Two arrested at pipeline protest near Highway One Coquitlam

A man and a woman have been arrested after a protest against a pipeline began blocking equipment and highway traffic at Highway One near Brunette.

The protest, which at its largest had nine people, had proceeded peacefully throughout the morning (February 8, 2018). At approximately 11:15 a.m., police were called to maintain the peace when a 22-year-old woman locked herself to a piece of machinery. The woman, along with a 23-year-old man, were subsequently arrested for mischief.

The man has been released with no charges. The woman, who is a resident of Ontario, faces a potential charge of mischief. Nobody was hurt during the protest and there was no violence from anyone involved.

Coquitlam RCMP is an impartial party in these demonstrations. Demonstrators have a right to lawful, peaceful and safe protest and the companies have a right to complete their work. Coquitlam RCMP is working hard to ensure that both of these rights are protected.

Title: One female arrested at pipeline demonstration in Burnaby

At 6:30 a.m. on March 6, 2018, Burnaby RCMP officers were called to the area outside Westridge Marine Terminal in the 7000 block of Bayview Drive in Burnaby for a report that a number of demonstrators were blocking work vehicle access to the terminal.

Throughout the morning Burnaby RCMP officers asked for the demonstrators to move off of the road and all but one of them complied. Despite numerous requests, a 47 year old female refused to move from the road and was arrested for mischief just before 10:30 a.m.

Burnaby RCMP would like to take this moment to remind those who are involved in ongoing demonstrations that police are an impartial party and are there to ensure the safety of everyone involved.

Demonstrators have a right to lawful, peaceful and safe protest and companies have a right to complete their work. Burnaby RCMP is working hard to ensure that both of these rights are protected and that all parties and the public are kept safe.

PROTESTS

Province Response to Demonstrations:

- My job as Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General is to ensure that an adequate and effective level of policing and law enforcement is maintained throughout BC to ensure the safety of the public.
- Please note that enforcement decisions, and individual investigations, occur at arm's length from government and we cannot interfere with, or direct police on such matters.
- However, we believe in a tolerant, welcoming and inclusive society.
- Our role in government is to create an environment in British Columbia where an inclusive and diverse population supports our communities.
- We recognize the public's right to engage in peaceful protests and lawful assembly.
- While the police will respect lawful protest they will also act pursuant to the Criminal Code of Canada and direction of the courts if necessary to address unlawful conduct.
- Again, police exercise their discretion independently of governments.
- Police are well trained and prepared to manage situations involving lawful protests, civil disobedience, and to protect life and property.
