That the reserve established pursuant to Order in Council No. 33, approved January 5, 1961, be cancelled in so far as it relates to the following described area: All that certain piece, parcel, or tract of land situated in the Kootenay Land District more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the north-west corner of T.L. 1526P; thence southerly along the westerly boundary of said T.L. 1526P a distance of 3,500 feet; thence due west a distance of 2,000 feet; thence northerly and parallel to the westerly boundary of T.L. 1526P to a point due west of the afore-said north-west corner of T.L. 1526P; thence due east to said corner, being the point of commencement:

Dear Chief Dubord:

Further to the BCACP Traffic Safety Committee meeting on March 2, 2016, I am writing to confirm the process for police to request cancellation of an invalidly issued Immediate Roadside Prohibition (IRP).

The removal of an IRP outside of the review process is only undertaken when it can be considered a nullity or invalid from the beginning. As a result, the fact of the error must be unequivocally stated by the police agency in each case.

This process should only be used in rare and exceptional circumstances. In order to process cancellation of an invalidly issued IRP, RoadSafetyBC requires a letter from the police agency; in the case of the RCMP, a letter from the Detachment Commander or Traffic Services Commander with a copy to OIC Traffic Services, E Division, and in the case of an independent police agency, from the Officer in Charge of the Unit with a copy to the Chief Constable of the police service. The letter must clearly state that, as a result of further police action or review, it has been determined the IRP was invalidly issued and RoadSafetyBC is requested to cancel the IRP and update the driving record accordingly. Additionally, the letter should cite the relevant IRP number(s), and should be included with any other documents pertaining to the IRP(s). The "Supplemental Report to Superintendent" form should not be used, as this is an evidentiary document created for use in an individual IRP review when information in the sworn Report to the Superintendent needs to be corrected.

When the cancellation has been processed, RoadSafetyBC's Appeals Registry will fax a notice to the originating police agency to update CPIC. No CPIC amendments are to be made by police until this notice is received.

In order to ensure that all of your written evidence is considered, you must provide the information to the Superintendent in advance of the scheduled review.

If you request an oral hearing and, without prior notice to the Superintendent, fail to appear on the date and at the time and place arranged for the hearing, your right to an oral hearing is deemed to have been waived.

***NOTICE OF MONETARY PENALTY**
Under section 215.44 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* the monetary penalty as indicated above must be paid no later than 30 days from the date this Notice is served. IMMEDIATE EFFECT OF PROHIBITION AND RIGHT OF REVIEW

You are immediately prohibited from driving for the period set out in this Notice of Driving Prohibition. You have the right to have this driving prohibition reviewed by the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles (the "Superintendent") under section 215.48 of the *Motor Vehicle Act*. An oral hearing is available only if the prohibition specified above is for 30 days or longer, and only if you specifically request one at the time you apply for a review. Filing an application for review does not stay the driving prohibition.

REVIEW INSTRUCTIONS

Within 7 days of the date of service of this Notice of Driving Prohibition you may apply to the Superintendent to review the prohibition. If you apply for a review you must: (1) file an application with the Superintendent at any Driver Licensing Centre, in the required form and manner, and containing all the required information; (2) pay all required fees; and (3) if the peace officer did not take your driver's licence or permit to operate a motor vehicle, surrender it to the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia (ICBC), or if applicable, file the required statutory declaration stating that the licence has been lost, stolen or destroyed.

When you apply for a review, the date and time for the review will be scheduled. If you intend to have a lawyer represent you, it is your responsibility to ensure the lawyer is available for the scheduled review. The scheduled review date will not be changed except in extraordinary circumstances.

When you apply for a review, copies of all available evidence concerning this prohibition will be disclosed to you unless you refuse the disclosure. If all relevant information is not available at the time of application, you must provide a fax number to which the documents can be sent, or make arrangement to collect the information or have it collected on your behalf from a Driver Licensing Centre.

You may attach to your review application any statements or other evidence that you wish the Superintendent to consider. You may also provide it separately to the Superintendent. In order to ensure that all of your written evidence is considered, you must provide the information to the Superintendent in advance of the scheduled review.

If you request an oral hearing and, without prior notice to the Superintendent, fail to appear on the date and at the time and place arranged for the hearing, your right to an oral hearing is deemed to have been waived.

***NOTICE OF MONETARY PENALTY**

Under section 215.44 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* the monetary penalty as indicated above must be paid no later than 30 days from the date this Notice is served. Under section 26 of the *Motor Vehicle Act*, ICBC may, without a hearing, refuse to issue you a driver's licence if the penalty is not paid, and any licence in your possession may be cancelled under section 26.1 of the *Motor Vehicle Act*.

IMPORTANT NOTICES TO DRIVER

MEANING OF WARN AND FAIL

Section 215.41 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* defines "warn" and "fail" as follows:

"warn" means an indication on an approved screening device that the concentration of alcohol in a person's blood is not less than 50 milligrams of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood.

"fail" means an indication on an approved screening device that the concentration of alcohol in a person's blood is not less than 80 milligrams of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood.

PROHIBITION LENGTH

You are prohibited from driving immediately upon service of this Notice for the period indicated. Your prohibition from driving is counted in full days. Partial days including the day you were served with this notice of prohibition are not included in the count of full days.

PROHIBITION REVIEW

Your right of review is outlined on the front of this Notice of Driving Prohibition. If a prohibition is revoked, the associated monetary penalty will be cancelled. The driving prohibition will be revoked if the Superintendent is satisfied of one of the following, as applicable:

- You were not the driver or in care or control of a motor vehicle;
- You were not advised of your right to a second test on an approved screening device (ASD);
- You requested a second test, but the officer did not perform the test;
- Your second test was not performed on a different ASD;
- The prohibition was not served on the basis of the lower ASD test result;
- The result of the ASD test was not reliable;
- The ASD, which formed the basis for the prohibition, did not register a WARN reading;
- The ASD registered a WARN, but your blood alcohol content was less than 0.05 (50 milligrams of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood);
- The ASD, which formed the basis for the prohibition, did not register a FAIL reading;
- The ASD registered a FAIL, but your blood alcohol content was less than 0.08 (80 milligrams of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood);
- You did not refuse or fail to comply with a demand to provide a breath sample, or you had a reasonable excuse for refusing or failing to comply with a demand; OR

The length of the driving prohibition will be reduced if the Superintendent is satisfied that you did not have the required number of previous WARN range prohibitions for a 7 or 30 day prohibition. If the driving prohibition is reduced the associated monetary penalty will be reduced accordingly.

REMEDIAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Under the *Motor Vehicle Act* drivers whose driving records meet criteria prescribed in the *Motor Vehicle Act Regulations* are required to complete remedial and ignition interlock programs. The criteria include driving records of drivers with one or more 90 day Immediate Roadside Prohibitions **OR** more than one warn range Immediate Roadside Prohibition within 5 years. Other prohibitions on your driving record combined with this prohibition may also meet the criteria. Please refer to RoadSafetyBC's website for more information on mandatory remedial and ignition interlock program requirements:

Note: Mandatory remedial and ignition interlock requirements are prescribed in regulation and are not subject to a reconsideration process. Ignition interlock requirements may be subject to exemption if satisfactory evidence is provided showing that a chronic medical condition prevents you from participating in the ignition interlock program.

If your driving record does not meet the criteria prescribed in regulation, the Superintendent may still require you to participate in a remedial or ignition interlock program under section 25.1 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* if the Superintendent finds your driving record to be unsatisfactory. You may apply for a reconsideration of a discretionary remedial or interlock referral under section 25.1.

DRIVING RECORD REVIEW – GRADUATED LICENSING PROGRAM DRIVERS

Drinking and driving is a serious violation of the conditions of the Graduated Licensing Program. If you are a participant in the program, you should be aware that your driving record will be reviewed by the Superintendent, and you can expect a further driving prohibition. DRIVING RECORD REVIEW – EXPERIENCED DRIVERS

Re: Contravention Changes Affecting Ticketing of Distracted Driving and Failure to Display "L" or "N" Sign Violations Effective June 1

Changes to the *Motor Vehicle Act* (MVA) regulations pertaining to penalties for distracted driving and failure to display "L" or "N" signs will be made June 1st. The changes affect the section citations for relevant violation tickets issued as of June 1st.

Please view the attachment which clearly displays the contravention changes.

Please note that on June 1st the financial penalty for distracted driving offences will increase from \$167 to \$368, and the number of penalty points will increase from 3 to 4. The increase in points will, on a first offence, result in an annual point penalty premium through ICBC's Driver Point Penalty Program of \$175. If the driver commits a second offence within a one-year period, the premium will increase to \$520.

Additionally, distracted driving offences have been added to the list of high risk driving offences that trigger early intervention and driving prohibitions through the Driver Improvement Program (DIP). Regular drivers who are convicted of two or more offences within a one-year period will be considered high risk and automatically assessed by DIP, potentially resulting in a 3-12 month prohibition. Graduated Licensing Program (GLP) drivers who are convicted of one distracted driving offence will also be considered high-risk, and will be assessed by DIP, potentially receiving a 1-6 month prohibition. GLP drivers may be subject to longer prohibitions for subsequent offences.

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
