Dear Deputy Commissioner Callens:

As per section 18.1.e) of the Provincial Police Service Agreement (PPSA) this letter is to advise of the projected funding available for the PPSA. The province currently has a tentative PPSA budget for 2013/14 of \$328,270,000 consisting of:

- i) \$307,344,000 base PPSA funding;
- ii) \$19,926,000 for Road Safety Initiatives recoverable through the ICBC MOU; and
- iii) \$1,000,000 estimated for other recoverable policing initiatives.

Additional funding required for new costs resulting from the new PPSA contract effective April 1, 2012 and the new incremental costs related to the accommodation of the provincial force in the new Surrey Headquarters building has not yet been determined. These are therefore excluded from the amounts above. In addition, the RCMP compensation increases announced March 30, 2012 are not included as Public Safety Canada has stated that there will be savings through a number of measures currently being implemented to offset these increases. We are currently awaiting quantified details of these measures and will not be requesting further provincial funding or advising of reductions to your budget until these details are known.

It is important to note that the Ministry of Justice will not have an appropriation until budget day February 2013. The Province is unable to commit funding prior to this date.



We are requesting that your letter of June 13, 2012, be amended to address all potential increases for fiscal year 2013/2014 including:

- Proposed establishment PTE increases related to our top 10 risk analysis of core policing (22 positions \$3.3M)
- Accommodations costs for the Provincial units to be housed at Green Timbers "E" Division HQ (\$10M)

This will ensure that the Federal Treasury Board can identify sufficient resources to cover their share of the 30% contract costs within their timelines. We would like to emphasize that this letter of "Approval in Principle" is for planning purposes only in order to address the Federal Government's Annual Reference Level Update (ARLU) process. It is not a final commitment by the Provincial Government for additional personnel or for an increase to the financial budget.

Dear Deputy Commissioner Callens:

I am responding to your letter dated June 22, 2012. In addition, this letter serves as an amendment to my letter dated June 13, 2012 (copy attached).

As per section 18.1 e) of the Provincial Police Service Agreement (PPSA) this letter is to advise of the projected funding for the PPSA. It is important to note that the Province is facing significant funding challenges over the next few years and that additional funding requests for policing will be met with significant scrutiny by our provincial Treasury Board.

The province currently has a tentative PPSA budget for 2013/14 of \$341,120,000 consisting of:

- \$307,344,000 base PPSA funding;
- \$19,926,000 for Road Safety Initiatives recoverable through the ICBC MOU;
- \$1,500,000 estimated for other recoverable policing initiatives;
- \$5,600,000 estimated for new costs resulting from the new PPSA contract; and
- \$6,750,000 estimated for compensation increases announced March 30, 2012.

As costs related to the Provincial Business Line's accommodation in Green Timbers headquarters are currently under negotiation we are unable to project the funding required for this. I note that you have provided an estimate of \$10 million for 2013/14 for Green Timbers in your letter. We look forward to receiving detailed information in support of this estimate.

In your letter you also refer to proposed establishment FTE increases of 22 positions identified in your top 10 risk analysis exercise. Given the current fiscal environment we are unable to include this in our funding request to Treasury Board for 2013/14.

In addition, the Province is currently awaiting quantified details of the cost saving measures announced by Public Safety Canada as an offset to the cost pressures identified above.

It is important to note that the Ministry of Justice will not have an appropriation until budget day February 2013. The Province is unable to commit funding prior to this date.

We look forward to working together with your staff in achieving our shared goal of financial accountability.



# **PURPOSE**

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To facilitate and expedite the entry of experienced police officers from Esquimalt / Victoria PD into the RCMP through our Lateral Entry Program (LEP).

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## **PROCESS**

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## All Lateral Entry Applicants must:

- ▶ Obtain and accept a posting (as discussed with Staffing);
- ➤ Submit a cover letter and structured resume with two previous evaluations;
- ➤ Complete a selection package;
- ▶ Pass the PARE (under 4 minutes);
- ➤ Complete the Regular Member Applicant Questionnaire (RMAQ);
- ➤ Complete the RMAQ supplement for peace officer experience;
- ➤ Complete the Pre-Employment Polygraph Interview and Examination;
- >Undergo a field investigation; and
- >Undergo medical/health assessments.
- \*Optional Steps (currently at the discretion of the Regional Recruiting Officer)
- >RCMP Police Aptitude Battery; and
- ➤ Regular Member Selection Interview.



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# **MOBILITY AND POSTING**

## Postings:

➤No set time when to discuss/confirm postings for Lateral Entry applicants, however this should commence early in the process.

## Mobility clause will apply:

>Must be willing to be posted anywhere in Canada after the initial posting.

### Engagement:

- >Review file/résumé for pay level (form 3835);
- ➤Offer of engagement;
- ▶Confirm resignation; and
- >Engage/Appointment just prior to Lateral Training.



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# **TRAINING**

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- ➤ If two years of policing experience or greater, applicants are eligible for the five week Lateral Training Program provided at Depot.
- ➤If under two years police experience, National Recruiting Program and Learning & Development will review résumés to determine training needs (five weeks versus full 24 weeks).
- ➤ Depot has advised that they will be able to accommodate a lateral entry troop this fiscal year 2012-13.

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
## **PROMOTIONS**

A Constable (Cst.) with previous police service is eligible to write the Job Simulation Exercise (JSE) provided that, before April 1st of the second following calendar year, he/she will have:

- > a minimum of two years of service as an RM with the RCMP; and
- > combined Canadian police service totaling five years.

To be eligible for promotion to Corporal, a Cst. meeting the description above must have combined Canadian police service totaling seven years, including two years as an RM and receive a successful JSE result.



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# **BENEFITS**

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- Benefits are as per current RCMP recruiting package.
- Vacation will be the same as a newly hired RCMP Officer, which is 120 hours per year - regardless of their prior police service.



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## PENSION PORTABILITY

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
#### **Current State:**

The only service that is eligible for election, in accordance with the RCMP pension plan, is service acquired as a Member of the Public Service, Canadian Forces or prior RCMP service.

#### **Future State:**

By the end of 2012, the RCMP may be in a position to offer expanded elective service options to our Members. These enhanced provisions would allow RCMP Members, who meet the criteria, to import service from any Registered Pension Plan in Canada.

Additionally, imported service as a Police Officer will be recognized as service in the Force, for the purposes of early retirement.



I am writing to apprise you of the current status of the project to construct a new detachment at 100 Mile House under the Provincial Police Services Agreement.

The total estimated cost (exclusive of taxes) of this project currently stands at \$8.9M, and if started in the near future, would entail implementation spread over fiscal years 2013/14 and 2014/15. I understand that while the PPSA annexes which detail the funding for this and other projects have not been signed, there has been extensive discussions between RCMP officials and Mr. Perry Clark on the confirmation of the Accommodations Program Charge (APC) for 2012/13 and 2013/14.


I would like to acknowledge that BC and Public Safety Canada are in negotiations on various other matters such as Green Timbers, Integrated Teams, and severance, to name a few important files. However, it must be clear that the Province's financial commitment related to the 100 Mile House project cannot be contingent on the eventual outcome of these other negotiations if the Crown is to proceed.

Therefore, if you can provide a letter confirming BC's commitment to proceeding and cost sharing this project, irrespective of other ongoing negotiations. I would be pleased to begin implementation immediately.

I am writing in response to your June 26, 2013 letter regarding the status of the construction of a new 100 Mile House detachment. I apologize for the delay in responding.

Further to our recent discussion, I agree that major capital construction projects such as the 100 Mile House detachment cannot be stalled due to outstanding issues between Public Safety Canada and the Province of British Columbia.

At the March 7, 2013 meeting of the Joint Accommodation Committee, the Province of British Columbia clearly directed that the work on projects specified in the Projected Divisional Major Capital Plan (Annex C) proceed against approved funding. As you are aware, 100 Mile House detachment is included in Annex C. While Annex C still remains unsigned, the funding for the projects listed in the Annex is included in our 2013/14 Provincial Police Service budget delegation.

The Province is hereby confirming commitment to proceed with construction of the 100 Mile House detachment project, irrespective of other ongoing negotiations with Public Safety Canada, within your delegated budget.

Dear Deputy Commissioner Callens:

Thank you for your July 29, 2014 letter requesting that the City of Prince Rupert provide appropriate accommodation for the Prince Rupert Municipal Detachment as required by the Municipal Police Unit Agreement (MPUA) and the Municipal Police Service Agreement (MPSA). As I understand, this letter is an exact copy of the correspondence that was sent to the City of Prince Rupert on the same date.

As you know, through the MPSA, the Province contracts the RCMP for the provision of municipal police service in BC. The Province can then enter into an MPUA with municipalities over 5,000 population for the provision of an RCMP Municipal Police Unit.

Articles 12.3 of the MPSA and 10.3 of the MPUA establish the process by which the RCMP can address situations where the accommodation provided by a municipality for use by the Municipal Police Unit is not to the satisfaction of the Commissioner and/or does not meet RCMP security standards. The process states that:

- The Commanding Officer will identify the deficiencies to the municipality as part of the regular reporting and planning process. [MPSA Article 12.3 (a) and MPUA Article 10.3 (a)]
- If these deficiencies are not addressed within a reasonable period of time, the Commanding Officer will provide a notice advising that the deficiencies are to be corrected within two years from the date of the notice. [MPSA Article 12.3 (b) and MPUA Article 10.3 (b)]
- If, within one year of the notice, the municipality has not corrected the deficiencies, the Commanding Officer will provide a second notice. A written report of the actions to be taken to correct the deficiencies within two years of the first notice is to be provided to the Commanding Officer. [MPSA Article 12.3 (c) and MPUA Article 10.3 (c)]
- If, within two years of the first notice, the deficiencies have not been corrected, the Commanding Officer will inform the Provincial Minister in writing that the accommodations still fail to comply with the agreement and that Canada may make the necessary changes and

that the contract partner will be responsible for 100 percent of the costs. [MPSA Article 12.3 (d) and MPUA 10.3 (d)]

While articles 12.3 (b) and 12.3 (c) of the MPSA indicate that the Commanding Officer will provide the Provincial Minister with those notices, Article 12.3 (e) clearly indicates that:

If the accommodation is being provided by a Municipality listed in Annex "A", all notices and writings with respect to the correction of the deficiencies will be between the Commanding Officer and the CEO, and a copy of each such notice or writing will be sent to the Provincial Minister.

Article 10.3 (e) of the MPUA confirms this part of the process when it states:

All notices and writings with respect to the correction of the deficiencies will be between the Commanding Officer and the CEO, and a copy of each such notice or writing will be sent to the Minister.

Since the City of Prince Rupert is a municipality listed in Annex "A" of the MPSA, it was the expectation of the Province that the first notice to be sent by the Commanding Officer regarding the deficiencies of the Prince Rupert detachment building would be sent to the City with a copy to the Minister.

I would like to bring to your attention the fact that my staff clarified the process established by the MPSA and MPUA with your staff in March 2014. While the process for addressing deficiencies in municipally owned accommodations has changed slightly from the previous agreement to the current one, the recipients of notices from the Commanding Officer has not. Under the previous agreement, communication regarding deficiencies in accommodation provided by a municipality for use by the Municipal Police Unit was also between the Commanding Officer and the municipality's CEO.

As you know, the July 18, 2011 letter you are referencing was also addressed to the Province in error. This issue was clarified with RCMP staff at the time. That is why it was determined that a response from the Minister was not necessary (see the attached email communication). My staff did indicate to your staff that reference to the 2011 letter to the City is needed in order to satisfy the reasonable period of time condition as contemplated under the process established by the MPUA. However, as it was our expectation that correspondence would be between the Commanding Officer and the City, any implication that the Province was not responsive made by this reference is incorrect.

I have asked my staff to further clarify the process that the RCMP should follow to address deficiencies in municipally owned accommodation with your staff.

RE: 2013/14 Budget Delegation for the RCMP Provincial Police Service and First Nations
Policing Program

The Province is pleased to provide a budget delegation to "E" Division for the 2013/14 fiscal year in the amount of \$350,929,560 for the RCMP Provincial Police Service and the First Nations Policing Program. This delegation includes \$8,897,000 for First Nations Policing. But does not include \$830,000 to be paid to the Northern Rockies Regional Municipality.

The attached list identifies amounts included in the delegation above that are not transferable to other programs.

We have previously advised Public Safety Canada that there will be no additional funding for the "E" Division Headquarters known as Green Timbers beyond what was in our previous year's budget for Headquarters staff accommodations. The Province considers Green Timbers to be an existing building under the 2012 Provincial Police Services Agreement and according to our calculations on that basis there are no incremental costs related to this facility to be borne by the Province.

Similarly, no additional funding is available to accommodate the pressure created by the Integrated Homicide Investigation Teams issue currently in dispute with Public Safety Canada. Funding for the severance payout for voluntary retirements and resignations is also not included in the delegation above but will be made available based on the severance policy in effect when the Province signed the 2012 Provincial Police Services Agreement.

You may be aware that the province is undergoing a core review of its programs as part of its plan to maintain a balanced budget. This review will impact all ministries and programs. The RCMP are expected to continue to review operations to find efficiencies and cost savings wherever possible and to report on their progress at our quarterly Minister's briefings.

We continue to look forward to receiving additional information from the federal government on the cost savings related to the Deficit Reduction Action Plan announced by the Federal Minister of Public Safety in the Spring of 2012.

We also look forward to working with you and your staff in the coming months to continue pursuing our shared goals of providing an exceptional level of police services to communities throughout British Columbia, and improving the operational and financial accountability of the RCMP Provincial Police Service.

Dear Commissioner Paulson:

I am writing in response to the options paper prepared by National Crime Prevention Services and presented to the RCMP Contract Management Committee Officials in September 2016, with respect to the future of the RCMP Auxiliary Constable Program.

As you know, British Columbia and its municipalities are the most engaged in the this provincial program, with more than 700 Auxiliary Constables providing 160,000 volunteer hours of service each year. Given this engagement, I clearly prefer a return to the program in its pre-October 2014 state and that risks be assessed and mitigated locally and appropriately so that the benefits of this valuable program are not diminished.

As previously indicated, the Province took time to consult with its municipal partners and consider the options paper, as well as the operational, legal and other implications for British Columbia and its Auxiliary/Reserve Constable Program. We have now had that opportunity and wish to advise you that in the interests of reinvigorating the program, we will accept Option 3 (tiered program) moving forward subject to some conditions outlined below.

Given the current training requirements in British Columbia and the annual hours that Auxiliary Constables commit to the program, we expect current Auxiliary Constables in British Columbia will be grandfathered into Option 3, Tier 3 with no further training requirements. We also expect further consultation before a decision is made on the curfews and other uniform and equipment changes resulting in cost impacts proposed under the various tiers so that we may fully consider the impacts to the program. Finally, I am seeking your confirmation that new Auxiliary Constables appointed after implementation of Option 3 may train up to the stated requirements and enter the program directly at the corresponding Tier level with no requirement to advance through each tier.

Dear Chief Superintendent Craig Callens:

In accordance with the Provincial Police Service Agreement (PPSA), I am writing to provide you with the Province's policing priorities for the Provincial Force.

The ongoing discussions for renewing the RCMP policing agreements have served to highlight the increasing importance of accountability and cost containment as well as the need to build a new relationship or partnership between the province and Canada and the RCMP. As part of the contract renewal process the province is working with the federal government to develop a proactive and consultative partnership that will help identify and address the challenges of modern day policing. To respond more effectively to the growing demands for financial and operational accountability from both the public and municipal stakeholders, the Ministry requires accurate and timely information regarding all new initiatives as well as updates on existing policies and programs both provincially and federally.

As you are aware, my vision for policing in British Columbia is to provide strong leadership to ensure effective and efficient police services to all British Columbians, that are operationally and financially accountable, and that are capable of anticipating and responding to rapid changes in the policing environment.

Over the last several years, my Ministry has focused on enhancing policing infrastructure and bolstering police information management systems; providing the leadership to facilitate proactive, evidence-based police service delivery, and restructured service delivery.

The development of crime reduction strategies and its main principles of evidence-based policing, prolific integrated offender management and integrated criminal justice response is fundamental to the Province's objective of significantly reducing the incidents of criminal activity while at the same time reducing the public's fear of crime.

Integration of specialized police services is still critical to addressing those areas of crime that are cross-jurisdictional, national and international in scope. The success of any crime reduction strategy and coordinated police response is dependent in large measure on the ability to strategically deploy resources and make decisions based on evidence and real time information sharing. PRIME has increasingly provided that capability. Ultimately, police investigations will be more effective and resource deployments more efficient as a result of the PRIME-BC initiative. These themes are the backdrop for the provincial policing priorities, which are essentially the same as in previous years.

Organized crime, gangs, marijuana grow ops and chemical drug production as well as reducing the availability of illegal guns remains a high priority. We believe that effectively fighting organized crime requires a highly trained and motivated cadre of police officers, well organized to meet the challenges of increasingly complex investigations.

At the same time, we remain committed to the principles of community-based policing. We believe that it is important for front-line police officers to continue to work with the community leaders and citizens of each municipality to address their policing priorities and develop strategies to prevent crime and support victims.

It is also important that police services continue to strengthen their relationships with, and responsiveness to those community members who have not traditionally felt supported by police, or for various reasons have not had a positive relationship with police. British Columbia communities are ethnically and culturally diverse and it is important for them to have confidence in their police services. First Nations policing in particular must continue to be delivered in a manner that is culturally sensitive, professional and accountable, and must promote partnerships to ensure the security and economic vitality of First Nations communities.

Family violence is another key priority that demands the attention of the police. We recognize that breaking the cycle of violence requires a multi sector approach in which the police play a vital role.

Another priority of the Province is to continue to improve the level of public safety on our roads and highways. We believe that the Integrated Road Safety Units and resources dedicated to enhanced road safety enforcement, targeting seatbelt compliance, impaired and aggressive drivers and intersection and commercial vehicle safety leads to greater public safety.

It is important that we work together to ensure there is a high quality of police service in every British Columbia community. I anticipate that this collaborative approach will lead to the development of initiatives and performance indicators that will enable the province to provide the accountability we require with respect to both the financing and the delivery of police services to the citizens of British Columbia.

In closing, I would like to convey my thanks to the members of "E" Division for carrying out the many duties and meeting the challenges of police work in a manner that continues to ensure public safety to the citizens of this province.
