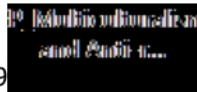

THE EVENT

MEDIA AVAILABILITY & PHOTO OPPORTUNITY

Tourism, Arts and Culture will recognize the Webb Ellis Cup visiting B.C. and acknowledge rugby in the province. This includes the qualification by the Langford-based national men's team to the 2019 Rugby World Cup in Japan this fall, the successful Canada Men's Sevens event in March, the upcoming Canada Women's Sevens in May, and the recent award to Rugby Canada of a stop on the World Sevens Series for the next four years in Vancouver again.

EVENT

Minister Beare will introduce representatives from both the men's and women's rugby seven's, Rugby Canada, PavCo, and the Webb Ellis Cup in the House before Question Period.

The Webb Ellis Cup will be displayed on the front steps of the Legislature at noon. Premier John Horgan and Minister Lisa Beare to say a few words about welcoming the cup to the capital and acknowledge the many facets of rugby in the province; similar to introduction in the House. A Rugby Canada representative will also say a few words.

MLAs, members of the public, the rugby community, and media will be invited to view the cup, get players' signatures and take photos. A brief demonstration of rugby by Victoria area rugby players in jerseys will be played on the front lawn.

Rugby Canada would reach out to their community to invite people to the display, but an internal invitation to MLA's and staff would need to be provided. TAC would send out a media advisory.

BACKGROUND NOTES

The Webb Ellis Cup is awarded to the winner of the Rugby World Cup, the premier international competition of men's 15-a-side rugby. After touring internationally, the cup is currently touring in British Columbia. The Webb Ellis was most recently awarded to New Zealand and the 2019 Rugby World Championships will take place in Japan in the fall. A British Columbia representative from Rugby Canada (Gareth Rees, World Rugby Hall of Famer) will be in attendance with the cup.

The Canada Men's 7s tournament ran March 9-10, 2019; the Canada Women's 7s tournament runs May 11-12, 2019. The Province has provided significant funding for both tournaments through the Tourism Events Program over the past several years:

- 2019: \$150,000
- 2018: \$125,000
- 2017: \$170,000

Overall attendance for 2019 tournament men's sevens in Vancouver was 73, 819 over two days with 35% of guests attending from outside the Lower Mainland. Economic impact in Vancouver is still being determined; but in its first three years, the Sevens tournament has generated more

than \$24m in economic activity in B.C. annually.

VENUE DESCRIPTION

The cup is displayed on a plinth with a Webb Ellis sponsorship backdrop (please see picture below). The cup is delivered in a Range Rover (as per their sponsorship); a parking spot for delivery will be required. A podium and sound equipment will need to be provided.

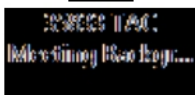

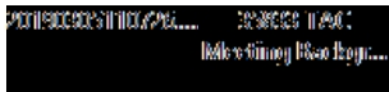
