



TS is incurring higher than expected capital expenditures this fiscal with the Public Service growing at a slow but steady rate. This not only increases the number of workstations the OCIO has to purchase, but adds volumes & additional consumption to the other IT services the OCIO provides.

TS continuously has to weigh decisions on fulfilling client orders versus investing capital to maintain the IT infrastructure. To continue to defer maintenance in order to stay within budget increases the risk of infrastructure failure.
