Reporting a Trimac truck with sulfuric acid drove to Hwy 22A/Hwy 3B to Quirk Siding (9550 Station Rd) and after unloading discovered the lead trailer was leaking sulfuric acid underneath the trailer and onto the ground. The supervisor inspected the nearby road on Station Rd and the test results were for a low PH. IRM is the company that owns the acid, and is the one that reported to Teck Metals.

RESPONSE:

Local FD and RCMP have been notified and Kootenay Boundary Regional Fire Rescue FD has taken command, and Teck Metals emergency response has been notified.

Advised that a Teck Metal Ltd. truck carrying 61, 280 lbs of Sulphuric Acid (93%) has crashed in a ditch near the above location in Rossland, BC. There is currently a small diesel trickle from the fuel tank and no waterways have been affected. The regional fire department is on scene and the area has been isolated at per the CANUTEC manual. The highway has been closed and the 4 occupancies within the area and have been notified. An evacuation alert has been issued. Teck Metal Ltd. has been in contact with IRM Emergency, in the US, who advised they are activating their response team. Teck Metal Ltd advised that they have activated their hazmat team.

Update from the Teck Metal Ltd: the Teck hazmat team is on site and have assessed the truck and trailer. The trailer is intact with no leaks and the truck has a small diesel leak, less than 200 L, which has been contained and bermed. The plan going forward is to drill the trailer and pump out approximately half the load (Sulphuric Acid) into a second trailer. Once this has been completed, they will upright the truck and trailer and empty the remainder of the material. Updates of the progress will be provided and a representative for the trucking company (IRM) is on site and managing the incident. **ACTION TAKEN:**

Two tow trucks are on site, stabilising trailer during off load, they are able to pump the trailer out through existent valves and will not need to drill tank. They will draw down the damage tank till the point were they cannot empty any further. Tow trucks will right the trailer and it will be moved approx 300 meters to a flat portion of the highway and remainder will be emptied from it. RCMP and highways contractor have been briefed and approve of the plan. They also have a dump truck of limestone staged below the accident scene to neutralise any product in case of a release. Anticipate next update when the tanks are empty. Details:

Advised that a WestCan Trucking Company transport vehicle (unknown size) was transporting sulphuric acid from Teck Metals (25 Aldrige Ave) to the WestCan facility (7 Mile Dam Rd Trail Highway 22A - 250-367-7778) travelling southbound down Highway 22, 3B and 22A. They suspect that a valve was left open during transport causing an unknown amount of sulphuric acid to spill to the ground while en route to the WestCan Facility.

Teck Metals activated their full time fire department to neutralize any puddles with limerock starting at their facility and moving south down Highway 22 toward the WestCan facility. Teck Metals has also mobilized their emergency response team to take command of the situation and oversee the response. WestCan is applying limerock to puddles starting at their location and working toward the Teck Metals facility. RCMP has been notified and is mobilizing EMCON services for traffic control (MOTI aware and has been working on getting individuals on scene, roads NOT shut down but will be having work done on them).
