

**1. Number of drivers who were prohibited from driving without relying on DIP - i.e. by exercising The Superintendent of Motor Vehicles' discretion;**

The Superintendent of Motor Vehicles may, under section 93 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* (MVA), prohibit a person from driving a motor vehicle if the person

- has failed to comply with this Act or the regulations, or
- has a driving record that in the opinion of the superintendent is unsatisfactory,
- if the person's privilege of driving a motor vehicle has been suspended or cancelled in any jurisdiction in Canada or in the United States of America, or
- for any cause not referenced above that relates to the use or operation of motor vehicles

All persons who are prohibited from driving a motor vehicle for an unsatisfactory driving record or for any cause referenced above are prohibited as a result of the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles exercising his discretion in accordance with section 93 of the MVA. In considering the imposition of a prohibition, the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles applies the DIP Policies and Guidelines accordingly.

**2. Number of drivers who were prohibited from driving in reliance upon the guidelines in DIP;**

We collect the number of prohibition notices issued to drivers per calendar year. A driver is not prohibited from driving unless they sign and return the prohibition notice or are served a Notice of Prohibition by police at roadside. The total number of prohibition notices issued for the following years are approximately:

- 2014-19,500
- 2015-18,500
- 2016-18,000

**5. Number of hearings held under Section 93(1) of the Motor Vehicle Act before drivers were prohibited from driving.**

We collect the number of reviews completed per calendar year. A driver may apply for a review either before or after they are prohibited.

The number of reviews completed for drivers either before or after a prohibition took effect for the following years are approximately:

- 2014-5000
- 2015-4600
- 2016-4700
