Crystal Smith, Elected Chief of the Haisla Nation said it right in response to the CCPA protests at an LNG Canada talk in Ottawa in December when she said she was "offended" by these protestors who had the gall to protest what her nation had spent years studying to

reach their own decision to support. A decision that gives her nation, for the first time, an opportunity to take control of their own future. As interested parties in the development of the LNG Canada project, I encourage you to speak out at any opportunity you have to ensure balance in the reporting as well as provide some cover to those in many First Nations communities and others that have stood up for the project but have become subject of bullying, intimidation, threats of physical violence and abuse.

Subject: Update on recent and current events

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

As we begin 2019, I wanted to wish you a Happy New Year and provide a brief update on recent / current events.

LNG Canada continues to advance work on the plant site, from dredging to tree clearing and other site preparation activities. We are working closely with JFJV, our Engineering, Procurement and Construction contractor. We have more than doubled the number of people working directly for LNG Canada, and a number of local people and First Nations have been hired for site construction-related activities.

In my first email to you, I advised that despite the unprecedented Indigenous and community support for LNG Canada and for Coastal GasLink's 670-km pipeline, there is some opposition to the pipeline and certain groups have erected a barricade over a public access road that Coastal GasLink needs to cross to access a small, but critical, portion of the pipeline right-of-way.

As you may recall, at the end of November, following many attempts to engage with this opposition group, Coastal GasLink applied for, and received, an interim injunction order to allow Coastal GasLink to access the public access road and its right-of-way in the short term. This includes removal of the barricade currently blocking the road. To clarify some of the information that has appeared in the public sphere, the interim injunction order, and the resulting access to the area by Coastal GasLink, will not require the people residing at the camp near this blockade to leave the camp, and will not impact the buildings located there in any way.

To date, despite the order of the Court, the blockaders have not removed the barricades voluntarily, and a second blockade has been established about 20 kms further up the road from the site of the first blockade.

We have seen a good deal of social media activity in support of these blockades. At the same time, while these blockades currently remain in place, there continues to be strong public support for the LNG project and the Coastal GasLink pipeline being voiced by groups such as the First Nations LNG Alliance, several Wet'suwet'en hereditary and elected Chiefs, and many others. Karen Ogen-Toews, CEO of the FNLNGA, wrote a compelling article calling for all parties to "Come together for the Wet'suwet'en people," which I shared with you before the holidays. In her article, Karen argues that without "economic development in our territories, our people will always have to accept a diminished quality of life unless they move elsewhere." In her article, Karen calls for her Nation "to come together for our people."

I also shared the APTN interview with Helen Michelle, a Wet'suwet'en Hereditary Chief and elected band council member, who confirmed her support, demonstrating that Wet'suwet'en hereditary leaders' opposition to Coastal GasLink is far from unanimous, despite some claims that it is. Grassroots support groups such as TheNorthMatters, Fort St. John for LNG and Resource Works also continue to speak out in support of LNG development, and they have been joined recently by ShareBC and Together4LNG. Membership is open to any supporter of LNG development – from communities to labour organizations, municipalities, academics etc.

LNG Canada respects the rights of individuals to peacefully express their point-of-view, as long as their activities do not jeopardize people's safety and are within the law. We are hopeful that there can be a voluntary and peaceful resolution to the issue of Coastal GasLink access. Our first concern remains for the safety of the public, Coastal GasLink's employees and contractors, the individuals participating in the two blockades, and for the RCMP officers if they are required to enforce the injunction order to remove the barricades.

#### In summary:

- Coastal GasLink applied for and received an interim injunction order. This order applies to both blockades that are currently in place.
- The elected council of the Wet'suwet'en territory as well as certain Hereditary Chiefs support the Coastal GasLink project, however, some Hereditary Chiefs do not.
- Strong support remains in place from northern communities and Indigenous groups along the length of the pipeline, at the plant and in northeastern BC where the gas will be produced.
- Accessing the Morice River Bridge and constructing this portion of the Coastal GasLink pipeline
  will not require individuals living or visiting the healing center or camp located in the area to
  move or relocate.
- LNG Canada and JFJV, our Engineering, Procurement and Construction contractor, continue to advance work at the plant site, including tree clearing, dredging and other site preparation activities, and continue to create employment opportunities related to the project.

Subject: B.C. Supreme Court Decision on CGL application for injunction - Prince George Citizen Article

A B.C. Supreme Court Justice issued an injunction Friday temporarily ordering opponents of the Coastal GasLink pipeline to allow workers access to a disputed area south of Houston and start work on the \$6.2-billion project.

Since 2012, a blockade in the form of a gate has been up across the Morice River bridge on the forest service road of the same name largely in opposition to the project, a 670-kilometre pipeline that would send natural gas from a station near Dawson Creek to the fledgling LNG Canada near Kitimat.

The blockade was established in the name the Unist'ot'en, a group within the Wet'suwet'en Nation, although Freda Huson and Warner Naziel were named as the defendants in Coastal GasLink's notice of claim seeking the injunction.

The injunction will come into effect on Monday and remain in place until no later than May 1, 2019. Coastal GasLink had been seeking a permanent injunction but Justice Marguerite Church found the defendants have not had enough time to respond to the company's notice of claim and opted for a temporary order.

In a statement, Coast GasLink, a wholly-owned subsidiary of TransCanada Corp., said it "appreciates the court's decision" which will allow it to move forward with pre-construction activities. The company also stressed it is only looking for access to the bridge.

"The camp established next to the bridge will remain as is. In fact, we see no reason why the camp cannot continue with its activities. We simply need to use the public bridge to access our pipeline right of way."

The corridor is located about one kilometre south of the camp "and does not overlap or directly affect the camp, as some reports have claimed," the company also stressed. The injunction comes with an enforcement order authorizing the RCMP to uphold the injunction if there is push back.

"The area of the blockade is remote, the number of persons present at the blockade varies, the time for the plaintiff to perform their work is very limited and based on social media posts by the defendant, there is an indication that the defendants and their supports may not obey the interim injunction order," Church said.

During submissions on Thursday at the Prince George courthouse, Coastal GasLink lawyer Kevin O'Callaghan said the company had obtained all the necessary permits and authorizations necessary to build the pipeline and in the process had consulted with Indigenous groups along the route, including the office representing the Wet'suwet'en hereditary chiefs and the five Wet'suwet'en bands recognized under the Indian Act.

He said Coastal GasLink has also reached benefit agreements with all 20 elected bands along the route, including the five Wet'suwet'en bands. O'Callaghan read in portions of affidavits outlining the tens millions of dollars at stake for the Wet'suwet'en in the form of contracts to carry out logging, clearing, road building and camp services.

The company had maintained a policy of working around the blockade but with the Oct. 1 decision to go ahead with both the pipeline and the \$31-billion LNG Canada project, the court

was told it needs to begin pre-construction work in January to avoid delays of as much to a year further along.

It was also noted that the blockaders have allowed Canfor access to carry out logging along the Morice Forest Service Road. Coastal GasLink's pre-construction work includes repairing and upgrading roads and culverts, clearing the corridor of trees and establishing a work camp. Church said she found the work Coastal GasLink intends for that phase of the project is consistent with the forestry work already being carried out beyond the blockade and noted the work camp will be set up on an existing cutblock. Beyond that, no other work on the pipeline is scheduled for the area until June 2021, she noted.

She also found there is enough prima facie or first-view evidence that actions of the defendants are unlawful and pose irreparable harm to Coastal GasLink to warrant a temporary injunction. "Given the logistical complexity of the project, any delays to the construction schedule could jeopardize the entire project, posing losses to the plaintiff and the various joint venture participants and contractors in the range of several hundred million dollars," Church said. "This would include significant and direct negative financial consequences to the Wet'suwet'en and other Indigenous-owned companies who have contracted and subcontracted for some of the project work.

"Delay to or loss of the project could also cause indirect harm, including delayed access for Indigenous bands to financial access and other benefits under agreements with the plaintiff and the province."

Moreover, if the defendants were eventually found responsible for causing such harm, Church said there is "no real chance" of recovering the loss from them.

Conversely, she found the harm to the defendants of allowing Coastal GasLink access for the interim would be "relatively minimal."

Although it's described on its website as a clan, the court was told the Unist'ot'en is a matrilineal group that spans across three house groups in the Gil\_seyhu or Big Frog clan. Huson is a member of the Unist'ot'en and a spokesperson for the Dark House and an elected member of the Witset, one of the Wet'suwet'en Indian Act bands.

Along with consulting with each of the bands and the office of the heriditary chiefs, the court was told Coastal GasLink and the provincial government were asked to consult with Dark House separately.

Attempts were made through Naziel, Dark House's hereditary chief Warner Naziel and through Huson. But they refused to meet and provided no substantive comments during the permitting process other than to maintain their opposition to the project.

Coastal GasLink has agreed that it did not consult with the Unist'ot'en, saying the group was not identified by the B.C. Environmental Office as a governing Wet'suwet'en body.

O'Callaghan had disputed the defendant's contention that they have not had enough time to provide a proper response, arguing they had known since at least Oct. 1 if not for years that the matter would come to a head.

But Church found they were not compelled to seek legal counsel until a notice of claim had been served. That occurred on Nov. 29, just two weeks before the hearing, and it was not until Friday that Huson and Naziel had secured a lawyer.

They were served at a time when Naziel was dealing with a family issue - his mother is in palliative care claim. Accompanying the claim was 17 affidavits amounting to 2,400 pages, it was also noted.

As many as 60 people attended the hearing on Thursday at the Prince George courthouse. On Friday, Church delivered her decision from Williams Lake via videoconferencing into courtrooms in Prince George and Smithers. About 30 people packed the courtroom in Smithers and 10 took in the decision in Prince George

Subject: An Open Letter to LNG Canada Stakeholders - Coastal Gas Link Update

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

Since receiving a positive final investment decision by LNG Canada's Joint Venture Participants in early October, LNG Canada has been busy moving forward into the construction phase of the project, doubling our workforce, working closely with our Engineering, Procurement and Construction contractor JGC-Fluor, and supporting Coastal GasLink to advance its Coastal GasLink pipeline project.

Coastal GasLink has unprecedented community and Indigenous support for its 670-km pipeline that will transport natural gas from northeastern BC to our plant site in Kitimat. Mayors and community residents up and down the pipeline right-of-way support the project, as do 20 out of 20 elected First Nations bands who have signed Project Agreements with Coastal GasLink.

LNG Canada supports the extensive efforts Coastal GasLink has undertaken to consult and engage with First Nations along the pipeline right-of-way and is pleased the pipeline has received so much support.

There is one group, however, that opposes the pipeline project and members of this group have erected a barricade over a public access road that Coastal GasLink needs to cross to access a small portion of the pipeline route, initially to conduct some pre-construction work, and later to construct a roughly 60-kilometre section of the pipeline.

On Monday, November 26, despite numerous attempts to respectfully consult with this group and find a solution that works for all parties, Coastal GasLink filed an application for an injunction, asking the Court to ensure it

can access the public road and complete important field work this winter. We are concerned that a delay to Coastal GasLink's ability to conduct this work could impact the delivery of jobs and opportunities to local First Nations communities, and in turn, will impact LNG Canada's project schedule.

LNG Canada's first concern is for the safety of the public, for Coastal GasLink's employees and contractors, and for the individuals participating in the blockade. We respect the rights of individuals to peacefully express their point-of-view, as long as their activities do not jeopardize people's safety and are within the law.

There is considerable discussion of this issue in social media, with sharing among the ENGO community and supporters of the blockade. As it will likely be covered in mainstream media as well, we wanted to ensure our stakeholders had important background information, as issues such as these are complex.

- Coastal GasLink requires access to the Morice River Bridge, a bridge crossing on a public road
- The Morice River Bridge is located within the traditional territory of the Wet'suwet'en Nation.
- The elected representatives of the Wet'suwet'en territory support the Coastal GasLink project, however, some of the Hereditary Chiefs do not.
- Near the Morice River Bridge, a group calling itself the Unist'ot'en Camp has built a
  Healing Centre and some individuals live there permanently, while others visit and
  access programs and services the Healing Centre offers. Accessing the Morice River
  Bridge and constructing this portion of the Coastal GasLink pipeline will not require
  individuals living there to relocate. (See map attached)
- LNG Canada, along with others, has filed an Affidavit in support of Coastal GasLink's
  application for an injunction, and outlined the impact lack of access would have on our
  ability to deliver our Project.
- Coastal GasLink and LNG Canada will continue to work to find a peaceful solution, one
  in which everyone can benefit from these significant projects. Coastal GasLink will also
  continue to assess its legal options, as efforts to discuss these matters have not been
  reciprocated.

My name is Perrin Grauer. I'm a reporter with The Star Vancouver.

I'm cc'ing a number of offices here because I'm not sure who my best point of contact is for this inquiry.

I spoke with a fellow from the environmental assessment office of the Office of the Wet'suwet'en in Smithers, BC, today.

He said that based on this 2017 mandate letter

(https://www2.gov.bc.ca/assets/gov/government/ministries-organizations/premier-cabinet-mlas/minister-letter/mungall-mandate.pdf) the permits which were given to Coastal GasLink to build pipeline infrastructure on unceded Wet'suwet'en territory — which ultimately resulted in Wet'suwet'en defiance of a Supreme Court injunction and police enforcement on Monday at kilometre 44 of Morice West forest service road — were responsible for a situation in which,

according to Articles 8 a,c and 10 of UNDRIP, the RCMP performed illegal arrests and transportation (removal) of Indigenous people from their territories.

Coastal GasLink's project, he added, denies Wet'suwet'en access to or destroys historically significant aspects of their land and fails to protect that land to their standards — the land being a critical part of Wet'suwet'en identity and culture — which likewise violates UNDRIP.

He says he will be bringing — or has already brought — these charges to the attention of government and law enforcement.

If you could address these claims, I would appreciate it.

And the challenge for government, federal and provincial, is determining how we bring together these historic band councils modelled with, as I understand it, the emerging hereditary model that's very much manifesting itself in Wet'suwet'en territory.

So, again, I know people would prefer to have what's the answer, yes or no, but there isn't one. And I know that all of you here who have been covering these issues for a long, long, time understand that every circumstance is different. I used the Broughton Archipelago and the salmon aquaculture issue as an example. We were dealing at that time nation to nation with hereditary leadership, with elected leadership, and not everyone in the region agreed. But those who did did so enthusiastically and now we have a way forward.

Nathan, thanks for drawing my attention to concerns about one passage in Premier Horgan's comments yesterday. In response to a number of queries, Premier John Horgan has reviewed the transcript of his remarks during the news conference January 9, 2019 regarding the events in Unis'tot'en territory.

The passage that raised concern reads: "And the challenge for government, federal and provincial, is determining how we bring together these historic band councils modelled with, as I understand it, the emerging hereditary model that's very much manifesting itself in Wet'suwet'en territory."

The Premier's comments regarding the hereditary model were intended to refer to traditional, long-standing and now "re-emerging hereditary model," in contrast to the Indian Act band council model imposed in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The use of the word "emerging" during the news conference has caused confusion.

In the Premier's view, it is the mutual responsibility of all governments to shift their relationships and arrangements with Indigenous peoples to one that is based on recognition for and support of implementation of their right to self determination, including the inherent right of self-government for Indigenous nations.

- Our government recognizes the importance of mining in British Columbia. On forming government, I asked
  Minister Mungall to establish a B.C. Mining Jobs Task Force to review exploration and mining in the province
  and find ways to strengthen this important industry.
- The 12-member task force [many of whom are here with me today] includes representatives from industry, First Nations, municipal government, an environmental non-governmental organization, labour, postsecondary/training and the financial sector.
- The Task Force established a vision that "British Columbians are proud of our growing mining industry as the backbone of an inclusive, progressive and low carbon economy"; and the final report includes unanimous recommendations that government will action.

- I'm very pleased to accept the report and the recommendations made to us. Our government is acting on the unanimous recommendations made by the Task Force and injecting more \$26 million into the mining sector so we can bring more certainty to create good jobs for people today, tomorrow and beyond.
- We are excited about the recommendations provided to us. Today, we are announcing funding to take immediate action on implementing and addressing what the Task Force submitted.
- Short-term actions we are taking include:
  - Investing \$20 million in the ministry over the next three years. This means 65 new full-time employees
    to ensure we have the boots on the ground to deliver an improved and properly resourced approvals
    process to assess mining applications and increase industry safety by establishing an independent
    oversight unit.
  - \$1,000,000 for a Mining Innovation Roadmap.
  - \$1,000,000 for the Regional Mining Alliance to promote mineral exploration and mining and Indigenous partnerships in B.C.
  - \$730,000 to explore and establish best practices in community well-being for mining.
  - o \$200,000 to host a multi-stakeholder forum on responsible metals next year.
- In addition, we are allocating nearly a \$1 million (\$830,000) to the ministry to further assess and provide recommendations to government on a number of the task force recommendations, including:
  - Mining's fiscal framework including the Task Force's recommendations with respect to the New Mine Allowance, PST, an investment fund, the BC Mineral Exploration credit and Flow-through credit, and BC Hydro's Mining Customer Payment Plan
  - Development of an action plan to attract and retain women in mining
  - Establishment of an accessible worker database
  - · Co-ordination of mine sector branding with CleanBC
  - Legislative changes with respect to establishment of community trusts that have the participation of multiple Indigenous groups
- I would like to tell you more about two of these initiatives:
  - The Regional Mining Alliance is an example of our government's approach to resource development; collaboration between First Nations, industry and the Province to attract investment into B.C. and demonstrate that B.C. is open for business.
  - The innovation roadmap will build on the work of the Innovation Commissioner to bring together First Nations, industry and academia to ensure our efforts are aligned to leverage collective effort to address industry challenges and develop competitive advantages.
- Government is also continuing to work on Task Force actions, including:
  - Indigenous stewardship and monitoring
  - Mine sector roadmap for training
  - Government's low-carbon industrial strategy
  - A review of government's revenue-sharing policy including indigenous equity ownership
- We are open for business, and we want to be the most attractive jurisdiction in Canada for exploration investment. We need minerals for an electrified economy and for transportation – for a cleaner, stronger future.

Hi Geoff (cc Nimmi),

As per your email yesterday, please see attached for information from LDB on public cannabis store procurement.

I've pulled out the relevant points here:

- To date, LDB is operating one store in Kamloops BC, which opened on the date of legalization, and has received local government approval for stores in: Kamloops (2 stores), Williams Lake, Cranbrook, Fort St. John, Campbell River and Terrace.
  - In addition to these stores, LDB has submitted applications to other local governments that have established their cannabis retail policy and are accepting applications for cannabis retail stores.
- In addition to trying to meet the above noted objective of optimizing it's performance and sustaining net returns to the Province, the LDB applies the following criteria in determining where to establish stores:
  - Population of community If the population of a community is less than 10,000 the Province is unlikely to pursue a store given that it could be serviced by the online BC Cannabis Store (BCCS), which allows British Columbians access to non-medical cannabis regardless of where they live. There are some exceptions to the population criterion, which include: (i) there is a strong desire by a community to have a government store, and/or ii) if the community is a tourist/seasonal destination or has a large trading area.
  - Site availability and suitability LDB determines if there are available suitable sites within a community, and if the sites have floor access, the level of interior and exterior renovations required, landlords' willingness to negotiate a fair lease, square footage of store, location of store in an established retail centre, foot traffic near the site, and site accessibility.
  - Local government readiness Assuming above criteria have been met, an application will be submitted if the local government has established their cannabis bylaws and/or framework and is ready to accept applications.
  - Profitability Long-term profitability and sales projections of a site is also a consideration. Market data obtained in relation to government operated liquor stores is used to provide insight into markets where demand is likely to be high and business operations sustainable.

Hello Sage. I don't believe we have met, but I have seen your name in the news over the years.

As you know, the Premier is delivering a luncheon keynote talk at the Natural Resources Forum on January 23. I have been asked to moderate a following up conversation with him, once he has finished his speech. I am happy to do so. As I understand it, the two of us will be seated on the stage, and I will be scanning questions put forward by the audience using the Pigeonhole system and selecting certain questions to ask the Premier.

I intend to start off by asking two questions of my own, and I wanted to share these in advance so the Premier won't be 'surprised' or caught off guard in any way.

- One question will relate to the heavy economic costs that Canada has been bearing from the inability to sell our oil and oil products in global markets, and whether he believe this is an acceptable situation for a major natural resource producing jurisdiction. I won't ask about or mention the Trans Mountain project specifically; instead, my question will be framed in the broader Canadian context, noting that energy is the country's number one export industry (generating up to \$100 billion in export earnings every year).
- My second question will concern the government's adoption of UNDRIP and the ongoing efforts to advance reconciliation with Indigenous communities (which we in the Business Council

support). There are many questions about how UNDRIP and the concept of Free, Prior and Informed Consent will play out across government – and also how it will affect regulatory decision-making touching on B.C.'s forestry, mining, energy and other landbased industries. There is a great appetite among natural resource stakeholders to understand these issues, so I want to raise this topic with the Premier.

I hope this head's up is helpful.

I look forward to seeing the Premier (and perhaps meeting you) in Prince George.

New homes with support services for people experiencing homelessness

KELOWNA - In response to an urgent need, the Province is building more supportive housing for people in Kelowna experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

"We know homelessness is a problem that has been ignored for too long in the region and around the province. We need to act now and build more homes for people who need them," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "Projects like this not only get people out of the cold and into safe, secure housing, they also help people rebuild their lives with the right supports, dignity and respect."

The project at 280 McIntosh Rd. is funded through the Building BC: Supportive Housing Fund and will include up to 50 homes. Residents will have a self-contained studio with a private washroom and kitchenette.

"Everyone deserves safe, secure shelter," said Colin Basran, mayor, City of Kelowna. "As addressed in the Journey Home Strategy and our community plan, these new homes will help house some of our community's most vulnerable residents."

The project will be operated by the John Howard Society of Central and South Okanagan. Staff will be onsite 24/7 and will provide support services to tenants, such as daily meals, life skills training, resume building and access to employment opportunities. This is a permanent supportive housing project that will prepare residents to transition into market rental housing.

"We are so pleased to be partnering with BC Housing to provide these safe, secure new homes that give people a real opportunity to rebuild their lives," said Gaelene Askeland, executive director, John Howard Society of Central and South Okanagan. "We look forward to being part of the community at 280

McIntosh Rd. As with all our projects, we are committed to be a good neighbour building safe communities, both inside our buildings and with those who live and work in the surrounding area."

"We know that access to safe and affordable housing contributes to one's health and well-being. Poor housing quality and instability is linked with a number of physical and mental health conditions," said Danielle Cameron, health service administrator, Interior Health, mental health and substance use. "The new supportive homes at 280 McIntosh will provide at least 50 people with the stabilized housing they need to recover and/or remain healthy."

Contingent on permit approvals, construction is estimated to begin in spring 2019 and to be completed by fall 2019.

#### Quick Facts:

- \* The Government of B.C. will provide \$2.95 million for the project and will also provide an operating subsidy.
- \* During the 2018 point-in-time counts of homelessness conducted in March, 286 people were identified as experiencing homelessness in Kelowna.
- \* Residents will be charged a monthly rental rate of \$375, the social assistance shelter allowance provided by the Province to those experiencing homelessness.
- \* The Supportive Housing Fund is an investment of \$1.2 billion over 10 years to build 2,500 homes with 24/7 support to help people experiencing homelessness.
- \* This project builds on the work government is doing to reduce poverty in British Columbia. In October 2018, the B.C. government introduced the Poverty Reduction Strategy Act. Informed by thousands of people who participated in a comprehensive public consultation, the act sets out targets and defines the scope of the poverty reduction strategy, which is scheduled to be released in early 2019.

I connected with Debbie Pierre and Peter Grant tonight as per Minister Fraser's letter to the OW last Friday:

- They will recommend support to their chiefs for our suggested negotiator. We can proceed to next steps with our negotiator (I will follow up with my MO on this). I advised Debbie and Peter that the negotiator was not available for the next week or so (they were fine with that). They requested that we provide our negotiator with a "letter of authorization" and that they see it in advance. I agreed.
- The OW will start to plan the feast as an early step. I asked that they keep the reality in mind for the Minister that he will not be able to leave (Monday to Thursday) once the house sits.
- I advised that we are working on "simplified" and adequate funding and that will take us a couple weeks (fyi for all of you we are aiming at a minor TB Jan 29). In meantime, MIRR will look at flowing 50-75k to the OW to aid with OW's expenses incurred, and incurring.
- Communications protocol Peter and Debbie agree that we will want to be public about the negotiations going forward. They needed reinforcement from me that the negotiation will be portrayed as reconciliation and not tied to any one project. More conversation to go on when and what we publicly say once we get closer to finalizing our negotiator.

Debbie acknowledged they have received the Premier's letter today.

This was submitted to province late last week and specifically is looking for provincial government approval to be on their list, as the province needs to support us to access federal support for our New South Vancouver Facility which the federal government is interested in providing along with our philanthropic investments.

This facility is one of four new Y's we are building in the lower mainland (Chilliwack opening in March/April 2019, Surrey Centre, Coquitlam and South Vancouver) that combined will double our current capacity of 120,000 people to close to 250,000 people. The conversation focused on moving forward on joint commitments around affordable housing, tackling the opioid crisis, and SkyTrain to UBC.

"Premier Horgan and I have known each other for a long time, and it was a pleasure to sit down with him to talk about how we can keep moving forward on the priorities Vancouver residents have," said Stewart. "The Premier and I both agree that delivering on affordable housing needs to include deep and long-term partnerships with non-profit housing providers and I look forward to working with our Provincial partners to strengthen those relationships and build the housing we need to make our city more affordable."

The Mayor also stressed the need to move forward with rapid transit from Arbutus to UBC as part of a regional plan to keep people moving. "The Premier has been a supporter of smart transportation investments from day one, and the extension all the way to UBC is no exception."

In my investigation into licence ownership in BC, I found the director of two companies (Tinlet and Tinshi holdings), that own considerable license/quota of BC fisheries. His

name is Guo Tai Shi and he has been named by casino investigators as a Chinese VIP gambler, with potential links to the casino-money laundering case. I reached a dead end in terms of being able to go further in my investigation after putting in many calls to the lawyer's office where the records for this company are help. This should perhaps be taken up by someone with access to criminal records and other tools to see if there are any potential links. There are strong connections between fisheries and organized crime, drug smuggling, etc. in other parts of the world, and with such a lack of transparency around fisheries licenses in BC, I wouldn't be surprised if this type of corruption was happening here too.

 Our number one priority is always student safety.
 We will provide any assistance we can to police and prosecutors on these disturbing arrests.

CTV News has confirmed a former Vancouver School Board trustee is among seven men now charged after a Vancouver police sting that targeted men looking to have sex with underage girls. Ken Clement was a member of the board from 2008 to 2014 and again from October 2017 until his resignation in July of 2018.

At the time, he claimed he resigned for personal reasons.

Court documents show he was arrested on June 27, 2018. He was charged in December with communicating for the purpose of obtaining sexual services for consideration from a person under the age of 18.

Those charged are among 47 men arrested as part of a larger VPD operation where detectives posed as underage girls and advertised escort services on social media. A teacher was also among those arrested.

<u>By January 31, 2019</u> – Freda Huson and Warner Naziel (lawyer Michael Ross) to file their responses, along with any affidavits and any other pleadings, to the CGL injunction application and the associated Notice of Civil Claim.

Note: yesterday CGL learned that Micheal Ross has been re-retained by the Defendants and asked to extend the due date of the response to February 20. This has been agreed to by CGL but has not yet been confirmed. This has implications for the May 1, 2019 date.

In the meanwhile, the court issued an interim injunction to allow CGL unobstructed access over the FSR. That injunction is supported by an enforcement order directing the RCMP to ensure the injunction is followed and to arrest or detain anyone in breach of the injunction order. The interim injunction remains in place until any further decision by the court after full hearing on the injunction application, or other order of the court.

Over the coming weeks, CGL will continue to do preparatory work including road clearing, starting to build the camps, etc.

By May 1, 2019 - the parties, unless otherwise agreed, must have completed any further hearings on the injunction application. That is, if Ms. Huson and/or Mr. Naziel wish to challenge the injunction application, they must move promptly to have the matter heard. If they do not, the interim injunction will stay in place.

Given the request to extend the date to provide information, the hearing date would be extended to not later than May 31.

Dear Minister Blair,

Thank you for meeting with me in Vancouver on January 22, 2019, to discuss the need to improve the detection, investigation and prosecution of money laundering in British Columbia. I have taken the liberty of copying the Federal Justice Minister and Federal Public Safety Minister on this letter, as several areas of concern relate directly to statutes or agencies within his portfolio.

In 2017, I appointed Dr. Peter German, Q.C. as an independent expert to conduct a review of British Columbia's anti-money-laundering policies and practices in the gambling industry, with a focus on the Lower Mainland. During his review of the province's gaming industry, Dr. German made incidental findings of concern related to horse racing, luxury cars, and real estate. As a result, he is currently working on a second review related to these very sectors.

In addition to the ongoing German review, Government appointed Ms. Maureen Maloney, as chair of the Expert Panel on Money Laundering in Real Estate. This Ministry of Finance panel is looking at gaps in compliance and enforcement of existing laws, consumer protection, financial services regulations, regulation of real estate professionals, and jurisdictional gaps between British Columbia and the federal government. Both final reports are to be submitted to government in Spring 2019. While Dr. German's report on this second review is not yet complete, he has provided me with some interim findings that I can share with you.

First, I understand that his review of the horseracing sector is largely complete. He advises that the sector is in decline and is not currently a significant money laundering threat to the Province.

His review of the luxury auto sector is also well underway. In contrast to horse racing, he advises that this sector's review has revealed areas of concern in both domestic and international sales. A likely finding of his will be to encourage the federal government to amend the POCMLTFA to include Geographic

Tracking Orders (GTOs), as mentioned in the federal Finance Consultation Paper. GTOs would permit either FinTRAC or the federal Ministry of Finance to impose special reporting obligations on a sector in a defined geographic location, such as Greater Vancouver.

With respect to money laundering in the real estate sector, as we have discussed, he advises me that he is not yet prepared to provide interim findings due in significant part to challenges in gathering information from federal agencies. Thank you in advance for your commitment to ongoing assistance in addressing this information flow issue.

I would also like to reiterate my request for the "secret police study," as described by Global News on November 26th, 2018. The media reports suggested that in 2017 a study of a data set including 1,200 luxury real estate purchases in 2016 concluded that up to \$1bn in real estate transactions in Vancouver alone were potentially connected to money laundering of the proceeds of crime.

In addition to Dr. German's above-noted interim findings, there are several policy proposals that I wish to bring to your attention. The context for these recommendations is important.

Following Dr. German's initial report on money laundering in casinos, and countless media reports both before and since that report, many British Columbians remain deeply concerned about an apparent lack of resources or interest (or both) on the part of law enforcement, federal government agencies, financial institutions, casino operators and regulators for the better part of a decade while organized crime used our casinos and other areas of our economy to openly launder hundreds of millions, and perhaps billions of dollars in proceeds of crime.

This concern about a lack of investigation and prosecution of money laundering is not unique to British Columbians – it is shared internationally. In labelling Canada a "Major Money Laundering jurisdiction" in March of last year, the United States strongly suggested that "The [Canadian] government should take steps to increase enforcement and prosecution."[1]

This American assessment followed what were already concerning findings from the international Financial Action Task Force, which concluded in a mutual evaluation report of Canada in 2016 (the most recent year available) that:

Law enforcement agencies [in Canada] generally suffer from insufficient resources and expertise to pursue complex ML cases. In addition, legal persons [corporations] are not effectively pursued and sanctioned for ML, despite their misuse having been identified in the NRA as a common ML typology... Overall, asset recovery appears low... Falsely and undeclared cross-border movements of currency and other bearer negotiable instruments are rarely analysed by the Financial Intelligence Unit or investigated by the RCMP.<sup>[2]</sup>

I can advise you that this finding is certainly consistent with concerns presented to me during informal conversations with current and former police officers and regulators involved in anti-money laundering enforcement. I note that British Columbia certainly does not place full responsibility on the Federal government for these issues. For example, our province is currently overhauling our policing and regulatory enforcement related to gambling in the province. However, we do need your assistance and support in addressing these concerns as they certainly cross jurisdictional lines.

All reviews and information gathered to date by British Columbia strongly suggests that there is urgent need for significant reforms, including:

1. Establishment of a dedicated agency or body to take on money laundering and organized crime investigations and prosecutions in British Columbia across jurisdictional lines, similar to Quebec's *Unité Permanente Anticorruption* in singularity of focus, dedicated resources, and cross-jurisdictional information sharing.

- 2. Reform of Federal law related to money laundering, with particular attention to the predicate offence proof requirements under Canada's anti-money laundering criminal laws. I understand that under the Criminal Code, property which is not directly connected to an offence can only be forfeited as the proceeds of crime if there is proof beyond a reasonable doubt. This is a continual and unnecessary frustration to successful money laundering investigations and prosecutions.
- 3. Establishment of a Canadian version of the *Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations*Act and/or Continuing Criminal Enterprise Statute. Versions of these two American laws have been used successfully in the United States and elsewhere for decades to prosecute organized crime. Law enforcement veterans who specialize in organized crime regularly raise concerns in the media and privately about the inability, under Canadian law, for successful large-scale prosecutions of the leaders of organized criminal groups to proceed, regardless of resources in law enforcement.

Dr. German advises me that it is his belief that the existing organized crime provisions within the Criminal Code have been singularly unsuccessful in dealing with actual organized crime. Furthermore, he advises that the expanding criminal discovery process stymies and unnecessarily protracts complex investigations and prosecutions, without providing any apparent significant benefit to the goal of preventing wrongful convictions. This situation cannot be allowed to continue if public confidence in our justice system is to be preserved.

- 4. Establishment of a Canadian version of the United Kingdom's "Unexplained Wealth Order" to assist Revenue Canada and federal RCMP, as well as provincial police, to identify and seize proceeds of crime and corruption. While such a measure could not be used for criminal prosecutions, if it were used judiciously and coupled with British Columbia's upcoming beneficial ownership registry, such orders could greatly assist in identifying the origins of money in our real estate market and could assist in property seizures or tax prosecutions where cash originated in criminal or otherwise corrupt activities.
- 5. Explore options to strengthen FINTRAC and provide support for securities regulators in Canada, including the BC Securities Commissions (BCSC) who face significant challenges in their efforts to collect the financial sanctions they impose on violators of securities laws. The BC Ministry of Finance and the BCSC have determined that amendments to federal legislation have the potential to provide significant complementary enhancements to the sanctions imposed through the provincial securities regime. They anticipate that a complete package of legislative amendments modernizing and enhancing the BC securities framework will be passed spring 2019. As you are aware, the Proceeds of Crime (Money Laundering) and Terrorist Financing Act establishes the Financial Transactions and Reports Analysis Center of Canada (FINTRAC). This federal statute has a specific provision allowing for information disclosure to securities regulators. I would ask that officials explore options to strengthen the effectiveness of FINTRAC's relationship and information sharing processes with securities regulators. It is my hope that discussions may reveal ways to improve prosecutions of criminal misconduct for securities-related offences.
- 6. Improvements in the interaction between provincial Civil Forfeiture statutes and the Criminal Code to resolve uncertainty, including but not limited to:
  - a. Minor amendments to section 490 of the Criminal Code to deal with the preservation, detention, and return of property during criminal proceedings; and,
  - b. Clarifying in section 490 the ability of police and/or government to preserve property in conjunction with civil forfeiture proceedings and the ability of courts to grant standing to provincial civil forfeiture offices (CFO) to appear in criminal proceedings.
- 7. Support for implementation of a provincial law enforcement and industry strategy similar to the United Kingdom, which launched its first national risk assessment of money laundering and terrorist financing in 2015. In British Columbia it is common that specific allegations of

money laundering discussed in the media have a connection to financial institutions that fall within Provincial or Federal jurisdiction.<sup>[3]</sup> These organizations deserve a legal and regular opportunity to draw transactions of concern to the attention of law enforcement at all jurisdictional levels proactively. Similarly, police may wish to raise concerns with industry about activities or individuals police have identified in investigations. Such a strategy of information sharing could assist in identifying targets of interest for industry, law enforcement, tax authorities, and regulators.

BC has already made significant progress in reducing bulk cash transactions associated with money laundering in our casinos. Further work needs to be done, but requires your office's assistance so that we may expand on this preliminary effort and follow the money wherever it goes by addressing systemic problems that are obvious to most British Columbians by now. After you have had an opportunity to review the above-noted policy suggestions, I ask that our teams meet again to begin discussions on next steps.

Dear Minister Blair.

Thank you for meeting with me in Vancouver on January 22, 2019, to discuss the need to improve the detection, investigation and prosecution of money laundering in British Columbia. I have taken the liberty of copying the Federal Justice Minister and Federal Public Safety Minister on this letter, as several areas of concern relate directly to statutes or agencies within his portfolio.

In 2017, I appointed Dr. Peter German, Q.C. as an independent expert to conduct a review of British Columbia's anti-money-laundering policies and practices in the gambling industry, with a focus on the Lower Mainland. During his review of the province's gaming industry, Dr. German made incidental findings of concern related to horse racing, luxury cars, and real estate. As a result, he is currently working on a second review related to these very sectors.

In addition to the ongoing German review, Government appointed Ms. Maureen Maloney, as chair of the Expert Panel on Money Laundering in Real Estate. This Ministry of Finance panel is looking at gaps in compliance and enforcement of existing laws, consumer protection, financial services regulations, regulation of real estate professionals, and jurisdictional gaps between British Columbia and the federal government. Both final reports are to be submitted to government in Spring 2019. While Dr. German's report on this second review is not yet complete, he has provided me with some interim findings that I can share with you.

First, I understand that his review of the horseracing sector is largely complete. He advises that the sector is in decline and is not currently a significant money laundering threat to the Province.

His review of the luxury auto sector is also well underway. In contrast to horse racing, he advises that this sector's review has revealed areas of concern in both domestic and international sales. A likely finding of his will be to encourage the federal government to amend the POCMLTFA to include Geographic Tracking Orders (GTOs), as mentioned in the federal Finance Consultation Paper. GTOs would permit

either FinTRAC or the federal Ministry of Finance to impose special reporting obligations on a sector in a defined geographic location, such as Greater Vancouver.

With respect to money laundering in the real estate sector, as we have discussed, he advises me that he is not yet prepared to provide interim findings due in significant part to challenges in gathering information from federal agencies. Thank you in advance for your commitment to ongoing assistance in addressing this information flow issue.

I would also like to reiterate my request for the "secret police study," as described by Global News on November 26th, 2018. The media reports suggested that in 2017 a study of a data set including 1,200 luxury real estate purchases in 2016 concluded that up to \$1bn in real estate transactions in Vancouver alone were potentially connected to money laundering of the proceeds of crime.

In addition to Dr. German's above-noted interim findings, there are several policy proposals that I wish to bring to your attention. The context for these recommendations is important.

Following Dr. German's initial report on money laundering in casinos, and countless media reports both before and since that report, many British Columbians remain deeply concerned about an apparent lack of resources or interest (or both) on the part of law enforcement, federal government agencies, financial institutions, casino operators and regulators for the better part of a decade while organized crime used our casinos and other areas of our economy to openly launder hundreds of millions, and perhaps billions of dollars in proceeds of crime.

This concern about a lack of investigation and prosecution of money laundering is not unique to British Columbians – it is shared internationally. In labelling Canada a "Major Money Laundering jurisdiction" in March of last year, the United States strongly suggested that "The [Canadian] government should take steps to increase enforcement and prosecution."[1]

This American assessment followed what were already concerning findings from the international Financial Action Task Force, which concluded in a mutual evaluation report of Canada in 2016 (the most recent year available) that:

Law enforcement agencies [in Canada] generally suffer from insufficient resources and expertise to pursue complex ML cases. In addition, legal persons [corporations] are not effectively pursued and sanctioned for ML, despite their misuse having been identified in the NRA as a common ML typology...
