## 1. Why did the public engagement only include an option for a move to permanent daylight saving time and not permanent standard time?

- The engagement survey was designed to determine if British Columbians wanted to continue changing their clocks twice a year. Their response was an emphatic "no."
- Lawmakers in Washington, Oregon and California are considering or legislating moves to permanent daylight saving time and that's what we consulted on.
- We also heard from respondents that it was important to maintain alignment with our west coast neighbours.
- 2. California now appears to be considering moving away from permanent daylight saving time and instead implementing permanent standard time. If they do, would we be out of alignment?
  - What's clear is that British Columbians want to stop changing their clocks twice a year.
  - The legislation does not prevent us from acting independently if it is in BC's best interest.

WRT to the committee-stage notes on DST, we received the following advice from DMs

- During the outreach on the proposed change, the only industries that indicated they may be impacted are the
  ski industry and to a much lesser extent the golf industry. In the case of the ski industry the issue centres on
  whether the time change would increase the amount of grooming work that would be conducted in the dark
  prior to resort opening. Though it follows that daily closures would be extended by an equal amount.
- The K-12 education sector suggested that it would increase the period during which children walk to school in the dark. Alternatively if districts want to make changes to school start and end times, they would need to do so prior to May 31 for the start of the subsequent school year.
- BC Hydro would find it easier to move in lockstep with the US as it simplifies the calculations involved in selling units of power at different times.
- PHSA would be able to adjust IT systems given adequate notice.
- The BC Chamber and local chambers indicated 1) that they want to move in lockstep with the US and 2) they want attention paid to the Kootenays and the Northeast who are tied into MT jurisdictions.

Eric, the certificate of readiness for the bill has been signed by the AG and we're scheduled for LRC next Tuesday.

We've consulted with staff/lawyers at UBCM and City of Vancouver re: consequential amendments. UBCM are fine with our proposed approach, which makes no changes to the Interpretation Act overrides in the Community Charter and Local Government Act re: Mountain Time areas of the province. Vancouver staff are consulting internally but don't believe there would be an issue with repealing the section of the Vancouver Charter that purports to give the City parallel powers to the LGIC re: time observance. It's never been used and they don't believe it ever would be. I've asked for them to confirm by end of week.

The only outstanding thing is messaging around possible social/economic impacts of moving to year-round DST. As discussed, one high level response is that those will be analyzed before the changes are brought into force. I'm concerned that may not satisfy some who believe govt should not legislate in advance of doing that work. Is there anyone you can point me to who could assist with outlining what discussions have taken place? I believe you mentioned Don Wright had discussions with some deputies and maybe there's more flowing out of that?

We have a draft but I have a few questions:

- we are planning to simply call our new year-round time observance "Pacific Time". I think this is simplest and it avoids potential confusion if it's called, for example, Pacific Standard Time (with a different reckoning) because for half the year it would be the same time as Mountain Standard Time; having two standard times that are the same would be odd. Also would sound strange to be on Pacific Daylight Time year round.
- Do we want to keep the existing reg making authority to alter Pacific Time by an hour for periods of the year, or repeal that power? It would be handy if there's any future desire to reinstate a time change. On the other hand it might look odd to retain it given the overall intent of the amendments.
- We are intending to leave the existing overrides in the Local Government Act and Community Charter that Interpretation Act doesn't apply to areas that observe MST and/or MDT. So they can continue to observe as they wish which I understand to be the policy direction. The only potential issue is the Kootenays which currently change their clocks to stay with Alberta. If they want to stay on the new Pacific Time year round they will have to decide that themselves. This change won't do that for them.

Those look fine to me as far as they go. Locals in Ft. St. John will likely want/expect that the provincial govt is not going to somehow force them to change their time observance, so a message to that effect would probably be welcome but that would require confirmation from PO.

The bottom line is that govt can't really force people to observe a particular time, except as it applies to the application of provincial law and programs. Historically, time observance has been a local thing, and time zones were only created in the late 1800s.

Also, perhaps worth noting that if the province moves to year-round DST we would, in fact, be moving to be on the same time observance as Ft. St. John, since MST = Pacific DST – both are Greenwich Time -7 hrs.

### **DST ONE-PAGER**

- Premier Horgan heard from people across British Columbia that wanted to stop changing their clocks and now we are preparing to make that change along with our neighbours and trading partners.
- Our government launched an engagement that would let anyone express their thoughts around the way we change our clocks and an astonishing 93% agreed that we should make our time zone permanent.
- This has been a people-led initiative and we've heard stories from thousands of families who are frustrated by the impact of the time switch on their children and from families who would like to spend more of their non-working day in daylight.
- We will be moving ahead along with our American neighbours and our Territorial neighbour the Yukon. This is the prudent way to proceed and it's what British Columbians expect.

Why did you not consider / consult on remaining on standard time instead?

- Let's be clear, the historic engagement we launched did put forward a proposal – this is standard for engagements – but participants had the opportunity to express a different preference and some did indicate they preferred standard time.
- But from the very beginning the overwhelming majority of those who have expressed interest in ending the clock change have supported permanent daylight time.
- Having 100% consensus in politics is impossible and we were very happy with 93% supporting our proposal but yes, whenever you have a proposal by government, there will be those who disagree.

If California moves to standard time or if the US congress doesn't make the change, what next?

- The legislation that we've introduced is permissive meaning it will allow government to make the change when the time is right but we are not going to be forced by one jurisdiction or another.
- This has been a people-led initiative and we will be continuing the conversation with British Columbians.

Recommendation #3: Benefits of discontinuing bi-annual time changes Provided any change in observing time in B.C. were done in alignment with California, Washington and Oregon, BC Hydro and Powerex would support discontinuing bi-annual time changes, as the benefits associated with not having to manage two time changes per year would more than offset any potential energy savings in B.C.

Bi-annual time changes impact IT capital and maintenance costs:

- Building computer systems to account for one 25 hour day and one 23 hour day each year consumes time and capital;
- Managing systems before and after each bi-annual time change consumes staff time that could otherwise be used to address other priorities and constraints;
- There would be a one-time cost associated with decommissioning software that supports biannual time change. However, it is anticipated that this cost would be recovered many times over in avoided capital costs for new projects and in avoiding on-going maintenance costs.

Thank you for your letter requesting information on our work with respect to Daylight Savings Time.

There are a number of Yukoners who respond to the spring time change by suggesting the elimination of this annual ritual.

In 2018, the Government of Yukon committed to investigate the time change practice following a motion in our legislative assembly. The outcome of this research determined that unilateral territorial change that results in Yukon being out of sync with western North America, particularly British Columbia, would not be in the overall best interests of Yukoners.

At the same time, we committed to continue to monitor the discussion among western leaders and ensure that we are well-informed on possible changes in other jurisdictions. Should there be a consensus to eliminate the practice among western regional leaders, our intention is to act in unison with the West.

I welcome any discussion between our two governments on potential actions to change the daylight savings convention. I appreciate the opportunity to share information and for possible coordinated action in the future.



Thank you for your letter of March 7, 2019, regarding Daylight Saving Time legislation in Pacific Coast jurisdictions.

You requested an update on Oregon's work on this issue. Senate Bill 320 and Senate Joint Memorial 6, which are currently being considered by the Oregon Legislative Assembly, would implement year-round Daylight Saving Time in most of Oregon, but only if a comparable time change takes effect in California and Washington, after being authorized by federal law.

At this point, SB 320 and SJM 6 have passed out of a Senate committee, and will soon receive a vote on the Senate floor. If, as seems likely, the Senate votes in favor of the bills, they will then be considered by the House.

I agree that Pacific Coast jurisdictions should remain in contact regarding Daylight Saving Time legislation. Dear Premier Silver:

Thanks very much for your letter of April 17, 2019, outlining the steps your government has taken with regard to the possible elimination of Daylight Saving Time (DST).

It appears that Pacific seaboard jurisdictions are well-aligned on this issue, assuming your Legislature continues to support change. Currently, legislation to implement year-round DST is being considered by the Oregon Legislative Assembly. Assuming the House votes in favour, federal action would then be required. I propose that the affected jurisdictions – British Columbia, Yukon, Washington, Oregon and California – make a joint statement at that time highlighting the consensus in the hope that it prompts action in Washington, D.C.
