There were no new significant incidents over the past 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

The upper ridge which has been over the province the past few days will shift eastward into Alberta today signalling a change in the large-scale weather pattern. As the ridge retreats, a southwesterly flow (jetstream) will develop which will direct a series of weak systems towards the Alaska Panhandle and into the northern part of the province. The jetstream is expected to slowly move southward over the next few days and this will bring a cooling trend to the province.

Today, most of the notable weather will be in the north, with showers and thunderstorms expected for areas north of Prince George. Conditions will settle on Sunday, but another bout of showers are expected for Monday. In the south, it will remain dry through Tuesday except for isolated thunderstorms today in the Kootenays.

The worst of the wildfire smoke over B.C. is in the northeast but there should be some improvement later today as winds shift to the west. Hazy conditions over southern B.C. will also improve.

There were no new significant incidents over the past 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

A significant change in the large-scale weather pattern has followed the retreat of the upper ridge which had been dominant over the province last week. A southwesterly flow (jet) has developed and has steered a series of weak systems towards the Alaska Panhandle and into northern B.C. EMBC UPDATE – June 3, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

An apartment fire on Pacific Street in Vancouver attracted significant media attention yesterday, but there were no injuries and only two people required Emergency Social Services.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

Monday morning, a low-pressure system weakens as it approaches the north coast of B.C. producing periods of rain. Northern and central B.C. will see showers and some lingering nocturnal thunderstorms in regions closer to the low-system located over the Rockies. Towards late afternoon, rain showers are expected for northern coastal regions, and showers are expected to continue across most of the northern and central B.C. interior. Northern regions will see a risk of thunderstorms while southern regions are expected to remain dry.

Tuesday morning, a weak low offshore will give showers to the north coast in addition to showers and isolated thunderstorms in the far north. Towards the afternoon, showers will persist in the far north while isolated showers and a risk of thunderstorms develop across the central interior. The far south remains dry and warm. Clouds will increase over Vancouver Island as an offshore-low approaches the coast. As the low crosses Vancouver Island Tuesday night, it will be absorbed by a much broader system early Wednesday morning. Significant upper level support due to the strong jet and upper low reaching the coast will favour more organized precipitation along the coast, spreading into the interior as Wednesday progresses.

By Thursday, the entire province is under the dome of cool, moist, unstable air associated with the upper low, although it will take a bit longer to filter into the South Rockies and Kootenay regions. Showers are likely everywhere, but heavier precipitation will be focused along a surface trough across the central interior.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

Today, a passing frontal system leaves cool, unsettled conditions through much of BC. Showers and unsettled conditions contribute to a widespread risk of thunderstorms as a cool, unsettled air mass envelops the entire province in the afternoon. Expect locally heavy rain in the Peace River regions, especially closer to the Rockies.

Through the next couple days, a cold upper low settles over the southeast. For the Peace region, rain will be heavy at times with total rainfall accumulations up to 30 to 40 mm. Elsewhere, expect between 5 to 15 mm on both today and tomorrow. EMBC UPDATE - June 7, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

There were no new significant incidents in the previous 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

Today brings showers, thunderstorms, and cooler conditions to most regions of BC. Snow levels start the day fairly low for this time of year, at roughly 1400 metres, and high elevation passes may see a few centimetres of snow. Most southern highway passes are forecast to receive about 2 to 5 cm of wet snow overnight, although up to 10 cm is possible over the Okanagan Connector. In northern BC, expect flurries on the Alaska Highway (Highway 97) from the Rocky Mountain foothills to the Liard River.

A ridge of high pressure is beginning to build over the Pacific and will start to influence mainland weather over the next few days. Late on Saturday sees a drying and warming trend for coastal regions of BC. Showers persist over the majority of the interior for most of Saturday night. On Sunday, high pressure clears away the instability over the interior. A weakening frontal system arrives on the north coast late in the day, returning showers to the region.

For Monday the frontal system on the north coast falls apart but a second, more intense system, follows close behind. The ridge of high pressure keeps the south dry and things begin to heat up going into next week.

There were no new significant incidents over the past 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

This morning, a weak surface trough persists over the interior. That combined with cool air aloft will keep the interior cool and unsettled with another day of widespread showers or thunderstorms. In the afternoon, a few showers and isolated thundershowers will occur over the interior. The focus for convection will be the Kootenays, Columbia, Cariboo, northern Rockies and the BC Peace. The coast areas will be mainly cloudy but should remain dry through the day, with a chance of an afternoon shower near the Coast Mountains.

Sunday, most of the southern interior and the south coast will be dry. There will be a chance of showers over the Rockies from about Golden - northwards. Prince Rupert and Haida Gwaii will be cloudy and drizzly. By the afternoon, dry and warmer conditions is forecast over the vast majority of the province.

Monday and Tuesday, the incoming surface ridge is expected to build from Port Hardy to the BC-Alberta elbow. South of the ridge, it looks to be sunny and warmer with temperatures approaching 30 degrees by Tuesday afternoon in the warmer southwestern BC valleys like Pemberton, Fraser Canyon, Nicola and the South Thompson. The central interior locales near Prince George-Cariboo-Bulkley Valley is forecast to be cloudy, which will take a few degrees off the daytime high temperatures.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

A ridge of high pressure is building over the BC coast, heralding a return to warmer weather this week. For today, cloud and scattered showers are still possible across the province, though the risk of thunderstorms will be mainly confined to the BC Peace. The northwest of the province is the exception, where showers and seasonal temperatures persist through Thursday.

A weak frontal system maintains rain over the northwest today and tomorrow, but for the rest of BC conditions are drying out. EMBC UPDATE - June 11, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

There were no new significant incidents over the past 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

A ridge of high pressure is in place over the BC coast today. Through the central and southern part of the province, it will be hot and sunny. Meanwhile, a weakening front is moving onto the Alaskan Panhandle and showers from this system will spread inland over the northwest today.

On Wednesday, a cold front is expected to sweep south across the province, moving in a bit earlier than previous forecasts. For the northwest from the Cariboo north to the YT border, clouds will move in in the afternoon with showers and a risk of thunderstorms. These showers will persist through the night and spread east into the Fort Nelson and Fort St John areas overnight. For southern areas including the south coast, cloudy periods are forecast to move in by Wednesday afternoon. While the air mass over southern BC is still going to be hot, this cloud cover may moderate temperatures. It still looks like Wednesday will be the hottest day this week. On Thursday as the front continues to move across the interior it will continue to destabilize the atmosphere. Temperatures will be several degrees cooler. Showers and thunderstorms will spread to the southern interior, but by Friday, this feature is already moving into Alberta, leaving a ridge to rebuild over the province. This means clearing from west to east through the day.

EMBC UPDATE - June 13, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

There were no new significant incidents over the past 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

This morning, a cold front over the central interior will bring showers to central regions. Cloudy periods are also forecast for southern areas with showers lingering over the north coast and Halda Gwaii. Dry conditions are forecast for other coastal regions due to the ridge of high pressure offshore. By the afternoon, the cold front sweeping across the interior will bring showers with the risk of thunderstorms to north, central and the southern interior regions.

Friday, a ridge of high pressure will rebuild along the coast and unsettled conditions with the chance of showers are expected over the interior in the wake of the departing cold front. The ridge of high pressure over Haida Gwaii will maintain dry conditions over coastal areas. Showers with the risk of thunderstorms are anticipated over the interior, particularly over northeastern BC.

Moving into the weekend, a ridge of high pressure building over the coast on Saturday will bring gradual drying and clearing over the BC interior. The stabilizing effect of the ridge will be felt moving across the province from west to east through Saturday. Meanwhile, an approaching Pacific frontal system will bring showers to the north coast. This frontal system will move into the central and northern interior on Sunday bringing a chance of showers or thunderstorms to the area. A mix of sun and cloud is forecast for the south coast on Sunday.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

This morning, a ridge of high pressure will build along the BC coast with unsettled conditions and some showers expected over the Interior in the wake of the departing cold front. The ridge of high pressure remains in place over Haida Gwaii maintaining dry conditions over coastal areas. By the afternoon, showers with the risk of thunderstorms are anticipated over the BC interior regions, particularly over the northeastern regions.

Saturday, a ridge of high pressure will continue to build over the south coast maintaining dry conditions over the region and bringing gradual drying and clearing across the BC interior. Some lingering showers are possible in the Kootenays early in the morning. In the afternoon, it will remain mainly sunny over the south coast and most of the BC interior. However, showers, associated with the approaching frontal system, are expected for the north coast and Haida Gwaii by the afternoon.

Sunday, a frontal system moving into the central and northern interior will bring a chance of showers or thunderstorms to the area. Showers will continue over the north coast while a mix of sun and cloud is forecast for the south coast. There were no new significant incidents over the previous 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

Today is generally warm and dry except for showers on the north coast and isolated thundershowers in parts of the central and southern interior. There will be extensive stratus and fog banks off the West Coast of Vancouver Island, but the south coast remains sunny. Daytime heating triggers convective cloud buildup in the interior, bringing isolated showers to the south and widespread thunderstorms to the central and the northern interior.

For Tuesday, expect scattered showers across the interior and morning showers in parts of the south coast. Nocturnal thunderstorms may persist into the morning in the northeast. Afternoon thunderstorms concentrate over the Kootenays and southern Rockies.

There were no new significant incidents over the previous 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

Today, a few showers linger near the Cariboo Region, while scattered showers with a risk of thunderstorms will intensify throughout the day. For the South Coast, a thick low cloud and converging low-level winds will result in patchy drizzle for the morning hours. By late afternoon, northerly upslope flow wraps around a low-pressure system and will cause steady rain to fall in the northeast. Embedded thunderstorms will complicate the rainfall pattern with 10-20mm of precipitation. The northeast can expect up to 15-25mm of rainfall overnight into Wednesday morning.

Wednesday the rain tapers to showers in the north as the surface and upper low weaken. Isolated showers for the coast and southern interior are expected with other weaker features. The central interior, while impacted by cloud cover and seasonal temperatures, will be mainly dry but breezy.

Thursday we see a North/northwesterly flow developing in behind the departing low pressure system. This will bring shower activity/rain for the southern Peace and eastern slopes of the Rocky Mountains. Friday the ridge of high pressure rebuilds and brings sunshine and warmer temperatures.

EMBC UPDATE - June 19, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

An interface wildfire has prompted the tactical evacuation of seven homes from the Penticton Indian Band. Fire crews from the First Nation, City of Penticton, and BC Wildfire Service are responding to the fire, which ignited around 02:00 this morning. The Penticton Indian Band EOC is activated to support the incident and evacuees. Further updates are expected today.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

A cool airmass over the province today will drop temperatures back down to seasonal, with fairly widespread bands of showers. Rain will be heavy at times in the Fort Nelson region, where total rainfall amounts of 50 mm are forecast by this evening. Showers and a few thunderstorms could develop over the southern interior this afternoon, and isolated showers are forecast for the south coast.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

Today and Friday, a cool, unstable airmass remains over eastern and southern regions as well as the east Kootenays. While the heaviest precipitation is east into Alberta, moderate rain and snow, down to 1700m, is expected on the BC side of the Rockies. A very different pattern is establishing itself over the coast and northwest with temperatures climbing back to seasonal values bringing sunnier weather and reducing the risk of showers and thunderstorms. This dichotomy holds on Friday, with showers lessening somewhat over the central and southern interior whilst the extreme southeast corner of the province may see a risk of thunderstorms. Light smoke from Alberta's wildfires may be noticeable in northern areas.

Saturday and Sunday, the active weather pattern continues as a frontal system makes landfall on the North Coast on Saturday morning, slides down to the South Coast Saturday night and moves into the interior on Sunday. A weaker feature riding overtop of the coastal ridge will bring about instability with scattered showers and risk of thunderstorms to the Central and southern Interior and Peace region while the south coast remains mostly dry.

EMBC UPDATE - June 21, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

Apartment Fire

Emergency Support Services have responded to an apartment fire on Richmond Road in Saanich, which has displaced approximately 100 residents. Residents were evacuated around 4:20am Friday morning. Fire Departments from Saanich, Oak Bay and Victoria responded. A Reception Centre has been established nearby. Salvation Army resources have also activated and are heading to the incident. There are no reports of any serious injuries at this time.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

This morning, the upper low complex will send bands of heavy precipitation sliding down the Rockies. There may be showers around the Similkameen and Nicola and over the extreme southern BC Peace. Otherwise, the rest of the province will be dry and mostly clear, due to the incoming ridge. I his afternoon, rain will persist for the extreme southeast corner including Sparwood and Fernie. Afternoon showers or thunderstorms will develop with daytime heating Near Fort Nelson and Watson Lake. There might be an isolated shower or thunderstorm over 100 Mile House and the Thompson region and a slim chance of showers exists near the mountains around Hope, Whistler and Pemberton. Most other areas of the province will be dry, sunny and warm this afternoon.

Saturday, the next Pacific front will overrun the coastal ridge and bring rain or showers to Prince Rupert, Terrace and Haida Gwaii. The same system will spread system clouds across the Bulkley Valley, Chilcotin and towards Prince George. Showers will persist in the extreme northeast and southeast corners of the province. Otherwise, it should be a dry, sunny start to the day over most of southern BC.

Though rain finally pulls away from the southeast corner Saturday afternoon, conditions generally deteriorate elsewhere. The modest Pacific front/trowal is expected to advance southwards and inland. The feature will bring isolated showers down the coast to Bella Bella and for the interior over the Chilcotin-Cariboo and northwards; increasing clouds for the south coast and southern interior will occur during the day but no showers are expected, except near the Rockies. The Watson Lake-Fort Nelson corridor will be a focal point for showers and thunderstorms.

Sunday, an unsettled weather pattern develops as a surface trough and low slides down from off the

Panhandle in the morning to west of Tofino by Monday night. Light to moderate showers are forecast to prevail across much of BC through the period.

EMBC UPDATE - June 22, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

Apartment Fire

The apartment fire that occurred early Friday morning on Richmond Road in Saanich resulted in one fatality and two people hospitalized. 89 suites were impacted by fire, water and smoke damage. 23 suites are expected to be uninhabitable for several weeks and some are damaged beyond repair. Emergency Support Services continue to assist residents affected by the incident and Disaster Psychosocial Assistance has been initiated for those residents requiring additional support.

There were no other new significant incidents over the previous 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

This morning, the next Pacific front will overrun the coastal ridge and bring rain or showers to Prince Rupert, Terrace and Haida Gwaii. The same system will also spread clouds across the Bulkley Valley, Chilcotin and towards Prince George. Rain will also persist in the extreme northeast corner of the province, but otherwise, it should be a dry, sunny start to the day over most of southern BC. This afternoon, the modest Pacific front/trowal advances southwards and inland. This feature will bring isolated showers down the coast to Bella Bella and to the interior over the Chilcotin-Cariboo and northwards; increasing clouds for the south coast and southern interior during the day but no showers are expected, except near the Rockies. The Watson Lake-Fort Nelson corridor will be a focal point for showers and thunderstorms this afternoon.

Sunday, the surface ridge is expected to flatten and pivot well to the south, opening the door to an unsettled weather pattern developing as a surface trough and low slides down from off the Panhandle. Extensive low cloud and drizzle will come in on the onshore flow on the North Coast. Scattered showers will threaten most of the interior. Another trough extending from the Yukon across the northeast will trigger showers in the Fort Nelson and northern Peace areas.

Monday, an unsettled weather pattern is forecast to develop as a surface low off Haida Gwaii slides south off Vancouver Island toward the Oregon Coast. Meanwhile, an initially sharp trough will extend westward from a Prairie Low towards Fort Nelson early Monday and then gradually weaken as it slides across the Peace region Monday night and Tuesday. Light to moderate showers will prevail across much of BC through the period. Heavier rain associated with the trough will likely

impact Fort Nelson and the Peace.

EMBC UPDATE - June 23, 2019 at 06:00 hrs

There were no new significant incidents over the previous 24 hours.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

This morning, an unsettled weather pattern develops as a surface trough and low slides down from the Alaskan Panhandle. Extensive low cloud and drizzle from an onshore flow along the North Coast regions. Scattered showers will also threaten most of the interior. In the afternoon, the trough extending across northeastern British Columbia will trigger locally heavier showers and thunderstorms along the Alaska Highway between the Peace region and Fort Nelson.

Monday, an unsettled weather pattern will develop as a surface low edges southward off Haida Gwaii, causing rain or drizzle on the north coast. Scattered showers prevail across much of the province throughout the day. By the afternoon, a sharp trough extending westward from a Prairie Low will slide across the Peace region bringing locally heavy showers and thunderstorms for the northern Peace, with rainfall amounts enhanced by upslope flow on the East North East slopes of the northern Rockies.

Moving into next week, the unsettled weather pattern will persist as a surface low slides south off Vancouver Island toward the Oregon Coast on Tuesday then starts to dissipate on Wednesday. A trough initially extending westward from a Prairie Low towards the Peace early Tuesday will gradually weaken. A weak, broad trough remains across the central interior on Wednesday, then forms a new surface low on Thursday. Light to moderate showers prevail across much of BC through this period with heavier rain associated with the trough likely impacting the northern Rockies and the Peace on Tuesday. Showers will be more widespread on Wednesday, and further still on Thursday when areas of heavier precipitation also becomes more apparent.

EMBC UPDATE - June 24, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

Landslide

Two mudslides have impacted Seymour Arm Main Forest Service Road halfway between St. Ives and Seymour Arm in North Shuswap. No reports of injuries or impacts to critical infrastructure at this time. Columbia Shuswap Regional District activated their EOC to Level one to support public messaging and issues concerning diverted traffic. The area's Neighbourhood Emergency Program, which is supported by the Shuswap Emergency Program, was alerted to help disseminate information regarding the road closure.

Wildfire

Yesterday, A wildfire closed the northbound lane of Highway 99 between Horseshoe Bay and Lions Bay, causing major delays on Highway 99. The BC Wildfire Service reports the fire to be around four hectares in size and burning 4.5 kilometres south of Lions Bay. There are no homes currently threatened and multiple agencies responded. BC Hydro reported 73 homes affected by the related power outage due to impacted powerlines. Power has now been restored for the majority of customers with two homes remaining without power last night. More traffic impacts should be expected today.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

This morning, the unsettled weather pattern continues as the surface low edges southward off Haida Gwaii, causing light rain or drizzle on the north coast, with continued scattered showers across much of BC. A trough extending westward from a Prairie Low will slide across the Peace region later this afternoon and into the evening bringing locally heavy showers and thunderstorms.

Tuesday, the trough, initially extending towards the Peace, slides further South and then gradually weakens. It is accompanied by showers and persistent thunderstorms early Tuesday morning. Following a brief dry spell for some regions showers and thunderstorms will redevelop across much of B.C. in the afternoon, the far North being the exception which is expected to remain dry.

Wednesday, an unsettled weather pattern persists as a surface low slides south off Vancouver Island toward the Oregon Coast where it starts to dissipate. A weak, broad trough remains across the central interior then forms a new surface low Wednesday night and into Thursday morning. Light to moderate showers prevail across much of BC through this period, however showers are expected to

be extensive on Thursday.

EMBC UPDATE - June 25, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

Yesterday evening, a wildfire started in the Madeira Park area of the Sechelt Peninsula. The Cecil Hill fire (V50714) is gaining significant media attention, who reported that firefighting efforts continued overnight to battle the 2.25 hectares fire. The fire is not approaching structures or critical infrastructure, but media reports place it within 600 metres of residential areas.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

An upper low off Vancouver Island with a trough extending across south-central British Columbia will be the most prominent meteorological feature today. Temperatures will be generally slightly below seasonal but can reach seasonal normals where the sun makes a more sustained appearance. Most of southern B.C. will be in the latter category, with highs expected to reach the low twenties near the coast and into the mid twenties in the interior. Clouds will generally increase in the afternoon with a threat of showers. There is also a risk of thunderstorms across the southern and central Yukon and nearly all of the British Columbia except the immediate coast this afternoon. Another region likely to be exempt from thunderstorms extends from Prince George west across the Nechako, where cool, cloudy conditions are more conducive to light rain.

The vast upper low complex will impact British Columbia through the week as it drifts slowly off Vancouver Island toward the Oregon Coast then expands again into B.C. by the end of the week. This will result in a persistent cool, unsettled and showery pattern over all regions.

EMBC UPDATE - June 26, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

The Sunshine Coast Regional District issued an evacuation alert yesterday for 6 homes due to the Cecil Hill wildfire on the Sechelt Peninsula, which has grown to 9 hectares. Two cellular towers are at risk from the fire.

A landslide on the Fraser River garnered media attention yesterday. The slide occurred prior to June 23rd and is 4 km upstream of the Big Bar Reaction Ferry, some 70 km west of Clinton. There is no blockage of the river, nor safety concerns. The Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) is working to ensure fish passage and will be the lead agency for coordination and messaging.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

The next several days see a persistent cool, unsettled and showery pattern settle over all regions of BC. This morning, showers longer over most of southern BC, with partly cloudy conditions elsewhere. Thunderstorms are likely to develop this afternoon over the southwest interior, Cariboo region, the Bulkley Valley and Terrace/Kitimat regions. There is a potential for heavy downpours, small hail and strong winds. Of particular concern is the dry belt area in the southwest interior, where local heavy rain gives rise to possible flash flooding in sensitive terrain. The second area of hazardous weather stretches from just south of Fort Nelson down through the Peace. A risk of isolated or scattered non-severe thunderstorms exists in most other areas of the province.

Tomorrow, expect heavier showers over southern BC and the central interior and a renewed risk of thundershowers for most of the province. For the rest of the week, details are still uncertain at this time but the overall result is that showers will continue across much of BC with a focus over central sections on Friday, shifting northward on Saturday. Thunderstorms will be likely, with a potential for severe weather locally.

WEATHER ALERTS

There are no weather alerts in place, but thunderstorm watches are anticipated for parts of the southern interior this afternoon.

There were no incidents of note in the past 24 hours. The Sunshine Coast Regional District rescinded their evacuation alert yesterday due to good progress by wildfire crews on the Cecil Hill Fire.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

Heavier showers with possible embedded thunderstorms develop over southwestern BC today. North of the main precipitation band, isolated showers persist with a risk of thunderstorms. Over the northeast, a cold front with light rain retreats eastward near Fort Nelson. In the afternoon, expect scattered showers and thunderstorms over much of BC.

EMBC UPDATE - June 28, 2019 at 07:00 hrs

Rock slide Fraser River

A naturally occurring rock slide which was reported to DFO on June 23, 2019 in the Fraser River approximately 4 kms upstream from the Big Bar Ferry has deposited significant amounts of debris into the river creating a water velocity and elevation barrier that may impact salmon attempting to migrate past the site. The slide is suspected to have occurred sometime on June 21-22, 2019. A visual inspection of the slide site during a helicopter patrol on the morning of June 25, 2019 confirms the magnitude of the event and indicates that at current flows salmon passage could be negatively affected. EMBC is assisting with outreach to all First Nations potentially impacted to participate in a DFO led technical brief at 1300 hours today.

Structure Fire

A fire has burned through the old BC Packers building at the Bella Coola Wharf. The Bella Coola Nuxalk Nation volunteer fire fighters remain on the scene to monitor what remains of the burning structure. EOC was activated for a short period as there were originally some concerns about smoke impacting public safety. Spill response authorities have been notified and are in dialogue with Nuxalk Nation and CCRD officials regarding debris from the fire. Further site evaluation will take place later this morning with the engagement of other responsible authorities continuing marine pollution assessment.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

This morning a band of heavier precipitation stretches westward towards the central coast of BC. Lingering showers with thunderstorms persist over southern BC. Dry conditions to the north with isolated showers over northern BC and then mainly sunny conditions over the southern Yukon. The surface low remains over Alberta while the band of heavier showers and thunderstorms remains draped across the central interior. North and south of the band, afternoon heating will trigger isolated showers or thunderstorms.

Saturday and Sunday showers will continue through the central interior and the northeast. A few

scattered showers will persist over the south.

Monday unsettled weather and scattered showers continue through the interior of BC. Expect more widespread showers in the northeast including the BC Peace late afternoon.

What's happening?

The BC Human Rights Code (Code) is a law which protects and promotes human rights in British Columbia. The Code protects citizens from being discriminated against under a list of protected grounds, including sex or gender identity. Under the Human Rights Code, sexual harassment is a form of sex discrimination. The BC Public Service Discrimination and Harassment Policy (HR Policy 11) outlines expectations and provides guidance to employees regarding discrimination and harassment, including sexual harassment.

In fall 2018 the Code was amended to lengthen the deadline for filing complaints of alleged contraventions of the Code, including complaints of harassment based on sex. Now, a complaint must be filed within one year of the alleged contravention, instead of within six months.
