Hi Krystal,

Further to our conversation, below are some key messages on the Funding Model Review that PS Rice can share:

- All students deserve the best educational experience possible and access to the same services and supports no matter where they live.
- But for too long, an outdated and complex

funding has not worked to give students the support they need in school.

- The current funding model was imposed in 2002 with no consultation, and is now outdated and complex.
- We have now released a report from an appointed Independent Review Panel – containing 22 recommendations to create a funding system that better supports all students in B.C.
- The report found there are significant challenges in the current system, resulting in inequities in education services and programs – especially for students with special needs and vulnerable students.
- It also found the current system can be an administrative burden and that too much money is being spent on administration – instead of delivering services to students.
- Building a new funding model is a generational opportunity and it's critical we get it right. This means that we shouldn't rush.
- Given the scope of the recommendations, we now need to work with all all of our education partners to better understand the benefits for students, parents, educators and school districts.
- We are currently working on this next phase of the review process – working with our partners and stakeholders to understand the impact of implementing the recommendations.
- Working groups are being established and will include representation from parents, teachers, school support staff, administrators, trustees, First Nations and inclusive education groups.

- The working groups will provide advice on how to move forward on the key themes raised in the report.
- They will report back to me by fall, 2019.
- Because we are taking the time to get this right, there will be no changes to the existing funding allocations for the 2019-2020 school year.

The purpose of this meeting is to provide Minister Farnworth and Ms. Rice with an update on the current partnership between the BC Government and the BC Lung Association in regards to two important programs, the Quit Now Program and the Wood Smoke

Initiatives Program.

So now in response to the BC wildfire Season, the BC Lung Association is proposing a new program to assist people on how to take action to protect themselves - particularly those most vulnerable such as children, seniors and rural residents - against the negative effects of smoke inhalation from wildfires in BC. The aim of the program would be to build a dedicated education program, in communities throughout BC, at people's doorstep before the wildfire season begins. By educating British Columbians year-round on protection and preparedness from wildfire, we can reduce the damage and number of wildfire smoke related health issues.

And due to the regularity of forest fires in the Summer, the harmful effects on British Columbian's lung health cannot be ignored. In British Columbia we spend more time preparing for an earthquake than we do for forest fires.

This proposed program's goal would be to raise awareness and target communities throughout BC, of the many actions that can be done to protect yourself in British Columbia from wildfire smoke effects.

The program would be a partnership with the Government of British Columbia and the BC Lung Association. This new program would cost an estimate \$300,000 for the development and implementation within communities in British Columbia.

BACKGROUND ON BC LUNG ASSOCIATION

The BC Lung Association began as the Anti-Tuberculosis Society in 1906 in response to the rapid spread of TB, the number one killer at the turn of the century. In July 1978, the Society changed its name to the BC Lung Association, and now focuses on the entire scope of respiratory disease including asthma, COPD (chronic bronchitis and emphysema), lung cancer, sleep apnea and tuberculosis. A non-profit and volunteer-based health charity, The BC Lung Association depends on donations from the public to support lung health
