The College's interest in acquiring the now vacant Emily Carr South Building on Granville Island is significant and should be given full consideration. For decades Langara has been training the next generation of artists, actors, designers, photographers, journalists, film producers, and more, including their nationally-recognized Studio 58 Theatre Arts program, providing much-needed talent for our creative community.

Beyond being an enthusiastic attendee of countless public performances at the College, I have hired numerous graduates in my previous capacity as artistic producer of Rumble Productions and my current role as artistic and executive director of the PuSh Festival. I have also had the great honour of being invited to direct a student theatre production at the College back in 2004. Like so



What is Sustainable tourism

• "According to the **World Tourism Organization**, sustainable tourism is tourism that leads to the management of all resources in such a way that economic, social and aesthetic needs can be fulfilled while maintaining cultural integrity, essential ecological processes, biological diversity and life support systems.

The World Tourism Organization defines sustainable tourism as tourism that meets the needs of present tourists and host regions while protecting and enhancing opportunity for the future. Rather than being a type of product, it is an ethos that underpins all tourism activities. As such, it is integral to all aspects of tourism development and management rather than being an add-on component

The objective of sustainable tourism is to retain the economic and social advantages of tourism development while reducing or mitigating any undesirable impacts on the natural, historic, cultural or social environment. This is achieved by balancing the needs of tourists with those of the destination."

Short History of TOTA's Process

The Thompson Okanagan Tourism Association set out in their 10year strategic plan to develop a sustainability charter. The first step they took was having a Best Practices Report completed, which identified six best practices:

- Best Practice: Engage and consult with stakeholders about sustainability to help inform future plans and actions.
- 2. Best Practice: Establish a baseline, set clear goals and identify the specific actions to achieve those goals.
- 3. Best Practice: Ongoing Monitoring and Measurement of Impacts and Results.
- 4. Best Practice: Certification of Tourism Businesses
- 5. Best Practice: Certification of Destination

TOTA has now embarked on the Certification of the Destination, which has required the region to begin undertaking the other best practices identified as part of the process.

What is Biosphere Responsible Tourism System?

Tourism developed in a rational manner can contribute to the promotion of new non-aggressive tourism models and to the environment from a social and cultural enrichment perspective, considering the need to advance towards these new models through certification. The Responsible Tourism Institute (RTI) shares the view expressed by UNWTO that the sustainable tourism certification systems applicable to tourism play an increasingly important role in regulating tourism services, offering significant benefits for the environment and the society in general, in those places where they are developed.

The Biosphere certification is based on standards founded on the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) integrated in the Agenda 2030, following the guidelines and recommendations emanated from the World Charter on Sustainable Tourism +20 proclaimed at the Second World Tourism Summit, an event sponsored by COP21, UNESCO, UNWTO and UNEP.

One of the most important challenges today, and a responsibility of all the players involved in tourism, is the design of sustainable tourism models that allow them to develop "products" and "sustainable destinations".

In relation to this vision, the RTI has created the Responsible Tourism System (RTS). This system develops a series of certifications to ensure compliance with certain requirements regarding the principles of sustainability and continuous improvement in line with these principles.

This designation not only applies to environmental and development stewardship. but extends into culture, language and social impacts.

- Minimizing the loss of biological diversity;
- Making people aware of how cultural diversity and biological diversity affect each other;

- Promoting environmental sustainability through the World Network of Biosphere Reserves.
- ? ethical guidelines, standards and legal instruments including safety in workplace from discrimination ...work practises ... human rights
- ? social and ethical responsibility
- ? promoting cultural and social diversity

To ensure environmental, economic and social (including cultural and spiritual) sustainability through:

- ? The development and coordination of a worldwide network of places acting as

I am writing as a member of BC's arts community and as a long-time supporter of Langara's outstanding Creative Arts and Industries programs.

The College's interest in acquiring the now vacant Emily Carr South Building on Granville Island is significant and should be given full consideration. For decades Langara has been training the next generation of artists, actors, designers, photographers, journalists, film producers, and more, including their nationally-recognized Studio 58 Theatre Arts program, providing much-needed talent for our creative community.

Beyond being an enthusiastic attendee of countless public performances at the College, I have hired numerous graduates in my previous capacity as artistic producer of Rumble Productions and my current role as artistic and executive director of the PuSh Festival. I have also had the great honour of being invited to direct a student theatre production at the College back in 2004. Like so many of my professional colleague in both BC and elsewhere across the country, I find the program and its students to be of the highest quality, a truly inspiring institution founded on industry-leading pedagogy.

This widely acknowledged, sector-wide benchmark makes their case for the vacant Emily Carr South Building that much more compelling. The College's students are currently housed in a building that is seismically unsound, well past its useful life, and inadequate to their learning. The opportunity to move them to a facility that has been **purpose built for post-secondary arts education** is perfectly aligned with the goals in your mandate letter regarding providing space for BC artists and upgrading arts and culture facilities.

Attached for your information is a the most recent Expression of Interest document they have provided to your colleague, the Minister of Advanced Education, Skills, and Training. An original Expression of Interest document was sent the ministry in the fall of 2016 in anticipation of the process to determine the occupancy of the vacated space.

I join a far-reaching group of community leaders who strongly believe that Langara is the ideal new tenant for the space, and am writing to ask for your support, as the Minister responsible for Arts and Culture, for their bid. I might go so far to suggest there be a transparent and proper public tender process where those vying for tenancy would be afforded an opportunity to fully make their case.
