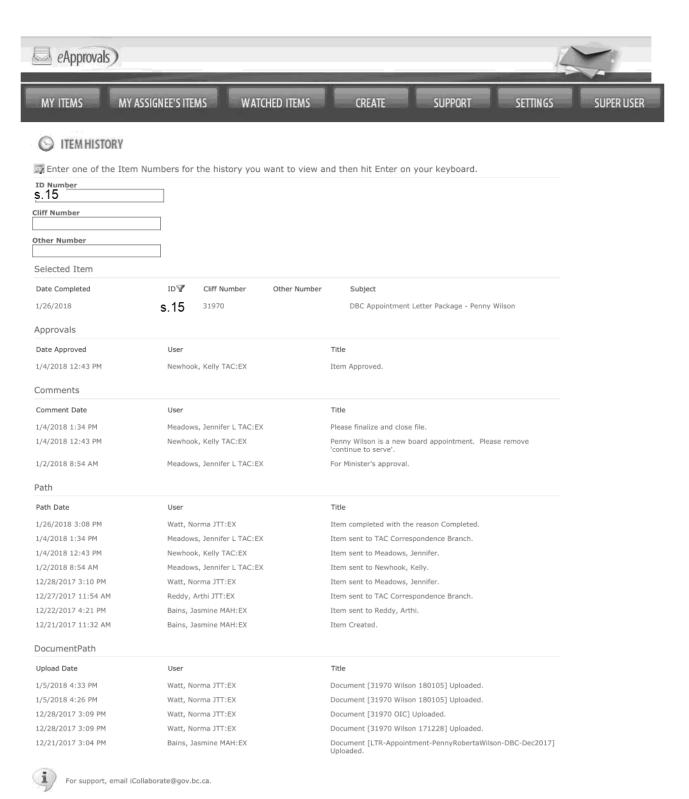

Organization Overview:

On November 2, 2012 Destination BC Corp. (Destination BC) was created. Destination BC has the primary responsibility to develop and implement tourism marketing strategies and tactics to promote tourism in BC. This includes, among other things:

- Marketing British Columbia as a tourism destination domestically, nationally and internationally;
- Promoting the development and growth of the tourism industry in British Columbia to increase revenue and employment and economic benefits generated by the industry, by, among other things,
 - providing support for regional, sector and community tourism marketing;

- providing industry leadership in tourism marketing, product development and innovation;
- supporting training and development related to tourism marketing;
- supporting visitor services, and
- conducting tourism marketing research.
- Providing advice and making recommendations to the Minister on tourism related matters; and
- Enhancing public awareness of tourism and its economic value to British Columbia.

Mandate:

Destination BC is accountable to government through the Minister of Tourism, Arts and Culture who acts as the shareholder's representative. An annual Mandate Letter is provided to Destination BC.

Composition:

Destination BC is governed by a Board of Directors that will include up to 9 individuals. A minority (4 of 9 Directors) may have current involvement or investments in the tourism and/or hospitality sector. The majority (5 of 9 Directors) may not have current involvement or investments in the tourism and/or hospitality sectors.

The Board provides strategic policy direction and leadership to the organization. The CEO is appointed by the Board of Directors and manages the implementation of operational policies and corporate goals.

The Board is responsible for establishing a Tourism Marketing Committee. The Committee is regionally representative and provides advice to the Board and CEO on tourism marketing strategies and tactics and tourism performance indicators.

Compensation:

The Chair and Board are remunerated in accordance with a Treasury Board Directive that has been developed to ensure consistent and equitable remuneration between Crown corporations of government.

Annual Honoraria Directors are entitled to receive an annual honorarium, as follows:

Board Chair: \$6,000
Audit Committee Chair: \$5,000
Other Committee Chair: \$4,000
Director: \$3,000

Directors are entitled to receive \$300.00 for each FULL day in attendance at an approved Destination British Columbia meeting, including days of travel to reach the location of the meeting. Attendance at either an a.m. or p.m. session will qualify for half of the daily.
