to survive, thrive, and get ahead. That starts with knowing that you and your family have a place to come home to. 

Below is the email that has been approved on our end to be sent at 1pm to government employees about the Fortis gas supply issue. Please let me know if you have any concerns or revisions that should be made.

Melissa

I want to start by saying thank you to all public sector employees for continuing to do your part to conserve natural gas during this period of constrained supply. Your on-going actions, such as turning down thermostats, reducing hot water use, and other conservation measures, are making a difference in ensuring all British Columbians will continue to have access to natural gas. But, we're not out of the woods yet.

FortisBC's natural gas supply to communities throughout British Columbia continues to be constrained as a result of the Enbridge pipeline rupture last month. While Enbridge has completed repairs to the pipeline it is not currently authorized to operate either of its two natural gas pipelines at full-capacity.

Because both Enbridge natural gas lines are not operating at full-capacity, FortisBC anticipates that its natural gas supply may be limited in the event of a prolonged period of colder than average weather. The company is working with Enbridge to restore full-capacity. In the meantime, FortisBC is reminding all of its customers to be conscious of their natural gas use and conserve energy wherever possible, to ensure all its customers across the province are able to access natural gas for essential uses.

I am encouraging all public sector employees to keep up the great work in our ongoing efforts to reduce our natural gas use. If we all continue to take action to conserve natural gas, such as turning down thermostats 2-3 degrees, this can help ensure there is access to natural gas for Fortis BC customers when the temperature drops and it is needed most.

So please, join me and reduce your use until FortisBC's natural gas supply situation returns to normal.

B.C. and FNLC joining together to implement UNDRIP, advance reconciliation

VICTORIA – The Province and First Nations Leadership Council (FNLC) will co-develop new legislation in 2019 to implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People in British Columbia.

"First Nations in B.C. continue to experience the ongoing impacts of colonization including a lack of recognition for our rights, and disproportionately poor living conditions," stated Grand Chief Stewart Phillip, President of the Union of BC Indian Chiefs. "We are hopeful that the joint work we commit to with the Province will improve the lives of our people and for all British Columbians – jointly developed recognition and rights-based legislative, policy and operational changes are needed to get beyond this colonial hangover."

New legislation tops the list of priorities agreed to between the provincial government and FNLC, which was announced on the opening day of the 5th annual B.C. Cabinet and First Nations' Leaders Gathering in Vancouver. More than 650 meetings between First Nations leaders, Cabinet ministers and deputy ministers will be held at the gathering Nov. 29-30.

"Reconciliation with First Nations is a priority of this government – creating certainty and opportunity for First Nations peoples and the province as a whole," said Premier John Horgan. "True and lasting reconciliation will help build healthy communities and create jobs and economic stability, and create a better future for everyone in B.C." DRAFT – not approved

FNLC and the provincial government have agreed to a shared vision and concrete actions for reconciliation with First Nations through innovative approaches to negotiations and agreement-making, new mechanisms for decision-making and economic relations, and meaningful changes to legislation and policy.

"Our leaders who came before us held onto a vision of strong and prosperous, self-governing nations living independently on their traditional lands, and we have continued this struggle to this day," said Regional Chief Terry Teegee of the BC Association of First Nations. "Now, finally, after decades of courage and continuous challenges to the systems and institutions that have been imposed on our peoples, we see significant progress as reason and justice have taken hold to create a climate of change. We move forward with the Province to forge a system of governance that increases stability and equality for everyone."

The FNLC is a working relationship between the BC Assembly of First Nations, First Nations Summit, and the Union of BC Indian Chiefs.

FNLC quote - Summit

In addition to the commitment to co-develop legislation to implement the UN Declaration, the concrete actions include a range of actions to advance reconciliation in B.C. The joint work agreed to between the Province and First Nations Leadership Council will strengthen government-to-government relationships with First Nations as the Province continues its work to implement the UN Declaration and Truth and Reconciliation Commission's 94 Calls to Action.

"We've covered a lot of ground in our first year, but after years of obstruction by the previous government we know there is still a lot to do," said Scott Fraser, Minister of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation. "We are committing to work together with First Nations throughout B.C. in ways we never have before, to take bold steps that truly support self-government and self-determination." DRAFT – not approved

B.C. has been working with in partnership with Indigenous leaders and organizations on a broad range of actions that address areas of concern for Indigenous communities. These include:

- \$550 million over 10 years to support the construction of 1,750 affordable housing units for on-and-off-reserve, with 1,100 homes to be built in the next two to four years;
- \$50 million to support the work of the First Peoples' Cultural Council and First Nations communities to revitalize Indigenous languages in B.C.;
- Introducing new legislation to modernize the environmental assessment process for major resource projects that will greatly enhance the participation of Indigenous peoples, ensuring their rights, interests and ecological knowledge are respected;
- Making changes to legislation so Indigenous communities can have greater involvement in child-welfare decisions, including agreements with the Wet'suwet'en and the Secwépemc Nation to chart a path forward in implementing their jurisdiction for child and family services. B.C. also continues to implement Grand Chief Ed John's recommendations to help keep Indigenous children out of care, wherever possible.
- Working with First Nations to forge innovative agreements that respect the inherent rights of their communities. These include an agreement with the Maa-nulth First Nations to affirm government-togovernment treaty partnerships, a tripartite memorandum of understanding with Stó:lō Xwexwilmexw Treaty Association to explore a recognition of rights approach to treaty agreements, and a landmark reconciliation agreement with the shíshálh Nation.

The B.C Cabinet and First Nations' Leaders Gathering is being held at the Vancouver Convention Centre on November 29-30, 2018. It is organized in partnership between the First Nations Leadership Council and the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation. The annual gathering offers opportunities for First Nations leaders to meet one-to-one with B.C. cabinet ministers as well as participate in plenary and breakout sessions on issues of importance to their communities.

BACKGROUNDER

B.C., First Nations Leadership Council agree to joint concrete actions for reconciliation

A new vision and concrete actions were identified as a joint work plan to implement the 2015 Commitment Document between the Province and First Nations Leadership Council. The joint concrete actions include:

- Developing legislation by fall 2019, similar to the federal private member's bill C-262, to establish the
 United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (the Declaration) as the framework for
 reconciliation in British Columbia.
- Establishing an independent Indigenous commission within three years that supports First Nations, upon request, with self-government, including boundary resolutions, developing constitutions, making laws and policies, and land-use planning, as identified in the 2015 Commitment Document.
- Developing new fiscal models of sharing provincial revenues to support First Nations self-government, including a new model to share gaming revenue by 2019.
- Reforming legislation and policies through a joint review table to reduce barriers to reconciliation, with a plan for changes in child welfare, environmental assessment and forestry within a year as identified in the 2015 Commitment Document.
- Developing a multi-year strategy to promote education both within the school system and more broadly to British Columbians on the history and contributions of First Nations within a year.
- Designing principles for new innovative, creative models for negotiation and dispute resolution between the provincial government and First Nations within a year.

The Commitment Document set an agenda for achieving an effective Crown-First Nations relationship in B.C., and working collaboratively to improve social and economic outcomes for First Nations communities. It is seen as a key tool for advancing Aboriginal title and rights, and as a means for First Nations to work toward establishing their own jurisdictions, governance, laws and responsibilities. The vision and concrete actions documents help to mobilize this agenda by now outlining a clear approach and a shared workplan for achieving meaningful progress.

Fall session focused on working for a better B.C., delivering results for people

VICTORIA – Making the province's economy stronger, more sustainable, and taking action on the biggest challenges facing people in B.C. was at the core of government work, both inside and outside of the legislature this fall. "Making life better for people is what drives our government every single day. We're delivering on affordable housing, improving health care and creating accessible child care," said Premier John Horgan as the House rose for the end of the fall session. "We're going to keep investing in people to build a strong, sustainable economy, and a better future for everyone in B.C." NOT APPROVED

Key pieces of legislation passed this session will improve the delivery of health care and strengthen protections for health-sector workers, promote and protect human rights in B.C., put targets in place for a cleaner, low-carbon economy, crack down on tax evasion in B.C. real estate, tackle speculation in the housing market, and put British Columbia on the path to reduce the province's overall poverty rate by 25% over the next five years.

The legislature rose a day after the release of the province's second quarterly report, showing that British Columbia is operating debt-free for the first time in more than 40 years. B.C.'s real estate market shows signs of moderating while the Province continues to make record-level capital investments in affordable housing, schools and hospitals. "We're taking on the big challenges in our province from the housing crisis to child care, while getting the Province's finances in order," said Finance Minister and deputy Premier Carole James. "The second quarter results show we can make B.C.'s economy work for everyone, while investing in people and providing strong fiscal leadership for B.C." NOT

APPROVED

Over the past 16 months, the B.C. government has taken unprecedented action and made historic investments to make a difference in people's lives. This fall the government delivered on major commitments, including announcing 4,900 new affordable mixed income rental homes - the first of 14,000 for mixed and middle-income people and families throughout B.C. The homes are part of the largest investment in housing affordability in B.C.'s history, more than \$7 billion over 10 years.

As part of a \$1 billion investment over three years to deliver low-cost, quality and affordable childcare, the government launched 53 prototype projects around the province to deliver child care that will cost families a maximum of \$200 per month per child. The government also announced a new benefit to help 60, 000 more families lower monthly child care costs.

To deliver better, faster healthcare for people in their communities, urgent primary care centres were announced in communities around the province. The care centres are part of a primary health-care strategy with a new focus on team-based care that puts patients back at the centre of health-care delivery. The Province announced investments in health care across the board, including hospital expansion, seniors care and expanded diagnostic and treatment options for B.C. patients.

The of the Confidence and Supply Agreement (CASA) with the B.C. Green Caucus has provided the basis for the government to move forward on initiatives that are important to both caucuses and deliver strong, stable government that puts people first – from reforming campaign finance laws, to moving forward with a referendum on proportional representation, eliminating MSP fees and more. As part of CASA, government is working in collaboration with the B.C. Green Caucus on a strategy to rise to the challenge of climate change while creating good jobs and better opportunities for people. The plan will be announced in the coming weeks.

Premier Horgan and Minister James vowed the government will continue to work collaboratively to deliver solutions to the problems people in B.C. face every day.

Fall session focused on working for a better B.C., delivering results for people

VICTORIA – Making the province's economy stronger, more sustainable, and taking action on the biggest challenges facing people in B.C. was at the core of government work, both inside and outside of the legislature this fall.

"Making life better for people is what drives our government every single day. We're delivering on affordable housing, improving health care and creating accessible child care" said Premier John Horgan as the House rose for the end of the fall session. "We're going to keep investing in people to build a strong, sustainable economy, and a better future for everyone in B.C." NOT APPROVED

Key pieces of legislation passed this session will improve the delivery of health care and strengthen protections for health-sector workers, promote and protect human rights in B.C., put targets in place for a cleaner, low-carbon economy, tackle speculation in the housing market, enable government to eliminate unfair MSP premiums, and put British Columbia on the path to reduce the province's overall poverty rate by 25% over the next five years.

The legislature rose a day after the release of the province's second quarterly report, showing that British Columbia isoperating debt-free for the first time in more than 40 years. B.C.'s real estate market is starting to moderate while the Province continues to make record-level capital investments in affordable housing, schools and hospitals. "We're taking on the big challenges in our province from the housing crisis to child care, while getting the Province's finances in order," said Finance Minister and deputy Premier Carole James. "The second quarter results show we can make B.C.'s economy work for everyone, while investing in people and providing strong fiscal leadership for B.C."

Over the past 16 months, the B.C. government has taken unprecedented action and made historic investments to make a difference in people's lives. This fall the government delivered on major commitments, including announcing 4,900 new affordable mixed income rental homes - the first of 14,000 formixed and middle-income people and families throughout B.C.The homes are part of the largest investment in housing affordability in B.C.'s history, more than \$7 billion over 10 years.

As part of a \$1 billion investment over three years to deliver low-cost, quality and affordable childcare, the government launched 53 prototype projects around the province to deliver child care that will cost families a maximum of \$200 per month per child. The government also announced a new benefit to help 60, 000 more families lower monthly child care costs.

To deliver better, faster health care for people in their communities, urgent primary care centres were announced in communities around the province. The care centres are part of a primary health-care strategy with a new focus on team-based care that puts patients back at the centre of health-care delivery. The Province announced investments in health care across the board, including hospital expansion, seniors' care and expanded diagnostic and treatment options for B.C. patients.

The of the Confidence and Supply Agreement (CASA) with the B.C. Green Caucus has provided the basis for the government to move forward on initiatives that are important to both caucuses and deliver strong, stable government that puts people first – from reforming campaign finance laws, to moving forward with a referendum on proportional representation, eliminating MSP fees and more. As part of CASA, government is working in collaboration with the B.C. Green Caucus on a strategy to rise to the challenge of climate change while creating good jobs and better opportunities for people. The plan will be announced in the coming weeks.

Premier Horgan and Minister James vowed the government will continue to work collaboratively to deliver solutions to the problems people in B.C. face every day.

VICTORIA - Making the province's economy stronger, more sustainable, and taking action on the biggest challenges facing people in B.C. were at the core of government work, both inside and outside of the Parliament Buildings this fall.

"Making life better for people is what drives our government every single day. We're delivering on affordable housing, improving health care and creating accessible child care," said Premier John Horgan as the House rose for the end of the fall session. "We're going to keep investing in people to build a strong, sustainable economy and a better future for everyone in B.C."

Key pieces of legislation passed this session will improve the delivery of health care and strengthen protections for health-sector workers, promote and protect human rights in B.C., tackle speculation in the housing market, enable government to eliminate unfair Medical Services Plan (MSP) premiums and put British Columbia on the path to reduce the province's overall poverty rate by 25% over the next five years.

The legislature rose a day after the release of the province's second quarterly report, showing that British Columbia is operating debt-free for the first time in more than 40 years. B.C.'s real estate market is starting to moderate while the Province continues to make record-level capital investments in affordable housing, schools and hospitals.

"We're taking on the big challenges in our province, from the housing crisis to child care, while getting the Province's finances in order," said Carole James, Minister of Finance and deputy Premier. "The second quarter results show we can make B.C.'s economy work for everyone, while investing in people and providing strong fiscal leadership for B.C."

Over the past 16 months, the B.C. government has taken unprecedented action and made historic investments to make a difference in people's lives. In the fall, government delivered on major commitments, including announcing 4,900 new affordable mixed income rental homes - the first of 14,000 for mixed- and middle-income people and families throughout B.C. The homes are part of the largest investment in housing affordability in B.C.'s history - more than \$7 billion over 10 years.

As part of a \$1-billion investment over three years to deliver low-cost, quality and affordable child care, government launched 53 prototype projects around the province to deliver child care that will cost families a maximum of \$200 per month per child. Government also announced a new benefit to help 60,000 more families lower monthly child care costs.

To deliver better, faster health care for people in their communities, urgent primary care centres were announced in communities around the province. The care centres are part of a primary health-care strategy with a new focus on team-based care that puts patients at the centre of health-care delivery. The Province announced investments in health care across the board, including hospital expansion, seniors' care and expanded diagnostic and treatment options for B.C. patients.

The Confidence and Supply Agreement (CASA) with the B.C. Green caucus has provided the basis for the government to move forward on initiatives that are important to both caucuses and deliver strong, stable government that puts people first - from reforming campaign finance laws to moving forward with a referendum on proportional representation, eliminating MSP fees and more. As part of CASA, government is working in collaboration with the B.C. Green caucus on a strategy to rise to the challenge of climate change while creating good jobs and better opportunities for people. The plan will be announced in the coming weeks.

Premier Horgan and James vowed the government will continue to work collaboratively to deliver solutions to the problems people in B.C. face every day.

> The BC Assembly of First Nations, First Nations Summit and Union of BC Indian Chiefs, working together as the First Nations Leadership Council (FNLC), and the Province also announced they are co-developing new legislation for introduction in 2019 to implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People (UN declaration) in B.C.

> "Undoubtedly this is a momentous occasion for all First Nations in the Province of B.C.," said Grand Chief Joe Hall, First Nations lead negotiator and past chair of the BC First Nations Gaming Commission. "We have worked at this for many many years and now we have finally arrived at an agreement that will see much needed revenue from gaming shared with all the First Nation communities of BC. The countless stories that we heard about how the revenue will make a significant difference in our communities was both heart-warming and inspirational. Our negotiating team is so pleased that this government has by demonstration addressed and resolved this specific long-standing unfairness. It bodes well for the reconciliation efforts in this province."

>

> "UN declaration legislation and gaming revenue sharing are important steps forward to advance true and lasting reconciliation, and create certainty and opportunity for First Nations and the province as a whole," said Premier Horgan. "Sharing gaming revenues will mean First Nations have the ability to invest in the services and infrastructure healthy communities need - child care, supports for new mothers, housing, road upgrades and economic development to create a better future for everyone in B.C."

>

> The joint announcement was made by the provincial government and First Nations Leadership Council at the annual B.C. Cabinet-First Nations Leaders' Gathering in Vancouver, where more than 650 meetings between First Nations leaders, cabinet ministers and deputy ministers will be held over the next two days.

>

> "This is a historic and progressive action by the provincial government to address the ongoing issues regarding jurisdiction and gaming revenue sharing," stated Regional Chief Terry Teegee of the BC Assembly of First Nations. "We see this as a positive first step, and look forward to this new fiscal arrangement. We will see a growth in the number and quality of community projects, including business ventures that will consequently contribute to increased economic prosperity for all British Columbians."

>

> The FNLC and provincial government have been working together to develop a set of concrete actions to advance reconciliation together, with new legislation and gaming revenue sharing as top priorities. The First Nations Gaming Commission has been in negotiations with the Province over the past year on a model to implement gaming revenue sharing. For decades, First Nations leaders have advocated for a share of gaming revenue.

>

> "We are pleased the Government of B.C. has committed to the implementation of the UN declaration and the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action, but now we need to put these commitments into concrete actions," said Cheryl Casimer of the First Nations Summit Political Executive. "After many years and attempts to create a mutual

agenda and roadmap for an improved relationship and moving substantially forward on reconciliation, B.C. First Nations and the government have finally landed on a renewed vision and plan for reconciling Aboriginal title and rights, with asserted Crown title and jurisdiction." She continued, "The Commitment Document sets out a progressive shared vision and plan with the Province. It recognizes our inherent rights of self-determination and jurisdiction, as well as our rights related to our lands, resources and territories. This new path and our collective work must be based on a new set of principles and values rather than the old colonial standard of denial."

> "We are committing to work together with First Nations throughout B.C. in ways we never have before, to take bold steps that truly support self-government and self-determination," said Scott Fraser, Minister of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation. "For the first time, the B.C. government will be sharing gaming revenues with First Nations, for the benefit of every nation across this province."

> The Province's commitment to gaming revenue sharing starts with \$2 million in immediate support to establish a B.C. First Nations gaming distribution limited partnership, which will manage the new revenue.

> "Today's historic announcement marks a significant achievement in the Government of B.C.'s journey to reconcile its colonial history with the unextinguished Title and Rights of Indigenous peoples," stated Grand Chief Stewart Phillip, president of the Union of BC Indian Chiefs. "First Nations in B.C. continue to experience the ongoing impacts of colonization, including a lack of recognition for our rights and disproportionately poor living conditions. We are hopeful that the joint work we commit to with the Province will improve the lives of our people and for all British Columbians. Jointly-developed, recognition- and rights-based legislative, policy and operational changes are needed to get out of this colonial hangover. B.C.'s commitment to developing a legislative framework for the full implementation of the standards and principles of the UN declaration, and its commitment to share gaming revenue, is a significant step towards the realization of Indigenous peoples' right to self-determination and the revitalization of Indigenous governments and a nation-to-nation relationship. We cannot reiterate enough, the UN declaration must be the framework for reconciliation in B.C."

> "This is an enormous step forward on the path to reconciliation and truly recognizing the right to self-determination for First Nations," said Carole James, Minister of Finance. "First Nations know better than anyone what their communities need to thrive. When First Nations can focus on their priorities, it creates new opportunities for communities to flourish both today and for the generations to come."

> Quick Facts:

> * All First Nations will be eligible for a portion of the new gaming revenue fund. A new limited partnership, comprised of a First Nations-appointed board of directors, will oversee the distribution of the funds.

> * First Nations will determine the best use for the new funding from a share of annual provincial gaming revenues. Funding will focus on priorities in the following framework: health and wellness; infrastructure, safety, transportation and housing; economic and business development; education, language, culture and training; community development and environmental protection; and capacity building, fiscal management and governance. Within that framework, First Nations governments will determine their own priorities for these funds.

> * Gaming revenue sharing will be provided in addition to existing revenue sharing. Currently, economic benefits agreements between the Province and First Nations are primarily resource based, and provide approximately \$125 million annually to First Nations whose land and rights are affected.

> * The B.C. Cabinet and First Nations Leaders' Gathering is being held at the Vancouver Convention Centre Nov. 29-30, 2018. It is organized in partnership between the First Nations Leadership Council and the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation. The annual gathering offers opportunities for First Nations leaders to meet one-to-one with B.C. cabinet ministers as well as participate in plenary and breakout sessions on issues of importance to their communities.

> New legislation and a share of provincial gaming revenues for First Nations top the list of priorities recently agreed to between the provincial government and First Nations Leadership Council (FNLC) under a set of concrete actions that form a joint work plan to implement the 2015 Commitment Document. The joint work, guided by a shared vision, will strengthen government-to-government relationships with First Nations as the Province continues its work to implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UN declaration) and Truth and Reconciliation Commission's 94 Calls to Action.

> The joint concrete actions include:

- > * Developing legislation by fall 2019, similar to the federal private member's bill C-262, to establish the UN declaration as the framework for reconciliation in British Columbia.
- > * Developing new fiscal models of sharing provincial revenues to support First Nations self-government, including a new model to share gaming revenue by 2019.
- > * Establishing an independent Indigenous commission within three years that supports First Nations, upon request, with self-government, including boundary resolutions, developing constitutions, making laws and policies, and land-use planning, as identified in the 2015 Commitment Document.
- > * Reforming legislation and policies through a joint review table to reduce barriers to reconciliation, with a plan for changes in child welfare, environmental assessment and forestry within a year as identified in the 2015 Commitment Document.
- > * Developing a multi-year strategy to promote education both within the school system and more broadly to British Columbians on the history and contributions of First Nations within a year.
- > * Designing principles for new, innovative and creative models for negotiation and dispute resolution between the provincial government and First Nations within a year.
- > The 2015 Commitment Document set an agenda for achieving an effective Crown-First Nations relationship in B.C., and working collaboratively to improve social and economic outcomes for First Nations communities. It is seen as a key tool for advancing Aboriginal title and rights, and as a means for First Nations to work toward establishing their own jurisdictions, governance, laws and responsibilities. The vision and concrete actions documents help to mobilize this agenda by outlining a clear approach and a shared work plan for achieving meaningful progress.

Fall session focused on working for a better B.C., delivering results for people

VICTORIA - Making the province's economy stronger, more sustainable, and taking action on the biggest challenges facing people in B.C. were at the core of government work, both inside and outside of the Parliament Buildings this fall.

"Making life better for people is what drives our government every single day. We're delivering on affordable housing, improving health care and creating accessible child care," said Premier John Horgan as the House rose for the end of the fall session. "We're going to keep investing in people to build a strong, sustainable economy and a better future for everyone in B.C."

Key pieces of legislation passed this session will improve the delivery of health care and strengthen protections for health-sector workers, promote and protect human rights in B.C., tackle speculation in the housing market, enable government to eliminate unfair Medical Services Plan (MSP) premiums and put British Columbia on the path to reduce the province's overall poverty rate by 25% over the next five years.

The legislature rose a day after the release of the province's second quarterly report, showing that British Columbia is operating debt-free for the first time in more than 40 years. B.C.'s real estate market is starting to moderate while the Province continues to make record-level capital investments in affordable housing, schools and hospitals.

"We're taking on the big challenges in our province, from the housing crisis to child care, while getting the Province's finances in order," said Carole James, Minister of Finance and deputy Premier. "The second quarter results show we can make B.C.'s economy work for everyone, while investing in people and providing strong fiscal leadership for B.C."

Over the past 16 months, the B.C. government has taken unprecedented action and made historic investments to make a difference in people's lives. In the fall, government delivered on major commitments, including announcing 4,900 new affordable mixed income rental homes - the first of 14,000 for mixed- and middle-income people and families throughout B.C. The homes are part of the largest investment in housing affordability in B.C.'s history - more than \$7 billion over 10 years.

As part of a \$1-billion investment over three years to deliver low-cost, quality and affordable child care, government launched 53 prototype projects around the province to deliver child care that will cost families a maximum of \$200 per month per child. Government also announced a new benefit to help 60,000 more families lower monthly child care costs.

To deliver better, faster health care for people in their communities, urgent primary care centres were announced in communities around the province. The care centres are part of a primary health-care strategy with a new focus on team-based care that puts patients at the centre of health-care delivery. The Province announced investments in health care across the board, including hospital expansion, seniors' care and expanded diagnostic and treatment options for B.C. patients.

The Confidence and Supply Agreement (CASA) with the B.C. Green caucus has provided the basis for the government to move forward on initiatives that are important to both caucuses and deliver strong, stable government that puts people first - from reforming campaign finance laws to moving forward with a referendum on proportional representation, eliminating MSP fees and more. As part of CASA, government is working in collaboration with the B.C. Green caucus on a strategy to rise to the challenge of climate change while creating good jobs and better opportunities for people. The plan will be announced in the coming weeks.

Premier Horgan and James vowed the government will continue to work collaboratively to deliver solutions to the problems people in B.C. face every day.

We drafted a statement for the signing of the USMCA, scheduled for Friday. The signing is not confirmed but likely to go ahead on the sidelines of the G20 in Argentina. This is an opportunity to reiterate the Province's support for people impacted by US tariffs.

This has program approval but not yet shared with MO.

Hi Rick and Robyn, As discussed yesterday, a bit of an update for you.

Jas is going to get back to us on dates, likely over the weekend, but these are the events that we hope to roll out between now and the new year. I will let you know if any others come up, but these will be the focus. We may potentially have a couple of more issuey announcements and likely some releases, but wanted to get the events on your radar.

Pups Assisting Wellness for Staff (P.A.W.S.) program – Vancouver **Event to with Vancouver Coastal** Health to publicly announce the P.A.W.S. project, which recently completed phase one and is ready to expand. A canine named Dr. Snuggles has served as a therapeutic comfort dog this summer for frontline staff needing support at Vancouver General Hospital's emergency department and intensive care unit. The pilot proved successful and he'll soon be joined by other dogs for phase two of the program. Media will have the opportunity to meet Dr. Snuggles, learn about the program and hear first-hand accounts of his impact on staff and patients.

Eagle Ridge Hospital groundbreaking – Port Moody Event to highlight that work will soon start on an expanded emergency department at Eagle Ridge Hospital. The expansion will more than double the number of

treatment spaces from 19 to 39,

meaning better care for people in the area. It will include four new isolation rooms to support improved infection-control measures as well as two new trauma resuscitation bays. Separated entrances will also be created for walk-in patients and ambulances.

Royal Inland Hospital patient care tower groundbreaking and **Coronary Care Unit** – Kamloops Minister to attend event to celebrate official groundbreaking for\$400 million Royal Inland Hospital Patient Care Tower at Royal Inland Hospital. We would also highlight financial close for this project and that EllisDon has been able to finance with a green bond. Could be tied to coincide with a separate announcement about Royal Inland's new coronary care unit. The coronary care unit is part of the Province's investment of \$4.7 million over the next two years to strengthen cardiac care for Kamloops and region residents. Community is aware of the unit, but this would be an opportunity to officially celebrate with partners, including the Royal Inland Hospital Foundation.

Announcement on implementation of Fair PharmaCare – Vancouver (as discussed, potentially Sunday, December 30)
Event to highlight that effective Jan. 1, 2019, changes to eliminate or reduce the PharmaCare deducible for 240,000 British Columbians will take effect.

Provincial Health Officer annual report – Vancouver – December 20 (afternoon) TBC The Provincial Health Officer is required by the Public Health Act to report annually to British Columbians on their health status and on the need for policies and programs that will improve their health. Media event in Vancouver to launch the report. As mentioned, this has typically been supported by GCPE events, if possible.
