# 4. Government Caucus Committee: Education - July 21

The Vice-Chair reported support of the Aboriginal Education Centre as a specialty school concept but noted issues raised by school closings in Prince George.

For Information: Centre of Excellence in Aboriginal Education in Prince George

Cabinet reviewed a submission for a Provincial Resource Program offering educational programs and services from an Aboriginal perspective for students from Grade 8-12.

Cabinet endorsed the concept of a specialty school to support Aboriginal children to learn and graduate with better rates of success. Cabinet suggested that there should be two Aboriginal Resource Centres, that are cost-shared on an 50/50 basis with the federal government, over a five year pilot plan basis. School Districts should be asked to apply to partner with the province to open up the opportunities to School Districts who want to take advantage of offering this choice. The proposals to partner between the province and School Districts should clearly indicate that performance and results will be measured, as the intention is to offer new options for Aboriginal students.

## 5. For Direction: Provincial Drinking Driving Initiative

The Minister responsible stated that the level of impairment to be enforced will be the current .08 level. Further work will be done on educating the public on penalties for impaired driving. Any program involving vehicle impoundment will take into account the fairness concerns where there has been a driver who is someone other than the owner of the vehicle.

Support for an expanded definition of lodges and approval of a strategy to
identify 10 potential lodge development sites for marketing purposes. The
marketing strategy will have to be sensitive to timing. In addition the
Committee recommended further work on clarification of deliverables for the

The Committee reviewed the treaty principles contained in the referendum, in discussing whether forestry management requirements for treaty settlement land (TSL) should be the equivalent of private or remain at Crown land standards. The Committee recommended that treaty settlement lands should have the same status as fee simple (private) lands and should be treated in a similar manner to other fee simple lands in the province, in the area of forest and range matters.

#### A. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/DECISION

#### 1. Premier's Opening Remarks

The Premier gave an overview of the First Ministers Meeting and the results obtained. He also described some of the work ahead to achieve a national formulary, and a national purchasing agency as part of a national pharmacare program.

#### 2. For Information: Health Update

The Minister of Health Services provided a report on expenditures to facilitate better treatment, more surgeries and reductions in wait times for patients who require cardiac procedures, hip and joint surgery, and diagnostic scans. He explained the National Aboriginal Strategy and other highlights of the First Ministers Meeting on Health care.

# 3. For Decision: Literacy

Cabinet reviewed the Ready Set Learn program as well as other measures that will assist to prepare children to attend school ready to learn, to help parents actively support the education of their children and to help make schools a hub of family and community life.

# 4. For Information: Drought Preparedness- 2004
