Disaster Financial Assistance has been approved for damages attributed to the above named event, as per Sections 33(2) and (3) of the Compensation and Disaster Financial Assistance Regulation (the "Regulation").

#### Recovery Plan:

The next step in the DFA recovery process is submission of a Recovery Plan detailing each recovery project, the damages and estimated costs for each project and, for larger projects, the various recovery phases. Your file has been assigned to our Field Evaluator who will make contact with you and will assist you in the creation of your recovery plan.

Recovery costs incurred prior to the DFA Recovery Plan approval may be eligible for DFA. Local authorities are expected to take action independently to protect and restore their infrastructure. The timing of the expenditure will not affect DFA eligibility.

#### Infrastructure Recovery:

Infrastructure recovery includes costs incurred or required to repair, restore or replace a public facility, or materials essential to local authority functions and operations; clean up and debris removal; deductible amounts for insurance costs; costs for inspections, appraisals, planning or design to determine the recovery activities; and general administration costs arising out of individual recovery projects.

The actual cost for repairing or restoring an item or facility to its immediate pre-disaster condition will be the maximum amount eligible. Additional repair or replacement costs required to comply with current federal and provincial codes and standards for construction, access, and fire and occupational safety are eligible, with supporting documentation.

Often the best time to make improvements to infrastructure is during times of reconstruction. If improvements are made, they must be funded separately and identified and recorded separately from restoration work in the Recovery Plan and in your Local Authority's financial records. The cost of improvements must not be included in any DFA claim submission unless previously approved by Emergency Management BC's (EMBC) Manager of Recovery and Funding Programs.

#### Recovery Claims:

To claim for approved DFA Recovery costs, please forward an electronic version of your claim submission spreadsheet with invoices, contracts and proof of payment to dfa@gov.bc.ca.

#### Response Costs:

These are costs required for emergency response measures undertaken to reduce or eliminate the threat to public safety. A Response Claim Submission spreadsheet, invoices, contracts and proof of payment must be submitted directly to the EMBC Regional Office in your area for consideration of reimbursement of eligible costs.
