





## LNG Canada Project Progress Update

- As of the end of August 2021, LNG Canada reported their total workforce as \*\*.21 workers employed. Of this total, roughly \*\*.21 are Canadian and are from B.C. As of September 2021, peak beds at Cedar Valley Lodge is \*\*.21
- On October 6<sup>th</sup>, LNG Canada reported that the project is over 50% complete, moving towards the expected mid-decade in-service date.

## Coastal GasLink Project Progress Update

- In July 2021, Coastal GasLink completed the opening of their workforce accommodation centres. As of the end of September 2021, 12 lodges are open and operational, housing services workers.

  of Icy Pass.
