Hi Doug,

Please find your estimate below based on what we discussed over the phone this afternoon.

I have not quoted on a purple stock as what is available in the market place for a purple 65 lb cover is all fairly dark. As discussed this would not be suitable for the officers as the black printing on the dark stock is very difficult for officers to read especially at night and in the car with the red light.

My recommendation is to print the text in purple ink on a white stock. We could print the title with a solid purple box with reverse type so the purple and IRP was clearly standout.

Here are some preliminary numbers based on what we discussed:

- Prints two sides, purple ink
- On white 65lb cover
- Scored 3 times to fold

Hi Jenna,

We just received the go ahead from Legal Services Branch regarding the revised 4-fold IRP (Immediate Roadside Prohibition) notebook information card for police.

While I am still working at securing a decision on the appropriate budget from which funding should come, I wanted to advance the attached template to you with the hope you could examine it and provide quotes for 10,000 & 20,000 of these cards.

The cards should measure approximately 3¼" x 10" and be printed upon a sufficiently thick gauge of stock like that used for the Charter/Police Warning cards your office previously produced for Police Services Division. However, unlike the Charter/Police Warning cards, the new IRP card stock needs to be a shade of purple consistent with the shade used on the cover page of the current IRP Forms MV2323 and MV2324. The shade of purple used for the previous batch of IRP cards was too dark and many officers complained of experiencing difficulty reading the card in low light conditions at night and red dome light conditions in their police cars.

Please provide your quote as soon as you can.

I will advise you once I receive clearance to proceed with the order.



PURPOSE: Clayton Pecknold, Assistant Deputy Minister
and Director of Police Services

ISSUE: Status update on the calibration and maintenance of Approved Screening Devices (ASDs) used in British Columbia impaired driving enforcement

SUMMARY:

- The Impaired Driving Advisory Committee (IDAC), formerly known as the Breath Test Advisory Committee, British Columbia Association of Chiefs of Police Traffic Safety Committee (BCACP TSC), is a police special working group that meets regularly to discuss issues relating to the enforcement of impaired driving.
- IDAC monitors Approved Screening Device (ASD) calibration issues and documentation, as well as police training, operational policies and procedures that support police in their use of BCs Immediate Roadside Prohibition (IRP) legislation in particular, and impaired driving in general.
- IDAC is also responsible for developing and advancing a new provincial training process for recertifying Qualified Breath Technicians (QT), which is being implemented in B.C. in 2014.

BACKGROUND:

- Standardized ASD calibration forms are utilized by all police across B.C. and are subject to ongoing monitoring by IDAC subject matter experts who provide feedback to the respective police agencies in support of accurate and complete documentation.
- If an ASD calibration error on a particular device is discovered, police pass that information to the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles at RoadSafetyBC, who has the authority to review any cases that may have been affected.
- In 2012, government also made changes to the IRP review process for drivers whose breath samples yield either "warn" or "fail" readings.
- These changes include the requirement for police to advise drivers they have the right to a second breath test on a second ASD and drivers can also challenge the results through an administrative review.
- Media stories have reported that Vancouver lawyer, Paul Doroshenko claims that ASD maintenance records and logs from 70 RCMP detachments, obtained under the federal *Access to Information and Privacy Act*, show a number of defective ASDs.

Mr. Doroshenko has repeatedly called upon government to direct police to suspend their issuing of Immediate Roadside Prohibitions and has further suggested that government enforce a scheme to report maintenance, calibration and repairs of ASDs.

- Supt Boucher of "E" Division Traffic Services advised that the information contained in the publically released ASD maintenance records confirms that police are following the operations and maintenance procedures set out in the manufacturer's specifications. Further, none of the ASDs Mr. Doroshenko claimed to be defective were faulty or in need of recalibration; rather, after incomplete log references were discovered through regular monitoring processes, the instruments in question were tested for accuracy and then put back into regular service. No notice was required to the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles and no IRP decisions were affected.

ISSUE: Status update on the calibration and maintenance of Approved Screening Devices (ASDs) used in British Columbia impaired driving enforcement.

SUMMARY:

- The Impaired Driving Advisory Committee (IDAC), formerly known as the Breath Test Advisory Committee, British Columbia Association of Chiefs of Police Traffic Safety Committee (BCACP TSC), is a police special working group that meets regularly to discuss issues relating to the enforcement of impaired driving.
- IDAC monitors Approved Screening Device (ASD) calibration issues and documentation, as well as police training, operational policies and procedures that support police in their use of BC's Immediate Roadside Prohibition legislation in particular, and impaired driving in general.
- IDAC is also responsible for developing and advancing a new provincial training process for recertifying Qualified Breath Technicians (QT), which is being implemented in BC in 2014.

BACKGROUND:

- Recent media stories have reported that a Vancouver lawyer claims that ASD maintenance records from 70 RCMP detachments, obtained under the *Access to Information and Privacy Act*, show a number of defective ASDs. The lawyer called upon government to direct police to suspend their issuing of roadside prohibitions and has further suggested that government enforce a scheme to report maintenance, calibration and repairs of ASDs.

- One media story reported the roadside experience of an individual last month in Surrey where he was reportedly prohibited from driving for 90 days and had his car impounded for "Refusing to provide a suitable breath sample". The individual reported that after trying to blow into the ASD "numerous times" the device kept reading "Void".

PURPOSE: For INFORMATION for Clayton Pecknold, Assistant Deputy Minister and Director of Police Services

ISSUE: Status update on the calibration and maintenance of Approved Screening Devices (ASDs) used in British Columbia impaired driving enforcement

SUMMARY:

- The Impaired Driving Advisory Committee (IDAC), formerly known as the Breath Test Advisory Committee, British Columbia Association of Chiefs of Police Traffic Safety Committee (BCACP TSC), is a police special working group that meets regularly to discuss issues relating to the enforcement of impaired driving.
- IDAC monitors Approved Screening Device (ASD) calibration issues and documentation, as well as police training, operational policies and procedures that support police in their use of BC's Immediate Roadside Prohibition (IRP) legislation in particular, and impaired driving in general.
- IDAC is also responsible for developing and advancing a new provincial training process for recertifying Qualified Breath Technicians (QT), which is being implemented in BC in 2014.

BACKGROUND:

- Standardized ASD calibration forms are utilized by all police across BC and are subject to ongoing monitoring by IDAC subject matter experts who provide feedback to the respective police agencies in support of accurate and complete documentation.
- If an ASD calibration error on a particular device is discovered, police pass that information to the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles at RoadSafetyBC, who has the authority to review any cases that may have been affected.
- In 2012, government also made changes to the IRP review process for drivers whose breath samples yield either "warn" or "fail" readings.
- These changes include the requirement for police to advise drivers they have the right to a second breath test on a second ASD and drivers can also challenge the results through an administrative review.
- Media stories have reported that Vancouver lawyer, Paul Doroshenko claims that ASD maintenance records and logs from 70 RCMP detachments, obtained under the federal *Access to Information and Privacy Act*, show a number of defective ASDs. Mr. Doroshenko has repeatedly called upon government to direct police to suspend their issuing of Immediate Roadside Prohibitions and has further suggested that

government enforce a scheme to report maintenance, calibration and repairs of ASDs.

- Supt Boucher of RCMP "E" Division Traffic Services advised that the information contained in the publicly released ASD maintenance records confirms that police are following the operations and maintenance procedures set out in the manufacturer's specifications. Further, none of the ASDs Mr. Doroshenko claimed to be defective were faulty or in need of recalibration; rather, after incomplete log references were discovered through regular monitoring processes, the instruments in question were tested for accuracy and then put back into regular service. No notice was required to the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles and no IRP decisions were affected.

Review of driving prohibition under section 215.41

215.48 (1) A person may, within 7 days of being served with a notice of driving prohibition under section 215.41, apply to the superintendent for a review of the driving prohibition by

- (a) filing an application for review with the superintendent,
 - (b) paying to the superintendent the prescribed hearing fee, and
 - (c) if it has not been taken by the peace officer or sent to the superintendent under section 215.41, surrendering to the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia his or her licence or permit to operate a motor vehicle unless the person completes and files with the superintendent a statutory declaration stating that the licence or permit has been lost, stolen or destroyed.
- (2) An application for review must be in the form, contain the information and be completed in the manner required by the superintendent.
- (3) An applicant may attach to the application for review any statements or other evidence that the applicant wishes the superintendent to consider.
- (4) The filing of an application for review does not stay the driving prohibition.
- (5) The superintendent is not required to hold an oral hearing unless
- (a) the driving prohibition is for 30 or 90 days, and
 - (b) the applicant
 - (i) requests an oral hearing at the time of filing the application for review, and

(ii) pays the prescribed oral hearing fees.

(6) If a person requests an oral hearing and fails to appear on the date and at the time and place arranged for the hearing, without prior notice to the superintendent, the right to an oral hearing is deemed to have been waived by the person.

(7) Despite sections 215.49 and 215.5, if

(a) a person applies for a review of a driving prohibition under subsection (1) of this section in accordance with subsection (2), and

(b) by the end of the period of time specified in subsection (1), the superintendent has not received the sworn or solemnly affirmed report required to be forwarded under section 215.47 (d),

the superintendent must

(c) revoke the driving prohibition,

(d) cancel the monetary penalty for which the person would otherwise be liable under section 215.44 and, in respect of any impoundment, section 253 (8) applies,

(e) if the person held a valid licence or permit issued under this Act to operate a motor vehicle at the time the notice of driving prohibition was served under section 215.41, direct the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia to return any licence or permit to operate a motor vehicle taken into possession by the peace officer or sent to the corporation, and

(f) give the person notice of the matters referred to in paragraphs (b) to (e).





This bulletin has information relevant to new ASD accuracy check procedures using “Certified Dry Gas” Alcohol Standard on either *Alco-Sensor IV DWF* or *Alco-Sensor FST* ASDs and utilizing the new ASD Information Management System.

“Certified Dry Gas” Alcohol Standard

Only “Certified Dry Gas” Alcohol Standard is to be used by ASD calibrators when conducting accuracy checks on both *Alco-Sensor FST* and *Alco-Sensor IV DWF* ASDs. As well, “Certified Dry Gas” only is to be used by Qualified Technicians as the Alcohol Standard for the *Intox EC/IR II* approved instrument.

All ASD Calibrators/Qualified Technicians must remove and dispose of any uncertified dry gas alcohol supplies to reduce the risk of its inadvertent use. Please ensure all dry gas at your agency is certified. A Certificate of an Analyst (see attached Certificate) must be posted on with the tank. All certified dry gas tanks must have an attached Freeze Tag Indicator and the indicator must have a check mark present per the below photo. Uncertified dry gas can be disposed of in accordance with previous directives from the provincial Impaired Driving Coordinators to ASD calibrators/QTs.



Alco-Sensor IV DWF ASDs

Because some police agencies continue to utilize the *Alco-Sensor IV DWF* ASD, ASD calibrators should utilize the recently updated *Certificate of a Qualified ASD Calibrator* [insert link to .pdf of Form ED6126] when conducting accuracy checks of *Alco-Sensor IV DWF* ASDs. The updated certificate lists valid certified dry gas lot numbers and their expiry dates. This practice will further enhance accuracy check procedural consistency.

Alco-Sensor FST ASDs

The rollout of the *ASD Information Management System* (ASD-IMS), a Quality Assurance (QA) database in support of all *Alco-Sensor FST* ASDs in BC, has been successfully completed.

ASD-IMS is an electronic records repository for the new "fillable pdf" electronic ASD Calibrator form (Form ED6125) for use by ASD calibrators to produce the 28-day accuracy check and *Certificate of a Qualified ASD Calibrator* records for *Alco-Sensor FST* ASDs. The ASD-IMS includes a linkage that will provide provincial Impaired Driving Coordinators with real time information on all *Alco-Sensor FST* accuracy checks.

All ASD calibrators are to utilize both the ED6125 and the ASD-IMS when conducting accuracy checks on *Alco-Sensor FST* ASDs. Non-RCMP ASD calibrators are to advance their completed ED6125 [insert link to .pdf] forms to the provincial Impaired Driving Coordinators for uploading into the ASD-IMS. Re: Approved Screening Device – Documentation of Calibration

With recent concerns regarding the inconsistency of documentation for the calibration of Approved Screening Devices (ASD), I wish to communicate to all police that it is imperative that the established procedures are articulated and adhered to.

On June 27, 2012 I issued the following:

"Police training materials, as well as the new ASD Calibrator Logs and Certificate of ASD Calibrators have been provided to Police Services. Having reviewed the ASD Working Group documents and recommended processes, I endorse these new police procedures in support of the reintroduction of IRP legislation.

In the spirit of providing a uniform approach to ASD management and usage in the province, it is requested that all agencies and departments refrain from using a supplementary ASD documentation, i.e. individual ASD logbooks that are kept with the ASD."

Since that time, subject matter experts from the ASD Working Group, including representatives from the RCMP, Vancouver Forensic Laboratory, Toxicology Section have designed an electronic Certificate of ASD Calibrator. I understand that the electronic form has been used by all agencies since November 2012, and recent audits have shown dramatically reduced error rates. Additionally, each agency may conduct follow-up with Office of the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles (OSMV) to submit any supplemental documentation for adjudication.

On January 18, 2013 a directive from the RCMP Vancouver Forensic Laboratory was disseminated to the policing community in British Columbia regarding the original or electronic signatures on certificates.



Further to our discussion and my follow-up email to Stacey Perri, wherein I outlined your contention that CFMP has no authority to issue suspensions under MVA s. 215 to alcohol/drug affected drivers and drew parallels between the CFMP situation and CN Police's non-authority to arrest under the MVA s. 79 (Prov Prohib Drivers, No Insurance, Hit & Run), I can now offer the following.

Stacey was able to locate the Legal/Technical Sub-Committee's advice of how to deal with the latter issue. **s.13.s.14**
s.13.s.14 I was separately informed that a Special Police Constable designation from our Ministry's Policing and Security Branch is the likely route by which a remedy to your predicament could be achieved.

However, as I review the CN Police (and CFMP) situation as it relates to s. 79 (Arrest Authority) limitations versus the authority outlined in s. 215 for service of prohibitions, I note a couple of important differences that raise potential question to your main assertion. MVA s. 79 only authorizes *an officer or constable of the RCMP or of the police department of a municipality to arrest without warrant*, while MVA s. 215 authorizes that a *peace officer may ... serve the driver with a notice of prohibition*, when a PO has R&P grounds to believe a driver's ability to drive is affected by (2) alcohol or in subsection (3) a drug, other than alcohol.
