The people of Surrey have been abundantly clear that such a move is a top priority, which is why Council and I have moved immediately to establish a Surrey Police Department and terminate the city's contract with the RCMP.

While Surrey City Council is moving rapidly on this front, I am dismayed by the resistance that is being encountered at the Provincial level. The overwhelming mandate that we have been given by the people is to complete the transition to a Surrey Police Department as quickly as

possible. I want to urge the Premier to remove any road blocks at the Provincial level and help us make this critical transition proceed in the most timely and smooth manner possible for the people of Surrey.

Hi Nimmi,

I'm following up on behalf of some of our members who live in Grand Forks.

Here are their concerns:

Many of the residents who lost their homes in the flood are in the lower socio-economic layer of our town.

The City of Grand Forks has asked the Provincial and the Canadian governments to provide \$60-90 million to repair infrastructure and buy out property owners allowing them to relocate to higher ground. Then, the flood plain area will return to its natural riparian state.

This process is taking a very long time. Forty families, whose homes are now uninhabitable, are living in motel rooms and travel trailers. There is snow on the ground and the temperatures are below 0. Other families, who had two story homes, have consolidated their living on the upper floor as the lower floor is unfit for living. They have had to move the mechanical apparatus of the house upstairs. These people have been told that they will have to live two winters in these crowded conditions until the 'land swap' becomes available for them to relocate to higher ground. These families are will aware that two winters means two springs and potentially two more floods.

We have yet to hear whether the request for the funds to move homeowners has been approved. Everyone in Grand Forks is concerned about the length of time this is taking. We are concerned the residents will give up and move out of our small town. Disheartened residents are living with uncertainty and without hope. There was a slight decline in our school population this September.

Businesses have been impacted, and many are still closed - some families lost both their home and their business!

They would like more information on what is happening to the funding request to address these issues. Thank you for your assistance.

### Recommendation - Provide background

 The non-medical cannabis retail store licence application process includes security screening and financial integrity checks. These application requirements are robust in the interest of due diligence and public safety.

- Security screening and financial integrity checks investigate applicants, associates, corporate structures and sources of funding to determine whether there are any linkages to organized crime.
- More detailed information about these processes is found here (under the Security and Financial Checks section): https://justice.gov.bc.ca/cannabislicensing/policy-document/eligibility
- These additional steps are in British
   Columbian's best interests and form a critical part of the licensing process and are a key tool in keeping organized crime out of a legitimate and vibrant cannabis retail industry.
- There is no typical length of time for an application to be processed because the opening of private, non-medical cannabis retail stores depends on several factors including the readiness of each individual applicant, the complexity of each application. The timing is also impacted by the readiness of a local government or Indigenous nation to accept notices of applications and return recommendations to the Province.
- Direct comparisons to other jurisdictions about the opening of non-medical cannabis retail stores are not easily made due to different regulatory schemes.
- We need to do this right and that means local approvals and screening must take place.
- Weekly statistics on cannabis retail store licence applications in B.C. and an explanation of how cannabis retail store licence applications move through the licensing process can be found here:

#### Mark,

There are no indications that any communities intend to issue a SOLE as there are no powers that need to be used to manage the service disruption. In addition to the power outages, there are some blocked routes within communities and MOTI has activated their DEOC to deal with these issues.

The concern for today is also the passage of another front which has brought some higher wind gusts but not as strong as last Thursday. Winds are expected to die down later tonight but conditions would make it difficult for crews to continue with on-going repair work and could lead to additional outages. We haven't received any reports that the situation has worsened but will continue to monitor.

The coordination call this afternoon was unusually quiet and as suspected, it seems that the notification did not make it through to a number of our intended participants. The team is reaching out now to make sure they have the latest information and to determine their needs, if any.

We have had a few communities note impacts for CI and BC Hydro is prioritizing restorations. To find has had difficulty with their sewage treatment back-up generator and we have funded them to bring an alternate source to avoid a spill and larger challenges while BC Hydro looks to restore the main power. Nanaimo has had some challenges with their water treatment plant which has been in the media. Power was restored but they are still experiencing some equipment failures. No assistance required at this time.

BC Hydro has noted that every resource available has been called for – from Alberta & the Puget sound area as well as assistance form Fortis.

We will continue to monitor and be engaged to support communities as necessary.

Thank you for kindly returning my call.

Please read the following email from one of our constituents:

Ten or so years ago, each CAT got a \$5000 annual grant from the Ministry of Solicitor General or Ministry of the Attorney General. This allowed each CAT to undertake activities in their communities. These funds were eliminated, so that each CAT now has to raise its own funds.

It is very difficult to raise small amounts, like \$1,000 to \$3,000, because Service Clubs don't like supporting Sexually Exploited Youth, and most mainstream funders don't make grants in such small amounts.

If the Government restored the \$5000 grants to each CAT, the total cost would be \$75,000 per year. If more CATs start up, that might go to \$100,000 per year. This is a very small amount of money, which would enable volunteer organizations to maximize their community impact, raise awareness of the issue and identify/coordinate gaps in services for these youth.

This could be achieved without direct funds from the Government, or the creation of any additional Government staff. All that would be required would be for the Government to direct the Public Safety Ministry, through the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Branch, to allocate up to \$100,000 of Civil Forfeiture Proceeds to Community Action Teams, with the maximum grant to each Team of \$5000. Teams will still be able to apply for funding for one-off projects on top of the \$5000. Or, a special category of eligible grant recipients of Civil Forfeiture Proceeds could be CATs, with a maximum of \$5000.

MLA Dean requested whether she could get a briefing on this from either you or a ministerial assistant.

If you haven't already shared it, here is a cleaned up version Statement:

The Windstorm on December 20<sup>th</sup> caused significant damage to BC's electrical transmission infrastructure in the Lower Mainland and Vancouver Island. I extend my thanks to BC Hydro crews and other personnel who have been working around the clock to respond to the storm.

BC Hydro has indicated that this storm is one of worst they have experienced in 20 years and while more than 500,000 customers have had power restored, 66,000 remain without power. Due to the extent of the damage and the number of trees down across roads, restoration of services to some communities and homes will take several days.

Emergency Operations Centres have been activated in affected areas and warming centres have been opened

I would ask all British Columbians in affected areas to ensure that they have supplies and plans in place to remain safe during this incident, and to please check in on neighbours, particularly those in a vulnerable situation.

I would also remind people that downed power lines should be considered live and members of the public should keep back at least 10 meters.

In addition, it is important that people use generators safely and never use a portable generator or outdoor barbecue indoors.

I know that an extended power outage during the holiday season presents particular challenges for many. I want to ensure British Columbians that our government will continue to support BC Hydro as they to work to safely restore power as quickly as possible.

- North Shore Rescue has received \$100K each the past 3 years as part of the \$15M provided to BCSARA.
- BCSARA distributed the \$15M over the past 3 years with just over \$4.3M being disbursed among the 80 GSAR groups in BC.

#### Request

CBC is working on a story about the state of the licensing process for private retailers two months after cannabis legalization and would like to know:

- 1) How close are officials to green lighting more private retailers in places outside of Kimberley, B.C.? What is the timeline for more government-owned BC Cannabis Stores?
- 2) Why is it taking so long to approve private and public retail outlets?
- 3) Why did the province urge existing private cannabis retailers to close their doors and empty their stores of non-legal cannabis as of Oct. 17, pending provincial approval, but then approve a retailer in Kimberley that did not follow that advice?
- 4) How is inventory holding up at the only BC Cannabis Store currently operating?
- 5) How adequate is the supply of legal cannabis to meet current and expected consumer demand?

CBC would like to schedule a radio interview with a government representative to discuss these questions. If an interview cannot be scheduled, they will accept background.

## Recommendation - Provide background

## 1) How close are officials to green lighting more private retailers in places outside of Kimberley, B.C.?

- There have been 365 paid applications so far that are at various stages of the application process.
- Weekly statistics on cannabis retail store licence applications in B.C. can be found here: https://justice.gov.bc.ca/cannabislicensing/policy-document/application-stats.

#### 1b) What is the timeline for more government-owned BC Cannabis Stores?

• The Liquor Distribution Branch (LDB) is actively investigating suitable locations across the province, and is committed to a careful and efficient rollout of its chain of BC Cannabis Stores.

- On November 20, Kamloops City Council approved two BC Cannabis Stores in that community, and we hope to have them open by late spring.
- At this time we cannot say when any additional BC Cannabis Stores will open, or where.

## 2) Why is it taking so long to approve private and public retail outlets?

- There is no typical length of time for a private application to be processed because the opening
  of private non-medical cannabis retail stores depends on several factors including the readiness
  of each individual applicant, the complexity of each application, and the readiness of a local
  government or Indigenous nation to accept notices of applications and return recommendations
  to the province.
- An explanation of how cannabis retail store licence applications move through the licensing process can be found on this link: <a href="https://justice.gov.bc.ca/cannabislicensing/policy-document/application-stats">https://justice.gov.bc.ca/cannabislicensing/policy-document/application-stats</a>.
- The LDB is actively seeking locations for Provincial retail cannabis stores in municipalities which have passed bylaws and zoning amendments to permit such businesses to operate.
- Potential storefront sites are not easy to find: LDB must first identify an appropriately sized site
  for lease, then ensure it is sufficient distance from community services (schools, recreation
  centres) and other retailers, before finalizing lease terms with the landlord.

- There are several stores that are illegally opened throughout the province. It is up to local law enforcement authorities to decide whether or not to take action against these stores. Illegal dispensaries that continue to operate may face provincial monetary penalties and may be charged with provincial offences and could face federal criminal charges. Monetary penalties for illegal cannabis sales will be up to two times the retail value of the cannabis. The penalty upon being convicted of the provincial offence of illegal selling cannabis is a fine up to \$100,000, imprisonment of up to 12 months or both.
- Applicants who are operating cannabis stores illegally will not be excluded from being
  considered for a licence. All applicants will be assessed using the same evaluation criteria,
  including rigorous background checks and local government support. Applicants who have
  operated dispensaries prior to legalization will not receive preferential treatment in the
  provincial application process.

## 4) How is inventory holding up at the only BC Cannabis Store currently operating?

 Additional products are continuing to be added to the store's product assortment, and inventory is continuing to be replenished as necessary.

## 5) How adequate is the supply of legal cannabis to meet current and expected consumer demand?

- As part of regular operational activities, the LDB is forecasting customer demand, factoring in demand from both the BC Cannabis Stores' retail channels, and private retailers, to determine supply needs and procure product as necessary.
- The LDB is working closely with its licence producers to regularly replenish stock and is continuing to add new products to its wholesale product assortment, in order to meet customer demand.

## Recommendation - Provide background

- We do not give priority approval for rural applications over urban applications. Retail cannabis applications are placed in the queue as they are received by the government.
- There are many factors that are considered when applying for a licence. They include: applicants submitting a completed application, paying fees, and consenting to security checks.
   All applications are referred to a local government or Indigenous nation and must receive a positive recommendation before the Province issues a licence.
- Many municipalities are still considering their options around cannabis retail stores in terms
  of rezoning, distance from schools, public versus private. Others are waiting to see how
  cannabis is rolled out in neighbouring communities before committing to any regulations and
  requirements.

  homicides. For this reason, our Stopping the Violence Counselling Programs and
  Outreach and Multicultural Outreach Services exclusively serve women.
- However, the majority of programs and services for victims of crime in British Columbia serve all victims of violence, including men and women. Across the province, men are eligible to access more than 160 victim service and victim court support programs, including:
  - The PEACE (Prevention, Education, Advocacy, Counselling and Empowerment) Programs provide counselling for children aged 3 to 18 who have witnessed abuse, threats, or violence in the home. This program helps children and their adult caregivers heal from the trauma and learn about healthy relationships. These programs serve boys, girls, and non-offending caregivers, regardless of gender.
  - The Crime Victim Assistance Program provides medical and dental expenses, counselling services, protective measures, income support and other benefits to assist all eligible victims of crime and their families to recover from the impacts of crime.
  - The Ministry's Victim Safety Unit provides men and women victims of crime with notification services regarding the custody status of an accused or offender including releases from custody and information about conditions that must be followed when in the community.
  - VictimLink BC, is a toll-free, province-wide 24/7 multilingual help and information line that provides emergency crisis support for all victims of family and sexual violence, regardless of gender.
- In addition, the Ministry supports coordinated responses to referred, high-risk domestic violence cases regardless of a victim's gender, including:
  - Domestic Violence Units (DVUs) which pair dedicated police officer(s), with community-based victim services and, in some communities, a child protection worker to coordinate and collaborate in addressing highest risk cases of domestic violence, regardless of the victim's gender. DVUs are operational in 9 communities: Abbotsford, Capital Region, New Westminster, North Shore (North Vancouver and West Vancouver), Surrey, Nanaimo, Kelowna, Vancouver and Prince George.

Interagency Case Assessment Teams (ICATs) that bring together service providers from various sectors such as police, victim services, probation, MCFD, and transition houses to share information, identify risks and create safety plans for specific high risk domestic violence cases regardless of the victim's gender. ## Funding of Victim Service and Violence against Women Programming

Kimberley, is having with the licensing branch.

I am extremely disappointed in the province is requiring tinted windows on the cannabis retail outlets. The effect is to make the store look sketchy, and rather than being discrete it stands out amongst adjoining stores. This is a common thing with smoke shops wanting to hide activity, and our municipality is not in favor of these stores tinting windows.

s.22 has been operating a medical dispensary under s.22 business license for 2 years. The business is a model corporate citizen who is not only discrete for their

customers but popular for regularly giving back to the community. The transition to a legalized environment is not going smoothly. I appreciate that the feds are the real culprit in this change, but being unnecessarily restrictive like this is not going to help us get to where we all want to be. Rather than be a provincial licensing condition, window treatment should be the responsibility of the municipality. Liquor stores do not require the tinting and we request the flexibility to make this decision for cannabis retailers in our community.

Thank you for the consideration. I understand that this is very challenging for the ministry and hope this feedback is helpful.

Thank you for kindly returning my call.

Please read the following email from one of our constituents:

Ten or so years ago, each CAT got a \$5000 annual grant from the Ministry of Solicitor General or Ministry of the Attorney General. This allowed each CAT to undertake activities in their communities. These funds were eliminated, so that each CAT now has to raise its own funds.

It is very difficult to raise small amounts, like \$1,000 to \$3,000, because Service Clubs don't like supporting Sexually Exploited Youth, and most mainstream funders don't make grants in such small amounts.

If the Government restored the \$5000 grants to each CAT, the total cost would be \$75,000 per year. If more CATs start up, that might go to \$100,000 per year. This is a very small amount of money, which would enable volunteer organizations to maximize their community impact, raise awareness of the issue and identify/coordinate gaps in services for these youth.

This could be achieved without direct funds from the Government, or the creation of any additional Government staff. All that would be required would be for the Government to direct the Public Safety Ministry, through the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Branch, to allocate up to \$100,000 of Civil Forfeiture Proceeds to Community Action Teams, with the maximum grant to each Team of \$5000. Teams will still be able to apply for funding for one-off projects on top of the \$5000. Or, a special category of eligible grant recipients of Civil Forfeiture Proceeds could be CATs, with a maximum of \$5000.

#### Vancouver Police release new short video to keep teens from flirting with death

**Vancouver** – Vancouver Police have released a new public service announcement aimed at raising awareness about the risks associated with illicit drug-use among young adults and youth.

"We wanted to do something related to the fentanyl crisis that would make young people stop and think," said Simi Heer, Director of Public Affairs, VPD. "Awareness is key, especially at a young age, when you're making decisions that could impact the rest of your life."

The project was made possible thanks to a \$40,000 grant from the Province of B.C. and hundreds of thousands of dollars of pro bono work by TAXI Vancouver and its partners.

The public service announcement aims to highlight the realities of casual drug use and moves away from traditional messaging around fentanyl. "Educating teens about drug use has unique challenges. We are very pleased with the concept created by TAXI and are grateful for the talented professionals who worked on this campaign because they thought it was an important message to tell," adds Heer.

In 2017, fentanyl claimed the lives of more than 1,400 people in B.C. Traces of fentanyl have been found in drugs such as Molly, cocaine, and counterfeit prescription drugs, like Xanax – drugs that are currently popular with teens.

Given the several cases of carbon monoxide poisoning that have arisen over the past few days, the reporter has the following questions:

My understanding is that it's not mandatory for people to install detectors in their homes and businesses. Can you confirm whether that is the case?

And if so, why is it not mandatory?

Any plans to change that?

### Recommendation:

- CO detectors aren't currently mandatory provincewide in the current BC Building code, though some communities have made them mandatory as part of bylaws.
- Under the B.C. Building Code, carbon monoxide alarms are required in every new residential building that contains a fuel-burning appliance or an attached storage garage.
- Right now, the legislation does not require buildings to retrofit for these alarms.
- Regardless, we encourage all individuals and businesses to purchase these detectors.
- When replacing current smoke detectors, or installing new ones, people should consider
  purchasing combination CO/smoke detectors if they are in a home with fuel burning appliances
  (ie: wood stove, propane, natural gas).

• However, it's important to remember they do not replace the need to check appliances regularly and use them safely.

#### Request

I'm working on a story about small cannabis growers in B.C. who want to apply for federal microcultivator licences but who say provincial and municipal decisions are getting in their way. These are my questions and I'll let you decide whether response should come from Agriculture or Public Safety. 1. Small growers licensed to grow medical marijuana have established themselves on land that was not

- municipally zoned for cannabis, as the federal ACMPR superseded municipal zoning. However, the micro-cultivator licence requires proper zoning and approval from municipalities and the province. Yet small growers say the province has done no outreach to municipalities to prepare them to rewrite their bylaws to allow for micro-licensing. This has left many small growers in B.C. feeling completely stuck. Why hasn't the province educated municipalities about the need to create zoning for micro-cultivators? 2. The province's decision in July to allow municipalities to ban concrete-based cannabis growth on ALR land has stymied many small growers. It is very difficult to grow cannabis in soil because of concerns about mold and pests, and the vast majority of growers grow marijuana in concrete facilities. Many small growers are already on ALR land because, as mentioned above, the ACMPR didn't require them to have municipal approval. Now, they're stuck in the black market as long as municipalities are reluctant to allow concrete facilities on ALR land. How do you respond to these criticisms and will you consider amending or removing the law?
- 3. The two above issues have led to a situation where small growers in B.C. are feeling left behind as those in Alberta and Ontario are able to proceed with their micro-cultivator licence applications. B.C. has long been a province renowned for the quality and abundance of its marijuana but it is being left behind in the legal regime. As a result small growers in B.C. say they have no choice but to continue to operate in the black market. Is this a concern for the province and how are you acting to ensure small B.C. growers are included in the legal regime?

### Response (on background):

- Individuals who have been growing cannabis under the ACMPR as designated producers were
  only authorized to produce cannabis for a limited number of authorized medical users. These
  authorizations did not authorize individuals to operate commercial cannabis production
  businesses, and it may be that not all of the sites where designated production was authorized
  are appropriate for commercial production.
- Preservation of agriculture land is a priority for the Province.
- In July 2018, local and First Nations governments were provided the ability to prohibit cannabis production in new concrete-floored structures on ALR land if they so choose.
- The change allows individual local and First Nation governments to make decisions regarding cannabis production on the ALR that align with local planning and priorities in their communities, including the preservation of farmland.
- The changes only pertain to land in the ALR. Local governments have the ability to regulate or prohibit cannabis production on other land in their communities.
- This policy also prohibits local governments from banning commercial cannabis production in existing licensed operations (or in open fields or in soil based structures in the ALR moving forward.)
- Many local and First Nation governments have different approaches for regulating cannabis growth in their communities, be it on the ALR or lands that are zoned for industrial or other purposes.
- Non-soil based production does not require farmland; it can also occur on industrial zoned land where the local government allows it.
- We know that some of those authorized to grow under the ACMPR now wish to participate in
  the legal market for commercial purposes, which is why British Columbia advocated that the
  Government of Canada facilitate the participation of small-scale producers and processors in
  the legal cannabis industry and were pleased when they introduced new micro-cultivation and
  micro-processing licences.
- We also know that the cannabis sector can be a driver of economic growth and employment in B.C., as it has been in other jurisdictions, and we will continue to work with the federal government to advance the interests of B.C. producers.
- The Province has been working closely with the Union of B.C. Municipalities through a joint working group and will continue to discuss policy and implementation issues at that table.
- Cannabis growers should consider which local government's bylaws and regulations regarding cannabis production align with their proposed operations, and plan accordingly.
- Adjusting to the end of nearly 100 years of prohibition is going to take some time and we
  recognize that all levels of government will need to monitor implementation and assess and
  refine cannabis policy and regulation over the months and years ahead.

- Drug-affected driving isn't new and neither are the police tools and skills necessary to detect drivers who are unsafe due to impairment of any kind and take them off the road.

## **Supplementary Response on Background:**

- One of government's primary objectives is to promote a high level of safety for all road users on B.C.'s roads and highways.
- In September 2010, B.C. brought into force tough, immediate sanctions for alcohol-affected driving. Since then, B.C. has seen its annual number of alcohol-related traffic fatalities fall by half, saving hundreds of lives to date.
- One of the ways we are working with our stakeholders to improve road safety is through the BC Road Safety Strategy, which brings together road safety partners to identify priorities and opportunities to advance road safety in B.C.
- Recent projects include the <u>BC Community Road Safety Toolkit</u>, which provides local
  governments with road safety strategies and designs to improve road safety outcomes, as well
  as development of a best practices guide that aims to help road safety practitioners focus their
  public education initiatives to reduce unsafe habits (i.e., alcohol-affected driving, distracted
  driving and speeding) and encourage safe habits and travel alternatives, including walking,
  cycling and public transit.
- In addition, the Province recently launched its drug-affected driving TV commercial. - > Q: It's nice to have a female perspective in this role. Are there many female wardens in BC and Canada, and how will this perspective be advantageous at OCC?

While, I can't speak to national or federal figures, currently there are three female wardens responsible for provincial correctional centres (out of 10 in B.C.). - > A: We see challenges as opportunities to continue being leaders across Canada in correctional supervision.

>

- > BC Corrections has four priorities that all correctional centres and community corrections are focusing on as part of our strategic plan:
- > 1. Support our staff –by ensuring safety, and implementing strategies to find and keep talented, caring and passionate people.
- > 2. Advance correctional supervision by leading by example, respecting our differences and weaving trauma-informed practices into our work.
- > 3. Address Indigenous overrepresentation by ensuring our staff are informed about the lasting impacts of colonization, providing culturally appropriate programs and holistic services that support healing, and engaging Indigenous communities in reintegration planning.
- > 4. Support inmates with complex needs and people in crisis We are actively working on ways to reform the use of segregation so that its use is always a matter of last resort. We are also implementing complex needs units and right living units throughout all centres to help better support the individualized needs of people in crisis.

>

- > Q: What program at OCC is the new warden particularly proud of or impressed with?
- > A: The right living community staff assigned to work the unit in 2019 and the inmates identified to be part of the community are working together to create an environment of trust, communication and accountability. We really want this program to be unique and we are very excited to have the opportunity to open this community within the walls of the centre with the aboriginal liaison workers from the Osoyoos Indian Band.

>

- > Right Living Units bring a positive, 'pro-social' approach to a living unit at a correctional centre for inmates who show they are committed to making real change in their lives. To live on a Right Living Unit, inmates make a public commitment to the Right Living philosophy and must follow the rules of the community, which include the 'cardinal rules' of no violence, substances or weapons. They also hold each other accountable and solve conflicts each day through group meetings led by the inmates and supported by correctional staff and other professional staff, as appropriate. The approach reinforces using the community as a healing and unifying force rather than a more traditional focus on each individual inmate. Community and program activities emphasize learning and embracing a positive, non-criminal lifestyle. The goal is to provide a safe and healing environment that will prepare members to successfully live in their communities, learn how to conduct themselves in relationships and maintain a healthy life on the 'outside'.
- > Q: What is the new warden doing to improve the safety of correctional officers at OCC?
- > A: Safety is always our top priority. In most cases, safety issues arise among people who are struggling with mental health and substance use issues. When you change your approach on how you respond, it's proving to be effective for both staff safety and better outcomes for the people in our care.

>

- > Q: Finally, a quick comment on the inmates' involvement in Oliver's "Share the Spirit" program. It's touching that inmates are helping needy families despite their own circumstances. What does the new warden think of this? Surely, this in itself is a big part of rehabilitation for the inmates.
- > A: I really hope the community understands how much the inmates get out of helping people who are in need. Unfortunately, I think for many of them, this is something they are very familiar with themselves, and they take great pride in doing what they can to help. Inmates have said how proud they were to be able to raise as much money as they did and enjoyed assisting with the wrapping of the gifts. Recently, the inmates received a thank-you letter from the Kiwanis Club; it was so heartwarming to read the kind words that were sent and I know that this type of feedback is extremely inspirational for them, especially at this time of year.

## Background

## Suggested Response

- The Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General funds specific Violence Against
  Women programs in recognition of the fact that women continue to be
  disproportionately impacted by the most severe forms of domestic violence, including
  homicides. For this reason, our Stopping the Violence Counselling Programs and
  Outreach and Multicultural Outreach Services exclusively serve women.
- However, the majority of programs and services for victims of crime in British Columbia serve all victims of violence, including men and women. Across the province, men are eligible to access more than 160 victim service and victim court support programs, including:

- The PEACE (Prevention, Education, Advocacy, Counselling and Empowerment) Programs provide counselling for children aged 3 to 18 who have witnessed abuse, threats, or violence in the home. This program helps children and their adult caregivers heal from the trauma and learn about healthy relationships. These programs serve boys, girls, and non-offending caregivers, regardless of gender.
- The Crime Victim Assistance Program provides medical and dental expenses, counselling services, protective measures, income support and other benefits to assist all eligible victims of crime and their families to recover from the impacts of crime.
- The Ministry's Victim Safety Unit provides men and women victims of crime with notification services regarding the custody status of an accused or offender including releases from custody and information about conditions that must be followed when in the community.
- VictimLink BC, is a toll-free, province-wide 24/7 multilingual help and information line that provides emergency crisis support for all victims of family and sexual violence, regardless of gender.
- In addition, the Ministry supports coordinated responses to referred, high-risk domestic violence cases regardless of a victim's gender, including:
  - Domestic Violence Units (DVUs) which pair dedicated police officer(s), with community-based victim services and, in some communities, a child protection worker to coordinate and collaborate in addressing highest risk cases of domestic violence, regardless of the victim's gender. DVUs are operational in 9 communities: Abbotsford, Capital Region, New Westminster, North Shore (North Vancouver and West Vancouver), Surrey, Nanaimo, Kelowna, Vancouver and Prince George.
  - Interagency Case Assessment Teams (ICATs) that bring together service providers from various sectors such as police, victim services, probation, MCFD, and transition houses to share information, identify risks and create safety plans for specific high risk domestic violence cases regardless of the victim's gender. There are approximately 45 fully operational teams throughout the Province.

#### Funding of Victim Service and Violence against Women Programming

- Over \$35 million is provided annually to support over 400 victim service and violence against women programs throughout the province.
- In December 2017, the Ministry provided \$5 million in one-time funding to help reduce waitlists and better meet demand for vital services needs such as counselling, outreach and crisis support. Budget 2018 increased annual funding by \$5 million starting in 2018/19, which will be further increased by an additional \$3 million in 2020/21, for a total increase of \$18 million over three years to better meet the ongoing demand for programs and services.

As British Columbia's Solicitor General we wish to meet with you personally over the failure of government staff to apply our legal access rights. This failure has subjected blind people from being treated on an equal basis as the law intended.

The Canadian Federation of the Blind's representatives met with David Eby, the Attorney General, back in January this year (please note the attached letter of the 18th September to the Attorney General).

You responded in February to our President, Mary Ellen Gabias, but to date communication with your staff has never materialized. Unfortunately, there appears to be a disconnect between staff and both the Attorney General's office and your office as there has been no progress at all since the January meeting. Although we drew up a letter approved by the Attorney General treatment of our rights in the field has not been resolved or altered in any way.

It is vital that we meet with you as soon as possible as a whole group of vulnerable blind people, including visitors to this province, are having their rights undermined by government staff. This is truly a form of oppression and is a disgrace.

As the Solicitor General of this province we call on you to show leadership and address this deliberate oppression of our access rights. This is a very important legal matter that should not be ignored. We look forward to your personal participation in our restorative justice that the Attorney General agreed upon.

Re: Oppression of Blind People's Legal Access Rights

After meeting with you and your staff in January this year and working together to draw up a letter to other Ministries, we were extremely hopeful our legal rights of access would finally be honoured and supported by the appropriate staff. Unbelieveably, despite months of several inquiries and assurance of a response to your letter, communication from Linda Canham has been completely unproductive. It is possible history could be being repeated as we understand the same bureaucrats that were previously creating barriers appear to be doing just that.

We, at the CFB, are hoping you and your colleagues could again meet with us or alternatively engage in a telephone conference to find a way of resolving this impasse. The access problems are increasing and both the Passenger Transportation Board and the Security Division under Mike Farnworth are, unfortunately, enabling discrimination rather than applying restorative justice. The "education" perpetrators are receiving just encourages drive-offs, sneaky drive-byes and a general contemptuous attitude towards vulnerable blind taxi customers. Furthermore, blind taxi customers with guide dogs have found themselves completely refused service from whole fleets of cabs. (Kamloops Nov. 2017 reported to the Security Division - lacked any redress or penalty to the perpetrators).

Government enforcement officials are quite aware of the Guide Dog Act which clearly states that we are to be treated as if the guide dog is not present and no one shall "interfere" with that right. We are not asking for something out of the ordinary. On the other hand, no one has a right to be a taxi driver at the cost of another's protected rights.

There is no objective evidence that a blind person with a guide dog has actually posed a health or safety problem in a public place or vehicle. To imply that they have is unconscienable. We call on your leadership and strong moral ethics to help us resolve this persistent and endemic injustice. We very much look forward to meeting with you as soon as possible.

#### Response:

- The Province has established a licencing regime for private non-medical cannabis retail, which is administered by the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch (LCRB).
- LCRB is engaging directly on all enquiries from Indigenous nations and is working closely with Indigenous nations and partnerships who are interested in either applying for licences or supporting the establishment of retail stores on their lands.
- The Province is committed to working with Indigenous nations to respond to the needs and interests of individual communities.

#### WILLIAMS LAKE -

Williams Lake Indian Band (WLIB) announced today that construction of a new cannabis retail facility on Indian Reserve #6 in Williams Lake will commence imminently.

"We're incredibly excited to announce this new project," states WLIB Chief Willie Sellars. "The project will be a partnership between Williams Lake Indian Band and another entity with strong indigenous roots. Unlike most other proponents seeking to get involved in cannabis retail, we are building new facilities as opposed to occupying existing space. We are investing heavily in our lands, in this City and in this region. This is evidenced not only by this project, but by the millions we've invested in our lands at Coyote Rock, the sizeable investment we will be making in the construction of a new government office on IR#1, the acquisition and renovation of our new downtown office on Yorston Street in Williams Lake and the numerous other activities and businesses we're involved in."

WLIB's IR#6 is located off South MacKenzie Avenue at the intersection with Borland Road near the entrance to Scout Island. Totaling approximately 2.6 hectares IR#6 has, until now, been undeveloped. "IR#6 is, in my estimation, the perfect site for cannabis retail," Adds WLIB Economic Development Officer, Kirk Dressler. "It's in an area that has primarily commercial and industrial land use. Up until now, the IR#6 site has lain fallow and we've had recurrent problems with people dumping garbage and creating mischief. This new project will hopefully set the tone for redevelopment in the area. It will be a state of the art boutique store that we are confident will set a higher standard than the BC government's own cannabis stores or other private stores."

WLIB is in the process of developing its own Cannabis Law pursuant to the community's Land Code, which will set rules and regulations around the establishment and operation of cannabis production and retail facilities on WLIB Reserve Lands. The draft law received First Reading from Council on November 5, and was presented to the WLIB community as part of the Second Reading process on December 3.

"We have the jurisdiction to regulate cannabis retail on our reserve lands," asserts Chief Sellars. "Reserve lands are federal and while we recognize there is a complicated interplay between Federal, Provincial and First Nations laws we are confident in our authority in this area. Notwithstanding the fact that we have jurisdiction over our lands, we are working with the Province of British Columbia to negotiate an agreement under Section 119 of the Cannabis Control and Licensing Act. We feel that having an agreement with the Province will give clarity as to the authority of our respective laws and reduce the possibility of confusion and conflict."

Section 119 Agreements under the Cannabis Control and Licensing Act are agreements with First Nations Governments that can modify the application of the provincial law. Under section 119 there are key policy objectives that must still be met by the First Nation that is a signatory to agreement. "We fully agree with the core policy objectives in section 119," states Chief Sellars. "We want to make sure that any product sold is safe and thoroughly tested. We want to ensure that cannabis is kept out of the hands of minors and criminals. We will be scrupulous in our maintenance of records. We want to be on the cutting edge of this industry. At the end of the day, this is about opportunity for our people and keeping economic energy going in our region. The Cariboo has had a rough stretch over the last few years, and WLIB has been working hard to diversify and drive our economy forward. We're looking forward to working with the Province and creating an agreement around cannabis that works for both our governments."

WLIB anticipates that construction of the new cannabis retail facility on IR#6 will be complete within three months. Once operational, the facility will create an estimated ten to fifteen new jobs.
