Ministers, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Overdoses and deaths from Fentanyl is a very serious matter. I believe this requires an out of the box solution and one which will be unthinkable in the beginning. Trying to stop the flow of pills or pill presses is a losing battle.

The main problem with street drugs is the consistency in the strength and purity of the drugs that the dealer provides. A user might find they got a weak hit from one pill and took two to get the hit they wanted. The next batch they bought might be much stronger and by taking two pills, they overdose.

My suggested approach is similar to what is done in Switzerland. The user buys the drug, **provided by the government**, in the safe injection site and, in the case of heroin, injects there. It is only legal to inject there and the drug cannot be taken out of the building. There are also drug addiction counsellors at the site for those who wish to try to come off the drug. The same could be done for Fentanyl in BC.

The advantage of this situation are:

1. The drug is of a known strength and is pure.
2. Should an overdose occur, remedial action can be taken immediately.
3. Saves hospital costs and first responders time.
4. Drug addiction counsellors are to hand.

This is a very radical step, but may be the only workable solution. Think of it as the least cost to society, in lives and money. Also, this should be treated as a health issue not a criminal one. To me the suggestions already made to deal with the problem are a continuation along the lines of the "War on Drugs" and we all know how well that has worked out.

Dear Ministers,

I am following up with a letter to you following a response I received from the Premier's office in regards to the recent loss of my s.22 year old son to fentanyl on s.22 (please find this attached for your reference). I was very pleased that the Premier's office responded to my concerns and they shared that they would be forwarding this communication to both of your offices.

Since the loss of my son I have been distraught to see further deaths due to fentanyl in the media in addition to the recent surge of overdoses experienced in Surrey on a particular weekend in the month of July. When you lose a child in such a way, your radar is up regarding the on going challenges of addiction and the risks involved to those who face the daily challenge of dealing with this disease. The stakes are so much higher now that Fentanyl is on the streets and it's disturbing to see that drugs even worse than Fentanyl are now making an appearance.

The loss of my son to a drug overdose was overwhelming for me. I continue to work through my grief but when you lose a child to a drug related death, there comes with it many more layers to sort through. Not many people want to talk about "drug addiction". There is a stigma attached to this type of loss and very few people understand the "disease" of addiction. Instead they think that somehow the person has made a "choice" to go down this path. I know for a fact that my son didn't want to die but he simply could not find a way out. He is not your poster child "addict" as he fell into the persuasive lure of the easy money found by dealing drugs and entered a world that he found difficult to extricate himself from. As a parent there is shame in learning this about your child after his death. However, when put in the context of "addiction", I've come to understand that the addict will do anything to support their addiction. For young women it is often prostitution.

Why I felt compelled to write a second letter regarding my concerns is to respond to the "Task Force" announced by our Premier to address the fentanyl crisis. As I researched who would be heading up the task force I was extremely concerned that absent on this group is anyone who works directly front line with those facing the challenge of addiction. While I understand that an immediate response is needed to prevent future deaths (naloxone kits, testing kits etc), it is my hope that you will also look at bringing together those individuals who can give you the "real life" needs of those struggling with addiction. As you know, addiction can be present in any level of society not just those who live on the streets and access street outreach/services. We have witnessed the sad fentanyl deaths of middle class individuals who use drugs recreationally. In working through my loss I have spoken to other parents who lost a child from fentanyl, school staff who see drug dealers lingering in parking lots to groom young teens, and I have spoken with programs who offer supports for those struggling with the disease of addiction. Their insight and feedback as to what is happening on the streets of our province, the challenges of this disease and the clear gaps that are missing in terms of supports is very valuable and worth your time and attention to listen to. It is my sincere hope that while you are working on putting immediate strategies in place to prevent future deaths from Fentanyl, that you also take the time to bring together those affected by addiction (families, recovering addicts) and those who work on the front lines providing support to those struggling with addiction.

Sadly, my son kept his struggles fairly private from me. Both he and I had talked about the risk of Fentanyl. He assured me he was careful. He was a strong pot advocate but after his death I sadly learned that he had starting using Heroin just this past Christmas. In losing s.22 I have questioned myself about how I could have missed his pain, what I could have or should have done better. Sadly, my story has become all too familiar with the appearance of Fentanyl.

At the end of the day, the root of this Fentanyl crisis and more drugs like it that are coming in the future is the disease of addiction. As a Ministry, I hope you will closely examine current supports, explore "gaps in services", talk first hand with those who are in recovery and those working in the field of addiction and continue to work to re-open harm reduction sites for those struggling with this disease.

Addiction was never a part of my life experience. I knew very little about the disease of addiction until this past year. Sadly now, with the death of my son it has become a reality. The pain and loss of my only child will take time for me to work through. However, if my story and what I share with you can work to prevent another family from experiencing this heartache, then s.22 death was not in vain.

Thank you for your urgent and on going efforts to address this crisis.

Last Friday I was a bit abrupt with my response to Charlotte on the fentanyl issue. I am a logical person and watching the news day after day about the deaths resulting from fentanyl, I am left thinking – don't they get it? How much more education is necessary? The Global News item that really sent me into orbit featured the mother of a young man who died from fentanyl and the other son's girlfriend also dying at a later date at Starbucks in Port Moody. She was asking for more education!!!! How much education do you need!!! A young fellow's brother dies of a fentanyl overdose and his girlfriend as well why do I assume the living brother knows the dealer or is the dealer!! I do feel sorry for the mother but responsibility starts at home, then with the government. Time for the son to step up and identify the dealer.

People press the government to find solutions to their issues. I suggest you push back and make a public plea for the "users" to step forward and identify the suppliers of "bad product". This may have a limited impact but it pushes the responsibility back to where it belongs. It is people taking the drugs that can best resolve their issue. The government can best help those who make an effort and those who want to be helped.

- The Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General are presently engaged in a public service campaign to raise awareness about overdoses risks due to fentanyl and other drugs. To that end we have developed resources for individuals and their friends and families to help educate themselves about hazards associated with using illicit drugs and how to mitigate them.
- We would continue to encourage members of the public to come forward to identify drug dealers to police – not just those who are problematic. To that end there are anonymous tip lines and other confidential avenues to inform police of drug dealers adding fentanyl to their product.

Your September 29, 2016 email addressed to the Honourable Christy Clark, Premier of British Columbia has been forwarded to the Policing and Security Branch of the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General for response.

In your email, you note that you believe criminal activity may be occurring in s.22 located on s.22 in Surrey, British Columbia, and you feel appropriate police intervention has not been conducted.

For context, please be advised that the provincial government provides overall direction respecting police services in the province, and ensures there are adequate and effective levels of policing. Police agencies conduct individual investigations at arm's length from government, and we cannot direct police in particular investigations.

It is not clear from your correspondence if you have already contacted the police. On your behalf our office did relay your concerns to the RCMP for follow up. If you feel your personal safety is in jeopardy, or if you witness further suspected illegal activity, the appropriate action to take is to contact the police directly and provide specific details on the circumstances surrounding the matter.
