The Deputy General Manager, Compliance and Enforcement Division, Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch (branch) has been delegated responsibility by the General Manager for the regulation of both the liquor and cannabis industries in British Columbia in matters of compliance and enforcement mandated under the Liquor Control and Licensing Act (LCLA) and the Cannabis Control and Licensing Act (CCLA). As a Regional Manager, I have responsibility to manage complaints that relate to the above named Acts.

I acknowledge your complaint against Astoria on May 1, 2020. Within your complaint you allege patrons consuming liquor outside of the licensed establishment. While the consumption of liquor in a public unlicensed place does not fall under the Branch's authority, the branch will investigate what the licensed establishment may be doing to contribute to this allegation.

Your complaint has been assigned to Liquor and Cannabis Inspector Tyler Maloney who may contact you for further information. Regarding your complaint, the LCRB will determine either that:

- -There is not enough evidence to prove a contravention
- -A contravention has occurred, but it is appropriate to deal with through compliance meetings with the licensee or

permittee, and recording details in the establishment's file at the LCRB; or

-A contravention has occurred and the LCRB will take enforcement action against the licensee or permittee in which case they have the right to sign a waiver accepting responsibility or dispute the alleged contravention at a hearing.

The LCRB operates under administrative law and can only release information related to investigations or enforcement action if a waiver is signed or a decision is made at a hearing. This ensures privacy of those involved, administrative fairness to the licensee or permittee, and the integrity of the compliance and enforcement process. Either way, you will be informed when the investigation into your complaint has concluded.

EXTRACT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE VANCOUVER CITY COUNCIL MEETING FEBRUARY 4, 1986

Astoria Hotel, 769 East Hastings Street - Licensee Retail Store

Submitted for information was a report of the Standing Committee of Council on Community Issues on the request to the Liquor Control & Licensing Branch for permission to operate a Licensee Retail Store for the off-premises sale of B.C. beer, cider and wine.

The Astoria Hotel is located five blocks east of the former liquor store site on East Hastings Street near Main. This was closed by the Provincial Government following strong urging by Council and community groups because of the problems created by its existence in the neighbourhood.

The Acting Director of Permits and Licenses and some members of the Community Issues Committee were concerned that the former problems created by the sale of wine at the liquor store could be re-activated if approval was given to this proposed Licensee Retail Store.

The Committee's report was submitted for information as a motion to recommend approval of the application subject to the sale of beer only was lost and the Committee took no further action.

Mr. S. Huberman, Solicitor for the Astoria Hotel, spoke to his previously circulated brief. As the management of the Hotel is aware of Council's Concern with respect to the sale of winel from this outlet, Mr. Huberman, on behalf of his client, gave an undertaking the company would restrict its sales to beer only. This undertaking has also been indicated to the Deputy General Manager of the Liquor Control & Licensing Branch. Therefore, Mr. Huberman requested Council to approve the proposed Licensee Retail Store subject to sale of beer only.

MOVED by Ald. Puil,

THAT Council advise the Liquor Control & Licensing Branch that it favours approval of the operation of a Licensee Retail Store for the off-premises sale of B.C. beer only at the Astoria Hotel, 769 East Hastings Street.

Report to Council Standing Committee of Council on Community Issues January 9, 1986

Licensee Retail Store -Astoria Hotel, 769 East Hastings Street

In a Manager's Report dated December 20, 1985 (on file) the Acting Director of Permits & Licenses reported that the owners of the Astoria Hotel, 769 East Hastings Street, have requested permission from the Liquor Control & Licensing Branch to operate a Licensee Retail Store for the off-premises sale of B.C. beer, cider and wine.

It was reported that a Public House may obtain approval for off-premises sale of beer and this new concept of a retail store attached to the hotel with a separate entrance, will permit the operator to sell B.C. beer, cider and wine to the public. A copy of the LC&LB requirements for a Licensee Retail Store was attached to the report.

The Astoria Hotel is located five blocks east of the former liquor store site on East Hastings Street near Main Street which was closed by the Provincial Government following strong urging by Council and community groups because of the problems its existence created in the neighbourhood. The Acting Director felt that some of the former problems created by the sale of wine at the liquor store could be re-activated if approval was given to this proposed Licensee Retail Store, as B.C. wines are generally at the lower end of the price scale.

The Acting Director therefore recommended the LC&LB be informed that Council is not in favour of a Licensee Retail Store being established in the Astoria Hotel. The City Manager endorsed this recommendation and advised that both the Director of Social Planning and Chief Constable have reviewed and support the report.

Mr. Nolan Fisher, Astoria Hotel, distributed a brief to the Committee (on file) and explained that the hotel has a good record of control over its patrons and does not present problems for the Police Department. Although his original application to the LC&LB was to sell beer and wine at the Licensee Retail Store, upon learning that the sale of wine in this area is a concern to the various licensing authorities, he has indicated orally to Mr. Don Anderson of the LC&LB that he would like to amend the application to sell beer only. Therefore, he requested Council's approval to grant him permission to be a retail licensee to sell beer only. He noted that he presently can sell beer over the counter, but he would like to provide a better service, at a lower cost, to his customers.

In response to a question, Mr. Ken Armstrong, Permits & Licenses Department, agreed that the LC&LB could limit Mr. Fisher's license to sell beer only, if approved.

During discussion, the Committee was divided in its opinion on whether or not the proposal would be good for the neighbourhood, even with the sale of beer only, a service which is already provided through the bar. A motion to recommend approval of the application subject to the sale of beer only was LOST and no further action was taken. Therefore, this item is submitted for Council's INFORMATION.

CLASSIFICATION: RECOMMENDATION

The Acting Director of Permits & Licenses reports as follows:

"The owners of the Astoria Hotel, 769 East Hastings Street, have requested the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch consider granting them permission to operate a Licensee Retail Store for the off-premises sale of British Columbia beer, cider and wine (see Appendix A). Also attached is a copy of the Liquor Control & Licensing Branch material which explains the requirements for a Licensee Retail Store (Appendix B).

A Public House may obtain approval for off-premises sale of beer. This new concept of a retail store attached to the hotel with a separate entrance, will permit the operator to sell B.C. beer, cider and wine to the public.

The Astoria Hotel is located five blocks east of the former liquor store site on East Hastings Street near Main Street. This Government liquor store was closed by the Provincial Government following strong urging by City Council and community groups because of problems its existence created in the neighbourhood.

The proposed Licensee Retail Store, if approved, could only sell beer, cider and wine produced in B.C. Since the B.C. wines are generally at the lower end of the price scale, some of the former problems created by the sale of wine at the former Government liquor store could be reactivated.

I recommend the Liquor Control and Licensing Board be informed that City Council is not in favour of a Licensee Retail Store being established in the Astoria Hotel."

The City Manager advises that both the Social Planning and Police Departments have reviewed and support this report. The City Manager RECOMMENDS approval of the recommendation of the Acting Director of Permits & Licenses.

INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

OFF-PREMISES SALES THROUGH

LICENSEE RETAIL STORES

On May 24, 1985, the Honourable James J. Hewitt, Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs, announced changes to liquor policy that will allow qualified licensed hotels and neighbourhood pubs to set up stores to sell British Columbia beer, cider and wine. Licensed marine pubs may also qualify for this privilege.

This material will explain how interested licensees can apply to operate such a store and the criteria for its operation.

APPLICATION

A hotel, neighbourhood pub or marine pub currently licensed to sell off-premises beer, or which is eligible to apply for such a modification of its licence, may apply to the General Manager, Liquor Control and Licensing Branch, to operate a store as an extension of its licence.

Applicants will also be required to enter into an agreement with the Liquor Distribution Branch with respect to pertinent financial responsibilities and procedures, administration of the program, and purchase and sale of product.

Any applicant wanting to be considered for the privilege should submit the following to the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch:

- a) Application letter
- b) Artist's conception
- c) Two sets of approved floor plans to be reviewed against design criteria.

If approval is granted, one copy of the floor plan will be returned marked "Approved in Principle". Construction can then proceed.

Upon completion of construction and upon the applicant having all necessary approvals from other authorities, including completion of financial arrangements with the Liquor Distribution Branch, the liquor inspector will do a final inspection. On his report, the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch will give final approval and the applicant can commence business. An amended license will be forwarded in due course.

All applicants should be aware that the decision made by the Branch involves more than the physical characteristics of the proposal. The Branch will always have to consider the following:

- The record of operation of that licensee a)
- Whether or not a licensee retail store would have an b) adverse impact on the surrounding area.
- c) Any recommendation from the local government

STORE DESIGN

The store must be on the same site as the licensee's premises and may be either free-standing or attached with a separate entrance.

It is expected that the store will have the following features:

- clean, attractive premises
- self-serve retail area
- refrigeration is desirable
- adequate parking
- drive-through service is optional
- sufficient storage space for product and empties
- separate cash register and sale procedures

PRODUCT SELECTION

British Columbia packaged beer, cider and non-fortified wine may be sold.

Package size must not exceed 20 litres. A representative selection of products from B.C. suppliers is required.

Draught beer may also be sold from these stores. Furthermore, a brew-pub may sell its own draught beer. The maximum size of container allowed will be 20 litres.

Complementary items such as glasses, openers and corkscrews may be sold as well as a limited selection of packaged snack foods and sundries (typically, those items available for sale inside the establishment).

HOURS OF SALE

The store may be open between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. each day, except Sundays, Christmas Day and Good Friday.

After 11:00 p.m., licensees may revert to selling beer, cider and coolers in their licensed establishment until the normal closing time for off-premises sales. These sales, however, are not available for any rebate.

SUPPLY -

Product will be ordered and purchased through procedures prescribed by the Liquor Distribution Branch. All products must be obtained from producers or their agents — not through government liquor stores.

No products will be purchased from or through Liquor Distribution Branch agency stores.

In designing premises, licensees should ensure that loading and unloading facilities are adequate and that there is sufficient storage space for product and empties. This is an important matter with suppliers and licensees may wish to consult with them during the design process.

EMPTIES

This store must accept return of empties of refundable containers of up to at least 20 dozen per customer per day. Provision for acceptance of empties must be prominently displayed in the retail portion of the store. The store must charge the prescribed fee and refund the full amount.

IN-STORE PROMOTION

Reasonable merchandising practices will be permitted.

PRICING

Licensees are free to set retail prices above the floor price. The floor price is the licensee's cost after deducting the rebate. The Liquor Distribution Branch would rebate the operator a sum equal to 10% of sales. The 10% would be calculated from Liquor Distribution Branch retail prices (i.e. exclusive of social service tax).

Rebate may also be claimed for the 5% licensee fee for product sold through the store. The fee would continue to be required for on-premise sales and for off-premise sales not made through the licensee retail store.

Licensees will be required to maintain auditable records of sales through the store and to submit rebate claims to the Liquor Distribution Branch in a prescribed format and time frame.

Credit cards and cheques may be accepted for sales, but no risk is assumed by the Liquor Distribution Branch.

The 7% Social Services Tax is to be paid directly to the Consumer Taxation Branch.

Licensees must understand that any abuse of the rebate system will be considered a serious violation which would likely bring about revocation of any off-premises sales for a period of time. Only sales of B.C. beer, cider and wine through the store qualify for the rebate of 10% and of the 5% licensing fee. Furthermore, a licensee cannot sell to himself. In other words, the licensee cannot take the product from the store to be sold on-premises and claim the rebate on that product.

LICENSEE SALES

Licensees are not permitted to sell to other licensees or Liquor Distribution Branch agency stores. Licensees include persons holding a Special Occasion licence.

MUNICIPAL PERMITS

The licensee is responsible for ensuring that the retail store operation conforms with local zoning requirements and that any necessary municipal permits or licenses are obtained.

INFRACTIONS

As in all other aspects of the licence, the licensee is responsible for ensuring the provisions of the Liquor Control and Licensing Act are complied with, including provisions prohibiting the sale of alcohol to minors or those persons apparently under the influence of alcohol.

The licensee should be aware that failure to comply with the provisions of the licence in respect to the store operation could affect any or all other aspects of the hotel, neighbourhood pub or marine pub licence.

Furthermore, with this new type of facility, licensees should be reminded of Section 46 of the Liquor Control and Licensing Act which states:

- 46. (1) A person shall not offer or give and a licensee or his employee shall not accept or receive money, gifts, reward or remuneration, directly or indirectly, for promoting, inducing or furthering the sale of a particular kind, class or brand of liquor.
 - (2) A licensee or his employee shall not before further or promote the sale of a particular kind, class or brand of liquor.

In other words, it is illegal for a producer of beer, cider or wine to give, and for the licensee to accept, any incentive to favour a particular kind, class or brand. Licensees must be aware that the sale and purchase of shelf space is prohibited. Similarly, it is not acceptable for a producer of beer, cider or wine to provide or pay for equipment in the store in order to gain preferential treatment.

- When construction has been completed, or the establishment has been relocated to the new premises, the applicant should contact the local liquor Inspector to arrange for a final inspection. If the establishment passes the inspection, the applicant will be issued new licence.
