Chinese Canadian Community Advisory Committee

Terms of Reference

Purpose and Rationale

The Premier's Chinese Canadian Community Advisory Committee will assist the Province of British Columbia in strengthening social, economic and cultural ties among members of the Chinese diaspora in this province and around the globe.

The advisory committee will:

- Advise the Premier on government initiatives of interest and concern to members of the Chinese Canadian community in British Columbia
- Recommend strategies for building on B.C.'s economic and cultural connections with China and Chinese communities throughout the world
- Propose new programs and projects for government consideration to enhance the contributions of the Chinese Canadian community to the province

Goals

The goal of the advisory committee is to:

- Identify and actively engage with members of the Chinese community
- Ensure information from this community engagement is brought forward to the Premier for active consideration and implementation into the government agenda

Proposed Structure

The advisory committee will include:

- A committee of 15-20 members, selected for their expertise and community involvement.
- Each member has a two year term. The term can be extended.
- There will be two co-chairs and one committee secretary. All three will be members of the committee and will be chosen by consensus of the committee.
- They are independent members of the community and do not speak for the government.

Reporting Requirements

The advisory committee will report to the Premier through the Minister of State for Trade.

Remuneration

The advisory committee is a voluntary board.
