On May 3, 2017 at 15:05 hours the BC Ambulance Service contacted the Oceanside RCMP to report that a vehicle bearing BC licence plates s.16,s.22 had been travelling east on Hwy 19A near Plummer Rd in Parksville BC and had been involved in a single vehicle motor vehicle incident. Cst. Jeff PELAT of Central Vancouver Island Traffic Services RCMP was the first police officer on scene and his investigation found that the vehicle had crossed over the fog line (to the right), drove into a ditch and struck a large tire used as a driveway divider before coming back onto the road and stopping. Two witnesses were on scene and tended to the driver, s.16,s.22

s.16,s.22

s.16,s.22

Cst. Danielle SWANSON attended to the MVI as well and in speaking with s.16,s.22 is of the opinion that s.16,s.22 the rain water pulled s.1 off the road.

s.16,s.22 was charged with Fail to Keep Right under s. 150(1) MVA.

s.16,s.22 vehicle was towed to a garage for a mechanical inspection as per s.1 own wishes with possible damage to the underside front end.

Witness #1 stated the following to Cst. PELAT in regards to this collision:

- s.16 was stopped at the intersection of Plummer Rd and Hwy 19A waiting to turn east bound.
- observed the vehicle drive off the road to the right and drive into the ditch.
- The vehicle drove through the ditch and then hit a driveway crossing and a large tire.
- The impact with the tire bounced the vehicle back onto the road.
- s.16 watched the vehicle drive on the shoulder of the road until it stopped.
- then rendered assistance until BCAS and police arrived on scene.

Witness #2 stated the following to Cst. PELAT in regards to this collision:

- s.16 was driving east bound on Hwy 19A approaching Hwy 4A in Parksville a few minutes earlier and observed s.16,s.22 vehicle turn onto Hwy 19A east bound and immediately pull into the fast lane, cutting the witness off.
- s.16 followed the vehicle east (approx. 3 kms in distance) over the Englishman River bridge.
- The vehicle suddenly steered right and drove into the ditch and was doing the speed limit at the time.
- s.16 observed the vehicle hit a driveway which connected to the highway and bounce up back onto the highway.
- s.16 then observed the vehicle drive on the shoulder and stop.
- believed that the elderly driver was having a medical issue and called BCAS.

Investigators found s.16,s.22 to be fine in terms of cognitive ability but have concerns about s.16 ability to drive. s.16 admitted to Cst. SWANSON that s.16 does not drive often and tends to stay very close to home but on this date s.16 came into Parksville to get s.1 car insurance.

Highway 19A at Plummer Road is a two lane secondary highway with traffic travelling in both directions (east and west). It's asphalt surface is flat and in good condition and at the time of this incident was wet due to a light rain that had been falling for some time. There was no observed

pooling of water on the roadway and speeds of travelling vehicles at that time would not likely cause hydroplaning. The temperature was approximately 12 degrees Celsius at the time. The highway is well travelled and there was vehicle substantial traffic at the time. It is a posted 50 km/h zone that transitions to a 60 km/h zone within approximately 300 metres east of the accident location.

It is requested that s.16,s.22 driving fitness be reviewed as RCMP investigators believe that s.16 cognitive abilities paired with s.1 motor skills may not be sufficient to ensure s.16 safety as a driver and may put other road users in jeopardy.



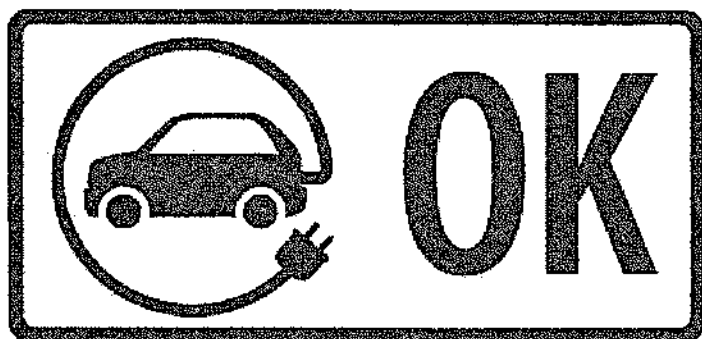

I hope you don't mind if I seek your opinion on an issue that has arose. The issue is whether or not an electric vehicle can drive in the van pool lane located at the bottom of Nordel ramp to Highway 91 north bound,  
The ICBC public information page lists simply:

***Electric Vehicles & HOV Lanes***

***Electric vehicles (EVs) displaying an official decal are allowed in high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes in British Columbia regardless of the number of passengers in the car, unless a sign is posted indicating otherwise.***



The Motor Vehicle Act and Regulations are some what more contradictory and confusion.

S. 119 of the Act states simply:

*"high occupancy vehicle lane" means a lane of a laned roadway in respect of which prescribed signs or markings indicate that the lane is reserved for the exclusive use of buses,*

*motor vehicles that meet prescribed occupancy requirements and other prescribed motor vehicles and devices;*

Division 23 Schedule 1 of the Regs clearly shows that there is a distinction between an HOV lane sign and a Van Pool Lane sign. Neither sign mentions the other type of restriction.

Division 42.02 of the Regs seems to be the crux of the issue:

42.02 (3) Subsection (2) does not apply to

(a) the driver of a marked vehicle responding to a disabled vehicle or another emergency on the highway where the high occupancy vehicle lane is located,

(b) the driver of an emergency vehicle, (c) a peace officer on active duty,

(d) an operator of a cycle, motorcycle, taxi, handy dart vehicle or an **electric motor vehicle**, or

(e) the driver of a blood delivery vehicle while transporting blood or blood products.

(4) Despite subsection (3) (d), subsection (2) applies to an operator of a cycle, motorcycle, taxi, handy dart vehicle or an electric motor vehicle if a traffic control device specifies

that the operator is not to use the high occupancy vehicle lane except as specified in subsection (2).

In short what it appears to say is that 119 says an HOV includes van pool lanes but Schedule one makes them distinct and different. 42.02(3) seems to say that electric vehicle can use these lanes, while (3) says they can use them unless a sign PROHIBITS them using the lane in a motorcycle or electric vehicle.

Our position is that there are signs on the HOV (multi occupant) lanes that indicate that motorcycles and electric vehicles are permitted. There is no such sign at the van pool lane. (or the bus lanes for that matter). It is therefore our opinion that electric vehicles are only allowed in the lanes where signs have been erected allowing their use and the ICBC website indicates they are allowed, that is the HOV car pool lanes. It is our position that electric vehicles are not allowed in the Van pool lanes. I would appreciate any guidance you can provide in this area.
