Sir.

I would like to express my frustration and concern to you regarding the forest fire issues in the Okanagan and in the whole of British Columbia especially over the last two years. It would appear that the Ministry is unable to deal with forest fires effectively with their present philosophy of persons on the ground put out fires and if it affects structures then with the support of aircraft dropping water on or near the fire. I keep hearing, if doesn't affect structures, let it burn. At present it is not working! Look at the state we are in!

This leads me into my biggest frustration of why the Martin Mars water bomber of Coulson Aviation is not being used for the last number of years because it is too expensive as per the Government of British Columbia, Liberal and NDP parties. It is indeed very very expensive to contract and operate that aircraft but it put out fires at 7200 gallons per drop and refilled skimming a body of water in less than 35 seconds and back in the air for another drop. I understand a firefighting helicopters bucket on a rope is 70 gallons. Helicopters are also not cheap to operate but no where near the cost of the Mars, but how many helicopter drops equal a Mars drop that actually put out the fire.

We keep hearing excuses that the Mars can not skim or land in every lake in British Columbia. Well it can land in a lot of them and put fires out and release smaller aircraft to areas where the Mars might not be able to fly and drop water. Right now the Province is stretched so thin in firefighting aircraft and persons on the ground, I firmly believe the early activation of the Mars this year would have improved the provinces situation this year and last year . Coulson aviation should be and should have been working alongside Con Air. The province wide health risk issues of burning out of control forest fires in British Columbia is completely unacceptable health risk to the citizens of British Columbia.

The present fire fighting philosophy of the Ministry of Forrests under both political parties is unacceptable.

I would respectfully ask you to please pressure the present provincial government to beg Coulson Aviation to reactivate the Martin Mars water bomber ASAP and investigate the use of Coulson's Fleet of fire fighting aircraft as well
