Hi Mike,

We hope this email finds you well and that you had an enjoyable long weekend. It has been a while since the last time you, Greg, and I met to discuss the latest research developments at the Community Development Institute (CDI) at the University of Northern British Columbia (UNBC). Life has certainly been much busier for you since then.

This time, we wanted to be in touch regarding the possibility of meeting with you in early May regarding the public safety issues related to major projects and fly-in/fly-out workers. With activity ramping up around LNG Canada, this is a critical opportunity for us to share findings, lessons, and best practices from our research.

Over the past seven years, the UNBC Community Development Institute (CDI) has been involved in ***On the Move***, a major pan-Canadian study on mobile workforces. We have looked particularly at issues of community impacts and pressures, policy options and opportunities, and cross-jurisdictional issues associated with mobile workforces. Our objective for this meeting is to provide research information that can help key decision-makers understand and deal the contentious issues that often emerge in relation to fly-in/fly-out workers. This will include concerns and pressures related to public safety, health and additions, violence, domestic violence, housing and homelessness, infrastructure, and transportation.

Our plan is to be in Victoria May 7-8, 2019.
